Apple last weekend and showed up (as did John Belushi) at McGuinn, Clark & Hillman's debut at the Bottom Line Observers got to see Keith knock over his table while getting up to leave, spilling a bottle of little red pills all over the floor of the club in the process...The Stones also have finished mixing tapes culled from four shows during last summer's tour for two King Biscuit Hour syndicated broadcasts this spring, the first of which will be aired April 29th . . . Steely Dan have asked Dire Straits' Mark Knopfler into the studio to lay down some guitar work for their next LP. Mercury Records threw a party to launch Frank Zappa's first release for the label, SHEIK YERBOUTI, at a village nightspot. Guests included writer William Burroughs and a real live camel, but Zappa was miles away, in the midst of a European tour . . . A Klaatu video will be aired soon on Don Kirschner's new Weekend Jam TV show, but the band nobody knows (by sight, anyway), will retain their anonymity. The video will be an animation . . . Albert Lee, legendary British country-rock guitarist and former member of Heads, Hands, and Feet and Emmy Lou Harris' Hot Band, has been asked by Eric Clapton to accompany him as second guitarist on Clapper's upcoming US tour. Lee's own solo album, HIDING, is set for March release on A&M . . . The Good Rats teamed up with WNEW-FM to present a benefit concert at the Palladium on March 7th, in aid of two local adoption services. Blondie, breaking nationwide with "Heart of Glass," are about to begin recording their fourth album. Mike Chapman will produce.:.Graham Parker's "Mercury Poisoning," the controversial track noted in last issue's column, will be available to deejays only—on a one-sided 12" "mercury colored vinyl" . Chuck Berry's first LP for Atlantic should showcase "a lot of heavy people," according

to insiders...Cheap Trick's DREAM POLICE studio LP has been postponed until early May due to the success of their recently released LIVE AT BUDOKAN disc...Will two members of a very prominent English tax exile group team up with one Canadian superstar for US tour this summer? Insiders say they just might...

IN THE STUDIO: At Criteria in Miami: Foreigner are working on their third LP, with Roy Thomas-Baker at the knobs. Ian Lloyd, former lead singer with Stories and recent signee with Scotti Brothers is there too, with Bruce Fairburn producing, and probable guest appearances by members of Foreigner who, after all, started out as the backing band on Lloyd's last solo venture. AC/DC is there also, finishing up a new one with Eddy Kramer, basic tracks to be laid down live with a few minimal overdubs to polish it up. The Cate Brothers, recently signed to Atlantic are there as well, with Tom Dowd producing . City Boy have been signed by Atlantic and are recording their fifth LP at Compass Point in Nassau with Robert John "Mutt" Lange, who's produced their previous four . . . Frank Carillo recording at Atlantic . . . Liner, made up of three quarters of mid-70's Brit-pop group Blackfoot Sue, are recording in London with Arif Mardin, the first UK group he's worked with since AWB...Nick Lowe is finishing up his own album at Eden Studios in London. Upon its completion he'll co-produce fellowRockpile member Dave Edmunds' next one, then one for Carlene Carter . . . Colin Blunstone is in Trident Studios in London being produced by former Zombies cohort Rod Argent. The material is said to be very much in the Zombies vein . . . New A&M signing Gordon Michaels is recording at the Hit Factory with Tommy Li Puma and Hugh McCracken.. Shirts are at Media Sound with Mike Thorne producing. Ex-Procol Harum pianist Gary Brooker recording with George Martin in London.

The quintet backed Costello on country originals "Radio Sweetheart," "Hotel Matches' and "Stanger In The House." I addition, Costello deivered a couple of choice covers, most outstanding being a sicky country ballad, "Psycho," originally recorded by Jack Kittel and penned by Leon Payne (whose schizo-morbid song presaged his own suicide). The one night, two show performance with Ray Campi & His Rockabilly Rebels opening, was recorded for a possible live album...The Costello booking is but one of the Pal's hot shows of late, the club's enjoying a hefty winning streak with the likes of Gary Stewart, Joe Ely, Carlene Carter (backed by



Clover) and Dwight Twilley. CAPT. HUMBLE

"That's when I was out of control," Captain Humble said. When he was out of control, Captain Humble looked like Annie Oakley's father. The image conjures up hair exploding like buckskin. But it's different now. The Captain was barbershopped a long time ago. Of course, he says, "I'm still out of control. My boat left a long time ago. Although now it looks like I might be in control

Humble captains at WNOE-FM in New Orleans, doubling as Assisstant Program Director and Music Director. He also jocks morning drive. At 34, he has spent close to half his life in radio. The beginning begins before that. When Captain Humble was a very young Hugh Dillard. It goes back to Lompoc, California and college radio. Dillard split his time working an AM classical music program and an FM rock and roll show

The real proving ground for Dillard's talents isn't Lompoc but New Orleans. Around 1963, he nails down a job with WNOE-AM. In news. "I never heard anybody do such a bad job, Dillard says. The PD was just about ready to give him the axe. Instead, Dillard persuaded him to surrender 4 hours of late night airtime. From news to jock. That's when WNOE-AM was called "the Friendly Giant."

During all this, Dillard didn't finish college. He cut back and finally quit the Friendly Giant to collect his sheepskin. Then Dillard went to Slidell, Louisiana to become Program Director of a small radio station in a small town where he would be Mister Big. Dillard recalls that it wasn't just small, it was "schmuck radio." It was also Swap Shop Radio and Meat Market Bingo Radio. Dillard even shared his radio station with an automobile showroom.

It got so bad, Dillard had to fall back on what he learned in college. He went out for a job as a substitute teacher. Until he found out that the teacher before him had been thrown out of a third story window.

Back to the classroom of rock

and roll and WRNO-FM in New Orleans. He goes from airshift to Music Director to Program Director. Dillard is no longer Dillard. He becomes "Captain Humble." "Captain" because of boating. "Humble" is borrowed from a jock in L.A. tried for murder. And that's the way radio was. Or is. Crazy.

While Dillard became Captain, RNO became "The Rock," the AOR in New Orleans. The Captain dug in for 8 years. Until the arrival of a superstar format in 1975. That signaled the Captain's departure to WWL FM, a nearby, freeform alternative. So the Captain got religion. All because WWL was owned by the Jesuits. Dominus Nabisco. "It was a fine place to work," the Captain laughs. "If you had a problem, any kind of problem, the Jesuits would solve it by offering you more money 'Cart machine broken? Here, have a bonus.'''

There was one time when there wasn't any bonus. WWL set up a personal appearance for the Captain. Some kinda contest. Nobody knew too much about it, not then. Just a little Miss Wet T-Shirt-American-Hardcore-Contest. Humble or not, the Captain found himself on the front page of the papers. Pictures, too. Microphone in one hand; a large breast in the other. The Captain was cut.

Didn't make that much difference. WWL was overhauled for Top-40. The Captain had been playing the same songs 3 times a day. So he started a new job at WNOE-FM. That's almost the same place where he started out. He loves New Orleans but he has an eyeball on Los Angeles. Then again, he is Captain Humble and Hugh Dillard.

It's also New Orleans and no Mardi Gras. Not this year. No matter. The Captain says "this is a serious, party town." To me, a party is never serious and we have a case of grammatical schizophrenia. But don't forget, the Captain is always out of control. Just a little.

Anyway, the indians always said the white man was crazy to move down to New Orleans. What some call crazy, Captain Humble calls home. WNOE is down in the French Quarter. You can look across Bayou country and Mardi Gras and Huey Long and cajun music and the

birthplace of jazz. In fact, it's easy to understand how this city holds you, keeps you. Where the saints are always marching in.

I think I got it Captain. Now pass the Mint Julep.□



STAN **MONTEIRO**

You know what he hates? Stan Monteiro hates the word "product." That happens to be his business too. Monteiro is the Vice President of Marketing for Epic. No contradiction here either. Monteiro hates 'product" but he loves music. All kinds. Everywhere. That's why he resents words like "product" or "AOR" or "R&B." "I hate categories," he says.

"People pour their lives into it, into music." Not product. Not units. Monteiro also says "I don't like the word 'artist. We've bastardized and over-used it. Now everybody who records is an artist." Strong stuff. Of course, Monteiro has been

around for a long time. In the fifties, he wasn't selling music; he was making music. Playing clarinet and sax at night in a club in Boston run by George Wein, impresario of the Newport Jazz Festivals. During the day, Monteiro was a shoe buyer, a kind of a Clark Kent of the clarinet. Monteiro got into promotion right around the same time that Alan Freed was going to jail. An auspicious time to enter the music business. "To tell you the truth," he says, "I was afraid to go into promotion." The problem wasn't Monteiro, the problem was the music. "The late fifties were very basic, just a few chords. The artists couldn't sing. And when they got on stage, they couldn't perform."

See, Monteiro wanted to sell something he could be proud of, something he could like or love, at least something he could

respect. But he couldn't sell this stuff because he didn't believe in it. That's a good place to be but there's more to this. "You know what I decided," Monteiro asks? "I decided that I was a snob. People should buy what they want. Who am I to judge?'

Monteiro's career starts with the independents in Boston. He pitches Ray Charles and B.B. King and Tutti Camerata. Monteiro calls himself "a jazz junkie." He sold it, listened to it, played it, and even wrote about it. Wrote about jazz and everything else as Editor of a little Boston weekly.

Finally Monteiro left Boston for New York to work for RCA. Then Epic, Columbia, and now Epic again. So Monteiro is old and new to the job at the same time. Twenty years later, his habits haven't changed much. He still plays in a band, sitting in sometimes with

Bobby Columby.

And in these twenty years, the music industry has gone from the gold to the plainum standard. "We're just scratching the surface,"
Monteiro argues. There's a
bigger audience for music, more sophisticated. The nut Monteiro wants to crack is how to get to that big, new audience. "It's always a crap shoot. You're always sticking your ass out. By Monteiro's count, this is a good time for radio. "It's got to be more exciting," he says. "Everybody has to get out and scrape for the bucks." There's more to choose from and more choices within a format. Monteiro's idea of good radio is a little like a rule of green thumb; more flowers make for a better garden.

He talks about love and dedication. He wants to make a big business intimate and for him, it is intimate. "If you're lucky," he thinks," people will say you're a pro. That's what I hope they say about me." Monteiro plays father, rabbi, and teacher. He says "you gotta teach; you gotta learn."

You might even learn how to

play football. Monteiro takes pride in the fact that he's a disciple of The Great Coaches Lombardi and Paterno and other Pigskin oracles. He actually reads and studies these guys. And what it means to him is to learn to work with talented, gifted, spoiled people. Little egos that grow up to be

Big Egos. Football has also taught Monteiro something about respect, discipline, and delegating responsibility. How to motivate and how to fight. It means, Monteiro says, "treating people like people."

First down, Stan. Hike.

TED TEMPLEMAN

ed Templeman's Warner Bros office probably has more gold and platinum in it than the inside of Fort Knox. A hit recording artist in his own right (as drummer for the late '60s pop outfit Harper's Bazaar), the loose, animated Warners Vice President has produced one hit record after another: Van Morrison, Little Feat, Montrose, Carly Simon, The Doobie Brothers and most recently Van Halen and Nicolette Larson

Drinking club soda, coffee and wine (almost all simultaneously), Templeman talked about his ideas on producing, on music in general, and of the artists he's worked with through the years. Apart from his impressive collection of hits, Templeman has an impressive gift for mimickry, with some dead-ringer Neil Young and Van Morrison impersonations under his belt. The interview kicked off with a George Meier-compiled variation on the Leonard Feather "blindfold test," the tracks denoted in the text. SXR: Could you talk a little

about your background.

TT: I was playing in this band we were called the Tikis we auditioned for Autumn Records and happened to get signed. There were two big disc jockies up there at the time Bob Mitchell and Tom Donahue they were at KYA and they also had Autumn Records. They were pretty hot, they had the Beau Brummels and Bobby Freeman. So they signed us, put out a record called "If I'd Been Dreamin'," didn't do anything it wasn't very good. And then Autumn sold out to Warner Bros., we changed our name to Harper's Bazaar, and Lenny (Waronker) produced us. We cut 'Feelin' Groovy" and that was a hit, and then we made the album and that was an experience — we had Van Dyke Parks and Randy Newman and Leon Russell all


writing songs for us and Lenny was a great catalyst, making it all come together. That's pretty much it. We went on the road for three years and after that I just came to work here at Warner Bros. as a sort of listener, listening to tapes and stuff. But I learned how to make records from Lenny, from watching him work — he's the best. That's pretty much my background. Nothing particularly exciting there.

SXR: Off the top of your head, could you mention some favorites?

TT: Weather Report, HEAVY WEATHER is one of the best albums. Ry Cooder's PARADISE AND LUNCH. I listen to a lot of old James Brown.
MOONDANCE by Van Morrison is one of my favorite albums.
SILK DEGREES, probably one of everybody's favorite albums.
Randy's LITTLE CRIMINALS, really fine. Miles' KIND OF BLUE is another one of my favorites. I like Little Jimmy Parker, Little Willie John, I like certain singles — I think Earth, Wind & Fire are just fantastic. Linda Ronstadt's "You're No Good" is still one of the best records.

SXR: Basically, you're first exposure to music was jazz,

TT: Yea, I was a jazzbo. I grew up listening to jazz. We had the dean of jazz music, Jimmy Lyons, a disc jockey who worked for KDON I think, out of Monterey — it's a rock station now. You'll see a lot of established jazz artists will have a tune called "Lines for Lyons" or something like that. I listened to him and I'd hitchhike to these concerts over in Monterey There's a classic album by Erroll Garner called CONCERT BY THE SEA, I was there when they recorded that, and I'd go over and see Dave Brubeck and Chet Baker, those guys. Also, late at night I could pick up KNDR, an R&B station from Oakland this was before K-SOUL and KDIA - but it was hard to get



the R&B singles, like when Little Willie John's "Please Please Please" first came out, or "Fever," or a James Brown tune, when those came out you couldn't buy them where I lived.

(Sonny Boy Williamson, "Don't Start Me To Talkin"")

T.T.: Sonny Boy Williamson, right? That's one of my favorite records. I did that with the Doobies on TOULOUSE STREET.

SXR: Was that something you turned them onto?

TT: I don't really remember, though usually with the Doobies any outside material is something I suggest. But every time there's an idea for a song it's a mutual thing that happens.

(Dr. John, "Such A Night") TT: Yea, great record. I love him anyway. He's one of the great piano players. He's out of that Professor Longhair school, you know. He plays good rhythm guitar too, he plays guitar on the Carly Simon album I did. I'm just a New Orleans freak anyway, I love New Orleans music. Allan Toussaint, the Neville Brothers, James Booker—another great piano player. I tried to get it together with James Booker but he was just too spaced, too crazy. But I love his singing, his piano playing. I'm a big fan.

(Ann Peebles, "I Can't Stand The Rain")

TT: Awh! I love that tune.
Willie Mitchell — I like his
production. The Memphis
Horns, Al Jackson. Ann Peebles
is just great. This is a classic

record. I like Mitchell's Sam & Dave stuff, all the early work, he had a great bunch of musicians.

SXR: Would you consider yourself a rhythm-oriented producer?

TT: Definitely.

SXR: Along the same lines as Mitchell?

TT: I don't know. I'm into different types of rhythms. The reason he's so great is he uses simple rhythm structures whereas I like more second line rhythms, New Orleans kinds of things, that's why I like working with two drummers a lot.

SXR: Do you still play drums at all?

TT: I played drums on the Doobies' latest single, "What A Fool Believes." I sit in with those guys — they'll go: "Well, we got an idea, come on, why don't you sit down, bring up an extra set of drums, we'll all play it." I played drums with Nicolette when she performed at the Roxy.

(Blues Brothers, "Soul Man") TT: The original record of this is one of my all-time favorites. In fact, the SOUL MAN album, the green one, has the same musicians, every one of them except for the drummer. Steve Cropper's in tune on this though — if you want to really hear him out of tune listen to "Tramp." the Otis Redding and Carla Thomas tune. But Cropper's one of the best.

(Tower of Power, "There's Only So Much Oil In The Ground")

T.T.: David Garibaldi playing drums. One of my favorite cuts to listen to is the very opening track on BACK TO OAKLAND, 'Oakland Stroke.''

They're totally unique too. Great horn section, I've worked with those guys a lot. And David Garibaldi played drums on Tommy Johnson's album, the new one, I used him on a couple of cuts.

SXR: When's that coming out? TT: It's scheduled for April. I'm really happy with it. We're finishing vocals now, all the tracks are done.

SXR: And you're also working

on Van Halen as well? TT: Just finishing up. I'm pleased with that too. It's much better than the last one. We did Linda Ronstadt's "You're No Good," really weird to hear Van Halen do that.

SXR: Do you listen to a lot of demos, try and seek out artists?

TT: A lot comes to the girl that runs the department here, my sister, she kind of runs the A&R stuff and she filters it all and then gives it to the producers here, either Steve Barri or Russ Titelman or Lenny Waronker or me or Gary Katz, whoever's

around. I listen to stuff in my car

SXR: Do you find much material submitted to you on spec, people just bringing in demos?

TT: We don't usually find things that way, even if people bring us tapes. The Doobie Brothers were one of the few exceptions. When I first came to work here, their managers brought in a tape and played it for me, I really dug them so I went up and had them play in the studio, boy, they were really a raggedy bunch. Then I got Lenny to listen, because I'd only been working there for twenty minutes, and he talked Joe Smith into signing them

SXR: Could you talk a little bit about the evolution of the Doobie Brothers, considering you've worked with them on every one of their albums?

TT: They've gone through a lot, so many changes. because the band developed around Pat Simmons on the one hand with his picking style, and Tommy Johnson on the other, he was the focal point as far as the vocalist, and then when Tommy left and McDonald came in it really changed because McDonald has a style that's not easy for a band to adapt to. I think they really did a great job at changing their style to work around McDonald's material.

SXR: They seem to have become more complex musically. A little more jazz

TT: Yea, they have. I've tried to keep them from a lot of it. I've tried to simplify the new album a little bit, make them a little more rock 'n rolly again. I want to take them there again and get away from the jazz-type stuff. But they're all good musicians and easy to work with. As far as the way they've evolved, it's just been a lot of transitional phases. It takes them a long time to make their records, because they tour so much, so they don't have a lot of time in the studio. The main problem is that right when you go and get in a groove, then they have to go back on the road, and then when they come back they've got a bunch of new ideas. So usually it takes a year, overall, to get an album done. although the studio time probably doesn't amount to more than a couple of months. They're also a good performing act, and a solid performing act is really good because you feel it when they come into the studio, there's a certain element that a group has that you can rarely duplicate with studio musicians.

(Sammy Hagar, "Turn Up The

TT: I haven't heard this before

but I recognize the voice. I knew it was Sammy but I might have thought it was a Montrose cut.

SXR: When you were working with Montrose, did you think that Sammy would break out on his own like he has

TT: I thought he'd stay with the group. I thought they really had it together, that's one of the reasons I signed the band — because of Sammy. It was a nice combination, and then when he left it was really depressing. Ronnie's just not a singer and they need a singer in a band like that. I never expected Sammy, quite, to bust out. He's done a great job. He's got a good producer and they work well together. Sammy's a good singer, very good in the studio. We did one thing he got all in one take called "Connection," it's a cut on one of the Montrose albums.

SXR: What do you think of the Montrose solo album?

TT: Doesn't knock me out, Ronnie can do much better

SXR: It's kind of an esoteric work, don't you think?

TT: I talked to Ronnie about that. I made a few suggestions, but he had certain ideas. something in mind - and I respect that - do whatever you're thinking and do it.

SXR: Is Nicolette Larson handling her newfound success? TT: She'll never have trouble,

she's just a real down-to-earth person, she's having a lot of success, the record's coming in worldwide, people recognize her on the street - more so than Linda, you know.

SXR: How do you feel about working with a female singer that falls so closely in the same generic category as Linda Ronstadt? Who chose the material on her album, you or Nicolette?

TT: Nicolette came up with most of it. I wouldn't want to work with just "another chick singer" even though they were a great singer, but being able to have an ear for songs - that's the thing, that's why Linda's so good — besides being a fantastic singer she always has a feel for tunes. And so does Nicolette, that's one of the reasons I wanted to work with her, in addition to liking her voice she'd have these great ideas: "Mexican Divorce," Neil Young's tune, she brought that in, she came up with "Rhumba Girl," "French Waltz" — an Adam Mitchell tune, "Come Early Morning" was a song she'd been doing for a long time.
"Give A Little" I came up with and "Last In Love" J.D. Souther gave me. I'd say 70% of it was her, and that's what makes a valid artist. And she writes too.

She's smart enough to know that her songs aren't quite to the place, but they'll get there, some of her stuff will be included on the next one. We're doing that in April.

SXR: Most of your artists write their own material, don't they?

TT: Nicolette's really the first person I've worked with that doesn't write her own stuff. All my other artists write their own material. It's the producer's job, you know — I don't think I'm as good as Richard Perry when it comes to it — he's really good with songs. I know good songs, but he's just out there getting them all the time. I like working with people that write their own material, you get a total picture of the artist. I know it's one of the problems Lenny had working with Maria Muldaur: he had to constantly come up with songs, as opposed to somebody like Nicolette, who has a real fix on where she's going and knows what songs are good for her.

SXR: Do you have any specific concepts, any operating plans when you go into the studio?

TT: I don't have any plan. I have an engineer that I work with almost all the time, Donn Landee, who is just fantastic. He gives me the flexibility to spend a lot of time out in the room with the musicians, working on arrangements with them without having to constantly look at meters. I can just look at Donn and he'll know how much to roll off the top, he'll know just what I want like that. And he's got great suggestions. We work like a real team.

The only thing I'm really adamant about is that whenever I work I don't allow anybody in the studio at all other than the artists, no one, no old ladies, no one. Number one, it's distracting if anyone's even whispering when you're listening for something, and number two, you can't be as candid with the artist. I like to be able to be really out front and say: "Aw, that sucks." I don't like to have people sitting around and then I have to be more courtious, not that I'm a monster. I'm really easy to get along with. And plus, there's something funny — you get a band in there playing, and they're working on it, and a couple of chicks come in and sit down in the booth and all of a sudden the band's in another place altogether.

SXR: How was it working with Van Morrison?

TT: Interesting. I worked with him a long time. I practically lived in San Francisco making TUPELO HONEY. He's a (Continued on page 34)

STELYDA

No Static By Rob Patterson

Steely Dan is an anonymous non-group who defy almost all the rules for commercial success. They don't tour, give rare interviews, and make their music under a shroud of mystery, but in the process have cultivated more mystique than anyone else in rock.

Yet with a public profile approaching negative, Steely Dan has received rather amazing acceptance, (amazing even to them) by all facets of pop

music radio.

'It has always surprised me that we've gotten as much radio play as we have," commented Walter Becker, one half of the mysterious duo. "Considering some of the things the songs say, IT'S SURPRISING MORE PEOPLE DON'T HATE US.'

'We've never tried to make music with a hit single in mind" interjected Donald Fagen, the eerie nasal voice of Steely Dan "In fact, I think we've almost consciously tried to make music that wouldn't be hit single material. But the people who decide those type of things find us right up their alley. That's

okay with us."
"There's something delightful about the fact that more people don't take offense or frequently jump up and say 'these guys are CRAZY!' and stuff like that,'' added Becker. "I've always liked the fact we could do what we do and get away with it. Which goes to show that if something's well crafted, it won't offend any people as long as it's skillfully

put together.

Much interest has arisen around Becker and Fagen's craft as well as the gentlemen themselves. Just who are these two guys — whose music yields hit AM singles, while still the darlings of progressive radio and stuffy rock critics; who have slid onto the tightest AOR playlists with ease, at the same time garnering a respectful jazz audience — and just how do they

no more fit the frequent photographic image of intense intellectual hepsters than they do the rumors of savage sarcastic attacks on reporters. Both men ar slight and less imposing than in their photos. Walter is eagerly straightforward and talkative, while Donald's sarcasm rarely bites, but frequently touches.

In short, two friendly and quite modest gentlemen, seemingly unlike the kind of

people mystique builds around. "Yeah, I don't know why that is," commented Fagen on their considerable mystique. "WE BOTH BATHE REGULARLY. I do," he said, motioning to Becker, "I assume you do."

"I guess it's probably because we have deliberately tried to create the optical illusion of a rock and roll band when there actually isn't one . . . which is fun," added Becker. "But I guess since AJA that illusion really doesn't exist anymore,'

''It's more the aural illusion than an optical illusion," interjected Fagen. "We have a 'travelling band,' extremely

protean.

"Actually, we just had this tremendous variety of songs we had to get on tape," he continued, "and we felt we needed, and it would suit our purposes better, to have different musicians play, per song, if necessary

On PRETZEL LOGIC we started to shuffle things around" Becker pointed out. "We've been working that way for the past four years. In the studio - for us - it's turned out to be the most successful way of going about it.'

As for their description of the

creative process

We get together" said Fagen, "and throw out ideas and put together a song. It's always hard to describe how they come about we just fool around . . . and IT'S NOT GETTING EASIER."

"You get more exacting . . added Becker.



"The songs are much tighter than they used to be musically and lyrically as well," Fagen commented. "Just to make something more concentrated takes more time and is more difficult. Because after all, we are just using the traditional

popular song structures."
"When we go into the studio,"
said Becker, "we have the complete arrangements and so on . . . though subject to change. There's always a lot of freedom – a lot of space for the musicians to contribute.'

They both admitted that those arrangements were the key to the consistency that creates the aural illusion of a band, along with choosing the right player

for the particular cut.
"Actually," admitted Fagen, we are thinking for the next album we are doing for ABC of using musicians more consistently, that is, using fewer musicians and trying to work with those certain musicians, maybe one band for each side of the record or something.

"I don't know if that will happen" cautioned Becker. 'That's something we're looking at as an ideal circumstance.'

There is much talk of the technical tricks that abound on Steely Dan albums, but Becker admitted that "though we've done some fairly outrageous things in the cause of making Steely Dan albums, mainly what we go for these days is something that works.

"Like we made a vary large 16 track tape loop once for "Show Biz Kids .

"An eight bar loop" Fagen pointed out.

"Of drums, bass, background singers, electric guitar and piano" picked up Becker.

"And we looped it," said Fagen, "and made a seven or eight minute long cut and then started working with that tape

"And then overdubbed anything that didn't repeat continuously'' said Becker.

'The drummer played eight bars and then said 'Is that it?' 'recalled Fagen.

"We could have done it either way," said Becker, "but we just decided to do it that way. There's a certain effect you get — it is absolutely repetitive.

"Roger (Nichols, their engineer) had a very long tap loop," Fagen remembers. "That's two inch tape running at 30 ips.


Probably running very quickly out the control room door, down the hallway and back.

"You get the idea" concluded Fagen. "That's an example, though there are various other things I really couldn't explain to you."

It seems that with AJA Steely Dan have hit a comfortable style for their songs, less hard-edged and rocking than earlier songs like "Reelin" In The Years, "Show Biz Kids,"
"Bodhisattva," and "My Old

School," and more tinged by a growing jazz influence.
"I don't know if you could say

that," countered Becker. "I don't see that progression. There is a progression (Continued on page 32)

DESOLATION ANGELS/Swan Song SS 8506

A prototype lead voice, lots of fine songs and a robust back-up make Bad Company a baad band. Under tight control, their rock juxtaposes a raw edge and restraint. Potent.

BADFINGER

AIRWAVES/Elektra 6E-175

Badfinger has always been tuneful. Here they clearly demonstrate no loss of musical sense. David Malloy's production is finished cleanly. And with The Beatles defunct, they aren't as much the me-too as they once were. "Gonna be a winner this time.'

GEORGE BENSON

LIVIN' INSIDE YOUR LOVE/Warner Bros. 2BSK 3277 Orchestrations aside, this album is graced with terrific performances and fine songs. Benson's $\ensuremath{\mathsf{S}}$ cool is captivating in spite of the easy listen-ing arranging which sometimes incroaches. Each side has its special moments.

CAFE JACQUES

INTERNATIONAL/Columbia JC 35697

There is more to Cafe Jacques than a cute French name. Interesting arrangements give them a unique sound which is more important because of their singable songs. Rupert Hine's production hand is felt.

DOWNWIND/Arista AB 4219

Anything which Gong has to say will be said instrumentally. Their songs are passable especially when next to their high end instrumental exprapelations. Gong employs invention in its arranging and a sense of melodic purity in its

ROBERT GORDON

ROCK BILLY BOOGIE/RCA AFL1-3294

Gordon brings a new energy to the old tunes. He manages to get inside the music, beyond a mere imitation. Could you imagine a revivalist supergroup composed of Gordon and Thorogood? Look out DEVADIP CARLOS SANTANA

The live 2/3's of side one is nice but should have been at the end. It is the studio recorded material which constitutes the more cogent state ment. That stuff is musically and spiritually arresting. Carlos' guitar solo in the title track is hair-raising and demonstrates what is lacking in 99 percent of the other guitarists we hear.

DWIGHT TWILLEY TWILLEY/Arista AB 4214

Sounds like a Dwight Petty album as Twilley gets more complex and as he burrows deeply into the 1960's just like Tom. The foundation built with lots of top-notch songs collatoralizes it.

MERIT ALBUMS

Thoroughly Competent Lps

ROCK N' ROLL NIGHTS/Mercury SRM 1-3748

The second album by this B.T.O. formulation is creditable, even pretty good. Blair Thornton's quitar work stands out as they power through several notable songs, i.e. "Jamaica" and Of The End." Positive return.

DAVID COVERDALE'S WHITESNAKE

TROUBLE/United Artists UA-LA 937-H

Power rock sometimes gives up something in re-corded clarity. Trouble does. However, as with every other style truly good tunes cut through.
Try "Lie Down" and "The Time Is Right."
THE C.Y. WALKIN' BAND

LOVE THE WAY IT FEELS/Parchute RRLP 9010

The nice harmonizing should be emphasized. Trade side one for two. Because they want to be a rock band the set order gets bent out of shape. Hooky tunes like "Night Romancin'" and "Don't Know Why" tend to get lost.

JENNY DARREN

QUEEN OF FOOLS/DJM-21

Jenny's lusty voice can lean toward warmly sensuous, but it seems to naturally push out a roar Joplinesque blues style places Jenny in league with the better rock singers. She is given good songs.

GEORGE DUKE

FOLLOW THE RAINBOW/Epic JE 36701

The choice is between George Duke's formula funk with elements lifted from Sly and George Clinton or a more musical, jazzy feel. A tune like "Festival" gets buried because the accent is on the funk.

DUKE JUPITER

TASTE THE NIGHT/Mercury SRM 1-3756

They break no new ground, yet Duke Jupiter has a special appeal with its resilient performance. The engineer captured it. Good but not great material is their only restraining force.

MANFREDO FEST

MANIFESTATION/Tabu JZ 35636

While the album's purpose was and is disco appeal, Manfredo rips through some heated rhythm rides. Alternating with the danceable music is his form of intensified jazz steam. Look in the seams.

THE GEEZINSLAW BROTHERS

IF YOU THINK I'M CRAZZY NOW.../Lone Star L-4606 When Willie Nelson gets a hold of an act, they make a radical transition to the real. The Geezinslaw Brothers have labored in country music for years, but here they roll into that now familiar Texas rockin' country. Barroom fun and no compromises.

STEVE GOODMAN HIGH AND OUTSIDE/Asylum 6E-174

The self-imposed, full arranging style represents a folk musician's attempt to cope with the coming 1980's. This Lp is a microcosm of the process many artists are going through. While it does not fail, the subliminal communication is that Steve isn't as sure footed as he once was. A hardened folk rockin' sound seems indicated.

GRANATI BROTHERS FORCE/A&M SP 4748

Heavy on the accentuated rhythm, the Granati Brothers tends to make even their smooth tunes choppy. A song like "It Was You" stands out because of its linear construction. Their material could improve.

HAMMER

BLACK SHEEP/Asylum 6E-173

Accomplished electronicians tend to fall into a techy trap. For example, is there a real reason to imitate a guitar with a synthesizer? Hammer is a solid rock band perveying decent songs, synthesized guitar not withstanding.

DAVID JAMES HOLSTER

CHINESE HONEYMOON/Columbia JC 35615
Braced by a couple of dynamic tracks, the front side of David's Lp leaps out. Top-rank songs driven by original arranging is the combination. The rest of the album tends to average out.
"Constant Love" and "Take Me Back" stand above.

JUDAS PRIEST

HELL BENT FOR LEATHER/Columbia 35706

Previously reviewed as an import. By meeting minimum writing requirements Judas Priest comes up some. The title song "Hell Bent For Leather" is even listenable. Further, their playing goes a step beyond cheap shots.

MANDRE

3000/Motown M7-917R1

Musical, funky electronic music is a rarity because most of the good electronic music comes from whitey Europe. Mandre, Andre Lewis, is special. His past recordings have been quite good, but not as adventurous. "Do Whatcha Gotta Do" combines all of the elements.

RALPH MCTELL

EASY/Kicking Mule KM 303

Previously reviewed as an import. Ralph's mellow voice and round songs have been ignored too long. If talent-will-out, it is his turn. This album continues a string of quality. RICK MOSES

PACE THE MUSIC/20th Century

A strong reflection of Neil Diamond is heard in Rick's urgency filled vocals. That affect is emphasized by the arrangements. But because those arrangements don't over orchestrate, this Moses is able to cross into the album radio promised land.

SUZI QUATRO

YOU KNEW SUZI/RSO RS-1-3044

Previously reviewed as an import. Suzi changed lives a while back and her association with Chinn/Chapman respectability wears well. Most of the material is choosen but it is the C&C music which stands out. So what's new.

RAPHAEL RAVENSCROFT HER FATHER DIDN'T LIKE ME.../Portrait JR 35683 Raphael Ravenscroft is an impressive rock interpreter. Solid songs were chosen and the saxophonic performances have a fetching quality to them. Appealing style is built into the arrangements too.

BEN SIDRAN

LIVE AT MONTREUX/Arista AB 4218

Bringing his Mose Allison up-date to Montreux is a very natural thing to do. The great aspect of Ben's music is how it seems to capture the whole history of jazz in a contemporary formulation. That's the mark of a special intelligence. SPYRO GYRA

ANALYSIS

BY GEORGE MEIER

The Radio Action Chart, which flips the Centerfold charts around in order to show movement, seems to be in a healthy balance. It's equally divided between gainers and losers. That is a change from recent issues when it was almost 3/4's negative. Leading the gainers into the charts is the powerful surge of George Harrison's album. While Cheap Trick, The Police and McGuinn, Clark & Hillman move deliberately, Harrison shows more radio acceptance than we remember his former albums getting.

Off to a good running start is Bob Welch who leads both the Radio and Retail Futures columns. In radio, at least, the Allman Brothers and Gary Wright follow strongly. Remember, that as in grain futures, record futures are subject to outside influences. Grain is affected by the weather, records by distribution patterns.

Again the Midwest is the pivot point in the Centerfold charts. New artists and newer musics tend to do relatively poorly there, while rock music bands tend to peak in that region.

For example, in sales Elvis Costello and Dire Straits struggle in the Midwest, as do McGuinn, Clark & Hillman and The Police on the radio side.

The other side of the picture is drawn by the relative radio strength of Cheap Trick, UFO, The Babys and Kayak in the heartland Midwest.

Another consistent pattern in musical tastes is also confirmed by this set of charts. The Northeast tends to be earliest on newer musics. So it is not surprising that there is radio strength in the Northeast for Blondie, Steve Forbert and George Thorogood. Meanwhile, The Jam does better on both coasts. Further, The Good Rats, whose home base is Long Island, gets back into the top 40 Lps by virtue of their strength in the Northeast.

A few further observations; note that The Pointer Sisters and J. Geils Band show particular radio strength west of the Mississippi while Toto's sales are drooping significantly in the same area.

Older albums are interesting to watch too. Rod's record is fading fast and first in Midwest sales, while Billy Joel's fading Lp is holding on tightly in Western sales.

Finally, the spectacular sales of the Doobie Bros. coming out of the South and West is notable. Their mellow funky rhythm seems to be quite in tune with those regions.

All of these patterns have a significance beyond a specific record. A sense of how each of the country's regions works with major artists, applies even more strongly to lesser acts. Understanding the patterns, vibrating with them, is the key to good radio programming.

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
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
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RADIO

What do King Kong, Godzilla and Radio have in common? They're all giants equally difficult to control. When industry representatives from all over the country come together to examine the means available for control, the scene resembles an ant colony - busy to say the least. Where it falls short in this comparison is that quite unlike the mighty ant, the potential unified power, radio's most important resource, is cast aside. This problem is basically due to the astounding number of people present from all forms of radio who have little more to say to one another than "When did you get in town?" Will you be here all three days?", and "We'll have to get together before we leave." Most people are either running in different directions like the KGB Chicken with his head cut off — doing everything but participating in the convention - or are milling around in the hotel lobby doing their one-on-one communication act

The one-on-one bit is fine because it's important to communicate personally, but not to offer some contribution to the success of the convention itself, not to try to help the industry in whatever way possible, is to defeat the purpose. To stand and watch this utter waste of time and money is somewhat like taking a kick in the gut from a Sumo wrestler.

This isn't to say, however, that nothing is accomplished during a three day biz blitz in a city like L.A. The uncontrolled carousing, the schmoosing, the boozing, etc., no matter how intense it may get, doesn't keep those with something to contribute from at least contributing to the small number who are present for the same reason.

For those of us with similar interests and goals (the Walrus reader) the convention was a success if only because it was made quite apparent that we need to communicate. Sure, it's great to see all of the people — that's part of it — but we must show our concern not only for radio today but for radio tomorrow.


In a small room supplied by DIR Broadcasting on the sparsely traveled mezzanine of the Century Plaza Hotel, the R&R Convention happened during the course of two open discussions in as many days.

PD's, MD's, jocks, promotion people, news people — in general, the people who cared enough about the future of radio — filled the room not only with bodies but with intelligent conversation, thought provoking ideas and, most importantly, passion.

It would be impossible to transcribe all that was said during those two meetings, but there was a staggering sense of awareness projected by those in attendance on such topics as: how to deal on a personal level with station competition; does a station sell records?; supplying relevant news; do programmers really want personality DJ's?; disco vs. a rock image and dealing with disco in general (a topic which cropped up more than once); the importance of a promotion director and use of TV commercials.

"I don't think of AJA as any kind of fusion music. As far as I'm concerned it's just rock and

"When we say jazz, I think of JAZZ. And I don't think the music we're doing resembles jazz that closely. The sponteneity's not there. It's a different sort of thing.

"But we do use the elements of jazz aside from the sponteneity," Fagen admitted.
"Such as the harmonics, and certain instrumentation." He admitted later that one reason he thought AJA acheived such huge success was that "the audiences are being conditioned to getting more used to jazz harmonies because of all this fusion business — that may have something to do with it."
"But the other thing," added

Becker, referring to their earlier, more rocking material, "it could pop up at any moment." As for the music to come, said

Becker: "We're not going to get a lot different. There aren't going to be any revolutionary departures in the immediate future, but we're always trying to do something a little different from what we've done in the past, rather than try to exploit it.
"We're always trying to do

something different just so's not to repeat ourselves; to keep it

interesting. But we're not going to start using sitars or anythings.

Few programmers will argue with the contention that Steely Dan represent a large quantity of quality music which FM radio

can offer its listeners, and it is almost more than coincidently that they composed the hit

theme to the movie — "FM."

"The song was a hit," said
Fagen, "but I think we should
have seen the movie before we committed ourselves. But I enjoyed doing it, and I thought it was a very succesful piece of movie music. As you know, it wasn't a successful movie."

"I'll tell you, there's something very tough about writing songs for movies," said Becker. "It's a little corny, although I really like it when a good old rock and roll song pops

We have also recently been talking with a German animator named Klaus Gorman about doing music for an animated film he's making," said Fagen, "tentatively titled 'The History Of The CIA'." Becker and Fagen have reached their heights of success musically and sense of how to craft good music, and it's a subject that obsesses

"We both like rock and roll when it's good — the principal elements of rock and roll appeal to us very much. We don't even like most of what's being done. But it's no strain to work within the confines of rock and roll. In fact, it would be a strain to do anything else. One hopes that rock and roll will get better, but ask me if it's possible, or even probable, based on any evidence that is happening right now. well, that's another story." "It is a shame," said Fagen,

"That there are so many great musicians now — guys who are technically gifted and have worked at it more than the people who began rock and roll, but they don't have the music to

play.
"The thing about jazz is that you have all these great players, plus you have this incredibly wonderful body of material to work with — all these popular songs, so well crafted . . . "
"And on top of that," added

Becker, "you have all these guys who were great composers and players like Miles Davis and Duke Ellington."

"I hope people pick up on it and start experimenting again,' lamented Fagen. "I guess there's just a lot of good musicians with no vision... concept of what they want to

do."
"It's hard for musicians to find themselves to when you consider what the commercial realities of music are. That is: one is encouraged to imitate really strongly, especially jazz musicians, if they are to survive, are encouraged to play

'crossover' music.
"But when you combine various elements of music you end up with some sort of mishmash that inevitably loses impact in a number of ways. The other thing is that when people are encouraged to be different, it is JUST to be different, in some striking way just for the sake of being different." Steely Dan have skirted those

pitfalls without yet hitting a trap. Their music crosses over boundries and formats, yet it is cleanly delineated and defined. They are quite different from 99% of the groups and artists now creating popular music, not for the sake of being different, but for the sake of quality.

Over the six carefully and well

crafted albums they have released, they have stamped enough good songs in the public mind to merit a GREATEST HITS set of two discs, of which Fagen is sure "that somebody will find something to object to our leaving off the album." They have gained more respect and acceptance than almost any Seventies rock and roll act through the sheer quality of their music.

"WE NEED SOME GENIUS," said Fagen after despairing the state of rock and roll, "and there just seems to be a big hole." But genius is exactly the term

that pops to mind when many

describe Steely Dan.
"Well...I don't know if it
even applies," answered Fagen,
"but at least we're giving it a shot. It's perfectly natural for us to do what we do. It's not like we try to do anything different . . . "

(Continued from page 5) brilliant musician and a great, great singer — he never overdubs his vocals at all, I did three records with him and not one was an overdub. And he's a great writer. And tempermental. But he was easy to work with. As long as he trusts what you're doing he leaves you alone.

SXR: Anything special you had to do to get Van's

confidence?
TT: I don't think I ever got his confidence. He trusted me to a certain point, I don't know. He vacillates so much, he might like you one day and hate you the next, but he left me alone pretty

SXR: Did he work with you much behind the boards?

TT: No no. Nothing. I mixed everything down here and he stayed up there. We had one mix of "Tupelo Honey" that was just beautiful and the only time he came into the studio he pushed up the fader on another mix, he wanted to hear the guitar part, it's the one that went on the album. He talked me into putting that one on and I did though I was really lobbying for this other mix — which was beautiful, it took us two days to do. The record had been out about a month and he calls me

up and he said: "Listen, Ted, you were right about that mix." I almost cried.

He is impatient. The thing with Van, which took me a little while to learn, is that when he walks in and picks up his guitar he wants to put the track down. Well, I'm sitting there dicking around with the sound of this and that and worried about leakage and he said: "Listen, Ted, I don't care if the drum's off. I'm only going to sing this twice and it's not going to be as good any more. So you just better get So, OK, and he was right. So, from then on I got the band in a couple of hours ahead of time, got them sounding right, and then I'd get Van in. I found with a lot of really good musicians -whether it's a Billy Payne or a Mike McDonald or Van — that if you do too many takes they don't like to repeat the same thing, they'll just get bored and you'll miss their best licks. So I've got to make sure that the arrangement's together before I start taking it. There are a few exceptions: Eddie Van Halen for instance, who's to me one of the finest musicians I know, can play the same thing exactly— he'll play a solo that will amaze you and then do it again and again and again and again, he's

got a steel trap for a memory. Other than that, it holds true for most of the really fine musicians
— Billy Payne never really does the same thing twice, and it's always brilliant, but he gets bored with what's going on. It still comes out good but it's not fair of me to do that to him — it's not as inspired. So I guard myself against doing that to a

good musician. SXR: So you place a lot of importance on rehearsing and

arranging?

TT: I do most of it in the studio, work things out, nothing till we get in. And I work it out there. But the point is while I'm working on the sound of things I'm making sure that the arrangements are coming together in a structural sense and then when I feel that it's all together I'll push the button.

SXR: Are there any of your records that you'd like to go back and do over again? Any glaring mistakes?

TT: No, just some I'd like to go back and not do again.

SXR: Like which? TT: I don't know. I don't think I did a good job on Carly Simon's album necessarily. I did the best I could but I didn't have a real fix on how to do it. I'd been working with bands so much I got in with studio guys and — I don't know — I worked hard on it. I don't mind it really, it just wasn't tremendously successful, although it sold records. But she was a pleasure to work with. And we took four or five months to make it, off and on, because James was making his record they were both out here. It was funny because Lenny would be working with James and I'd be with Carly.

And Lorraine Ellison I didn't do a good job on. That was a dismal failure. You couldn't even say it didn't do well commercially - I mean, we probably got more back than we shipped out.

SXR: Have you pinpointed your dissatisfaction with that record in terms of what you did

or didn't do?

TT: It didn't flow, you know. I got into a situation where I was half way through the record and figured out that she didn't sing the way I'd thought she'd sing. I should've found that out in front. She's really a good singer but she doesn't lay into certain kinds of tracks. Also, in the past, she had one of the premier producers, Jerry Ragovoy. That's like Dionne Warwick going to somebody else right after Burt Bacharach, Christ! I couldn't do what Jerry Ragovoy could do - he wrote those songs: "Stay With Me Baby" is a classic. So I was a fool to try that, but I wanted to. I also wanted to try using a lot of big sounds and she had the kind of voice that cut through all that stuff. When I first did "Many Rivers To Cross" nobody had done it. Richard hadn't done it with anybody yet and Linda hadn't done it. I thought that

would be a good one but I couldn't get the performance out of her, I just couldn't. Didn't know how. Still don't think I

SXR: Going down your discography, the only other commercial failure was the Captain Beefheart LP.

TT: I like that record oddly enough. He's got great rhythm ideas. And he's nuts, so the combination of the two makes it real interesting. He'll do stuff like he'll want to sing the track but he doesn't want to hear it. He'll say: "Ok, tell me when it starts." Turn it on and he doesn't care, he'll just start singing the song and sing it all the way through. Or he'll say he can hear the typewriter through the wall. And he believes it. But that's a well recorded album. I think Donn Landee did an excellent job on that album. I think it's pretty good, I wouldn't change anything on that. I know

I couldn't have made that better. (Steely Dan, "Bodhisattva") TT: What is it? SXR: Steely Dan's "Bodhisattva.

TT: I still don't recognize it. It's that intro, I never associated it with that. It's the same thing as "Don't Take Me Alive" — the intro to that reminds me of a Joe Walsh record or something, then all of a sudden it's Steely Dan the same thing. Trapped me

there, boy.
SXR: They're signed with Warner Bros. now, aren't they?

TT: I'm one of the ones that started generating all the enthusiasm around here about Steely Dan, a long time ago. They're like the J.D. Salinger of rock 'n roll. I mean, "My Old School" is a brilliant piece of music, lyrically, all the way: "Put me on the Wolverine up to Annandale," and "oleanders growing outside her door."
"Reelin' In The Years" is a great song, all of their songs. They're just great writers.

SXR: Do you have a different approach when you're recording a power rock group as opposed to the more laid back, West Coast

rhythm stuff?

TT: Well, you've got to treat sound a lot differently. Drums have to be considered a lot differently when you're working with an Eddie Van Halen rhythm guitar as opposed to Mike McDonald's electric piano.

Arrangement wise, I always like to wait until I get in the studio and then I make suggestions as it goes along. Most groups usually have an arrangement and then you go


I just don't have a plan for any of them, but definitely sound considerations have to be taken into account. Also, the way you approach it too. With Van Halen, we did all the recording in six days, all of it. So it's important to get the spontaneity there with a group like that. You've got to really nail it. And then they get everything in the first or second take — good band. \square




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
