EDITOR'S COMMENTS

"Tis the season" — the holiday time when we turn our attention to the good things in life. That's pretty easy if we focus on our caring radio-collecting community. In that context, we can easily find examples of folks helping each other with solutions to restoration problems, with research, with just plain give and take. An example is found in *Radio Miscellanea* where we learn about the generosity of fellow collectors to Pete Van Waesberge whose collection was a Katrina victim. Spontaneous giving is certainly a primary element of the holiday spirit.

Positive notes are also sounded in a story like the one in our lead article — the evolution of Mac MacQuarrie's museum over a 30-year period. This was a labor of love shared by Mac's wife. Her passing put the project on hold for a while, but Mac has reopened his expanded museum in the true spirit of a radio preservationist.

This museum is typical of many small, private museums where unusual sets are interspersed with the more commonly seen sets in homes of another era. Here collectors may gather to see not only high ticket items, but also sets more accessible to us all.

Such items are often the source of much pleasure to a collector, as illustrated by Richard Arnold's Emerson Model 25. This set is interesting because it turned the dying market for small radios around and made sales history in the depths of the Depression. The ordinary family could enjoy the new "compact" radio, which was even smaller than the "midget" models already available. Furthermore, though it plugged in, it "pretended" to be a portable, in that its accessory was a carrying case with a handle.

Speaking of ordinary families, we might call this our "back-to-basics issue," as the articles illustrate the pleasure derived from restoring and collecting some very basic sets. Richard Arnold's February '06 article on the GE HJ-624 prompted responses from both Neil Robar and Danny Schaffer on the GE HJ-618-AC. This set looks very much like the HJ-624, but it has a surprise under the lid — a 78 rpm turntable.

We don't often have articles on radio/phonograph table models perhaps because they are not particularly popular among collectors today. But, these sets were very popular in the homes of the late 1930s and 1940s, so again, it's interesting to tune in to what pleased regular folks in earlier times.

We report on two meets this month, both medium-sized, "down home" events. The success of both prove that you don't have to go to the big national events to enjoy all the elements of a good meet — contests, flea markets, banquets,

and auctions.

The Indiana Historical Radio Society has been around for 35 years and is obviously still going strong. The Spring Meet attracted 120 registered families, and the auction garnered over \$10,000 — a very good showing.

Drawing from a wider geographical area, MAARC's RadioActivity was equally successful. The theme of the meet was Emerson Radio and a highlight of the banquet was the keynote speaker — the daughter of Emerson founder Benjamin Abrams. The event organizers couldn't have known how much in keeping with the times this choice would be — a lady speaker.

Responding to comments of attendees last year, MAARC did some rearranging of events this year. The auction was on Saturday morning; however, this diminished participation in the flea market. Next year, they will try the auction in the afternoon. This flexibility in an attempt to improve an event and meet the needs of everyone is admirable and should be emulated by other organizations.

In a way, club events like those above have become modern-day Radio Rows where collectors can go to browse at a flea market and pick up information about acquiring parts or restoring a basketcase. A Radio Row memory in *Radio Miscellanea* takes us back to pre-9/11 days — an age when shopkeepers became personally involved with their customers who mourned their demise. Today we can get that same sense of camaraderie, almost of family, at a meet. I encourage you to attend one whenever you can.

COLLECTOR PROFILE

Mac's Old Time Radio Museum

When antique radio collectors are traveling, they welcome the discovery of a local museum and the opportunity to view someone else's collection. On your next trip to California, be sure to drop in on Mac MacQuarrie's newly reopened museum. (Editor)

Some years ago — October 1, 1989, to be exact — I began a radio museum inside the small antique and collectibles store my wife and I had ventured into when we took early retirement from the business world. Though we were both products of New England, we had moved to California in 1950 when I was a flight radio operator with a new commercial airline known as Transocean Airlines. Founded in 1946, the airline was based in Windsor, Connecticut, at what is still known as Bradley Field.

Radio was in my blood even before Transocean Airlines. During World War II, I had served in the U.S. Army Air Corp as a radio operator attached to the 15th AAF B-24 Bomber Squadron. After discharge in 1945, I attended Boston Radio and Television on the GI Bill. Then came the pursuit of a job.

Having heard that airline companies were advertising for flight radio operators, I thought I might qualify for such a job because of my Air Force experience. I also thought more education might be necessary. So, my wife and I took a gamble and moved with our young son to Kansas City where I could enroll in the Central Radio and TV Flight School.

The job with Transocean followed in 1949. Intercontinental flights, which required a radio operator using Morse Code and voice communications, made

up 95 percent of our business. Among the company's more memorable jobs was the airlift called the "Magic Carpet" which transported Jewish refugees to the new state of Israel. This operation involved several airlines manned by many World War II pilots and crew. Another such operation was the West Coast Korean War airlift. Airlines like Transocean all

made history, but it was not widely publicized, no doubt due to the political complexities of the times.

My flying career ended in 1953 when I was asked to return to the East Coast for a position at a New York base. Knowing that my job as a flight radio operator trained in Morse code communications would soon be a profession of the past, we decided to stay in California.

I switched professions entirely and went to work for the Prudential Life Insurance Co. from which I

took early retirement in 1975. Given my long history with radio, it was only natural that our retirement antique and collectible business would include radios.

THE GROWTH OF THE ANTIQUE RADIO MUSEUM

In the 1970s, I began buying and selling radios, many of which I brought back from Massachusetts. They were purchased at yard sales in my hometown of Charlton, Mass., and, of course, at the renowned Brimfield Swap Meet only 15 miles from Charlton. At the time, I wasn't skilled enough to do repairs, but I met an expert, Ray Cadell, at a swap meet in California. This is another small world story.

It turned out that Ray had been in the radio business in Brookfield, Massachusetts, in the 1930s. He had actually traveled the road by my family home in Charlton, but I never knew him until our chance encounter in California. I don't think there was much he didn't know about radios, and I learned

a lot about repair from him. He has since passed on at the age of 90.

As our antique and collectible business grew, I became more interested in preserving these radio gems of the past and decided to establish a museum. My wife was very supportive, and we put together a nice little collection of 150 radios, a few TVs, and some radio collectibles. These occupied an

area of 350 square feet in our newly leased building. Naturally, the major portion of the building had to be devoted to the antiques and collectibles that provided the income to sustain the business.

As the years moved on, we eventually purchased the building, thus removing the fear factor of having to move if the building was sold. With that out of the

way, we continued to expand. However, between July of 2002 and June 2006, the museum was closed, as my wife had passed away and plans for remodeling the building and setting up a new museum took time.

But, the new Mac's Old Time Radio Museum is now open. Visitors are welcome to see over 450 radios (400 in reserve); some early TVs; telegraph equipment; Air Force radios of World War II; radio pieces from my flight days in World War II, as well as in the commercial airline industry that became a thing of the past in the late 1950s; and some of my own accounts of the Magic Carpet Flights. All this is in a dedicated 1,500 sq. ft. area in our building.

I hope many A.R.C. readers will want to visit. My hours are 1 P.M. to 4:30 P.M., Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, or by appointment. Mac's Old Time Radios and Radio Museum is at 4335 W. 147th St., Lawndale, CA 90260. Bus.: (310) 675-6017; Eve.: (310) 674-5306.

WITH THE COLLECTOR

Emerson Model 25 World's Biggest Selling Little Radio

In this article, Richard Arnold describes the Emerson Model 25 compact radio and tells us how Emerson bet on a payoff from the production of compact sets in the Depression years. (Editor)

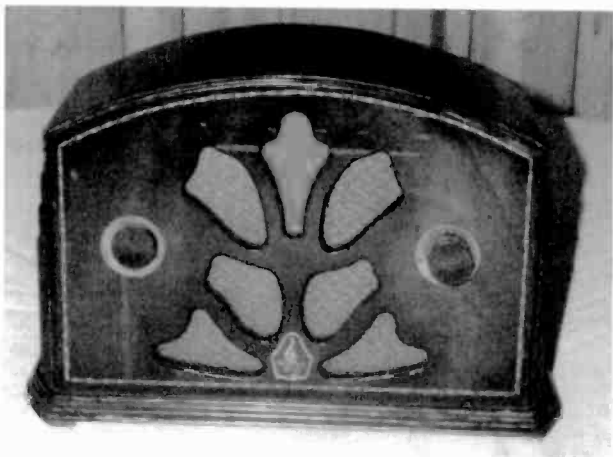


Figure 1. A front view of the Emerson Model 25.

From 1924 to 1932 Emerson Radio and Phonograph Corporation distributed radio receivers bearing the name "Emerson" through many diverse channels, including department and sporting goods stores. In 1932, Emerson began to specialize in small receiver sets for home use. One of these sets was the now very collectible and desirable Model 25, shown in Figure 1. This is the first truly compact radio.

The idea for this radio design came to Benjamin Abrams, president of Emerson, while looking at a clock or rather a clock case, handsomely styled, as style was understood in those days. A few attempts had previously been made to produce a set smaller than the "Midget," but nothing quite so small as the clock case. How could public confidence be inspired to buy such a hybrid?

The year is 1932 and the fortunes of small radio were at a low state. For some reason the midget sets — in those days, cathedral and tombstone receivers were considered midget sets — had failed to hold their own on the market and had lost public favor. Small radio manufacturers were folding about as fast as they had started. Some of the major compa-

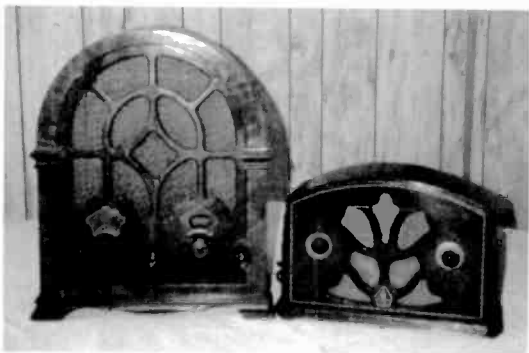


Figure 2. A comparison of the relative size of a Philco Model 70, left, a GE Model K-62 "Midget," center, and the Emerson Model 25 "Compact," right.

nies that produced consoles reluctantly continued their midget models to round out their product lines. For all practical purposes, research, engineering and promotion of small radios were dead.

EMERSON'S "NEW IDEA"

At this time Emerson attempted to make a radio smaller than the midget radios that were usually 18" x 15" x 9" in size. This "new idea" radio would be only 10" wide x 6½" high x 4" deep. The idea of squeezing a radio chassis, along with the tubes, speaker and everything else into a case this small was preposterous, to say the least.

Figure 2 compares the size of the "compact" Emerson 25, which is only 6½" high to my Philco Model 70 cathedral, and my GE-K-52 "midget" cathedral, 13" high. Compared to even the smaller cathedral, the difference is quite impressive.

No standard speakers, condensers, dials, coils or other components were available, nor were any of the suppliers of radio equipment very enthusiastic about making any. It was going to have to be a pioneering job, and Emerson engineers went ahead on their own and overcame many discouraging and seemingly insurmountable difficulties.

By doing so, they developed the first practical and popularly accepted "compact" radio

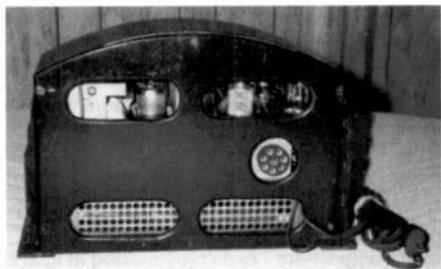


Figure 3. This rear view of the Emerson Model 25 shows its closely packed components.

receiver, measuring only 10" x 6½" x 4 ½". It has small brass discs behind the knobs; the one on the left says, "increase volume"; the one on the right says, "selector." The dial scale goes from 0 to 100. This set also has a wood inlay behind the knobs, while other versions have only a design behind the knobs and no inlay.

The 1932-1933 Model 25 is a 4-tube TRF (Tuned Radio Frequency) receiver. It uses a Type 39 tube as an RF amp, a Type 36 as a detector and 1st audio, a Type 38 as an audio output, and a Type 37 as a ½ wave rectifier wired with its grid and plate tied together. It uses a 5" electromagnetic speaker and weighs in at only six pounds, as compared to the twenty-five plus pound midgets. Figure 3 shows the tightly packed components. The price of the Model 25 was fixed at \$25. The going price

of other midget radios was around \$49.50.

RADIO AND MERCHANDISING HISTORY

With the design and production of the Model 25, Emerson made radio and merchandising history in that the first practical, popularly accepted "Compact" had come into being.

The Emerson Model 25 was presented to the public late in 1932 when the country was at the lowest depth of the Depression. Astounded dealers sold more than two hundred thousand Model 25s in 1932-1933. Orders poured in from all across the country, and for more than a year, orders were greater than production could sustain. Not until the middle of 1933 did production and sales come into balance on this one model alone.

Many manufacturers and dealers of the time considered Emerson's small radio a "Depression product," and thought that with the return of prosperity, sales would drop. Instead, sales of small radios climbed to even higher levels in the following years.

One of the many interesting developments, which immediately followed the introduction of the Compact, was a revived acceptance of the Midget. For several years both types, in varying sizes, enjoyed wide sales. Most of the small-set engineering, however, was devoted to the Compact, and the Midget gradually faded out of the picture. Some of the first Model 25s were even altered for 32- and 6-volt battery operation to respond to the growing demand for farm reception. The round half-dollar sized connector seen on the back of this radio's chassis was for the portable or DC operation option. This change may be where the Model 25A designation came from.

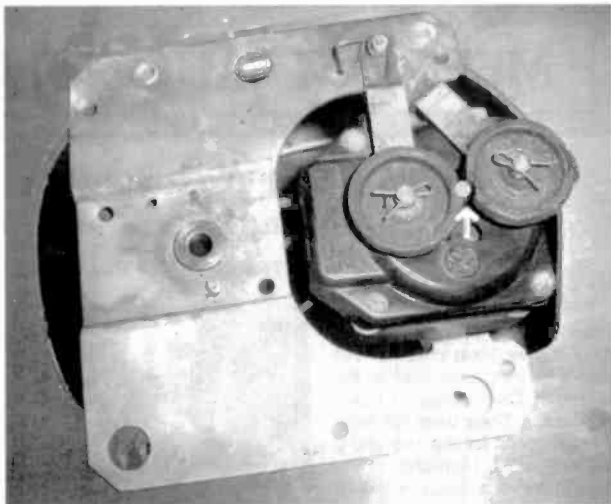


Figure 5. Obvious in this photograph is the need for rebuilding the deteriorating idler wheels (see arrow), typical of those found in old phonographs.

Just a little trivia here — Saks Fifth Avenue in New York, advertised and sold the radio as a "Unique" compact radio. The ad is reproduced as Figure 4. For an additional charge of only \$10, one could purchase an exclusive pigskin carrying case with a handle, shown in Figure 5. This item was available in the Sports Department on the seventh floor.

By 1935, total production at Emerson of all types of receivers was 5,500,000, of which 2,600,000 were small sets. All of the major radio manufacturers as well as distributors, dealers and the general public, had been forced to take small radio seriously.

For years one of Emerson's slogans was "World's Biggest Selling Little Radio." The company thinking was that it was small radio that built Emerson in the past and it would be so

again. "For in small radio the public has a larger variety of products for its choosing, greater value for less money—more easily utilized receivers—and sets for every purpose and every purse."

It is amazing that even though there were so many of these sets made, they are now hard to find. The Model 25 is a very popular radio today.

Well, this one is in my collection. I really do like the style and even more so the history of this small radio. I have it sitting on a table in my radio room where I can enjoy looking at it, and even better, enjoy listening to it.

A special thank you to Mr. Fielding Grigsby, a local collector/friend, for his charitable efforts in getting this radio working for me.

RESTORATION TOPICS

General Electric Model HJ-618-AC Radio/Phonograph Combination

One article frequently leads to another, and that's a very good thing for us collectors. Both Neil Robar and Danny Schafer were inspired by Richard Arnold's February 2006 article on the GE "Feather-Touch" Model HJ-624-AC radio only. Their Models HJ-618 look almost identical to Richard's Model HJ-624, but opening the lid of the HJ-618-AC reveals a compact 78 rpm phonograph, in addition to the standard broadcast radio.

Neil sent in photos of his restored set and added a few words of description.

Danny describes his restoration of the radio and the phonograph mechanism for this pre-war GE radio. (Editor)

GE MODEL HJ-618-AC BY NEIL F. ROBAR

The February 2006 issue of A.R.C. featured a short article on the General Electric Model HJ-624. This 1939-1940 radio was also produced as Model HJ-618-AC. Figures 1 and 2 show the two models. Though almost identical to the HJ-624 in outward design, the Model HJ-618-AC also included a small phonograph under a hinged top lid, as shown in Figure 3. In the phono arm is a switch that turns the phono on or off when the arm is raised or lowered.

I agree with Richard Arnold that the model he restored, as well as my restored model, are "good lookers." I too get a lot of positive comments when the set is shown.

Neil Robar has been interested in radio since the 1940s when his father gave him and his brother an old Howard to play with. They got it working and listened to stations all over the country. Serious collecting began 20 years ago, and

his pride and joy is a 1933 Majestic Model 344 lowboy, now fully restored and working. He is a member of the Jacksonville, Florida, Antique Radio Society.

G.E. MODEL HJ-618-AC BY DANNY SCHAFER

A client from my "real" job asked me to restore his aunt's old record player, which is the General Electric Model HJ-618-AC radio-phonograph, shown in Figure 4. The unit appeared to have been stored in an attic for many long years.

What I found interesting about this set is the opening at the back of the unit to accommodate the diameter of a 10" record disc. When a record is placed on the platter, a small portion of it sticks out of the rear. The phonograph can be played with the lid down, completely hiding the phonograph operation.

Just as interesting is the large lollipop looking tonearm, which is additionally a 3-position function switch. When the radio is playing, the rear of the tonearm is stowed in the pushed-down position; pulling up on the rear of the tone arm switches the audio input from radio to phonograph. Swinging the tonearm toward the spindle switches on the phono motor. Therefore, to operate the phonograph, you must pull the tonearm up and swing it toward the edge of the record. Luckily, the switch contacts were in good condition when I acquired this set, and Rider has a great illustration of the assembly.

This radio/phonograph design is an inexpensive unit, circa 1939/40, but of decent quality. Certainly the designers of this set did not expect or even want it to survive and properly operate into the 21st century. However, here's one that made it and is surviving well.

THE RADIO RESTORATION

Evaluating the radio, I found that the line cord insulation crumbled off when moved and flexed, and the dual idler wheels were totally dry rotted and sort of form melted around the motor capstan, shown in Figure 5.

I did not even bring the thing up on a Variac. I just went ahead with the recapping, tube testing, alignment and replacement of the chassis wiring that had crumbling insulation. In general, the radio restoration was easy with no difficult surprises.

THE PHONOGRAPH RESTORATION

This was my very first phono restoration, which I started in April 2004. It took me until late summer to finish it completely. I did nothing to the cabinet. But, with my slight apprehension about and inexperience with phonographs, and having no way to make new idler wheels, let alone rebuild the cartridge, I farmed the job out to an expert — Gib at West-Tech, Smithville, West Virginia. The phonograph was not a unit from my own collection, and I wanted to return it in good working order to my client.

The on/off/volume switch was stuck in the on position, and I could not get a signal out of the cartridge; even the #44 pilot lamp was burned out. I sent the motor assembly, volume switch and car-

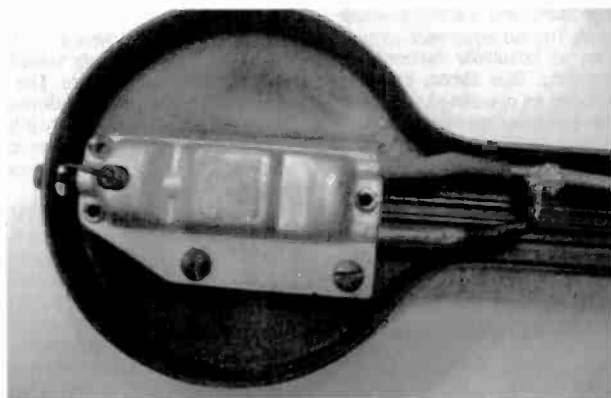


Figure 6. A view of the rebuilt phono cartridge mounted in the pick-up arm.

tridge to Gib, who was able to correct all these problems expertly. I give my biggest thanks to Gib. He provided new idler tires, cleaned and lubed the motor, rebuilt the cartridge, fixed the power switch, and even replaced the leads in the tonearm — all at very reasonable cost. Figure 6 shows the rebuilt phono cartridge.

After I had reinstalled the motor with its nice new rubber wheels, the motor played too slowly. After reexamination and some head scratching, a good friend and I heard a very slight dragging sound (he has good ears). The problem turned out to be a cardboard insulator from the motor field winding that was rubbing the motor rotor as it rotated. This caused enough drag to slow the motor down slightly and thus affected the record pitch. We snipped off the offending stray piece of cardboard to allow the rotor to rotate freely. That corrected the slow play condition, which had been very easy to miss.

Everything on the unit was working properly. I was a little concerned about the crackling and the heated dust smell (like from a furnace being turned on for the first time in the fall) from the ballast tube. So far it does not seem to affect anything and is probably a normal condition, especially since the set had been asleep for several decades. After I had used the radio for a few days, the dial string gave way. I'm glad it happened while on my bench rather than after the return to the owner.

Part of the success of this restoration is the fact that the unit was never worked on before — I got to be the first one in there. Everything down to the tubes appeared original. It may have even been stored away when it was last used and working, and then forgotten about for a very long time. Also, having good experts to do the more specialized restoration, such as Gib at West-Tech to handle phonograph motors and cartridges, made a major difference.

I think a hot dry attic is better than a damp basement for these wonderful radio finds.

IHRS 35th Annual Spring Meet Kokomo, Indiana — May 5-6, 2006

The Indiana Historical Radio Society (IHRS) presented its 35th annual Spring Meet in May of this year. The meet was held at the Johanning Civic Center in Kokomo, Indiana. There were 120 family registrations for the one and a half day event. Highlights of the meet included a Swap 'n Sell of vintage radios; a radio repair seminar on testing vintage vacuum tubes, led by Ed Dupart; an old equipment contest; an awards luncheon; and a large auction of vintage radio and electronic equipment. The old equipment contest had many fine entries, all beautifully restored with several of them operating. Blue ribbon, first place contest winners included an operating Lyric table radio presented by Bob Sands; a Carco crystal radio by Dr. Ed Taylor; an Indiana-made radio by Robert Avey; and a homebrew 3-tube regenerative receiver by Jack LaVelle. The annual Founders Award "Best of Show" plaque was presented to Fred Prohl for his 1920s Radio Art entry.

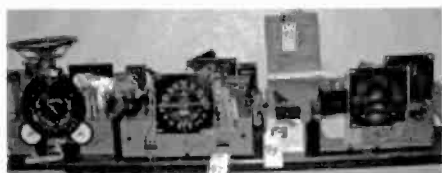

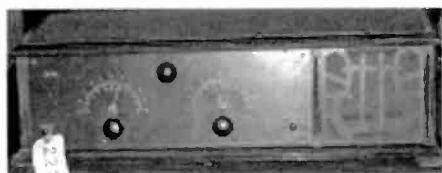

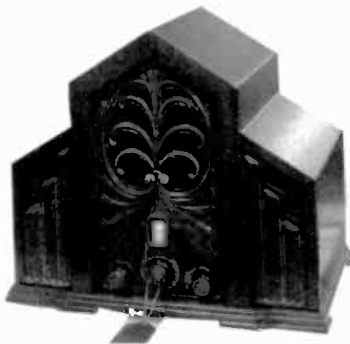
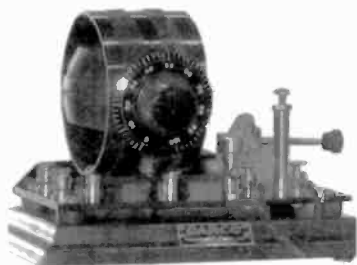

MAARC RadioActivity 2006 Beltsville, Maryland — June 9-10, 2006

The Mid-Atlantic Antique Radio Club (MAARC) held its annual collectors' meet, Radioactivity, June 9-10, 2006, at the Sheraton College Park Hotel in Beltsville, Maryland. The theme of the meet was Emerson Radio.

Flea marketing was the main event Friday morning, and the weather was as great as it had been last year. Vendors attended from as far north as New Hampshire and from as far south as Florida. All types of equipment were offered at bargain prices, and some not so bargain prices.

Bruce Mager of Waves brings a wonderful selection of items from New York, and the DeLorians brought their nice assortment which included thousands of knobs. Joe Milano was also there with his gorgeous selection of cathedral and tombstone radios. The prices were reasonable with at least one Emerson "Patriot" plastic radio selling for \$500, an Emerson "Aristocrat" for \$350, a Coronado "Jewel" little Bakelite set for \$150, a Zenith 705 wood mantel set for \$125, a Westinghouse Aenola Sr. for \$150, a Zenith 311 for \$130, and a Zenith 312 for \$130.

A red Grebe "Challenger" also traded hands at \$120, as well as a DeWald A-501 Catalin radio for \$180. There were numerous high-end plastic and transistor sets for sale, including a Sparton 557 "Sled" offered at \$2,500. There was also trading in parts and junker sets, and all-in-all, there was something for everyone.

SEMINARS AND CONTEST

Several seminars were planned for the afternoon out of the heat, and they were well attended. Ed Lyon's repair seminar is so popular that we have to schedule it last so the seats don't get filled up an hour early. It has been requested that we extend this repair class beyond the current hour and a half.

Another seminar was given by MAARC's own Steve McAllister on "Collecting Vintage Hi-Fi Equipment." The number of audio collectors is growing, and we opened this subject up to encourage others to get involved in saving and restoring these sets.

While this talk was going on,

the judges were evaluating the entries in the old equipment contest. Once again, it took over two hours to judge the items because of the number and quality of the entries. The "Best of Show" award this year went to Gary Alley for his display of a Presto Model K Disc Recorder, with accessories and related paraphernalia. The "People's Choice" award went to Steve Hansman for his superbly restored early Emerson console.

THE BANQUET

The Friday night banquet turned out to be the highlight of the meet. Brian Belanger, vice president of AWA and a leading authority and collector of Emerson radios, gave a presentation on the history and success of the Emerson Company. Key to the company's success was the vision of Benjamin Abrams who bought the company in 1922 when it was still making phonographs.

Brian invited the guest of honor, Ben Abrams' daughter, Cynthia Abrams Hochman, to speak. She talked about life in the Emerson household and how everyone in the family was involved in the business. Most of the "celebrities" in the Emerson ads were family members and friends. She also told the story of how the Emerson 888 got its numbers.

To go along with the Emerson story, Rod Matzko put together a remarkable, museum quality collection of Emerson radios and ephemera ranging from the common to the rare. Items were

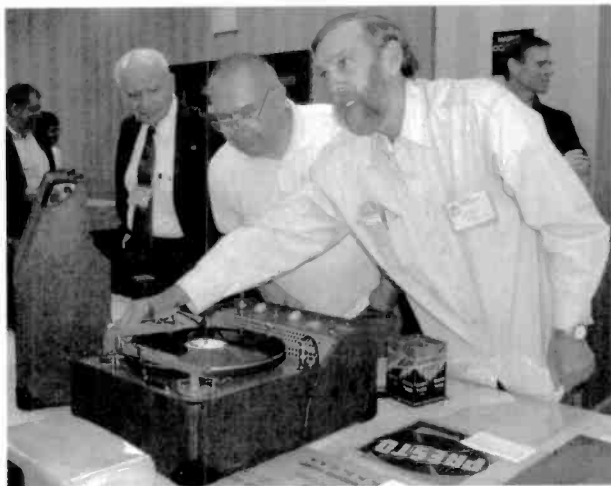
borrowed from a number of MAARC members' collections and placed around the room on custom display shelves he had built. It was a memorable experience.
