STARSHIP LOG, STARDATE MAY 1979: Paul Kantner was up at RCA New York recently talking about the new LP the Starship have just begun recording with Ron Nevison producing. According to Kantner the album will be a major departure from past Starship discs. He claims the record will be rock'n'roll oriented, and that there will be "no more MOR" from the Starship. Marty Balin is not working with the band for the time being, and Grace Slick has been coming to rehearsals, but they're not sure whether she'll be on the album either. Ex-Elvin Bishop vocalist Mickey Thomas will be doing some of the vocals on the LP, along with (it is to be assumed) Kantner himself and David Freiberg.
WE CANNES ROCK YOU: This

year's Cannes Film Festival seems to be attracting as much attention in the rock world as it is in the film world, what with the premieres of the two Who films, THE KIDS ARE

ALRIGHT and QUADROPHENIA, a concert by the recently revamped Who (who made their live debut in London the first week in May, sporting new drummer Kenny Jones and keyboard help from Rabbit Bundrick), and a visit from the Shirts' Annie Golden, one of the stars of HAIR, which kicked off

the festival.

FRIPPERTRONICS TO BE REVEALED: Ex-King Crimson guitar/electronicsmeister Robert Fripp will be embarking on a most unusual tour in June and July to promote his new EXPOSURE LP. Fripp will be doing a series of one man shows, using guitar and tape recorder, to be conducted in non-concert hall situations. Fripp will apparently, on fairly short warning, show up at odd places, such as record stores, and perform. He also plans to demonstrate "Frippertronics," his own brand of electronic music, with an LP of same to be ready by the fall. Fripp also plans a "Discotronics" LP for sometime in 1980. He claims 1981 will be "The Year of the Fripp." We hope he's right.
PARTY TIME: The weekend of May 5-6 was a big one for Big Apple industry partygoers, who were treated to CBS sponsored bashes for both the Boomtown Rats and Ronnie Wood's New Barbarians. Notable guests who turned out for one or both of the affairs included Blondie (the group), Cheap Trick, David Johansen, Rick Derringer, Andy Warhol, and Neon Leon. LOWE TO PRODUCE McCARTNEY'S NEXT?:

Reports from London are that Nick Lowe's next production project (he's currently producing an album for the Pretenders) will be a Paul McCartney & Wings disc. That's not as unlikely as it might sound — Lowe (who has just completed his follow-up to PURE POP FOR NOW PEOPLE, slated for a June release) knows McCartney from way back when the Brinsley Schwarz band opened on several Wings tours through Britain. The former Beatle was one of the Brinsleys' earliest supporters, and Nick, of course, was one of the Brinsleys...In other Brinsley Schwarz spin-off news, the Rumour (two-fifths original Brinsley Schwarz boys) have FROGS SPROUTS CLOGS AND KRAUTS imminent from Arista. Apparently the package is somewhat different from the already-released British Stiff LP, with Clive Davis ordering a resequencing of tracks and the inclusion of at least one song not available on the U.K. version CARLY SIMON OFF AND

RUNNING: Carly Simon's forthcoming album from Elektra will be her last for the label. Simon's being courted by a number of companies, though Columbia looks to have the inside slot due to hubby James

Taylor's affiliation there.
SOUTHER GOES TO
COLUMBIA: J.D. Souther, who was reportedly dropped by Asylum after spending way too much money on his third solo album, has been signed to Columbia with the costly album in question (still untitled)

scheduled for a July shipping.

STEELY DAN NOT ON

WARNER BROS.?: Three years ago, halfway through their deal with ABC Records, Steely Dan signed a long-term contract with Warner Bros. effective at the end of the group's ABC obligation. Apparently there's now some doubts as to whether Steely Dan will actually be on Warners, with rumors flying that the Becker-Fagen duo have broken the W.B. pact for a new deal with MCA. At press time nothing could be confirmed from either Warners, MCA or Steely Dan's management.

INK SPOTS: Recent signings include the B-52s to Warner Bros. The B-52s hail originally from Athens, Georgia, released a homemade single called "Rock Lobster" and then proceeded to take New York's new waveophiles by storm. No word on a producer for the two girl/three guy outfit as yet . . . David Werner has been signed to Epic's Ocean label. Werner's IMAGINATION QUOTA, which came out on RCA a few years ago, excited a lot of folks with its Bowie-esque elements... Singer/songwriter Tom Jans has inked with Infinity Records... L.A.'s Motels have signed a deal with Capitol . . . Rickie Lee Jones, Warner Bros'. 24year old overnight success story, said to have dropped her boyfriend/manager in favor of perhaps the industry's heaviest management org:Irv Azoff's Front Line Management. That puts Ms. Jones in the company of Front Liners Jimmy Buffett, Boz Scaggs, Dan Fogelberg and the Eagles — to name but a few.
IN THE STUDIO: Sire

Records' acts the Paley Brothers and Ramones are ensconced in an undisclosed L.A. studio with reclusive legend/producer Phil Spector...John Denver is working on an album at Filmways/Heider in Hollywood, as is A&M's Peter Frampton . . REO Speedwagon putting down tracks at Sound City...Bill Withers is recording in San Jose for his upcoming Columbia release... Producer Tom Werman is doing the final mixes on the Blue Oyster Cult's LP, MIRRORS, described as a "very pop, commercial affair," due in late June on Columbia . . . The Searchers (reunited after a decade-long lull) are recording in London for Sire with tunes being contributed especially for the project by the likes of Bob Dylan, Dire Straits' Mark Knopfler and Elvis Costello . . .

PÉRAMBULATING PRODUCT: Upcoming albums and so forth include Abba's VOULEZ-VOUS from Atlantic in June... Third World's THE STORY'S BEEN TOLD from Island in June... Voyager, a British band recently signed to Elektra/Asylum, with their debut also due in June. . . Later in the summer expect a new Bruce Springsteen LP...And tentative summer-slated discs from MCA include new ones from MCA include new ones from Stephen Bishop, Roger Daltry, Wishbone Ash and B.B. King... From Columbia in June: new group THE LAUGHING DOGS, Kate Taylor's IT'S IN THERE AND IT'S GOT TO COME OUT, Mick Taylor's solo LP. In July: Aerosmith, Weather Report and the HAVANA JAM compilation.

INCREDULOUS COUNTRY: Sammy Davis Jr. announced on the Tonight Show that he'll be recording an all country album with Willie Nelson producing. Honest!

ED's NOTE: Matthew Kaufman is like a one man board of directors for Beserkley Records who changes hats depending on what decision needs to be made. To say that he is different would be too obvious. To say that he is a rare breed would be more accurate. Joel Selvin (San Francisco Chronicle) is an old friend of Matthew's and one of the few people who could penetrate his original thought processes. . .

JS: Matthew, would you start out by telling me what it is that makes Beserkley different from other record

companies?
MK: On the whole, I would say that we have a non-corporate approach to the record business. It's our duty not to think corporate. We have a certain concern about making a profit, so to speak, but I think that the corporate mentality and the decision priority structure that has permeated the record business is the single thing that's defeating the growth and development of American groups.

JS: And what do you do at Beserkley to counteract that? MK: Any time a decision looks corporate we re-evaluate it.

JS: How did Beserkley first get started?

MK: A figment of my imagination. At one point we just put out a record. Before that there was no Beserkley, after that, there was.

JS: I think it's worth explaining the factors that went into putting out that record.

MK: When I recognized the fact that the only way I was going to successfully be a president of a record company was to start my own, I just started.

JS: I remember at the time, that you were having difficulty finding a deal for Earthquake. You had actually given up talking to other record companies following your

disassociation with A&M Records.

MK: Your memory seems pretty correct.

JS: Was this an example of the corporate mentality?

MK: There was obviously a void here; the United States corporate thinking didn't include the development of groups. They were very interested in selling plastic, but they weren't super knocked out about having to develop groups, and stick with them and watch them from kind of an infantile status to where they mature and successfully sell byproducts of Petroleum.

JS: How does your role as a record producer fit in with your role as a record company

oresident?

MK: Hand in hand. See, the executive is in direct contact with the artist . . . let's view the record industry as a male Tupperware party — there are 3 or 4 different things that need to get done. The most important, in my opinion, is the creation of the mold for the new piece of plastic. I think a record executive has got to work hand in hand at that particular point. To know when to expect the record... to know if there's anything they can offer, constructively, that is going to add commerciality to the record. Let's just say that the record company president does nothing more than to keep the production cost efficient. Most of the artists on the label, and I think there's only one exception, now have sold more records than their production budgets, so at least in their minds they're vindicated that they're successful to the relative scope that they're going. Like somebody's got to make the decision that I guess started with chart busters. If there's a

great LP and it's not any one artist, we can still put out a great LP... we're not just going to put out filler to sell

JS: Of course your role as artist manager fits in there neatly

MK: Well, see if the decisions are all made then it makes everything more efficient. See, there's a very odd philosophy in America that bases a belief in the inherent dishonesty of people and it says that we have to have adversary or arguing actions to take care of this. Like we have a manager who argues with the record company president. What happens if we could get honesty and efficiency of decision making in one person who could do three or four different roles and has the best interest of the artist at heart. I mean, the only thing that says that that can't be done, is that America seems to feel that the artist would be unscrupulously taken advantage of, but that's not the case. I have certain role conflicts where there are some songs sometimes that are good but just aren't right for the artist's image and we just don't do them even though the artist has written them. 'Cause a lot of times, what pours out of artists is stuff that they write that isn't quite suited for them.


JS: What about the thought that the one person guiding the artist's career might fail to see the broad view?

MK: In a lot of these capacities, I'm just an extension of the artist themselves.

JS: Let's try the first blindfold test. (Robert Gordon -'Flyin' Saucers Rock & Roll")

MK: All right. I'd sign the guy JS: You recognize the track? MK: Sure.

JS: What about Gordon's revitalization or resuscitation of rockabilly — do you see that as some kind of parallel or



allied art school of what's going on at Beserkley? MK: (Shrug) Question is a little

too deep.

JS: Do you think you could describe what the musical philosophy of Beserkley is? MK: Too deep.

JS: Are there not common elements in the music of all the artists that you work

with?

MK: Live band records. You know, like guitar arranged, accurate representations—a fusion of what the group does accentuated, hopefully, with what a studio can do.

JS: Why can't you create this with session players who have a lot of experience recording

in the studios?

- MK: Cause they just don't play as many live dates and can never get quite as close unless they spend a year together in the studio and then they wind up being bands of studio guys. Bands of studio guys have been successful as well, but then they're band records, not studio records. And there have been lots of studio musicians who have a big record and can't put anything together live and some of the bands actually work because they have been together a long while . . . these are just like live bands that have actually been performing live more than they've been playing in studios first. JS: What's the qualitative
- difference here? MK: Well, see like a lot of times the performer is a lot more knowledgeable and can see visually what gets the audience off sometimes, while the studio musician is a lot of times in the dark. He doesn't have that same direct confrontation with the audience. He's just too manipulated . . . too in a position not to get the picture because of the intermediaries such as the producer.

JS: Right. I can see where that isolation will affect a musician, but how does that lack of isolation manifest itself in the music? What are

the differences?

MK: Well, I guess like I... the biggest difference I notice is the endings. Most live groups come in with club endings... with the big finale endings and never think about the endings of songs and are always very conscious of the beginnings of songs because the beginnings always set the tenure for how the audience is going to respond. Most of these live groups watch the audience a great deal, especially when they're not successful because sometimes there's not very much of the audience to watch. You can see each of their little faces. You definitely watch their reaction from the beginning but by the

middle and the end you're not anywhere near as sophisticated about your thinking. By the time you've cooked into the solo, you're there, live. You don't have to be as sophisticated as a lot of these studio guys who think that the polish and the sound and the particular magic in the studio is what makes a record. As far as I'm concerned there are three things that make a record good beat, neat words, and a melody I can remember or just like a super riff, but there are very few super riff songs that don't have a melody but there are a couple. You notice I didn't have to say anything about the qualitative value other than words you can remember.

JS: At Beserkley, you've taken groups that were essentially all recording virgins and put them in the studio after letting them do their rehearsals on stage, essentially, and then brought these musicians along as recording artists.

MK: Yeah, a lot of people have said my productions suffer because of that.

JS: Do you think it does?

JS: Has it been difficult? MK: With some artists, yeah, with some artists, no. Jonathan - no problems at all. "Roadrunner" was done in four minutes and 40 seconds and mixed once. And "Egyptian Reggae" was done live in an echo chamber. Jonathan has been able to completely capture the essence of hit records with the most sparse approach conceivable and some of the other artists have taken a painstaking approach interpreting the live show which is really dynamic into the live record because they don't know how to pace their energies correctly and they don't know how to tailor their songs to the AOR format or make sure that the hook goes in early enough so that they don't get counted out of the top 40.

JS: And those have been the problems more than the actual studio type situations that would have been resolved by using more experienced musicians?

MK: Look, I would never trade the excitment of our records for using more experienced musicians who don't know each other and come in and play the charts and leave. I think there's just a certain raw gutsy excitement that I would never trade.

JS: That sounds ephemeral and it could be costly. I assume that it has been, in terms of studio time and production budgets.

MK: Oh, I'd say, generally, the records that are done by

strangers cost a little bit more, in my experience, than the records done by groups but you're right, we've had our ups and downs.

JS: Tell me about your philosophy that would lead you to put out an album by the Rubinoos two years after their last LP, when that first LP had a top 40 chart single, when normal record company thinking would have had you putting out a second LP just as fast as you could.

MK: Corporate. Very corporate.

The Rubinoos, to be succinct, only started their careers with a single and garnered a lot of attention on the chartbusters and put out their first LP. If we were a corporate record company, after the buzz on chartbusters we would have had an LP out immediately. But the Rubinoos are trying to use the attention they received sparingly and correctly and they wanted their new record to be better than their first record and it took them that long to do it.

JS: They were the youngest musicians you started working with when you first signed them up, were they

MK: Right. They were still in high school.

JS: And they had not worked in any other recording business situation.

MK: Right.

JS: Just playing around Berkley clubs . . . how did they develop the sound that was so oriented towards commerciality? Such

a hit sounding group . . .

MK: They dug hits . . . there's just a whole other generation

of people who are into hits.

JS: Is that what Rubin and the Rubinoos sounded like? I

never saw that group. MK: Yes. John Rubin and the Rubinoos were like parodying a little bit of the 50's stuff and like they saw a whole joy in commercial records that at the time I was too snobby to appreciate and they turned me onto a whole school of music that I had kind of overlooked because I had suffered through hearing those hits to hear my Beach Boys or Motown Records.

JS: You're talking about bubble

gum records.

MK: No, not bubble gum. The ultra commercial records, some of the really slick ones. Beyond bubblegum. Why go

JS: It might fix it in our minds just exactly what you're talking about.

MK: Everyone's got the picture. I'll give you the perfect example. The Rubinoos turned me on to the Pepsi generation.

JS: OK, the commercial. MK: They made me feel a whole new beauty in TV commercials that I hadn't seen before.

JS: Why haven't The Rubinoos, in your opinion, gotten more FM response across the country?

MK: I think they get a lot actually. When the album came out they got all kinds of FM play and as soon as "I Think We're Alone Now" hit the charts, then it seemed that the FM's just stopped playing it. At the time, that was sort of the state of the art that FM radio was at. If you heard a hit AM, you didn't want it on FM anymore. Now they've changed their minds . . . a hit's a hit . . . what sounds good.

JS: What about Jonathan - is his FM action as good as the

Rubinoos?

MK: Yeah. Jonathan always suffers from being compared to the latest trend. Oh, "It's not as cool as barbeque rock" or "It's not heavy" or the words mean too much, ya know. I think that Jonathan just cruises along. Those people who get the picture just get the picture. I'd say 'Road Runner' got tons of airplay. So did the early stuff and I kind of envision 'Affection' getting a lot of FM airplay because there is no other access other than AOR-FM.

Generation X — "Valley Of The Dolls"

JS: How would you describe Generation X?

MK: Kind of a neat little band. I mean if you're trying to find some kind of commercial parallel, they could come up with the next "96 Tears" just as easy as anybody else, cause this group happened to come out of a social protest era. Punk, Jazz and Folk all have four letters and they want to move into pop which has three letters and have a hit which also has three letters. You can come from any of the genres and still make it. I was in England and I saw what was going on — I'd be a punk too sometimes...as a matter of fact I probably was, in high school, except calling somebody a punk back then was kind of a disgusting term I would have fought.

JS: So then these categories

seem artificial to you.

MK: Not artificial. Everybody's got to come from somewhere. Like Miss America's got to come from here or Miss Michigan or Miss Baltimore or wherever...they've got to show up from somewhere.

JS: In order to go into the 3 letter

category.

MK: Right. Or you could be in a 9
letter category. Psychiatry—
isn't Perry Como a psychiatrist or something? Or a barber? I think of Perry Como just because my sweater today reminds me of

ANALYSIS

BY GEORGE MEIER

A real story emerges from the picture drawn by the Centerfold charts this week. It is evidence of changing tastes in the Southern U.S. This is not merely supposition, there is evidence of a closer tie linking the South to the Midwest. The South turns to hard rock while rejecting traditional Southern bands.

Last issue's analysis pointed out the curious fact that the Allman Brothers' album seemed to have sold through in the South very quickly. That was an omen. Not only is the Allman Brothers' sales figure in the region low but so is the number by the Marshall Tucker Band.

Meanwhile, if you look at those records getting disproportionately high airplay in the South, they are almost always getting that kind of play in the Midwest too. For example, there is Supertramp, Van Halen, New England, Tycoon and Blackfoot who do best in the South and Midwest. Note the unusual character of those bands. Jay Ferguson and Dixie Dregs do well on Southern radio too. At least, the Dregs cannot be thought of in the softer rock context associated with the area.

The second most significant story in this issue's numbers is the change over in the chart. The Radio Action Chart shows several hot new records, lead by Bob Dylan, powering their way onto the Centerfold. That coupled with a full Radio Futures column implies a major turn-The final proof, however, is that 19 of the 40 artists in the last Centerfold have been replaced. That is a high drop out rate.

Other regional notes include the Midwestern radio strength of Journey and Ian Hunter and the strength on both coasts of Flash and The Pan, The Tubes and Dire Straits East of the Mississippi you'll find support for Zappa, Orleans and Pat Metheny. In Northeastern radio there's Joe Jackson, James Taylor, Bob Dylan and Elvis Costello. Blondie is dead in the South and Rickie Lee is slowest in the Midwest.

On the retail side, the Centerfold makes clear the point about how many strong radio acts get a relatively weak response across the counter. That is significant. Is radio chasing too many acts which fail to connect? An interesting point in this regard is that two artists who didn't make the Centerfold do extremely well in record stores. Both Molly Hatchet and Herbie Hancock, what a nice couple, score in the .500's in Southern retail. That puts them in the South's top 5. Lots to think about. Is radio doing research or isn't it?

I feel the point that was missed is that Ben Rock, as you dub it, does just that - rock! Whilst Michele was still with Zeta 4, the senior staff of that station started a weekly program to feature Ben Rock from the U.K. It was here that Miami firs heard of the likes of The Police, Boomtown Rats, Devo, The Pretenders, etc., and were consistently exposed to early Blondie, Flamin' Groovies, etc. well as getting to hear Joe Jackson, Live Cheap Trick, and even Dire Straits for the first time.

At first there was much trepidation that the show would last at all, but in point of fact it has been extended to a two hour format, with some of its features leaking into format.

The point being that Southern enthusiasts of boogie, will just as soon get their rocks off to "Touched By Your Presence Dear," or pop a tube of beer whilst cruising to the Pistols have you, as they will a Molly Hatchet. Similarly, the Southern rock fan is almost as hungry as his Northern counterparts for development and good new rock. And if Bent Rock is programmed, knowledgeably, enthusiastically, energetically and as skillfully as one would program anything else, then there will be a surprisingly enthusiastic response.

So be courageous P.D.'s and give a little airspace to Bent Rock under the suffocating blanket of superstar programming.

Miami and the South get off on it, so I'm sure the likes of Pittsburgh or Denver or wherever will too.



(Continued from page 6) Beserkley artists come in.

MK: Oh, they vary. I guess Greg Kihn started in folk, Jonathan probably started in a more rock mode. As a matter of fact I would say "Modern Lovers" was one of the first punk bands I had seen in the seventies with the "old" Modern Lovers.

JS: And the other two? MK: Oh, Earthquake is probably in a rock genre and the Rubinoos are just pop pop pop

JS: They never were a four letter?

MK: No. They started in three and just needed a h-i-t to be pop-hit-pop-hit-pop-hit instead of pop-pop-pop. That'll give them something to think about, eh Joel?

JS: Why do you think Greg has been accorded the most universal industry acceptance?

MK: Because he can pass the any shmuck test. JS: Any shmuck test?

MK: Any shmuck can see he's a hit. (ha ha)

JS: Why hasn't Earthquake

passed the any shmuck test?

MK: It's tougher for any shmuck to spot rock acts as hits. Earthquake really borders in that very special area of trying to make rock oriented rock and roll and love songs balance and that requires a little more than the sensitive any shmuck, and as long as Earthquake's been around they've never played the midwest, except for 2 or 3 dates in the Ohio region which were very successful.

JS: You see the midwest as a big

Earthquake market then?

MK: I just think other areas of the country might have less shmucks than around here.

JS: What about Europe. Has Greg been accorded the similar universal acceptance? MK: Yep. Plus a lot more record sales.

JS: What's the difference

between here and Europe? MK: Ah, we're still like a singles market. There are people who buy singles and the access to radio is a lot different, plus there's just like a certain amount of the Tupperware party that just hasn't been swallowed here yet in the states

JS: Tupperware party? MK: A certain amount of the merchandising element of the Tupperware party where free bowls — they just keep giving out free bowls and there's like a lot of free bowls and a lot of

those kind of things. JS: What do you mean by free bowls, Matthew? They give away free bowls in Europe or they give them away here? MK: Here.

JS: Are you talking about promotional tours? MK: The regular woes of the independent label is like, the business is being swallowed up by the corporate monsters, and see, the European record business has already been swallowed by the corporate monster - there's like, much more competition between corporations here. They're in a different mode right now.

JS: How do you feel about disco? MK: I think it's great.

JS: Do you see parallels between you and disco?

MK: Less than I see between other recording artists who actually take a band on the road. See, disco's great cause it's fed a new life blood into the industry by people who make record-only-records. they've given people something to dance to. And I don't think disco's ever left --I think it's just been ignored for a period of time because I know there's been a club scene from the Starlighters all the way you know there's always been like music to dance to and a lot of it's come on records and a lot of it's come into people's homes so that they can dance to it. I think like any other avenue of the four letter words, disco being a five letter word, would lead to h-i-t eventually, where radio, another five letter word, would eventually, encorporate the disco formula pop record into their programming, and there's nothing wrong with it. The only thing that I don't like about it is that it's not a live band. Disco is a producer's showcase and if you're really a producer fan and like producer records, it's great.

JS: How would you describe your own work as a producer? MK: Kind of making sure the project gets done. Each job is

different. A producer's job with each different job and with each different group is different. But, it's definitely not that standard kind of Hollywood guy who goes in and cuts the tracks and cuts three tracks that day and then gets another set of session guys for the next three numbers and then puts on a sweetening and then puts on the lead vocal . . . we just don't do that. We just march in and make a record . . . I've got to face the same guys. See the thing we stress the most though, is rehearsal. I hate working with groups that haven't rehearsed. The studio is no place to rehearse, it's just too indulgent. You have the very talented engineer, the guy who's the second who puts a lot of time in and the studio is very expensive and other people could be using it and you're just camped in the studio rehearsing...it's like some of the most boring periods of time I've ever had and so we stress a lot of rehearsal with bands beforehand and all the producers go down to the practice place and try to work everything out at the rehearsal situation so that everything at recording is positive.

JS: I know that what you say is true, each act is different, but I also know that your work as a producer involves long philosophical discussions about the nature of career, the relevance of recordings to career, all the way down to the most finite musical contributions. I know you write songs with all your acts. I know you've played on records, I know that you're really active in the studio. I

know you're especially conscious of how the lead vocal goes down and I've seen you go out and give what Glenn Kolotkin, your assistant producer says is one of "Matthew's famous pep

talks" to lead vocalists.

MK: That's just threats.

JS: Does all of this make you a collaborator?

MK: I collaborate with the record company president, manager, artists, on the totality of the artists' career and we've got to limit the amount of records they put out so we put out only the best. And sometimes the artist doesn't quite have the total vision of what the song could sound like finished and sometimes for a while the producer does before the artist does and can make it sound even better. I do a lot of different things with a lot of different groups. It's still a standard kind of experience a disco producer for instance. I can never not have access to the group and I'm always very open to suggestions and discuss most of the decisions and I'm not very tyrannical until I get overbearing, at which point everyone is very quick to tell me. (ha ha) JS: Are there producers that you

would compare yourself to? MK: Only in fleeting moments of delusion.

JS: What kind of producers today do you enjoy?

MK: There are so many that it would take a long time.

JS: Do you watch what Roy

Thomas Baker is up to these

days?

MK: I think he's cool. I personally know a couple of the guys in some of the groups that he does and I'm really glad that they've met with success and I think the records sound great. I know what you're trying to lead up to. I can't tell you what stimulates me to listen to any particular record that I do, but there's just some kind of perverse pattern — either I've heard it, somebody plays it for me — that kind of catches my attention for some reason, or for some reason I like the packaging. Another timeI'll recognize the producer as somebody I've had an argument about something with and I'll listen to it for that reason. There's no single thread of names of producers that make me put on records. JS: Perverse thread, common

pattern between Earthquake, Rubinoos, Jonathan, Greg? MK: Well, I could answer with

hits but I need some more. JS: But, isn't there some music and philosophical thread there too.

MK: Jeez, that's like asking somebody if there's symbolism in their work. Joel, you got me.

F arms, Factories and Heavy Metal. These three terms seem to go hand in hand when describing the Midwest updating the American Gothic with an electric guitar in place of a pitchfork. Rush, Nugent, Kansas, Journey, Van Halen, Styx, REO and UFO are staples of the average midwesterner's musical diet. The Midwest reacts first and strongest to new releases by these bands. But when it comes to 'Bent Rock' (see last issue) the 'Industrial Midwest' is the slowest region to respond — an understatement to be sure. They were the last quadrant to show acceptance for The Cars, Talking Heads, Manzanera, Elvis Costello, Fab Poos, Blondie, Jam, Police, Joe Jackson, The Tubes, Roxy Music, Duncan Browne and Graham Parker. The Midwest jumped on Cheap Trick but there is some debate as to that band's classification as Bent Rockers.

While they have not always picked up on trends set by the rest of the country, the rest of the country has been slow to respond to what's big in the Midwest. Obviously, a fan from Chicago or Detroit can't imagine why people in L.A. don't get off on Rush. It's interesting to note that REO can play to 50,000 people in parts of the Midwest and can't sell out a 3,000 seat hall in New York City. And a Bob Seger LP can go gold from sales in St. Louis alone. And for most midwesterners Ted Nugent

What it basically comes down to is that the Midwest parties to a different kind of music. The South loves to boogie and the heart of the country blitzes away on Heavy



The Moter City's motives according to
W4's Mark McEwen... "When you're
banging fenders all day, puting Chryslers
together and you get out of work, you don't
want to hear Joni Mitchell. There's alot of tension here because this is a working town. You don't find too many people in bars around here at one o'clock in the morning. The workers have to go home 'cause they have to be up by five. So, when they come off the line at night two things enter their minds at the same time gimme some loud rock'n'roll and gimme some beer. They go cruisin', get a good buzz on and try to forget the day where they've put in their millionth part which looks the same as it did all of last year. That's why they're into Heavy Metal.

"Recently though, Joe Jackson, The Cars and The Police are all doing very well. There is that sort of chieness that is here in Detroit that people are getting into which is surprising because the same people who are buying Judas Priest are buying The Cars. On a sublevel of sophistication The Tubes, The Jam are happening too. There is a resurgence of the newer sounding music."

Down the dial from W4, Tawyna Townsend from WRIF adds some statistical insight regarding Detroit. "In most major markets across the country rock'n'roll AOR stations account for less than 10% of any given audience in that market. In this city the average is up to 15%. And that's astounding. That says alot about the musical tastes in Detroit."

WXRT's Bob Gelms is a native of the city which gave us The Blues. He expounds on the Chicago attitude. "I find the Midwest a bit more conservative than the rest of the country. And that attitude affects the willingness of the people to accept something different. Their conservative outlook on economics, politics and lifestyles in general tends to narrow their vision a bit and I think it just carries over



into the music.

"As far as new music goes, alot of the stations in town didn't traditionally take too many chances with it. It comes down to a function of the network stations and their policies toward programming music on the basis of sales and popularity."

Sky Daniels, originally from Youngstown Ohio, has worked in almost every industrial town in the Midwest and now handles the MD chores at WLUP. "It's bleak living in Youngstown or Pittsburgh or even Cleveland. Life's real fucking bleak in those places so hard rock is a release form, a way to get rid of alotta frustrations and pent up energy. For many people, when they come out of an industrial plant their whole hearing process is a little more

oriented towards louder stuff.
"As for 'Bent Rock', at first there was a good deal of critical backlash. But that's because these people here are so earthy, so street level that they thought it was some sort of weird thing and related it to the safety pins and vomit of the Sex Pistols. But once they were allowed to just hear the music they were receptive. They want new music in the Midwest. They want to hear what's hip. British rock, for example, is very big here, and they are very production oriented

WEBN in Cincinnati doesn't quite fit the Midwestern mold but Curt Gary does delve deeper into Sky's production theory. "The Cars went over real big here but that's because they took the whole economy rock sound and knew that the average American wouldn't buy it because it didn't sound slick enough. To a Cincinnati ear, a record that's been given a million dollars worth of production, like the Cars is musically alot more entertaining than something that just came out of the amplifiers of a quartet. They'll buy all the over-dubbed vocals and phased guitars Cincinnati is a cross section of people with

highly advanced heavy metal tastes. They won't stand for thinking through a Costello record. They just want to be beaten over the head with that million dollar FM sound.

The town that fits no pattern at all is Cleveland. WMMS has always been different. Kid Leo offers his analysis of

why Cleveland rocks.
"It's industrial, it's factories, auto assembly lines, coal miners — Midwestern hard working, hard drinking people. That's why hard drinking, hard working rock'n'roll works well here. Also, we are receptive to new idioms of rock. As long as it deals with rock, no matter how intellectual the critics like to call it, if it deals with the guts of rock'n'roll we're very receptive to it. The critics want to analyze, criticize and labotomize but we're not hung up on images.

"As for Heavy Metal's popularity in the Midwest, in the early 70s it was the only rock'n'roll you could have. Everybody was singing about draft resisting, love your neighbor, let everyone take advantage of you — those were the only people who gave us rock. And when we loved somebody we supported them. We still do. We didn't give two shits about the peace, love and understanding that Elvis Costello evidently cares about so much.

From the metropolis in the middle of farm land, Mike Tinnes from WFBQ describes the Indianapolis rockers. "The people here who like 'Bent Rock' are real zealots — very active phone—wise and buying -wise especially during the first week after the album comes out. We do have a hard time getting mass acceptance. It's been a real learning process. If it isn't straight ahead rock then they are a little hesitant. I guess that's because even with its metropolitan areas the midwest has alot of farming communities with people who aren't as prone to trying something new. Relatively speaking, the kids compared to their parents are out in left field but it's still a whole lot different from being on either coast. The acts who have been around for a long time are the acts they know they can depend on so that's what they buy. With Heavy Metal I'm not so sure that they're as into the music as much as we think. For a Rush or Nugent concert I think they go because it's more of an event, not as much for the music itself." Peter Parisi is New Jersey born but has been working at KADI in St. Louis for 9

years. ''Missouri is the 'show me' state and the people have to be shown. They're not going to like something because the people in New York or L.A. think they should. They don't care. Besides, St. Louis is cut off from other cities. We're not influenced by Chicago or any other city. The city we're closest to musically and geographically is Kansas City which more or less dictates to the rest of Kansas the way we do to Missouri. We go as fast as we can but the people can only absorb so much at a time.


"The only real observation that can be made is that this is the party era. The whole world's falling apart, I can't get gas for my car next week, my money is worthless, it's hard to find good jobs, even if you have a job it's hard to pay your bills
— fuck it, I'm going to get stoned, drink
some cheap wine, take a qualude, smoke a joint — fuck everything and listen to Ted Nugent." In other words, who needs a heavy message? Life is heavy enough.

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
