RADIO STATS

OUR RELATIVE CHARTING, AS SEEN BELOW, RESEMBLES BASEBALL'S BATTING AVERAGES. IT ESTABLISHES A RATIO BETWEEN THE IDEAL, (HEAVY AIRPLAY AT EVERY STATION WHICH REPORTED); AND THE WEIGHTED COUNT THAT A RECORDING HAS ACTUALLY EARNED. THIS MATHEMATICAL FORMULA IS APPLIED TO EACH RECORD—FIRST REGIONALLY, THEN NATIONALLY. A DUAL WEIGHTING SYSTEM IS USED TO DERIVE THE COUNT. IT ADJUSTS FOR MARKET SIZE AND FOR HEAVY OR MODERATE AIRPLAY. THESE CHARTS SHOW THE RELATIVE INTENSITY OF RADIO AIRPLAY FOR BOTH NEW AND ESTABLISHED RECORDINGS.

NEWS/PUBLIC AFFAIRS

Ever-lengthening summer days mean an ever-lengthening broadcast day for us here at 'CAS... and in celebration of that, we've added a newscast to our line-up - and - a new concept. In addition to the Morning Record (music, news and features 7-9am), and our High Noon News, we've turned our 4pm newscast into a feature break. It works: brief headlines followed by an in-depth 3-5 minute report on a major story of the day. Then, at 5:35pm - The Last Round-Up - it's a full-fledged eight minute newscast with filed reports on local stories and lots of sound. Back to the 4pm feature-break: it's wonderful to have the chance to explore complicated issues with a little more care... but still, at 3-5 minutes, really hold listener attention. Examples: a look at the controversial substance Laetrile, as possible hoax, hope, and a definite challenge to the medical establishment (produced by Anne Bauer); Mat Schaffer investigated the constitutionality of dress codes at local discoteques; the situation in Chile according to some exiled artists; the 3rd Law of the Sea Conference; and Anita Bryant's anti-Gay Campaign. I did a report on a recent study critical of over-use of surgery in the U.S.

In response to Donna's inquiry around the question of whether jazz is a tune out, well, since we began programming selected jazz cuts last year, we've received more "Whatwuzthat song" calls about the jazz than any other music we play. Also our new Sunday afternoon Free-Form jazz show has been getting strong positive response.

And, as one Walrus reviewer noted 2 issues back, Weather Report does shine! Master of space and time Josef Zawinul guided the quintet through the 95 minute set, creating shapes and forms with his polymog, or leading the group on a funky, electric piano number. The others would weave their instruments around and through the loosely defined Zawinul creation to obtain a unique synthesis called Weather Report. The audience had their confidence bolstered in the individual musicians as they took solos - especially Jaco Pastorious on bass as he knocked out the house with harmonics that wouldn't quit. Percussionists Acuna and Badrena clowned together with drums strapped on tight as they ran around the stage. The high point was the more basic, less electric duet with Shorter (soprano sax) and Zawinul on grand piano. Jazz roots got the prize for the night, but the entire evening, from DiMeola's Elegant Gypsy to W. R.'s Birdland, was greatly appreciated by the mixed Portland crowd. In three words, don't miss it!

SPECIAL MENTION ALBUMS

(These records which, in our opinion, deserve special mention because they come closest to perfecting their musical genre regardless of progressive radio application.)

Ornette Coleman/DANCING IN YOUR HEAD/Horizon SP722 (The return, after too many years, of Ornette Coleman has to be greeted with joy. He and Coltrane lead the last great rethinking which jazz went through in the early 60's and here he reflects the last great rethinking which rock went through somewhat later. The resultant combination of relentlessly intense rhythm and his blowing is at times staggering. It won't get lots of rock airplay but, that doesn't diminish the Lp's significance.)

STRONGLY MERITORIOUS

(We feel that these Lp's have an extra edge.)

Osamu Mitajima/OSAMU/Island ILPS 9426 (Osamu starts by being marvelously inventive. Add to that an obtuse musicality and a heavily accented rhythm feel and you get an artist who brings us an excitingly fresh viewpoint. Mitajima's fabrications are organic therefore, they don't strain either ear or intellect.)

MERIT PLUS ALBUMS

(All Merit and Merit Plus Albums are recommended for serious progressive radio consideration, recognizing that not all of these recommendations are suitable for all stations. The Merit Plus Albums distinguish themselves with an extra vitality.)

Don Cherry/HEAR & NOW/Atlantic SD 1217 (An object lesson of the first magnitude. With this Lp Don Cherry proves the value of the avant garde. He has been a part of that movement for years and here he comes back inside but, not without bringing his fresh approach in too. Score this one high.)

David Dundas/Chrysalis CHR 1141 (Super arrangements by Gerry Butler, Leo Warburton and Mike Moran take David Dundas' music out of the ordinary. Hinting at the English music hall tradition and the Beatles, Dundas strikes a responsive chord. Consistent, creative quality.)

Fringe Benefit/Capricorn CP 0183 (Dotted with charmingly good songs delivered by the superior vocals of John Jones, Fringe Benefit emphasizes its benefits. The only disturbing element is the sweet sided production which emphasizes the fringe. The songs finally win but the sound should harden somewhat.)

Horslips/THE BOOK OF INVASIONS/DJM DJLPA-10 (Previously reviewed as an import. The Book of Invasions is called a Celtic symphony. It is lyrically based on ancient mythology and is charming in that way. Musically it takes off when the dual guitars take over. Enjoyable as a whole or in parts.)

Karma/FOR EVERYBODY/Horizon SP-723 (Highlighted by well developed arrangements and careful production, Karma represents the high end of the R&B-jazz style. They invent little but work toward the fulfillment of contemporary music.)

Denny Laine/HOLLY DAYS/Capitol ST-11588 (If you find yourself complaining that everything sounds the same try an awful Denny Laine. Here he teams with Paul McCartney and a synthesizer to remember Buddy Holly. It's fun all around.)

Mother's Finest/ANOTHER MOTHER FURTHER/Epic PE 34694 (Carried by that rhythm track. When it's blazing, so is Mother's Finest. Dynamic power, under control, places Mother's Finest in contention. Side two is stronger top to bottom.)

Artie Traum/LIFE ON EARTH/Rouder 3014 (That first side is so up, so bright, that side two would have had to go some just to match it. It does real well. Some fine writing and even finer presentation assure this kind of quality.)

Rusty Wier/STACKED DECK/Columbia PC 34775 (Rusty's assault on the mainstream rock scene stacks this deck in his favor. Retaining the Texas-Oklahoma feel as a flavoring he attacks the music with midwest intensions driving toward the heart with a piercing thrust.)

MERIT ALBUMS

American Flyer/SPIRIT OF A WOMAN/United Artists UA-LA 710-G (Flying tigers they are not, American Flyer has softened their sound a few degrees from the first album. The missing bite reduces their impact as the sound homogenizes before our ears.)

John Blair/WE BELONG TOGETHER/CTI 7-5004 (John Blair, jazz vitar player of enormous unrealized potential, ditches everything to become a fairly routine rocker. Even so, there was no reason to sublimate the vitar. This album exemplifies the guidance an artist sometimes needs because the Lp was done more as an expedient. It was gone into without a clearly defined idea in mind. It survives.)

MERIT ALBUMS CONTINUED

Carla Bley/DINNER MUSIC/Watt 6 (Watt Records, the Bley/Mantler label, is full of surprises like Mantler's fusion album of last year. Here too is Carla's, properly named Dinner Music. It's a case of the avant garde coming inside to treat us with a relaxing break.)

Tyrone Davis/LET'S BE CLOSER.. TOGETHER!/Columbia PC 34634 (Carrying on his back a few overloaded arrangements, Tyrone still commands a real rhythm and blues album. Without excesses the Lp would have been rated higher because Davis delivers fine material throughout.)

Dixie Dregs/FREE FALL/Capricorn CP 0189 (It's not too often that elements of jazz, country, rock and R&B get mixed together. However, the combination of The Dregs and Stewart (the Crusaders) Levine yields an amalgam made up of various proportions of each. Like "Turkey in the Straw" played by Sly Stone or Little Feat in Appalachia, these well executed instrumentals are slightly weird.)

Dan Fogelberg/NETHER LANDS/Epic-Full Moon PE34185 (While the middle of the road has made accommodations to rock 'n' roll, so too, has rock accommodated MOR. This is a prime example of that pattern. A finely crafted album, it is its crossover intentions which are disturbing. Good songs.)

Mickey Gilley/FIRST CLASS/Playboy KZ 34776 (Mickey Gilley's rockabilly grows directly out of the Southern roots of rock 'n' roll. Like a mild Jerry Lee, Mickey strikes easily, one foot in the mud and one foot in the saloon.)

Sonny James/IN PRISON, IN PERSON/Columbia PC 34708 (With innate talent doing a surprisingly good job of backing The Country Gentleman, Sonny's album cooks. A pile of country classics fills this program of bonifide country folk music. Fun.)

Little River Band/DIAMANTINA COCKTAIL/Harvest SW-11645 (Little River Band meanders through soft rock cutting a pleasant groove with pretty fair songs and warm vocal harmonies. Their presentation is controlled and professional but not very fiery. An injection of sting would turn them around.)

Bette Midler/LIVE AT LAST/Atlantic SD 2-9000 (We reviewed the airplay version of this album in last issue. The complete set fills in with mostly special material. Midler fans will love the album because it captures her as well as this one dimensional medium is able to.)

Lori Moran/LORELEY ON THE ROCKS/TRI-AD 907 (Lori's Lp is in the good demo-unfinished album class. But she demonstrates a conversance with both a jazz and a blues tradition. Her own writing shows promise too. The accompaniment is rough, weak on execution, strong on intentions. Still, the overall essence is right. Write: 1823 Oak St., Eugene, Ore. 97401.)

NRBO/ALL HOPPED UP/Red Rooster LP 101 (Certainly NRBO is a junky band but, they are effective when you pick your spots. The chosen material is generally better than the homegrown. Why Al Anderson's guitar playing isn't featured is a mystery.)

Ted Nugent/CAT SCRATCH FEVER/Epic JE 34700 (By a process of attrition Nugent has become the leader of a dwindling list of guitar centered bands. His songs are O.K. but, it's his axe which turns him and his listeners loose. He's a powerhouse.)

Nutz/HARD NUTZ/A&M SP 4623 (Previously reviewed as an import. Nutz gives quarter to no other rocker. They add nothing to the genre which, in the end, limits them. Still they burn.)

Flora Parim/ENCOUNTER/Milestone M-9077 (Orrin Keepnews has mounted an elegant album in support of Ms. Parim. It demonstrates beyond a reasonable doubt that while she is a marvelous vocal technician her sense of melodic parity is deprived. There are moments of musical supremacy but they come from Hermeto's piano solo in "Uri" or Joe Henderson's solo in "Black Narcissus." Flora has been given her best shot.)

Q/DANCIN' MAN/Epic-Sweet City PE 34691 (Striking production quality would enhance appreciation even if Q wasn't a good band. They touch several musical styles delivering them convincingly. Among their average tunes is the gem "Have I Sinned?" Execution - A, material-C.)

Severance/Largo 1001 (Severance needs a producer to tie their musical loose ends together. There is skill, talent, and there are ideas resident in the writing and performance of their music. Too often they get entangled. Write: 9165 Sunset Blvd., Los Angeles, Ca. 90069.)

Stephen Sinclair/A-/United Artists UALA 767-G (Basic rock music. What is immediately appealing to the ear is the appetentious, direct route taken to these pleasant tunes. Though Sinclair sometimes fails to enunciate clearly, it constitutes a relatively minor problem.)

Status Quo/LIVE/Capitol SKB-11623 (Previously reviewed as an import. Their studio albums add craft to good songs. Live the craftiness is replaced with abandon. Everyone has fun, this Lp documents that fact.)

Thundertrain/TEENAGE SUICIDE/Jelly JRLP-1 (Designed to offend anyone over 19, Thundertrain barrels along. Their new generation rock is strictly from the streets lacking all of the faint refinements we've become used to. Nasty, nasty. Write: Box 485, Lexington, Mass. 02173)

MERIT ALBUMS CONTINUED

Various Artists-Soundtrack/BANJOMAN/Sire SA 7527 (This must be a documentation of a folksy Woodstock. In any case, the list of artists who got left out of the record is impressive. Enclosed are performances by Earl Scruggs Revue, Joan Baez, The Byrds, Nitty Gritty, Doc & Merle Watson & Ramblin' Jack. The sound is fair to poor.)
 Jessica Williams/THE PORTAL OF ANTRIM/Adelphi AD 5003 (Some artist's are too talented, they are able to do too many things. And those artists tend to want to do them all at the same time. While they show versatility they break the first rule of communications which calls for unity. Because of its diversity Jessica's Lp fails as a communication, yet it succeeds as a demonstration of talent. Her solo piano, ala Jarrett, is best.)

SATISFACTORY ALBUMS

(Albums of acceptable quality, which, of themselves, require only secondary progressive radio consideration.)

Flavor/IN GOOD TASTE/Ju-Par JP6-1002 SI (Flavor is colorless and odorless. They generate mediocrity both in their songs and in their instrumental approach. This artificial Flavor is harmless but competent.)
 Judas Priest/SIN AFTER SIN/Columbia PC 34787 (Style in search of a reason to be. Judas Priest has put together their bombastic delivery forgetting the songs. Overly limited sonics are no tribute to 100 years of recorded sound and no help to the sinners.)

UNDISTINGUISHED ALBUMS

(In our opinion, below standard Lps except where noted.)

Detroit Emeralds/FEEL THE NEED/Westbound WB 302 (Too many cooks spoil the album. You remember that old adage... With five people messing with the arrangements its no wonder that everything is well developed but the music. And Tom Moulton's mix adds to the confusion by applying a disco logic to songs. Get out of the kitchen.)

FRINGE ALBUMS

(Good albums which are not progressive, yet hold some interest for progressive audiences.)

Walter Bishop, Jr./BISH BASH/Xanadu 114 (More than the musical settings, the 1930's recording quality holds this record back. Walter's style in the 60's, when these sides were recorded, was rather traditional. Side two is stronger.)
 The Reuben Brown Trio Featuring Richie Cole/STARBURST Adelphi AD 5001 (A solid lounge outfit, this Lp moves out of the traditional schools of the post-war era. Richie Cole's billing "Alto Madness" is humorous in the light of Coleman, Coltrane and Sanders. Best when they take off.)
 C. J. & Co./DEVIL'S GUN/Westbound WB 301 (The sheer Detroitness of the C. J. & Co. album makes it listenable. It's got power behind its half disco, half pop R&B style. Spunky.)
 Dennis Coffey/BACK HOME/Westbound WB 300 (These Coffey instrumentals tend to understate the melody line, putting them in a rocky type of disco genre. Organized without much flair, they drive straight ahead.)
 Al Cohn/AMERICA/Xanadu 138 (Another afternoon session which captures the post-war jazz mood. It is pleasant at all times but, not riveting.)
 Dolé Coker/DOLO!/Xanadu 139 (Free swinging and a bit more interesting than many Lps which record jams. An important factor contributing to that interest is the arrangements. The music sounds like it is the product of some thought. Harmonizing Blue Mitchell's trumpet and Harold Land's sax works.)
 Sonny Criss/THE JOY OF SAX/ABC Impulse AS-9326 (Automatically you know to dodge the tracks which carry the telltale "plus strings." That then leaves the tracks marked "plus horns." They are the more suitable minority lead by "Turn Me Loose" in which Sonny gets his wish.)
 The Crusaders/FREE AS THE WIND/ABC Blue Thumb BT-6029 (With the orchestration-free tracks placed at the back of their Lp, the Crusaders telegraph a non-progressive message. This record feels particularly restrained - tea time music.)
 Dynamic Superiors/GIVE & TAKE/Motown M6-879SI (The Dynamic Superiors embody what remains of the old, and glorious, Motown sound. Most of what they are all about is pop but, tunes like "Give It All Up," "Nowhere To Run" and "Once Is Just Not Enough" cross back in bounds.)
 Bill Evans/QUINTESSENCE/Fantasy F 9529 (Mellowness. In the face of multiplying second rate aggregates, the post-war genre is elevated by this esteemed grouping. Along with Gil we find Harold Land, Kenny Burrell, Ray Brown and Philly Joe Jones. These thoroughbreds combine to make an Lp which is the quintessence of this music.)

FRINGE ALBUMS CONTINUED

Fania All Stars/RHYTHM MACHINE/Columbia PC 34711 (Though some of the Latin heavies are used in this Spanish all-star team the sound is strictly homogenized. Latin music is in a no win position. If it remains pure it limits itself and if it reaches for an audience it pollutes itself, Santana excepted.)
 Tal Farlow/SECOND SET/Xanadu (This very relaxed session was, in fact, a private jam. It demonstrates the agility and articulation of Tal Farlow's guitar technique. Recorded in 1956, this Lp documents an artist right in sync with the times - Tal should have gotten more attention at that time.)
 Aretha Franklin/SWEET PASSION/Atlantic SD 19102 (We always lean toward Aretha because she remains such a dynamic talent. Sweet Passion doesn't change that feeling except that it is simply not funky. As such it holds less interest. "Mumbles" is the track which is uninhibited Aretha.)
 Dizzy Gillespie & Lalo Schifrin/FREE RIDE/Pablo 2310794 (The Free Ride is for Dizzy. The accomplishment of the album is that it places Gillespie in a modern rhythm context. Its disappointment is that Schifrin doesn't use him well. He might as well have had a no-name studio player fill in the riffs.)
 Thelma Houston & Jerry Butler/Motown M6887 SI (A fairly classy production marred only by a noisy pressing. Potent singers, Thelma and Jerry together were destined to succeed artistically. The production is unfortunately too pop to play.)
 Willie Hutch/HAVIN' A HOUSE PARTY/Motown M6-874SI (Inconsistency is the problem in Willie's album. He doesn't always take charge of the disco tracks. They wander aimlessly sometimes. When he sings a real song, he finds favor. Try "I Never Had It So Good.")
 Paul Jabara/SHUT OUT/Casablanca NBLP 7055 (Jabara's music is totally pop. Side one is white disco (unfunky) while side two is oriented toward songs. That is where the possibilities are. Big production.)
 Munich Machine/Casablanca NBLP 7058 (Both the name and the music feed the standard German stereotype. Exacting in all details the Munich Machine chugs along relentlessly. A fair sense of tunelessness keeps the ear attentive.)
 The O'Jays/TRAVELIN' AT THE SPEED OF THOUGHT/Phila. International PZ 34684 (Transcending the group and some off stride lyrics, the Gamble-Huff formula triumphs again. Good tunes [if not lyrics], fine production, and energy define their success. And the O'Jays were there too.)
 David Ruffin/IN MY STRIDE/Motown M6-885SI (Ruffin's textured voice is placed in a soft musical bed by Van McCoy. The contrast works but, it eliminates anything resembling funkiness. Pop R&B.)
 Neil Sedaka/A SONG/Elektra 6E-102 (A sumptuous George Martin production captures the real Sedaka. It happens that he belongs squarely in the middle of the road or in the right lane. "Sleazy Love" is the only real airplay option.)
 Dianne Steinberg/UNIVERSAL CHILD/ABC AB-1011 (Here we have a beautifully, carefully mounted middle of the road album. It's glossy throughout, barely mentioning rock and roll.)
 Various Artists-Soundtrack/THE GREATEST/Arista AL 7000 (Smaltzy pop with the exception of "Ali Bombaye II")
 Various Artists/TRUE BLUE/Xanadu 136 (Tom Piazza's liner notes open with praise for jam sessions which, he claims, "have always been renewing experiences for musicians and, often, breeding grounds for new musical ideas." Nothing could be more off base. Rarely has a jam session meant anything to the advancement of music. They are just fun for the players. This jam is no exception to the general rule.)

SPECIAL PROGRAMMING

(Spoken, poetry - comedy and extraneous musics.)

David Murray/LOW CLASS CONSPIRACY/Adelphi AD 5002 (Stanley Crouch has written what must be the best, most insightful liner notes about avant garde music in memory. He nails it, both generally and specifically as regards this Lp. David is a young jazzman of immense strength. His music is difficult.)

Pete Brown & Piblokto/MY LAST BAND/Harvest SHSM 2017 (Pete Brown's music was rather elusive when originally recorded. Time has allowed us to catch up to his diffuse style. He's merely adequate as a vocalist but, many of the melodies wind through pleasing turns. Meritorious History.)

Clearlight/LES CONTES DU SINGE FOU/Isadora ISA 9009 (French contemporary music takes another step backward as Clearlight has difficulty seeing light at the end of the melodic tunnel. Further, eroded by a mix which emphasizes the drum kit to the disadvantage of the lead voice, they find less to recommend them. The players are classically trained and therefore, will find some fans among those who can't whistle. Satisfactory.)

Lol Coxhill/DIVERSE/Ogun OG 510 (In an incredible tribute Miles Kington of the London Times said, "Lol Coxhill's unaccompanied soprano saxophone playing is one of the strong points of Western culture." Lol's small band of admirers covet his charm, independence and wit. His free spirit should last forever. Special Programming.)

IMPORTS CONTINUED

Dr. Feelgood/SNEAKIN SUSPICION/United Artist UAS 30075 (No pretense, just good ole rock 'n' roll music. It's always in style and Dr. Feelgood always has a place when core music is required. Merit.)

EDQ/THEY ALL BE ON THIS ROAD/Ogun OG 410 (EDQ must stand for the Elton Dean Quartet. In any case, their jazz is stylistically located somewhere around the time of Coltrane. They find a comfortable pattern and maneuver about from there. Longish tracks keep it at arms length radiowise. Special Programming.)

Manuel Gottsching-Ash Ra Tempel/NEW AGE OF EARTH/Isadora ISA 9003 (The irony of the New Age of Earth title as applied to Gottsching's spaced, synthetic sound waves, is not lost. Only slightly eery this electronic music is, like Klaus Schultz's work, environmental music for the 21st century. Special Programming.)

Rogue/LET IT GO/Epic EPC 81987 (Strikingly good songs mark a band to be reckoned with. Produced a little too sweet to taste, they might profit by being more roguish. Still, those songs are undeniable. Merit Plus.)

Tai Phong/WINDOWS/Warner Bros. 56264-Y (There's a band here. Melodically and instrumentally they are impressive. However, they would make important stride if they would get to the point. Instead of only six tunes the Lp should contain nine, more direct items. Merit.)

CONCEPTS

THE RECESSION MENTALITY IS BACK

The recession mentality has surfaced again in consumer buying patterns. A few years ago we wrote in this column about the apparent pattern which the recession of those days was generating. With money tight record buyers tended to be more conservative. They avoided unknown artists who might have gotten an impulse buy before then, sticking to the hits. Since, records are, in fact, a good buy for your entertainment dollar the business didn't suffer any serious pain because of this purchasing pattern. Rather it adjusted to the market place by reducing its output and restricting its A&R policies.

When the recession ended the record business seemed to go wild. Last year was the industry's most prolific year and this year we stand 10% ahead in output with the Christmas season still on the drawing boards.

However, something new has been added, the \$7.98 list price. It's affects on the market place are just beginning to come into focus. The pattern we see is the familiar one we noted during the above mentioned unpleasantness. The recession mentality is back.

If you refer to the retail stats published in the last several issues it becomes clear. A few hits are out selling everything else by an emphatic margin. The intensity of interest in the second half of the top twenty is down right meager.

A former suggestion to develop introductory lines at, a \$4.98 or \$5.98 list price and the development of a cheaper, four band 33-1/3 EP looks even more appealing if the future matters at all.

The street is talking back.
