Bullet And Gehron Winners In Chicago

CHICAGO — The advance ARB 12+ Metro Shares for Chicago are in and the market shapes as follows:

WAIT 2.0, WBBM-AM 6.9, WBBM-FM 2.1, WBMX 4.3, WCFL .8, WCLR 3.5, WDAI 2.2, WEFM 2.7, WFYR 3.0, WGCI 1.9, WGN 11.0, WIND 4.7, WJEZ 1.7, WJJD 2.0, WJOL .7, WJPC 1.9, WKQX 1.4, WLAK 4.2, WLOO 6.9, WLS 7.9, WLUP 5.3, WMAQ 4.7, WMET 1.4, WVON 3.2, WXRT 1.8.

John Gehron, program director of WLS, and Jessie Bullet, program director of WLUP, emerged as winners. The two stations moved ahead dramatically with WLS going from a 5.9 to 7.9 and WLUP moving from 3.1 to 5.3.

Both programmers gave credit to all the hard-working people on their stations. Gehron thought the book reflected the fact that "everyone at the station did what they were supposed to

New Format Emerges

LOS ANGELES — A new format is emerging in radio today. It is being played on WBLS, New York; KMJQ in Houston; WHRK, Memphis; and quite

WBLS' Crocker Adds Kute/L.A.

LOS ANGELES — Frankie Crocker has told Radio Report that he will both program and be on the air at Discoformatted KUTE in this city. Crocker, as program director of WBLS in New York, was responsible for that station's ratings successes.

Crocker said he planned no staff changes; however, he might shift some time slots.

Crocker will divide his time between the New York and Los Angeles stations. possibly at WNOE, New Orleans and KUTE, Los Angeles. Frankie Crocker, program director of WBLS, prefers to call the format "Disco And More." Candy Wessling, music director of WHRK in Memphis describes the format as "Contemporary Rhythms." Jack Patterson, program director of KMJQ, also likes the term "Contemporary Rhythms." "We play a little bit of everything. Disco-Jazz, the term we were using, doesn't quite fit." According to Patterson, "to program the format correctly, you need expertise. You have to be able to find things that are compatible and for Continued in page 4



An Expert Rates The Rating Services

By BARBARA HALL

"Radio's rating services are far superior to the service being rendered for television," according to Deborah Gonderil, senior vice president, director research. Western International

Gonderil pointed out that there is much more data produced by radio's rating services. For example, "the cume information is printed in the radio books, while in television you have to go to the service, and they charge extra for the information. The surveys in radio are better, particularly for developing reach schedules."

Before joining Western International Media, Gonderil was co-founder and president of Dimensions Unlimited and Source. She was with McCann/Erickson and at one time was research

director for KFI.

Regarding the demise of Trac 7, Gonderil stated, "It's an indication of the fact that while the radio stations say they would like an alternative to Arbitron . . . when business is so good (so many stations are saying that they are sold out), they can't find a reason to spend the many thousands of additional dollars that it would take to support another service. While they may approve of the methodology or the idea of a second service, it still comes down to the fact that they really would like to feel another service would provide other ways of selling their station, and they say they don't have any inventory left to sell. So they aren't motivated to spend the money for another service. However, she points out that "generally when a station says they are sold out, if you ask 'you mean 7 to mid-night?', they say, 'no, well, perhaps not 7 to midnight.' So maybe there is a problem with the way the rate cards are structured and the way they are

One of the major problems of any kind of rating service, survey, or any kind of interviewing throughout the nation is lack of cooperation. Even the United States Census Bureau has been

ADULTRADIO: Let's Face The Music

Rick Sellers is director of operations and programming for WMT Radio in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. He has also worked at WOXR, in Oxford, Ohio as program director and general manager; and at KCRG in Cedar Rapids as program director. Rick has a B.A. in Psychology and an M.S. in Communications, and is a part-time instructor of Broadcasting at Kirkwood Community College in Cedar Rapids.

It's been titled "chicken rock" — "personality/MOR" — "adult MOR" — "adult contemporary" . . . in fact, prior to the days of album-oriented Rock, this "mysterious" radio format was tongue-in-cheekly called AOR, then meaning "all over the road!" The elusive format is, of course, the non-disco . . . non-heavy-metal non-Rock melodious music that is seemingly blended together with perhaps more personality and empathy

with resultant attraction for audiences aged 25-plus.

Whatever it's called, Radio for adults, by any format title, seems to be doing a gradual disappearing act.

As PD at one of our younger oriented competitors in town, I knew hard times lay ahead when moving across tracks to "adult" WMT; my peers around the country all called to wish condolences; my former general manager was quoted in Broadcasting Magazine as saying that WMT's music selections resembled "nursing home heaven" - even my wife was caught leaving the car radio punched up to different stations! Admittedly, at that time, WMT was just at the beginning of a slow but deliberate music metamorphosis . . . nothing drastic, but the time had come to insert some of the more current artists between the Andy Williams and Ray Conniff records. Today, we still program Ray Conniff,

mulate the things that are not so they will be compatible. It is one of the most demanding programming formats. You have to know music theory, the market, Disco, R&B, Top 40 and MOR."

Frankie Crocker stated flatly: "It has to be programmed by a professional."

Wessling describes WHRK's format as a curious mixture of Disco, Jazz, R&B, Top 40, Soft Rock and anything else that is appropriate for the market. "We play Teddy Pendergrass, Rickie Lee Jones, Donna Summer, Toto, the Isley Brothers and the Jacksons . . . a lot of cross-over records, Black to White and White to Black, plus mainstream."

Patterson says, "We have a Black base but we format the station on a general market basis so that it doesn't come out like a 'Black' station. We play Barbra Streisand, Rickie Lee Jones, Steely Dan, Chicago, Boz Scaggs, Toto, Funkadelic, Con Funk Shun, the Bar-Kays. I wouldn't play Supertramp, but I might go on a Kenny Rogers or a Waylon Jennings. Remember, this is Texas. The audience tastes change too as time goes on. The Blacks are listening to more Top 40 radio since we started. I did a Doobie Brothers special. We played cross-over material, and to my surprise I had calls from Black 18+ men and women for 'China Grove and 'Long Train Runnin' which is about as Rock and Roll as the Doobie Brothers ever got.

Frankie Crocker agreed he had a lot in common with the music on both KMJQ and WHRK. However, he pointed out "what I'm doing is what I have always done as a programmer ... finding the music. I might play Supertramp. After all, who knew that Rod Stewart would be a hit! Who knew that Herb Alpert would have a hit in Disco . . . and it is a hit! It really doesn't matter, a hit is a hit. There is nothing I won't play if I hear it and like it and feel it will go for my market.'

At first examination, it appears that the Disco stations traded audience, with a slight increase in listening. WDAS-FM went up from 6.5 to 7.2: WCAU-FM moved from a 4.2 to a 3.9; WZZD went from 1.2 to 1.7. The two FM Adult/Contemporary stations, WUSL and WMGK both dropped. The Beautiful Music stations had no real changes.

Funds Requested to Study Full-Time AM

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Funding for a study on ways to expand fulltime service to all AM radio stations was requested by the National Association of Broadcasters. In a letter to Senator Ernest F. Hollings, chairman of the Senate Subcommittee on State, Justice, Commerce and Judiciary, NAB senior vice president for Government Relations, Donald P. Zeifang urged the

appropriation of sufficient funds in 1980 to allow the FCC to pursue "the goal of full-time authorization for all AM stations" in coordination with a joint Government-Industry Committee.

Zeifang said that the results of the study would be critical to the U.S. position at the meetings of the Western Hemisphere countries scheduled to begin next year.

NAB Protests FCC's Combo Action

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The announcement by the Federal Communications Commission of a "condition" of possible divestiture on its approval of all applications for new and transferred AM-FM station combinations has come under attack by the National Association of Broadcasters. The NAB has asked the FCC to rescind its action, which would condition grant of applications filed after June 7 on the outcome of a rulemaking proceeding not yet begun.

The NAB stated that "the FCC's public notice was adopted without any prior notice and opportunity for comment. It directly contradicts the Commission's current policies, adopted following an extensive rulemaking proceeding, which allows AM-FM combinations.

An affidavit from Blackburn & Company, the nation's largest media broker, noted that the Commission's action "brought many negotiations to a standstill and has had an adverse economic impact on some licensees.

do. The personalities entertained. We had good solid promotions on the air. I could go on and on about each department. The key is we did not make any major changes at the station. We felt there were problems with the January book because of weather and we are now back where we should be. It's nice to have the tools and people and the support from the company. They are letting us do what we think is necessary to have this station remain successful. That's what's nice about working for ABC.

Jessie Bullet felt "the book is reflective of a lot of hard work by the talented people here." In addition, he believes that "the advances recorded by The Loop indicate beyond a shadow of a doubt the advantages of utilizing the model concept of programming. By this, I mean choosing your targeted audience and delivering as pure as possible a product. With as many FM signals vying for FM audience . . . you can't be something for all people. You have to pick what you're going to be and strive for that goal . . . and model programming is appropriate for any format, Soft Rock, Top 40, MOR, etc.



Andy Williams, Johnny Mathis, Herb Alpert, Lettermen and so on. I can hear "gasps" out here in Cedar Rapids as you read this - but yet, these "adult" artists are the crux of our musical programming - however, with a good amount of careful selection, our current playlist includes England Dan & John Ford Coley, Neil Sedaka, Kenny Rogers, Crystal Gayle, Neil Diamond and others similar. We don't play Donna Summer, K.C. and the Sunshine Band, Village People or the Doobie Brothers. Some might label us as "conservative", but that's a matter of semantics. Most radio stations today provide their announcers with 18 to 35 records and tell them to play them over and over, with a sprinkling of oldies thrown in. At WMT . . . and a few other adult stations around the country, the air talent has freedom to program his or her musical selections from a decent record library according to prevailing audience moods, events . . . even weather conditions sometimes play a part in music selection. We utilize format clocks to suggest to air people proper music category order; but, for the most part, the actual song selection is up to the person who best knows prevailing audience tastes - the announcer. And that's not "conservative."

Back to the music. Who buys today's "single" record? In fact, who purchases the most albums at your local retail record stores? Mostly, the under-30 folks. Adults I've talked with tend to avoid making any record purchases at most of our local record outlets due to the atmosphere in the store: black lights, loud music . . . the "head shop" atmosphere turns most adults off - so they turn to the national record "clubs" and place album orders via the mail. Who "tracks" these sales? However, by programming just the Lettermen-Conniff-Williams "sound", we literally asked the 25-34 demo to turn elsewhere for music - so then what? Record promoter help sometimes works; the national "easy listening charts" are possibilities . . . but, in the end, we frankly listen to the sound of the songs being scrutinized for airplay. The vocal style, the accompaniment, the overall mix - all provide a "gut feeling" that says either "no - it won't sound good on our station" or "yes, our audience will enjoy that". Unfortunately, often it's a "damned if you do and damned if you don't" situation - play something too young and the substantial older demo will disappear . . play a bit too much of the "standards" and the younger end of the spectrum hits the push-button.

What we are attempting to do is June 28, 1979

educate the older demos about the current artists we play by way of artist bios, telephone interviews, "feature artist" hours and the like. Audiences, no matter what age, will enjoy the music of artists or groups far more if they can better identify with them. Our longtime morning man (who perhaps would be more comfortable with "over-35" selections) has done a super job in further making the 25-34 music acceptable to the over-35 crowd simply because he is now playing it.

What has been the end result of the careful influx of current music here? We don't know yet, but we're working on it. WMT long has been Arbitrondominant in this market; our 27.4 metro share (12-plus) is among the highest in the country (some swear by Arbitron, others swear at them!) but Cedar Rapids is one of those one-booka-year places and an overall trend toward picking up some younger numbers has yet to "officially" show. Ideally, WMT will be "number one" in the 25-plus category not only because of our very strong over-35 audience, but also because of a decent 25-34 showing as well. However, ARBs are merely quantitative. We'd like to know more about our audience; how much money do they make? . . . do they invest?...do they fly often?...do they have credit cards?...and so on. Our parent corporation, Orion Broadcasting, Inc., has a research division with which we are closely working on a massive research project to not only help answer these questions, but to aid us further in proper music selection.

WMT is one of those "no format" formatted stations with features like two hours of agricultural programming in the morning (remember, this part of the country provides most of the food you eat; in fact, one out of every 50 Americans is fed by farms located within WMT's primary signal area). News is a major factor, too . . . over 15 percent of our programming is news ... two meteorologists give us hourly weather updates . . . three hours each weeknight is devoted to a talk show which originates from a brand new downtown civic center-hotel complex: our custom studio has attracted many dignitaries who might not have taken time to be driven out to our suburban "broadcast park" regular studios; add a sprinkling of vintage old time radio shows and our regular CBS features and you can readily see that while music is important, especially in attracting the 25-34's, WMT really cannot be called a "music station."


How to go about holding the metro audience while providing essential information to the TSA farmers is another problem for us; there are the usual "tricks" in non-music program placement that will supposedly have the least effect on those elusive "diary holders" - we've tried a bit of that; but most importantly, we think the metro audience will hang on if we better involve them in things that their farm friends are concerned with. So, we're making endeavors toward informing the metro audience just what the market information we provide the farmers translates to . . . in plain English. We're also planning a plainly worded brochure to accompany requested program schedules that will further explain the nomenclature used in some of our agricultural programs. Similar to "educating" the older demos on younger music, we're trying to educate and involve the metro in what thus far have been TSA concerns. The research mentioned previously is further aiding us along these lines.

So - one takes a proper adult music mix, personalities who are encouraged to use their minds as well as their mouths and a potpourri of features . . . and voila! 25-54 is yours. What's so great about owning 25-54? Or, let's momentarily turn it around . . . what's not so good? Well, as a programmer or music director, you seldom get freebie tickets to see KISS when they're in town; the record promoters tend to give more attention to your local Top 40 operations (although someone told me Ray Conniff sold 2.5 million albums last year . . . when was the last time you were hyped on Conniff?). Seriously, the positive aspects of truly dominating 25-54 are phenomenal. First of all, your announcing staff is happy because a 25-54 station tends to pay better salaries, only if just to keep people around for a while, avoiding that revolving door syndrome that so often occurs over at the Top 40 places.

DANNY DAVIS

A Man Of Many Words — And Worlds

This week, the Radio Report launches an in-depth interview/discussion with a man whose career has run the gamut from stand-up comic to [presently] senior vice president of promotion for Motoum Records - Danny Davis. The interview was conducted by Claude Hall, publisher.

CLAUDE HALL: Over the years that I have known you, you've characteristically been associated with some highly creative people. And, Berry Gordy's supposed to have some of the greatest ears in the business.

DANNY DAVIS: I started out as a press agent for Eddie Fisher. I was with Eddie and I was with Donnie Kirshner and I was with Phil Spector and with The Partridge Family and The Monkees. I have what I believe to be a great book of me and I'm intent on setting it all down on paper. One of these days, I mean. I have already started it but I definitely want to see it complete before I fade away. I'm writing it myself. I really have had a colorful career; some things that have happened to me, why I could keep you here for hours. I was with Eddie in the good days; I was with him when he was married to Elizabeth Taylor, when he was married to Debbie Reynolds, and I saw that whole thing emerge. I know all the ins and outs of how the marriage was manipulated and how Louella Parsons had a hand in it, and how Eddie Cantor announced it to the Jewish community and made it palatable to them. Eddie Cantor announced it because the truth of the matter is, Blackstone, who was his manager, thought that his career would be ended if the Jew boy married a shiksa - you understand that is a girl who's not Jewish.

HALL: I thought Elizabeth Taylor was Jewish.

DAVIS: No, this is Debbie Reynolds. So when they married, they got Eddie Cantor to announce it, making it palatable to the Jewish community. I know all those ins and outs. I was with Phil Spector when we found Lenny Bruce's body.

HALL: I didn't see you in the movie. DAVIS: No, I wasn't in that, but I can tell you the whole story. I was there in that whole situation. I mean, I really do have a colorful background.

HALL: What is Phil Spector like? 10 RADIO REPORT

DAVIS: He's fun-loving . . . I don't think I'd get in trouble if I'd tell you, I think Philly is a lovable kook. I think he certainly is a genius for his time. I think he's a most obviously talented guy, but there are certain people who thrive on shocking people and I think that's Philly. I think Philly loves the notoriety; he loves to be known as an eccentric, and I must tell you, I think that's what endeared him to me. I had never known anybody like Phil, and there's no question that he was at the height of the business, he was wellregarded. Saying you worked for Phil Spector was like saying, at the time, you worked for Eddie Fisher; and I'll tell you quite honestly I basked in that after-glow for a long time. I think that's indigenous to all of us who work in the business — we like to be associated with success. And, I plead no different from that; I love the aura that comes to you by being around people or being a hang-around somebody. Philly's a lovable kook. I think that would be the best way to explain it. I had a lot of good times with Phil. As a matter of fact, I just had an occasion to reacquaint myself with him and to rekindle the friendship. At the last cocktail party with Paul Drew, he made an appearance.

HALL: I remember a television show once in which Rick Nelson acted the part and I know the character was based on Phil Spector. It was a television show called Flipside.

DAVIS: I have some great, great Phil which will all be in my book I got to tell you. I'll tell you 'cause I know you love my stories Claudie, and this is a true story. Your successes in this business overwhelm your failures, so bearing that in mind and having said that to you, listen to this. We went up to his house one day. I'll give it to you in fast order; you know about all the successes with the Righteous Brothers and all that. Okay, we went up to his

house and in his living room was auditioning a group that a guy by the name of Matthew Kates brought up from San Francisco. It's the Jefferson Airplane. Okay, from there we went to a party Lance Reventlow was giving, and somebody late in the evening says to Phil 'I have a great group for you in New York City you really ought to cut, you'd love them.' Phil says, 'no kidding. That's sensational, what's their names.'
The other guy says, 'The Lovin' Spoonful.' And, Phil says, 'I hate the name,' and left, and never did anything about it. One more. Sid Bernstein came to me. My association with Sid Bernstein goes back hundreds of years, and he came to me one day and said 'Danny I got a group; they're playing a place called The Barge in Westhampton.' He says 'you must bring Phil Spector out.' Anyway, for the sake of brevity, I begged and pleaded and finally got Phil on a plane which was a chore in itself. Got him on a plane, we flew to Westhampton, got a limousine, drove up to The Barge and there was a group playing called the Rascals. They were so intent on impressing Phil Spector that they went into an entire medley a long medley — of all of Phil's tunes. He turns to me and says 'damn group ain't anything, they don't write any originals.' Then he walked out. Absolutely, they're all true.

HALL: You're a natural stand-up

DAVIS: I was a stand-up comic. On my discharge and on my Army papers, my civilian occupation is listed as comic. I went into the Army and I was tailgunner. I was a lot thinner then; I could get in the tail of a B-25. Anyway, I did gunnery training; I had a great eye. My typical Jewish mother hated the fact that I was a tailgunner, thought that I was just insane. The life expectancy of a tailgunner at the time was 90 seconds in battle. Anyway, I was sent in on what is known as a block assignment to a fighter outfit. And the Air Force does not deviate from a block

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assignment, so here I was a tailgunner in a fighter outfit, and there was no other recourse but to put me in the Special Services. So after I did gunnery training, they sent me to Fort Benjamin Harrison in Indianapolis, Indiana for Special Services school and I took training there. And, one day I was at a party for Eddie Fisher. I had just driven his Cadillac out here. I don't know whether you remember this name or not, but Deborah Paget came up to me and said she saw my wings. I was a very proud little guy and loved the wings, and she said 'Oh, Sergeant, are you a gunner?' I said, 'yes, ma'am, I'm a tailgunner.' I was very proud. And, she said 'Oh, is that what you do in the Air Force?' So I said, 'No, ma'am, I'm in Special Services now, I'm no longer in gunnery.' And, she said to me, 'Well, you still gun for women don't you?' What can I do for you Claude, I'll answer anything.

HALL: How many albums does Motown turn out in a year's time?

DAVIS: Well, last year we put out

just short of 40.

HALL: That's a lot of albums. DAVIS: Not really. We view ourselves as one of the shortest releasing; I mean, we feel we don't release that many. We try and keep it to a minimum, therefore we have the opportunity or the luxury or whatever you will to work product for a longer period of time. We do have a very small release schedule. We view everything as a primary piece of product. Hopefully. And, we try to devote as much time as it takes. A classic example, if I might, and one of a very pleasing nature that is currently paramount in this office is the job that we are doing with Fresh. We're very pleased with it because we appear to be knocking on the door of AOR radio. All the guys in the field view that as their clarion call for Motown to be recognized in the AOR community. And, just today about an hour before you came up, we were regaled with a 4,000 reorder out of Pickwick. That album is out since November and there's no question in anybody's mind that had it been on any other label but a subsidiary or a

division of Motown, that it would have made a stronger impact far before this. But, at Motown we have to extend ourselves more. We have to prove ourselves more. We have to show total and undying commitment more. Anyway, we have been allowed the luxury of working that album since the time of release, which was November, and we have met with some tremendous response — Milwaukee, St. Louis, Philadelphia, WKLS, I mean some real strong call letters. And, we're all very pleased 'cause it's now starting to come home. We well know what renumerations or what fruit would be available for us should we at "Motown" have the capacity to break a thorough pop group. This company for so long has been saddled, if you will, with the standing in the record community as being only one dimensional and the reality of it all is that we are not! We feel very strongly that with all our artists, we're in the business of music and we would like to be viewed that way. I've read your stories on some of the other guys - of all my contemporaries and some of the guys that are in the promotion business, and all of them claim that their men are the best. I feel that that's real good, that all of those guys support their own individual staffs; that's very noteworthy. In my case, I really firmly, thoroughly believe that every one of my men is the best that exists for a very interesting reason. Every man on the Motown promotion team comes from behind every week, week in and week out. They don't have the luxury of walking in with a built-in artist often. Yes, it is true that we have Diana Ross and we have Stevie Wonder and Marvin Gaye and it is a long time between releases. But, every week we don't have the luxury of The Cars or Linda Ronstadt or Barbra Streisand, do you understand what I'm saying. And, every one of our acts comes very hard, because it appears - I don't know whether this is true or not but it appears that way that we must make for ourselves our own openings on the playlist. Maybe there are some other people who are thinking about something that they'll

play or something occurs during the course of the week that'll put a programmer onto a piece of our competitions' product. But, in our case. we have to go and we literally make the in-road. It is traceable directly to the fact that Motown unfortunately for a long period of time was viewed as a one dimensional record company. Now I would hope that in my 10 years here, and if you'll forgive me for using your magazine for a bit of personal kudos, I think my guys and I are that egotistical that we believe that we have effected a change. We believe that the tempo of the street, the tenor of the radio community have changed in certain instances and we don't find it as tough as we once did. We still have a problem cracking through when we have periphal product, but we are of the opinion that we have made in-roads, and for that we are supremely obliged and we thank radio for making it easier. We are very appreciative in many regards that it has changed. We have cooperated with radio and I would hope that both the pop and the guy saddled with R&B product have effected a great solidification of their relationships with radio. We have cooperated with promotional stunts which heretofore had not happened. Not only had Motown not cooperated, but we had never been asked to cooperate which feels real good. And I'm still getting as many laughs as I did. The whole tenor feels real good, and going back to what I started to say, I feel real strongly that the guys who represent Motown are indeed excellent.

HALL: How many people do you

have in the field?

DAVIS: We have just increased the field force by two. I believe it's 17 now and myself and Skip Miller, who is gonna be a dynamite killer national man. That would be about 19 men all total. The guys are really well-rounded; they do a little bit of everything. So we do make free use of all the great national independent men.

Louisiana's Le Roux Is Touring The Nation

"Keep The Fire Burnin'," Le Roux's latest album, grows on you. By the second listen you can feel the melody, energy, and craftsmanship of the group. Not just for the single, "Feel It," but for "Keep The Fire Burnin'," "Call Home The Heart," and "Thunder N'Lightnin'."

In discussing the group, Michelle Robinson, music director of WSHE, Miami, FL noted, "Probably their strength is just like the last album... their harmonies. Also the musicianship on this new album is at least as tight and as good as the last, if not better. Musically they have made some slight changes in their style. They have more ballads on this album. I like the changes that they made. But it did take me a while to get used to the new direction. Definitely, this direction will bring them a large audience and help broaden their base."

Lee Armstrong, operations director of WNOE FM commented on the day he added "Feel It". "I think they are pretty good. They are very fine musicians. They have a good chance

with 'Feel It' for breaking out nationally."

Dana Jang, music director of KOME in San Jose stated: "I really like their energy on stage. That's something I always respect in entertainers. They put out on stage and have fun at the same time. They have the right direction in mind."

Ray Sutley, music director of KSMB, La fayette, LA felt, "This album is more polished, though I liked the raw feeling of the first. I'd call them Country Rock and R&B almost. They have great energy. The album grows on you.

Leon Medica, producer and bass player and Jeff Pollard, guitar, lead vocals and writer, regard "Feel It" as "the best song the band has recorded to date . . . the total song, the performance, and the arrangement!" Rod Roddy, the keyboard player, came in with the basic chord structure and the first verse. Then Rod and Jeff worked together getting a hook to it and structure.

"We are a big band in the South," Leon says, "and it's weird to go from being a big band and headlining, to somewhere where we're absolutely nothing — perhaps the first of three bands. But it makes you develop."

Their efforts to establish themselves on a national level mean that they are always touring.

What was the hardest audience they ever faced? An audience in Champagne, IL. "Everyone was yelling 'Ya'all better be good'. By the second song, we had everyone into it and by the end of the set, they gave us an encore."

What is the band like? "Nobody takes each other seriously, so it never gets out of hand. We have a very mature attitude for crazy people. I don't know if you have to be crazy . . but" the two members of the band pointed out, "the lifestyle of a musician is different from the normal mode . . . to put up with being booked one place and then drive 18 hours to the next booking. You must have a desire so strong that it may be normal to most musicians . . . but not to the rest of the world." And then finally, "The actual playing is not work. The playing is smooth. We have fun!"

Artist:

Doug Fieger, lead singer and guitarist: "Rock 'n' Roll is all I ever believed in and it's really wonderful to see this kind of music scene in Los Angeles developing again. It's even more wonderful knowing that you're a part of that scene. It's great that there's such good local Rock 'n' Roll available for kids to see and for a couple dollars get transported by the music. There are many local groups that are working it up, getting tunes and realizing what it's all about. For many years, Top Forty or commercial were bad words and they weren't what you wanted to be, but to me, the greatest records were Top Forty records. They were hit records and you only listened to hit records. Hits were on the Top Forty and even if you listened to FM, most of the stations were playing Top Forty

"People have drawn parallels be-tween our album and the Beatles' first album, cover-wise and the refreshing kind of simpleness of what we're doing. but they haven't drawn negative parallels between us. I'm elated by this, because people are realizing that there are certain values that are basic. Rock 'n' Roll is not an intellectual process - it's an emotional process. Yet, the songs can speak about certain intellectual processes, but that's not the most important aspect, it's the feeling one gets that's most important.

"The experience of life can't be explained in the time it takes to live it. You don't understand what's going on until it's passed you. But Rock 'n' Roll is something that's instantly understandable and can be experienced at

the moment it happens. It's something that doesn't have to be explained to you by someone who knows more than you know.

"People have also asked us if we're the next Beatles, and our guitarist, Berton Averre, said something that really answers that when he said, 'It's like asking a rookie outfielder if he wants to be like Babe Ruth. What's he going to answer? Of course, who wouldn't want to be like Babe Ruth' or the Beatles. We loved the Beatles, they were one of the best. We want to be like them, sure. I want to hit sixty home runs in a season. That's what it's all about."

Radio:

Dave Sholin, music coordinator, RKO Radio: "What impressed me the most, initially about The Knack, was the first thirty seconds of 'My Sharona'. I said, 'What is this?' The best way I can describe it is that it's just a pleasure to hear this kind of sound.

"I saw them recently in England at The Marquee Club and after each song, the audience was screaming for 'My Sharona'. The Knack finally went into it and people were bouncing off walls. That was the first time I had seen the group and they were just unbeliev-

Jeff Pollack, program director, WMMR, Philadelphia: "I listened to the record and felt that it was well produced and had catchy tunes. We've been playing it and it seems to be one of those albums that will grow on you. Both our staff here at the station and the listening audience like it.

Bob Coburn, program director, WMET, Chicago: "What I like best

about The Knack is that the music makes me feel good when I play it and it makes me want to move. The lyrics are very clever and their music is just really the epitome of Rock 'n' Roll. I also like the purity of their music and the fact that they do it with such class. Right now we're playing four tracks off the album.'

Club:

Doug Weston, owner of The Troubador, Los Angeles: "The Knack is a group with a great deal of vitality, a great deal of energy which is very current and they've captured the popular imagination of the people of Los Angeles in a way no other groups had until now. How they're different is in the approach that they individually take to their music. They are a vital and 'happening' group and I believe that this 'happening' will spread worldwide.

"When The Knack is on the stage, they're really fresh and there is never a performance which is a replica of something else; it is always new and exciting. That's the key to The Knack's whole approach. It's the same thing they've done to their album. They've not done an overly-produced album, they've done an album that captures a live sound. I believe that the album and the success of that album may leave some kind of an effect on the way records will be produced in the future.

having problems getting returns. "People," Gonderil points out, "don't want to disclose things. They don't want to take the time to fill out surveys or talk on the phone. Even the phone systems aren't getting 100% cooperation. It is more like 40 to 60 percent. It's a basic attitudinal problem. They are asking 'What is in it for me?'"

As Gonderil discussed the different rating surveys, she commented: [Arbitron] "The major strength is that is is established and there. The numbers produced by Arbitron are the standard by which all other rating services are measured. They have all kinds of problems with younger age groups and minorities; however, they are increasing sample sizes and testing, giving larger premiums to these hard-toreach sub groups. According to Ted Shaker, they are very serious about extended measurement (surveying continuously in monthly reports). Right now they are doing it in three markets, but they plan to add more in the near future. They are discussing improving the diary and improving their weighting techniques. Monthly data would be very valuable for programming and spotting trends. (But I know that Arbitron charges for everything extra

they do.) If you have continuous measurement, it is possible that the practice of hyping in rating periods will be financially unfeasible."

[Burke] "They are producing qualitative and demographic information. In one phone call, they ask people for one day of recall to get their quarter hour information and seven days of recall to get their cume. We find the quarter hours in Burke are higher than in Arbitron. We did a run on the same buy on Burke, and Burke developed twice as many gross rating points. We don't know which is more accurate. I do know if Burke becomes a more used survey, the ways in which radio is bought will have to be changed. If people buy on gross rating point goals, those levels are achieved with fewer spots in Burke. However, since Burke's cumes are so much lower, it's possible that the buys made on reach goals might take more spots. But there are many buys that come down that have both rating points and reach goals. Obviously, to get the same budget using Burke means re-educating the client to setting up higher gross rating point goals and lower reach goals.

[Ram] "Ram is a one-day diary that provides qualitative information. They give their users access to all kinds of break-down information in smaller units than reported in the book (geographical, for example). But it is only

one day's worth of data."

[Media Trend] "Media Trend is a phone interview of one day's worth of data. The way it's been sold is as a predictor of the Arbitron. As a predictor, it seems to be valid as far as some of the big changes, but the data is highly limited."

Gonderil points out that the problem with all the rating companies is nonconfidence in the reliability of the data. "Of course," she adds, "in any kind of research you do, if the clients don't like the data, they are not going to believe it. And the people who like the results just use it to sell. The question is always 'how large a sample size and what kind of methodology?' . . . and this often boils down to cost. 'We'll increase the sample size' say the rating services, 'if you pay for it.'

"In statistical theory, sample size is not of primary importance if the sample is properly drawn and if people are giving the accurate information. But those are two very big ifs."

Finally, Gonderil states: "There is too little information on what it actually takes to move product. What moves product is so much more complicated than just the media placement. However, if we had the answer to how many spots it would take to move product and on which stations, then," she says wryly, "perhaps we wouldn't need the rating services."

Your salespeople and sales managers are happy because the 25-54 stations most often command higher average listener figures with resulting higher spot rates. National rep firms are finding the 25-54 group to be increasingly asked for; Katz attributes the increase in inquiries to the growing number of those in the age bracket and also the affluence of this group... Blair has stated that 25-54 is now their most requested demographic, with teens taking a drastic slide.

Additionally, several years ago, Golden West had a survey conducted by W.R. Simmons Research which basically concluded that "personality-MOR" had the highest commercial recall of all radio formats studied; "Country and Western" came in with a close second — both due to the fact that audience involvement with personality is present; both formats tend to almost seek out and ask the audience to actively participate, while other formats tend to act more passively — now, your announcers, your salespeople, your rep... and your advertisers are happy.

At WMT, audience pleasing comes first, followed by advertisers, em-

ployees and stockholders. How about your audience? If they're involved, they must be happy. We at WMT find that taking the radio station out to the people has an incredible impact, especially when we're not selling anything! So often, the public sees a station outside the studio only in a "come out and buy" situation. Why not simply go out and be there when a small community in the TSA has a strawberry festival . . . or when a county fair happens? So many of us go out and do remotes, but only when direct income is generated. Try going out; the "indirect income" will amaze you.

In my opinion, a genuine adult radio station, while being desirous of attracting as many human bodies as possible to its dial position, should remember that the Top 40's will gladly handle the under-25's . . . the over 25's are what we're after. It amazes me how nicely Burt Bacharach, Frank Sinatra, and Petula Clark sound when carefully mixed in with Carpenters, Manilow and even Bee Gees. And yes, Conniff—but we're as careful about which Conniff songs air as we are which Bee Gees cuts air.

I'm happy to report that my wife now is known to sneak a listen now and then, and at the same time, the area nursing homes haven't staged a protest over our subtle music shifts.

retail clerks had seen The Knack and there had been some visibility in the San Francisco area, so those two markets were our primary target markets. I'd say probably in the Boston, Philadelphia, Chicago, Cleveland and Midwest market areas, the word about The Knack had slipped in minimally, but radio in those areas was more hip to the group than we had anticipated.

"I think one thing you have to be careful of is that you don't hype. On the West Coast, most of our customers knew what we were saying. The trades had helped somewhat there, people were aware that thirteen record companies were trying to sign the group, so it really wasn't hype here; we had to downplay the West Coast marketplaces and begin that kind of exciting activity on the East Coast and Midwest. The

believability was there, obviously, because they saw that we were committed to the group."

Steve Meyer, national promotion manager: "California was basically set up by their live appearances, but the buzz was bleeding over into other markets. The Rock press picked up on them and started writing things. Bruce Springsteen played with them when they were at The Troubador, and that made the columns and people said, "Who's this band that Springsteen's playing with?" Then Tom Petty and Eddie Money played with them and the buzz continued to build.

"The music is fresh and right now. There's plenty of room on radio for some fresh music. A lot of the music that's out there is stagnant. It's summertime and The Knack plays

happy, up-tempo music.

"We intended to give The Knack exposure in Europe so that they could become an international act, not just an American act. It's unusual to get a

group over there as early as this, but The Knack's music is so contemporary and just basically good Rock 'n' Roll, we felt that they would cross any barriers even without a hit. The response over there was as good as it was here."

Ray Tuskin, national album promotion director: "They recorded and mixed the album in eleven days and it was essentially all first takes. They put down on vinyl what was very similar to their performances and did it with very little overdubbing. There was really a confidence about the record.

"I think we are going to see some amazing things happen if this continues to develop the way it's begun, and I think it will. I believe that this group will reach a really broad audience. They'll reach the young teens and they'll also appeal to those of us who were into The Beatles when we were in that age for the same reason. It's good, infectious, musically appealing, high energy Rock 'n' Roll."

Corky's Country Corner

This week we start a three-part series with Buck Owens and Jack McFadden. Jack McFadden is Buck Owens' personal manager and business partner. Based on the years that he has spent working with Buck and with the Country Music Association, and the Academy of Country Music, I felt it was right to start our Buck Owens series with this interview with Jack

CORKY MAYBERRY: Why did you choose to work with Buck Owens 16 years ago? With your ability, there were a lot of Country people you could

have picked up

JACK McFADDEN: Well, not really. I had a lot of doors slammed in my face. I knew that one day my main ambition was to handle a number-one artist in Country music. I had been pushed around; I'd get people up to a certain point, then they would leave and go with somebody else. They'd use you as a stepping stone. You know, you've gotta pay your dues too. So I told a friend of mine, "One of these days I'm going to find some entertainer, Country music entertainer and singer, who's as hungry as I am and we're going to make it." And I got to know of Buck, and know how hard he worked, and how sincere he was, and all that; and after about two weeks, I knew that that was it. And we've been a great team. We do whatever it takes manager, artist, whatever. We pick up after each other. Because we really care about our career. I believe that with Buck Owens, your hard work pays off. You know, a manager only can do what an act will let him do. Buck is a self-starter. He's got a great mind and he's energetic; he cares about his career. So all I ever did for him was try to keep up with him. I'd try to do my thing, and he did his, and that's the story, Corky. I had Merle for seven years, and Freddy for ten, and a lot of other people. Of course you can't work with everybody, and I decided to put all my eggs in Buck's basket, because every time I asked him anything or every time I suggested we do a certain thing - I can count on my one hand the times he would say "No, I don't want to do that." And he's let me do my thing, and I think that is really the key to it. He let me do it.

CORKY: During the period of time you managed Freddy Hart and Merle Haggard, were you also managing

JACK: Yes. My son Joe did most all the work with them; Buck took all my time. Cork. We were working 300 days a year; one year we worked 322 days. One year we worked 240 days and it was like a vacation.

CORKY: It seems like there's always a big turnover in bands. Has that ever

been a problem for Buck?

JACK: No. Don Rich, before he was killed, was with Buck 14 years; Doyle, a singer, has been there 11 years; Jerry Wiggins was there 10 years; Tom Brumley was there five years. We've had very little turnover in the Buckeroos. When Buck hires a guy, he hires him for his ability, and for the human element, as well the compatability to work.

CORKY: Was there a leveling out point, as it were, after Don Rich was

killed?

JACK: Definitely. It will, naturally, never be the same. There isn't a day goes by that in some way, form or fashion Don's not talked about or reminisced about. See, Don Rich was just one human being that, well, there are no words to describe him. You can call him unique; he was a great human being, and he was a great friend, and I'm not even talking about his musicianship or his ability as an entertainer. He was just a great human being, and anybody that has ever met Don or talked to him, I'm sure feels the loss. We do. I can tell you, Buck's the same way; especially Buck, he has good pleasant thoughts and memories of Don Rich

CORKY: Tell me about the albumwith Emmylou Harris.

JACK: It's not an album! Be very careful about that. It's not with Emmylou. She just sang harmony with him. There won't be any credits on the album or nothing.

CORKY: I did not realize that.

JACK: She just came in to sing harmony with him and helped us out.

She played guitar on the single.

CORKY: Which is?

JACK: "Play Together Again,
Again." By the way, tell Claude hello. I enjoy reading the magazine.




