AMATEUR VIOLATIONS MAY BRING RESTRICTIONS

SEVERE restriction of amateur radio activities, reversing the policy of giving the utmost freedom to amateur operators to which this country has been committed for years, threatens as a result of an increasing wave of violations of the radio regulations.

The use by amateurs of other operators' call letters as a means of evading penalties for off-frequency operations while adjusting transmitters and the broadcasting of phonograph programs are the two violations most frequently reported to the radio division of the Department of Commerce, which is now giving serious consideration to drastic revision of the regulations unless insubordination ceases.

The more than 20,000 amateurs of the country, many of whom have played prominent parts in times of emergency, face the loss of many of the privileges they now enjoy because of the illegal activities of a small percentage of their number, believed chiefly to be comprised of operators who have only comparatively recently received their licenses and who are either not familiar with, or do not care about, the self-policing policy of the amateur fraternity, according to officials in Washington.

"The using of call signals other than those assigned to a station is a serious offense," Director William D. Terrell, head of the radio division, points out, "and those who use

the call signals of another are working a hardship upon fellow amateurs. A large number of amateurs have written in to the radio division protesting that they were not using their sets at the times they were said to be off frequency. There is a possibility that innocent amateurs may lose their licenses as a direct result of the unsportsmanlike conduct of others who 'bootleg' station call signals.

"A number of cases have also come to my attention recently where amateurs have transmitted phonograph record music for more than an hour without either establishing contact with another station or breaking the transmission at frequent intervals to announce the station call and location. The use of phonograph records is permitted for testing purposes by a station which has established contact with another station, but not for the purpose of providing 'entertainment.'

Rebellion against the comparatively few restrictions which surround amateur operation in this country, it is warned, may serve to center upon America the attention of other nations which do not look with favor upon the freedom the United States Government has extended to amateurs, and may result in definite efforts at the forthcoming international radiotelegraph conference at Madrid to limit amateur operations materially.

The choice of musical selections has been noted as quite excellent and dialers, especially femmes, are learning to shop by radio with more confidence than ever before.

• • • For several years—five to be exact—Dell Raymond of KJBS has arranged and produced benefit shows for the pleasure and enjoyment of inmates of hospitals and various state institutions.

He is working hard on "Colorado Skies" and "Waltz Recipe" and, true to the profession, admits they are hit tunes.

• • • Mlle. Marie Viratelle, KFSD staff soprano, was graduated from the National Conservatory of Music in Paris with the highest honors in her class. She was decorated by the French Government for her

services during the World War. Mlle. Viratelle sings with the outdoor organ at Balboa Park, San Diego, and is heard on the Around the Network broadcasts over the NBC Chain.

• • • Seldy Roach, veteran character actor who is a member of NBC's National Players, is going about with a dreamy look these days.

"Trying to think up names for my babies," he explains. "I've got four new arrivals out at the house, and they're not christened yet."

The "babies" are tiny balls of yellow feathers—newly hatched canaries, whose parents Seldy also raised from babyhood. He always names each canary in his aviary, and most of them recognize their own names when he calls them.

When she took her next bow they were on either side, also carrying violins and bowing.

• • • John Grover, a young graduate of the University of California who is to give a course in the public-speaking department this summer, is to play a most difficult lead as Faustus, the scholar in Marlowe's "Faustus," Sunday evening, April 10, with the Eight O'Clock Players over K LX. Everett Glass has directed Grover in many previous plays. John has had a large number of leading comic rôles, proving what a thoroughly worth while player he is. But this part of Faustus is different—very different—and will call into play all that John has gained from his radio experience.

• • • Velva Darling, the versatile young lady who conducts her radio column, "Hollywood Brevities," over KNX each Monday, Wednesday and Friday, has had several years' experience as a newspaper woman.

Two weeks after plucking her sheepskin from the president's hand at Stanford gradu-

ating services, Velva was receiving \$20 a week as a reporter for a San Francisco newspaper. One of her first assignments was to cover the Santa Barbara earthquake.

Later she wrote for the Hearst Syndicate, including more than fifty newspapers, with a circulation of 2,000,000. It was this column, entitled "Sometimes I Think Yes, and Sometimes I Think No," which won for her an international reputation as a "Modern Girl Philosopher."

• • • Oakland welcomes a new radio advertising agency headed by Frank Wright, formerly Oakland manager of the Pickwick Broadcasting Corporation, who was for three years in charge of KTAB's activities in the East Bay.

Frank Wright and associates have opened extensive offices in the Alameda County Title Insurance Company Building, Suites 417 and 418.

• • • The depression is on for Hap and Jack, KYA's rapid-fire song writers. While the boys were away playing a theater engagement a couple of weeks ago, someone placed a ladder against the window of Hap's apartment and casually ransacked the place, helping themselves to all valuables with a lavish hand. "The only thing they didn't get," says Hap, "is our song-writing idea, and we had that with us." Hap is particularly anxious for the return of a \$105 electric clock, so that he can get to the studio on time. As his wrist-watch also joined the missing, times are indeed hard.

• • • Fifteen hundred books and fifteen thousand musical compositions compose the \$8,000 library of Irma Glen, Chicago NBC organist. Incidentally, her librarian, who is the niece of Chauncey Parsons, well-known Chicago NBC tenor, has taken charge to further her musical education.

• • • Morton Downey challenges other radio artists to boast of a busier day than one which he recently encountered. In one twenty-four hour period he appeared on the vaudeville stage four times, took part in two benefit performances, one of which required him to journey to Yonkers, sang in two broadcasts and made news reels and still pictures with former Governor Al Smith. After it was all over, instead of going home for some well-earned sleep, he rehearsed for his next day's radio activities.

• • • Parker Fennelly, who plays "John Stebbins" in the NBC's Stebbins Boys sketches, says the most hectic experience in his stage career occurred in Meridian, Mississippi, when he played "Macduff" without rehearsing for the part. The actor cast for the rôle failed to arrive. The same fate befell the scenery, and the whole of "Macbeth" was presented in a parlor set.

• • • Tony Colucchio, whose brother Ralph does the modulating on the Boswell Sisters' program, is also a guitarist. He reports that both he and his brother studied to be violinists but when radio came along, they both took up guitaring. Tony is collecting autographs on his instrument of all celebrities who take part in the same program in which he is performing.

• • • Fred Yeates, of the KFI-KECA writing staff, says he was born on July 4, and has been "fighting for freedom ever since." He started out as a bass singer and organist, gravitating to secretarial work for several famous writers, including Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, went on the stage and finally became a newspaper reporter. In August, 1914, he accompanied the Fourth Lancers of the British cavalry corps in France and was sabered by an Uhlan who objected to being lanced. He has traveled everywhere, is single, and lists his hobbies as "life and love."

• • • Gerda Lundberg and Wint Cotton (Mr. and Mrs. Cotton), formerly of KTAB, are singing over a southern station—and still shaking the rice from their clothes. They were married here recently.

• • • Thelma Brown, popular KFRC Golden State Blue Monday Jamboree star, is one of the few negro women singers on the air. She is a graduate of the University of California and received many honors in her majoring subject, public speaking. Her father is a Baptist minister and is now teaching training at the Chicago Negro Christian Center.

• • • Bing Crosby, who will return to the New York Paramount Theatre after a run of eight weeks at the Brooklyn Paramount, has received offers from half a dozen large movie concerns to make a new series of shorts. Bing expects to sign a contract with one of these organizations within the next two weeks.

Mister and Missus Jack Spratt are we.

SILHOUETTES

ALEX GRAY, Columbia's baritone of "Music That Satisfies," first discovered the value of his voice on the high seas. His vocalizing with a deckhands' quartet won him a dinner in the skipper's cabin of a British merchantman.

The Chesterfield star then was a rugged young seaman, bound 'round the world with a college chum. They never reached the road to Mandalay. The pair jumped from the poop deck to the parlors of Britain. There they tried to sell exciting stereoscopes that took one "around the world in your sitting room." But Britons cared nothing about seeing Niagara Falls pictured in three dimensions. Gray, stranded, came home in the stoke-hole.

The same folk who once refused Alex Gray's picture-scopes later deserted their parlors to view him as a star of talking pictures. Copybooks are insistent regarding the rolling-stone business, but Alex has confounded them. His life has been as varied as his rôles in song.

Gray deserted early success in business to hitch-hike to Broadway. He left the advertising management of a Chicago motor truck firm and headed over the highways to New York, camping en route. Alex knew no one on Broadway, but had heard of Flo Ziegfeld. He camped on Ziegfeld's stoop for days.

His persistence won an audition before Ziegfeld and Gene Buck. Alex thereafter deserted the life of sales and costs for songs and choruses.

He swept through Ziegfeld's Frolics and Follies to stardom on the musical stage and screen—with Marilyn Miller in "Sally," with Mitzi in "Naughty Riquette," with Bernice Claire in "The Desert Song."

Gray leaped overnight from a one-song spot in the Follies to leading man in "Sally." He

had never played a full rôle on the stage before. Tours with these and other favorite operettas soon swept him to Hollywood, where he sang romantic rôles in color pictures while powerful lights burned his eyes, singed his hair and melted his vest buttons.

Alex hasn't been without his ups and downs. He recalls early days when, as the dashing "Red Shadow" of "The Desert Song," he tripped with the heroine (Bernice Claire) in his arms and sprawled down the stairs. Encouraged

to develop privately the horsemanship associated with the same character, Gray returned to the footlights with his hand in splints. He had broken a finger while bouncing in the saddle.

Before Alex Gray turned to the life of song, he had picked tobacco in the fields of Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. . . . milked eighteen cows daily as a dairy hand . . . peddled pots and pans, washed dishes and fired furnaces for his schooling . . . graduated as an industrial engineer from Pennsylvania State College.

Gray first sang as a member of the college glee club and in dramatic productions at Penn State. He received a Bachelor of Science degree, shipped to sea with a fraternity brother, and returned to take the first job at hand.

The singer had been encouraged by Mme. Louise Homer, opera star, and sought any kind of work that gave him spare time for vocal study. He taught carpentry and wood turning in a boys' school. He wrote technical articles on the editorial staff of "Iron Age," trade journal. He taught at Northwestern Military and Naval Academy.

In these early years, the Federation of Musical Clubs cited Gray as an outstanding young singer. Concert and recital work followed, but Gray did not find them lucrative enough. He joined the Diamond-T Truck Company of Chicago, studied motors, and computed costs. He became promotion and advertising manager before Broadway lured him from business.

Alex Gray was born at Wrightsville, Pa., of Scotch-American ancestry. He is the sixth son of six generations to be named Alexander Pringle Gray. His grandfather migrated from Linliphgow, near Glasgow.

Gray's father today is associated with a Philadelphia publishing house. The elder Gray is a basso, and has sung in churches and oratorios of the Quaker City. Alex, Jr., was reared and schooled in Baltimore and Philadelphia.

The Chesterfield baritone has blue eyes and brown hair. He weighs 165 pounds and is five feet ten and one-half inches tall. Gray is single, strikingly modest and handsome, and puts himself vigorously into his songs. Alex divides his time between his Long Island home, the studios, and the life of a young clubman.

THE rise of Mary Charles to radio stardom was a perfectly conventional series of auditions and successful try-outs, uncolored by any of the tricks of fate that catapult many entertainers to fame. Mary's earlier career on the stage, however, brought a haphazard lot of coincidences and accidents. It was the kind of career one might expect would overtake a red-headed girl who possesses amazing resourcefulness, a good deal of courage and a splendid sort of humor.

Mary's first big chance at musical comedy came when she was chosen for the lead in the London cast of a successful Broadway eye-and-ear production. Not until the cast gathered for their first rehearsal on the other side was it discovered that Mary's part called for a contralto voice

and she is quite definitely a soprano. Most girls, one feels certain, would have been fairly discouraged over a break like that and would have accepted meekly the return passage to New York that was proffered by the director. But not Mary, though she was alone and unknown in London. She threw a good, old-fashioned tantrum

that did credit to her red hair, told them to keep their old passage, and marched over to the establishment of M. Charlot, a musical comedy impresario, whose gift to America a few years before had been that famous pair of comediennes, Gertrude Lawrence and Beatrice Lillie.

Charlot knew a good thing when he saw it and Mary became a principal in his 1929 London Revue. It brought her immediate recognition and an after-theatre job in London's smartest supper rendezvous, the Club Splendide. All in all it was a successful season, and Mary found herself in demand when she came back to New York.

But again bad luck, unaccountably silly bad luck,

dogged her footsteps. The first thing she got into was a promising Broadway musical that opened up in Boston. A couple of days before opening night it seemed that only the first act had been written and the rest of the show was a miserable hodge-podge. It arrived in New York on schedule, but lasted only a few weeks.

Her next job was a leading rôle in the Chicago production of "Sweet Adeline." The star fell ill and withdrew from the cast, and the show never went on the boards.

Mary returned to New York, and once again Charlot, this time by indirection, kept her career alive. Jack Buchanan, whom Charlot first introduced to Broadway along with Gertrude Lawrence and Beatrice Lillie, was looking for a partner to share the spotlight with him at New York's Cazanova Club. Mary got the job.

Her career progressed more smoothly from then on, and Paramount called her for talkie shorts with Charles Ruggles. That was a natural step to radio, for Paramount immediately made use of her talents for its weekly Paramount on Parade program over Columbia. Radio executives heard her just once and signed her up. She is featured in a special period that is simply, but impressively, listed as "Mary Charles."

Mary was born in Philadelphia in 1907. She is a graduate of the Finch School in New York.

She sings popular and character songs, and has a natural flare for dialects. She is particularly adept at impersonations of Irene Bordoni, Libby Holman, Helen Morgan and other stage personalities.

THE United States Senate will be both heard and seen in action by the people of the country within a very few years if plans now under consideration are carried into effect.

Initially, the Senate chamber would be equipped with microphones and the daily debate and proceedings would be broadcast. Later, upon the perfection of television, the necessary apparatus would be installed to provide also a full picture of the scene.

The possibilities of broadcasting the Senate have been under consideration by the rules committee for some time. Hearings have been held at which the representatives of both the broadcast-network companies assured the committee of their coöperation, advising that they would carry the proceedings without charge to the Government. The installation of the necessary microphones and acoustic equipment would be made at the expense of the Government, but could be done, it was estimated, for not more than \$30,000.

The broadcasting of Senate proceedings is being sponsored by Senator Clarence C. Dill of Washington. Public interest, the Senator believes, will eventually demand such broadcasts from both Houses of Congress and before many years will also require that pictures of Congressional proceedings be televised into every home.

The Right Dope

RECENT contributors to your interesting department object to unfavorable criticism, which they call "knocking." Such objections are based upon bad thinking. We owe radio to the long line of scientists whose discoveries made it possible, not to the business men who employ it to sell their goods.

At present the programs are paid for by a sort of sales tax, the cost being added to the price of the products advertised. As this form of tax is practically painless, and as the selection and distribution of talent is fairly satisfactory, not many desire to change the situation fundamentally. However, the public will do well to bear certain facts in mind. The advertisers naturally desire to spend as little as possible to secure a given result. They will therefore hire poor talent if the public fails to insist upon good talent. Moreover, those advertisers having a poor opinion of the quality of public taste will provide trashy programs, and continue them as long as they do not meet with criticism. If anyone doubts this tendency, let him consider that in order to balance the radio fare the great broadcasting chains must provide in their sustaining programs distinguished speakers, musicians, and entertainers; in fact, with notable exceptions, the best programs are unsponsored.

Therefore, those who praise the good programs and complain of the poor ones are serving both themselves and the public at large. Abusive and ill-tempered criticism is, of course, everywhere out of place; but let us continue to have the freest possible expression of opinion, favorable and unfavorable.

Finally, let us accept willingly our share of the expenses of broadcasting by conscientiously patronizing those advertisers who provide valuable programs.

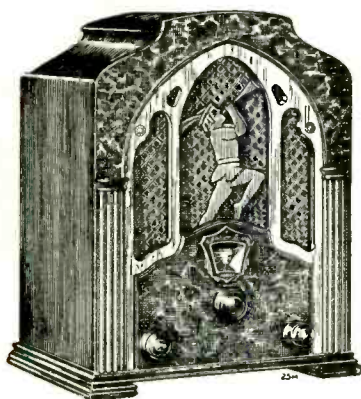
