NEW RELEASES

Below is a catalogue of new releases. They are divided into categories designed to give you an idea of their relative musical worth. These first impressions are not meant to relate in anyway to past, present or future sales, nor should they be taken as the word of God.

SPECIAL MENTION ALBUMS
(These recordings which, in our opinion, deserve special mention because they come closest to perfecting their musical genre regardless of progressive radio application.)

Leon & Mary Russell/WEDDING ALBUM/Paradise PA 2943
(Extra special songwriting and uniquely styled presentation raise Leon's music above the crowd. He and Mary make an exhilerating musical couple. Quite a celebration.)

STRONGLY MERITORIOUS
(The following Lps are Merit Albums which we feel have an extra edge.

Firefall/Atlantic SD 18174 (Firefall is among a batch of groups which represent an ongoing exploration of forms which already exist. Crisp delivery in the context of smooth harmonies gives admirable songs a vigorous beauty. Positive recapitulation.)

Jaco Pastorius/Epic PE 33949 (Jaco gets a positive nod for more than just good music. His album is filled with ideas he remembers Charlie Parker, reintroduces Sam and Dave, recognizes electronic music and reaches out to steel drums. Still, it all unifies around a terrific bass. "Come On, Come Over," in spite of Sam and Dave, seems out of place.)

The Shakers/YANKEE REGGAE/Asylum 7E-1057 (By naming the album Yankee Reggae and not avoiding the issue, The Shakers legitimize themselves. Their Doo-oop singing doesn't clash with their strong reggae beat as one might assume. Good songs are well executed throughout.)

MERIT ALBUMS

(Our recommendations for serious progressive radio consideration, recognizing that not all Merit Albums are suitable for all

Larry Ballard/HONKY TONK HEAVEN. /Capitol ST-11520 (One of the younger country singers, Larry circumvents the pop-Nashville jive opting instead for a closer-to-the roots approach. Well chosen material suplements and enlivens his own sure footed compositions. Pete Drake's production blends from straight country to rockabilly.)

Broken Glass/Capitol ST-11510 (Broken Glass blues starts slowly. First, they come with an unattractive name and Lp cover, then they follow with their weakest music at the front of the album. But, it isn't all dismal. By the middle of side one things begin to sound better. Side two is solid.)

MERIT ALBUMS CONTINUED

Harry Chapin/GREATEST STORIES-LIVE /Elektra 7E-2009
(Capturing the undeniable charm of Harry's live essence had to be done. Where his studio albums have tended toward being over-produced, the live format keeps the musical intensity his stories should always have.)

Paul Davis/SOUTHERN TRACKS & FANTASIES/Bang BLP 405 (Paul's pleasant execution of nice songs is enough to get a mildly favorable response. One can only imagine his album had it been built on firmer underpinning. An outside producer might have punched it up.)

Flying Island/ANOTHER KIND OF SPACE/Vanguard VSD-79368 (Start with side two. It gets itself together both melodically and conceptually better than the first woffling side. It seems like the lead players equivocate less. They step out and in doing so forge a more decisive sound.)

Marvin Gaye/I WANT YOU/Tamla T6-342SI (Combining talents with Leon Ware, Marvin expands on his sensuous funk. More than the writing, it is that airated rhythm which permits the music to flow easily.)

Steve Goodman/WORDS WE CAN DANCE TO/Asylum 7E-1061 (Steve touches every base in this album. He has fun, makes a point, is poignant, rocks and picks. An enjoyable panarama results.)

Don Harrison Band/Atlantic SD 18171 (The feeling is Creedence Clearwater all over again. Don Harrison's vocals bend toward John Fogerty's, while the band's rhythm is

Head East/GET YOURSELF UP/A&M SP-4579 (If Head East was somewhat kiddish on their first album, they are not here. Yet, they don't compromise their rock and roll in the maturation process. Good songs are commonplace.)

Led Zeppelin/PRESENCE/Swan Song SS 8416 (Presence won't go down as the quintessenal Led Zeppelin album. The real music begins on side two where the best is left to the roots-conscious, blues ender "Tea For One." It swoops and soars like nothing else on the album.)

Little River Band/Harvest ST-11512 (Most everything that has come out of the Australian music scene has been tonched by at least some jive dust. Little River Band seems more free of it than the rest. Their pleasant rocking style - songs and presentation - is enhanced by Rick Formosa's surprisingly fluid and melodious guitar work.)

MERIT ALBUMS CONTINUED

Ian Lloyd/Polydor PD 1-6066 (Anglophile, Ian Lloyd resembles Todd Rundgren in his devotion to the Empire. But, Ian just doesn't write with Todd's ease. So the tracks tend to be heavy on style and lighter on substance. He gets by.)

C. M. Lord/Capitol ST-11514 (Ms. Lord's voice has character and her writing though spotty, can be very good. Unfortable.

and her writing, though spotty, can be very good. Unfort-unately, Ken Mansfield's generally well crafted production can cross that invisible line into overdone. Each side is stronger at the start.

Mary McCaslin/PRAIRIE IN THE SKY/Philo 1024 (Mary's mellow confience pervades an album brushed with a country and western feeling. It's soft and smooth and boasts a sure knack for song selection. The album as a complete thought. Contact Philo at The Barn, N. Ferrisburg, Vt. 05473.)

Shawn Phillips/RUMPLESTILTSKIN'S RESOLVE/A&M SP4582

(One must respect Shawn for his stylistic tenacity. He works his way and it is a thoroughly individualistic approach. Transgressions like pomposity and lack of economy aside, this is one of the better albums by Phillips.)

Michael Pinder/THE PROMISE/Threshold THS 18 (Moodies will be Moodies. Pinder makes a big album, slightly overdoing everything but, his melodies. Too often they just miss. Ironically, some of the Lp's bigness saves it by engulfing the weaknesses.)

Jimmy Rabbitt and Renegade/Capitol ST-11491 (A really neat streak of audacity runs through this entire Waylon Jennings production. Super song selection, which seems to wed naturally with Rabbitt's personality, secures this devilishly good Lp.)

Rare Earth/MIDNIGHT LADY/Rare Earth R6-550S1 (This

marriage continues to function successfully. Jerry La Croix finds a permanent home and Rare Earth combines with him to play substantial rock and roll. Norman Whitfield's production cannot be disregarded as a factor in their success.)

Bob Seger & The Silver Bullet Band/LIVE BULLET/Capitol SKBB-11523 (Rarely has Seger been as enjoyable. After a raver opening track his music settles into lower volume, higher quality phase. He rocks spiritedly showing roots deeply embedded in the form. Good choices of his own and outside material.)

Shadowfax/WATERCOURSE WAY/Passport PPSD-98013
(Shadowfax's fusion is ambidexterous. They can come at you from their keyboard side or their guitar side and electrically or acoustically. Going beyond what has already been done by other fusionists (the title track) is their real accomplishment. They play well and try hard.)

John David Souther/BLACK ROSE/Asylum 7E-1059
(Albums done with meticulous care are not hard to spot. This is one. However, John David's tunes may not ring

This is one. However, John David's tunes may not ring with the same kind of consistent clarity. Side two slows down in a collection of pensive, sad songs. Still, it is well done.)

The Temptations/WINGS OF LOVE/Gordy G6-971Sl (The Tempts can do it any way that they choose. Switching from Norman Whitfield's convoluted production style gives them a refreshed sound. Good songs are at the core of this rejuvenation.)

Guthrie Thomas/LIES & ALIBIS/Capitol ST 11519 (Side one tries hard to shed the me-to writing and vocal styles that even his name implies. He is fairly successful though he blurs his essence in the process. Side two is more directly where Guthrie really belongs. Great potential that is still

developing.)
Three Dog Night/AMERICAN PASTIME/ABC ABCD 928 (Moderately good songs are choosen for this funkier than normal Three Dog Night Lp. The Andy Fairweather-Low and Hoyt Axton things highlight the album. Three Dog always manage to successfully emulsify tunes from diverse sources into their sound.)

The Tubes/YOUNG & RICH/A&M SP-4580 (With their production problems solved The Tubes can begin a quality recording career. Though an audio medium can never do justice to them, at least, this Lp accurately represents their dense music. Good show.)

Bodie Wagner /HOBO/Philo 1015 (Bodie Wagner's country fally music flows with joy and a note of authenticity. You'll

folk music flows with joy and a note of authenticity. You'll believe he has been on the road. A rich voice and round tunes carry the message. Delightful.)

Bobby Whitlock/ROCK YOUR SOX OFF/Capricom CP 0168 (While Bobby's adequacy has not always been apparent in his records, it is in this one. As it turns Rock Your Sox Off gathers increasing strength. A loose and funky rhythm relieves some of his natural stiffness.)

(Good albums which are not progressive, yet hold some interest for progressive audiences.)

Jimmy McGriff/THE MEAN MACHINE/Groove Merchant GM-3311 (This album is improperly labeled. It is the arranger's album. McGriff is merely a minor sideman. "Get Back" is the only track on which Jimmy imposed himself. It back off a frack on which

himself. It leads off a funkier side two.)
James Moody/TIMELESS AURA/Vanguard VSD-79366 (Times have changed and an old-fashioned, rhythm suppressed, mix helps to moderate even the Latin tracks.

One also gets nervous when most of the tunes are the producer's own. The edge on Moody's tone cuts through

many problems.)
lver Convention/Midland BKLl-1369 (One is immediately struck by the performing and recording quality of this Silver Convention Lp. They deserve their success since

they raise the quality quotient of disco music. Listen for the reggaeish "The Boy with the Ohh La-La.")

Shandi Sinnamon/Asylum 7E-1054 (You can't judge an album by an attractive cover. Shandi is a voice in the hands of an over-producer. It sounds like pretty good pop music.)

The word "follies" is the key to the presentation - 3 female singers using a stage show style over a rocky bottom. Mackay's writing doesn't capture the imagination without the missing programatic pieces. Satisfactory.)

Toward Interdependence

Inspite of progressive radio's shifts in more pop directions some remnance of the old days remain. Actually, a few of the negative aspects of those times hang on like barnacles, hard to cut through.

The most serious of the old, unchanged flaws was and is the isolation of stations in different markets. From the very first day a kind of unshakable independence has kept non-competitive radio stations from talking to each other and from working together on projects of mutual interest.

By its very nature Valrus has always stood against such isolation and more recently the existence of other trades and industry conventions also stand against it.

The specific event which triggered this thought was the occasion of a shared live broadcast of Laura Nyro's per-formance from Carnegie Hall. Tied together for an hour and a half were WNEW-FM, WMMR, WBCN, WHCN & WBRU. It is amazing that it hasn't happened more. (There is an informal confederation in Florida.) Further, this kind of union can work in many other areas of programming.

Rarely have the four Metromedia progressives joined forces to use their considerable resources. For that matter how much real interplay goes on between the Lee Abrams' stations or the ABC stations? Certainly the full weight of their collective muscle hasn't yet been felt. Finally, people like WBCN's Danny Schechter can atest to the limited response they get when good special programs are offered for general use by any stations, group or individual.

For the betterment of radio programming, regardless of your position on the pop-progressive continuum, we urge a new interdependence which could strengthen the entire medium by raising its collective level.
