

#### **EDITOR'S COMMENTS**

Calling all writers! The requests keep coming in for articles on a whole range of topics — from radio repair and restoration, audio, history, TV — you name it, and A.R.C. relies on you to fill those requests. Some of you may not realize that all our articles are contributed by your fellow collectors. The work of several longtime contributors like Daniel Schoo, Ray Chase, Dave Crocker, Ray Bintliff, Richard Arnold and many others may have become familiar to you. In more recent years, we've welcomed Phil MacArthur, Andrew Hayden, Paul Turney, and others on board. But the welcome mat is out there for all of you.

To begin with, do not think that you have to be a master writer. We have an editorial staff to help shape the article, guidelines to send you, and if necessary, we can tackle your grammar and spelling. Write about what you know — just be sure of your facts, as we rely on you for accuracy. The fun lies in giving a topic your own personal twist, not just directly from a book, but a different outlook that will appeal to a general audience.

Second, do not think that any subject has been exhausted. There is always a new perspective, even on an Atwater Kent breadboard, a Philco 90, or whatever you have acquired and find interesting. If you happen upon an obscure auction, there may be something there worth writing about. If you acquire a new radio and research it carefully, or if you do a repair or restoration and record the process with photos, you have an article. The possibilities are limitless.

One note of caution — please do not attempt to "lay out" your article with the photos embedded in the text as if ready for placement in the magazine. Always submit the text and photos separately. Leave the rest to us.

I must emphasize that good photos are essential to enhancing an article. If you are not a photographer, enlist the help of a friend with a high resolution camera to achieve photos of one megapixel or better. He or she might like to see those photos published. Both the article and the photos can be submitted by e-mail, but you may also send the text, prints and negatives via U.S. mail.

Photos could, in fact, be the inspiration for an article. Our lead article on Britain's Lizard Wireless Station by a new writer — A.R.C. staff member Bobby Lyman — is a good example. Like Bobby, you might be on vacation and come across something that is radio-related or a place that is steeped in radio history. A few photos, a few brochures, a little research, and you have an article.

Of course, there are simpler ways to be a contributor. One is to send photos of your latest find or an intriguing mystery set to *Photo Review*. Another is to respond to an article or to seek information through Radio Miscellanea.

We can always rely on Phil MacArthur for good photos, as shown in his latest article on hand-wired table sets. Phil's surprise discovery when he opened the seemingly commonplace set reminded me of my own collector maxims — always look beyond the panel, and if you see a closed box in an antique shop, always open it.

As mentioned earlier, Phil is among our relatively new bank of writers. Adding Bobby Lyman and Dale Boyce to the "new" list, we have a variety of contributing writers this month. Dale's report on the Dick Bury estate auction Part 1 by Estes Auctions is an excellent presentation. Because this was, in Dale's words, "a battery set collector's dream auction," a battery set collector myself, I naturally had to attend, and I did contribute to the report. However, the major work is Dale's. He tabulated the results which totaled over \$200,000.

The quality of Dale's auction report is a reminder of the value of auction reports in general. They are more than just set values at a given time. In particular, they are vehicles for presenting photos of unusual sets that show up at such events. Examples at the Bury auction are the RPM Atwater Kent breadboard type units, a Zenith ZEV portable set, and an early Fleming valve. Again, photos are a way for us to serve you better.

At the risk of repeating myself, I urge you to contribute to A.R.C. in the form of an article so that others in the radio collecting community can share in your considerable knowledge. In short, you are this magazine.



# The Lizard Wireless Station The Oldest Surviving Wireless Station in the World

Even on vacation, A.R.C. staff members can't help being alert to radio-related topics along the way. Bobby Lyman and her husband made a fall 2008 hiking trip to Comwall, England, and brought home the following story for our readers. (Editor)

In the middle of nowhere on a coastal path in Lizard, Cornwall, England, we came upon the site of the oldest surviving Marconi station in the world. This strategic location high on a coastal bluff was ideal for transmissions. The unassuming sign is




Figure 2. A bust of Marconi reminds visitors of the wireless pioneer who made radio practical.

shown in Figure 1. Inside, Marconi still has a presence in the form of the small bust shown in Figure 2.

First, here is a bit of background. Marconi began his experimentation with electromagnetic radiation in 1894 at his home in Italy. His idea was to take the work of previous experimenters like James Clark Maxwell and Heinrich Hertz and make a form of practical communication without wires. By 1895, his

transmission range had reached 2.4 km.

Italian authorities did not support his work, so at the age of 21, Marconi moved to a more supportive environment in Britain in 1895-1896. In 1897, Marconi formed the Wireless Telegraph and Signal Company, Ltd., to develop the equipment commercially. The range of transmission increased over the next few years, but the Navy was his only customer.

In 1900, Marconi founded the Marconi International Marine Communication Company, Ltd., to increase business. The company leased wireless telegraph equipment to ship owners and put operators on board. The plan was to build eight coastal stations to communicate with the ships, the first of which was the Lizard Wireless Station.

#### THE LIZARD WIRELESS STATION

Built in 1900, the Lizard Wireless Station, shown in Figure 3, consisted of two modest wood huts, one for equipment and one for living quarters, plus a 38-meter mast, the support for long wire aerials. By 1903, an electric generator and electric light had been installed, but dry batteries provided power for the equipment at first.

At the Lizard, Marconi worked to prove horizons would not be a barrier with the curved earth surface in transmissions. He developed circuit components called "jiggers" to act as filters in transmitters and receivers and to allow tuning to a desired transmitter. Before this, with receivers open on a wide frequency band, messages got garbled.




Figure 5. A close-up of the tape register.




Figure 6. A 1901 photo of the original wireless station equipment.

On display at the Lizard is a recreation of the wireless station, as shown in Figure 4. A closeup of the tape register is shown in Figure 5. Figure 6 is a 1901 photo of the equipment. Another type of detector invented by Marconi in the days of wireless — the magnetic detector — is shown in Figure 7.

The Telegraph Acts of 1868 and 1869 had given the post office a monopoly on messages sent by telegraph, but wireless was not a consideration then. However, privately owned systems for personal use were allowed a loophole. Nevertheless, the post office took over the Lizard in 1908-1909. Its location gave the Lizard the first contact with ships after long voyages and 1910-1913 was a busy time. The station closed in 1913 when a new station near Land's End opened. The Lizard reopened in 1914-1918 for war-related work, but closed again in 1920. In 2001, the National Trust reopened the Lizard as an operating station, recognizing its importance in wire-(Continued on following page)

less history. The Lizard Station website is www.lizardwireless.org.

#### MORE ON EARLY STATIONS

Early 1900 station equipment included the transmitter (a 10-inch induction coil with an interrupter, which produced a spark); capacitors (Leyden jars); an aerial transformer (or jigger); a coherer receiver; a Morse inker; a mast; and Earthing (buried metal plates).

Originally all Marconi stations used call signs to reflect their locations. The Lizard was LD, nearby Poldhu was PD, etc. Two letters became inadequate and Marconi stations added on an "M". Thus The Lizard station became MLD. Later post office ownership changed the call sign to GLD. Today the Amateur Radio Club at Lizard uses GB2LD for special events.

The Poldhu station, built 10 km away from the Lizard, was a high-power, large-aerial station. The two stations were connected by a telegraph wire, but did wireless transmission experimentation between themselves, working to prove that several stations might be able to operate in close proximity.

The various stations discovered problems as they began service. "SOS" was introduced in 1906 at the Berlin Wireless Telegraphy Convention. Distress signals were sent in 1908 and 1909, but no coastal stations got involved.

On April 18, 1910, the Lizard recorded and acted upon an "SOS SOS" call from the *Minnehaha* after it had gone aground. Communication went both ways, and a lifeboat began rescue.

The problems that surfaced included the ship's using the wrong frequency so that reception was difficult. The nearby Poldhu station was scheduled to begin news and weather broadcasts five minutes after the distress call, and communications between the Lizard and the Minnehaha were jammed during the 45-minute long broadcast. This exposed the fact that interference issues with adjacent signals had not been completely resolved.

The post office had paid a large amount for a station at Bolt Head to replace the Lizard, but the Bolt Head station heard nothing at all. Its location

was not geographically as suitable as the Lizard's.

Near the Lizard station is Lloyd's Signal Station, shown in Figure 8. Originally the Lizard received signals from merchant ships as they passed the coastal station. Lizard operators used landline telegraph to London to reassure the shippers who insured cargo with Lloyds that the ocean crossing had been successful.

Also nearby today is the Marconi Center in Poldhu Cove, open to the public. It hosts the Poldhu Amateur Radio Club and has exhibits and a video presentation. Web: www.gb2gm.org. The Porthcurno Telegraph Museum (also called the Porthcurno Museum of Submarine Telegraphy) is open year round with displays and hands on exhibits. Web: www.porthcurno.org.uk

The beautiful coastal path in Cornwall is reason enough to visit this section of England, but the connections to past telegraph history are an added bonus.

#### More on Philco 37-620 Restoration

Dear Editor:

I read A.R.C. from cover to cover each month and a few times afterwards. The Philco restoration article in the August 2008 issue threw up a flag. Replacing an electrodynamic speaker with a permanent magnet speaker seems sacrilegious to me. A "Want" ad in A.R.C. probably would have resulted in several offers; at least, it has done that for me a couple of times. There are a lot of very helpful restorers who read A.R.C. out there. However, the method described to calculate the field coil resistance was on the money.

In addition to the A.R.C. comment about replacing the 6F6 with a 6L6, I would add that a 6L6 draws 0.2 amps more filament current, further overloading the power transformer.

Since originality doesn't seem to be a factor here in this case, perhaps a couple of heat sinks attached to the power transformer and a fan are in order to give it a fighting chance. No criticism intended.

# WITH THE COLLECTORS

# Hand-Wired Radios in the Late 1960s

#### BY PHIL MACARTHUR

Never dismiss a seemingly insignificant radio out of hand. Phil MacArthur describes how he learned that lesson. (Editor)

Most of us spend a fair bit of time shopping for radios — on eBay, at flea markets, through radio meets and yard sales, and, of course, A.R.C. Our eyes are well trained to spot even a square inch of a Federal, a Catalin, a Trans-Oceanic, a reverse painted transistor. Not as much as a mental note is wasted on those boxy, ugly, AM/FM and clock radios from the 1960s and up. Will anyone ever want to collect those??!

So when my wife brought a cheap looking AM/FM table set




Figure 2. A bottom view of the Zenith, chassis No. 8NT121,

she found at the Salvation Army store for a buck, I wondered how I could tactfully explain to her that it wasn't a tube model and was therefore not worth anything. I planned to talk about how price competition had resulted in flimsy PC boards and poor workmanship. As part of the lesson, I popped the

back off — and dropped my jaw. Inside was a steel chassis, completely hand-wired with socketed transistors and all U.S. components.




Figure 3. A rear view of the chassis, No. 8NT121. The model ID is stamped on the chassis tab, lower right.

This was a Zenith chassis #8NT121 (model tag missing) with date codes from February 1966. Figure 1 shows a front view of the set. Figures 2 and 3 show bottom and rear views of the chassis. I had thought that once Zenith adopted the PC board for the Royal 500B in 1957 that the only remaining hand-wired steel chassis products were the Inter-Oceanic (through 1970) and the Trans-Oceanic (through 1982) lines — the high-priced stuff.

#### MORE 1960S MODELS

I started buying more 1960s Zenith AM/FM transistor table sets to see just how long Zenith continued this ideal. I found a Model X480, an AM/FM/clock set with chassis No. 8XT22, date coded June 1967, identical to the above No. 8NT121.

Next came a Model Z476, chassis No. 8ZT18, AM/FM/clock radio, date coded April 1968, with a printed circuit riveted to a steel chassis, but with a separate handwired FM sub-chassis. There are no transistor sockets in this one.




Figure 5. A view of the Zenith Model A411 chassis.

Next came a Model A411, shown in Figure 4. This is an AMV FM with chassis No. 8AT18, date coded September 1969, with the heavy PC board riveted into a steel chassis. However, this one has soldered Motorola transistors and Japanese capacitors, and the FM front end is on the PC board with the rest of the circuitry. Figure 5 shows a chassis view of the set. You can tell that by 1970, engineering was beginning to lose the battle with the bean counters.

I haven't yet found any examples from 1970 or 1971, but by the time the Model E414 AM/FM appeared in 1972, production had moved to Korea, the steel chassis was gone, and all parts were from Japan.

I'd like to find the model number of that radio in Figure 1 with the No. 8NT121 chassis. Perhaps other manufacturers had similar heavy-duty, hand-wired units in their product lines. I guess we're all going to have to search a little more slowly through the markets — there are some real sleepers out there in those unassuming polystyrene boxes.

# Estes Auctions — Dick Bury Collection Part 1 Burbank, Ohio — September 17, 2007

The first part of the great collection of the late Dick Bury was auctioned on September 15, 2007, at the Expo Auction Center in Burbank, Ohio. Once again Richard Estes and his crew did an excellent job of organizing and moving things along. Total proceeds were an impressive \$208,360.

The quality of the items in Dick's collection was outstanding. Dick and his wife Mary were well-known in the radio community, which has lost a true friend and a devoted collector.

This auction was an early battery set and wireless collector's dream. The collection was very complete and comprehensive almost every major manufacturer was represented. Needless to say, your editor could not miss it and was happily rewarded by some nice items.

The highlight among the early wireless items was the rare Marconi 106B receiver, which sold for \$24,000. Among an array of a little more common but still

rare wireless sets were an IP501A, selling at \$5,000, and an even rarer matching IP503 antenna tuner, which was a bargain at \$1,400. Other manufacturers, such as Nesco, Wireless Specialty, DeForest, and Murdock also brought good prices.

All the important manufacturers of early battery sets were represented. Over a dozen Atwater Kent breadboards sold for up to \$2,500. A Golden Leutz 9 sold for \$2,100, indicating continued interest in a set that since has warranted two follow-up articles to Dan Schoo's October 2007 article on the subject.

It's rare to see Neutrowounds in all three colors available in one place. The rarest in red sold for \$3,100. Among the other offerings was a Federal Model 61 selling at \$875; a rare Zenith ZEV portable at \$7,500; a Grebe RORA at \$3,100, and a Sodion receiver with both amplifiers at \$3,400. The list goes on to include Adams Morgan, Cutting & Washington, Amrad, Kennedy, RCA, and Clapp-Eastham.

Dick also had an exceptional number of speak-

ers, over 40, in fact, selling for as much as \$3,100. Among the manufacturers represented were Federal, Music Master, Auto-Hom, Magnavox, Amplion, Westem Electric, and Mesco.

An unusual selection of vacuum tubes brought solid prices, including a DeForest Audion selling at \$2,000 and a Fleming valve selling at \$3,000. A large number of individual Atwater Kent breadboard parts were sold, as well as similar but rarer RPM breadboard parts. A large selection of books and magazines were also offered.

In all, this was an outstanding auction and most attendees looked forward to Part 2 a couple of months later.


