

MARCH 29: Representative Edith Nourse Rogers of Massachusetts and Dr. Thomas Parran. Surgeon General of the United States, launched a national offensive against cancer with talks on "Cancer Control and the Public." The broadcast was the first step of a month-long educational campaign against cancer. 3:15–3:30 p.m.

APRIL PROGRAMS

Columbia's Special Feature broadcasts are arranged on a week to week, sometimes day to day, and even, on occasion, hour to hour basis. One result of this flexibility and timeliness is the following partial list of April programs which were arranged too late for inclusion in the last month's issue of THE COLUMBIA PROGRAM BOOK.

As Germany struck rapidly through Denmark into Norway, and war in Europe flared up with new intensity, the Columbia Broadcasting System heightened its foreign news coverage. In addition to its present schedule of two round-ups of European news each day, CBS added several broadcasts from overseas daily when the Norwegian crisis was at fever pitch. The land battles in Norway, and the sea battles off its coast, were covered by CBS' regular staff correspondents and by Miss Betty Wason, who was added to the staff as Stockholm radio correspondent with Germany's latest thrust. After the battlcs raging in Norway subsided to the slower, steadier grind of war, Columbia returned to its regular war-time news schedule - prepared, on a twenty-four hour basis, to enlarge its coverage wherever important, unexpected events broke out again.

APRIL 25: Senator David I. Walsh, Democrat of Massachusetts, was heard over the Columbia Network in an address on American maritime problems, entitled "The Needs of Our Navy," 10:15-11 p.m.

APRIL 27: Senator Robert R. Reynolds. Democrat of North Carolina. and Representative Jennings Randolph, Democrat of West Virginia, spoke over CBS from the studios of WJSV. Washington, 10:15–10:30 p.m.

APRIL 28: A series of CBS interviews of presidential candidates, as they are nominated, was continued as Albert Warner, Columbia Washington correspondent, quizzed John W. Aiken, candidate of the Socialist Labor Party. Aiken had just been named the party's standard-bearer for the 1940 election at a nominating convention in New York City, 10:30–10:45 p.m.

APRIL 30: I. M. Ornburn, head of the Union Label League of the American Federation of Labor, delivered a special address over the nationwide Columbia Network. His topic was "Union Label Action," and the program originated in the studios of WJAS, Pittsburgh, 3:35-3:45 p.m.

APRIL 2: Two choral programs were broadcast over the Columbia Network in connection with the Music Educators National Conference in Los Angeles. The latter—originating in the Shrine Auditorium, Los Angeles — was devoted to the Sacramento Junior College Music Festival and featured the massed Festival A Cappella Choir of 750 voices and the Festival Symphony Orchestra of 125 pieces. 

A feature of the summaries is a review of New York Stock Exchange noon and closing prices.

In collaboration with Will Hays' office, Columbia presents news of Hollywood once each week in English, Portuguese, and Spanish respectively.

World-wide news events are broadcast Monday through Friday by Alberto Zalamea, wellknown journalist and native of Colombia, Saturday and Sunday by Americo Lugo-Romero, (both of WCBX). Monday through Friday by Adriano A. Rubio (WCAB).

Luis Correa, native Brazilian journalist, reports the news each week-day in Portuguese for Columbia's audience in Brazil.

Carmen Castelo takes her audience touring on a series of "dial trips" to interesting spots in the United States.

Americo Lugo-Romero is heard each Wednesday in a quarter-hour digest of cultural news of special interest to South American listeners.

The latest news of the theater, motion pictures, fashions and personalities of Broadway is reported in Spanish by Carmen Castelo.





NBC, Mutual, and CBS combine networks for the broadcast, which originates at the New York Fair, the San Francisco Exposition, and studios in Hollywood, Chicago, and other cities. The program features some of the biggest figures in the entertainment world, as well as leaders in every phase of public life.



AUGUST 7: Dr. Harry Emerson Fosdick of the Riverside Cathedral, New York City, spoke in support of the Burke-Wadsworth Conscription Bill, 10:15–10:30 p.m.

AUGUST 8: Mrs. Ida B. Wise Smith of the Woman's Christian Temperance Union was heard in an address from Chicago. 5:30– 5:45 p.m.

AUGUST 8: All seven members of the National Defense Advisory Commission participated in a forum on the problems which confront them and were interviewed by Albert Warner of CBS and correspondents of NBC and Mutual. The Commission members heard on the broadcast were Ralph Budd, Chester C. Davis, Miss Harriet Elliott. Leon Henderson. Sidney Hillman, William S. Knudsen. and Edward R. Stettinius, Jr.. 10:30-11 p.m.

AUGUST 13: Senator David I. Walsh. Democrat of Massachusetts. spoke on the topic. "Our Navy for Our Own Defense," 10:15-10:30 p.m. ALGUST 16: A special half-hour broadcast from the assembly room of the Elwood. Indiana, High School heralded the following day's acceptance speech of Republican candidate Wendell L. Willkie. Old friends of Mr. Willkie, his first employer, and others were heard on the special broadcast, 10– 10:30 p.m.

AUGUST 17: Senator Rush D. Holt. Democrat of West Virginia, was heard in a broadcast opposing sending American destroyers to Great Britain, 10:15–10:30 p.m.

AUGUST 18: Ambassador William C. Bullitt, who had returned from France several weeks before, addressed a mass meeting in Independence Square, Philadelphia, His remarks, which were broadcast on Columbia's coast-to-coast Network, were on foreign affairs, 7–7:30 p.m.

AUGUST 20: Mrs. Lucille Foster McMillin. U. S. Civil Service Commissioner, spoke on "Women and the National Defense," 5:30-5:45 p.m.

At GUST 20: Senator Burton K. Wheeler, Democrat of Montana, a leader in the Congressional fight against the conscription bill, attacked an address by Admiral William H. Standley in which the Admiral proposed that the United States turn over reconditioned destroyers to Great Britain. 10:15–10:30 p.m.

AUGUST 21: Harlee Branch. Chairman of the C. A. A. Board in Washington, and Robert H. Hinckley, assistant secretary of commerce, were both heard in a quarter-hour broadcast from Washington, 10:15-10:30 p.m.

AUGUST 22: William Allen White, nationally-famous editor and publisher of the Emporia Gazette, urged that the United States sell reconditioned destroyers to Great Britain, 10:15–10:30 p.m.

AUGUST 23: General Hugh Johnson. nationally-syndicated columnist, who drafted the conscription bill in 1917 and who supervised its execution, spoke in favor of military conscription. 10–10:15 p.m.

AUGUST 24: Eight reporters roved through "blacked out" London to bring CBS audiences a picture of wartime "London After Dark." The broadcast included pick-ups from nine spots in the Greater London area and among the reporters to participate in it were Vincent Sheean. J. B. Priestley, Bob Bowman, Raymond Glendenning and Michael Standing. all of the British Broadcasting Corporation, and three CBS correspondents. Edward R. Murrow, Larry LeSeur. and Eric Sevareid. 6:30-7 p.m.

AUGUST 25: Francis Biddle, Solicitor General of the United States, told aliens "How to Comply with the Alien Registration Act of 1940." in a special broadcast from Chicago, 2:15-2:30 p.m.

AUGUST 27: Senator Charles L. McNary's acceptance speech as vice-presidential candidate of the Republican party was broadcast over the nation-wide Network of the Columbia Broadcasting System from Salem, Oregon. the candidate's home-town, 9–9:30 p.m.

AUGUST 29: Former Secretary of Agriculture Henry A. Wallace's address accepting the Democratic nomination for the Vice-Presidency was broadcast from the Drake Coliseum in Des Moines, Iowa, Mr. Wallace's home-city, 10:15–11 p.m.

SPECIAL EVENTS

AUGUST 1: Each Sunday evening in August CBS broadcast the open-air concerts from the Grant Park Band Shell in Chicago. The concerts included performances by a number of orchestras. 10:30–11 p.m.

AUGUST 10: CBS broadcast a track-side account of the running of the American Derby at Arlington Park in Chicago, 6:15– 6:30 p.m.

AUGUST 11: Ted Husing described the All-

American Soap Box Derby for Columbia listeners. The Derby is held annually near the Akron Airport in Akron, Ohio, 5:30–6 p.m.

AUGUST 19: Major General Henry H. Arnold, chief of the U. S. Army Air Corps, broadcast over CBS, as Network reporters covered the ceremonies dedicating the Wright Brothers Monument at Wright Field, Dayton, Ohio, 3:15-3:30 p.m.

Carmen Castelo takes her audience touring on a scrice of "dial trips" to interesting spots in the United States.

Americo Lugo-Romero is heard each Wednesday in a quarter-hour digest of cultural news of special interest to South American listeners.

SEPTEMBER 4: Norman Thomas. Socialist Party candidate for the Presidency, discussed "How We Can Defeat Hitlerism" in a special CBS broadcast from Buffalo, 10:15-10:30 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 11: Senator Robert M. LaFollette, Jr., Progressive of Wisconsin, opposed extension of aid to Great Britain beyond the limitations of the "cash-and-carry" neutrality law in a specially scheduled CBS address. His talk, which originated in the studios of WBBM, Chicago, was made under the auspices of the America First Committee, 10:15– 10:30 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 11: Winston Churchill, prime minister of Great Britain. was heard over CBS in an address from bomb-torn London. 1–1:15 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 12: Dr. Arthur H. Merritt and Dr. C. Willard Camalier. president and former president respectively of the American Dental Association, discussed the dentist's role in national defense from the Association's convention in Cleveland. 5:30-5:45 p.m. SEPTEMBER 13: A coast-to-coast salute to General John J. Pershing, commander of the American Expeditionary Force in the World War. on the occasion of his 80th anniversary was broadcast over CBS. Raymond Kelly, then National Commander of the American Legion, paid tribute to General Pershing from Chicago, and the General replied from Washington. 5:30-5:45 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 14: Senator Charles O. Andrews. Democrat of Florida. was heard in a broadcast over Columbia's coast-to-coast Network from Washington. 10:15–10:30p.m.

SEPTEMBER 16: Wendell L. Willkie's speech at Coffeyville. Kansas. called by the Republican candidate the "main opening" of his campaign, was heard throughout the nation over CBS. Mr. Willkie was introduced to the Coffeyville and radio audiences by Walter Johnson, one-time baseball star who is now a Republican candidate for Congress in Maryland, 6-6:30 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 16: General George C. Marshall, chief of staff of the U. S. Army, addressed 200,000 members of the National Guard over the nationwide Network of CBS. The Guardsmen, some of whom were mustered for one year of active training, were assembled in armories in all parts of the country for induction into the Federal military services, 11:15-11:30 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 17: Dr. Thomas Mann. Nobel prize winner and refugee from Nazi Germany, explained why alien registration is important in the United States in an address over CBS. Dr. Mann. interviewed by William A. Carmichael. Federal supervisor of immigration and naturalization for Southern California. told the Network audience that the checkup of foreign-born residents in the United States serves as a safeguard against fifth column activities, 10:15–10:30 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 18: H. W. Prentis. Jr., president of the National Association of Manufacturers, and Major Benjamin H. Namm. executive committee director of the National Retail Dry Goods Association, met before a CBS microphone to discuss "Business Unity for National Defense," 10:15–10:30 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 19: Edward R. Stettinius, Jr., head of the National Defense Advisory Commission's Industrial Materials Division, spoke on the first of three progress reports from the Commission to the country. Talking from the studios of WJSV, CBS station in Washington, Mr. Stettinius outlined the commission's aims and accomplishments, 10:15– 10:30 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 20: President Franklin D. Roosevelt spoke over CBS in connection with the bicentennial celebration of the University of Pennsylvania, at which the President received an honorary degree, 1-4:30 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 21: Maury Maverick. Mayor of San Antonio. Texas. presented the reasons why he has abandoned his former stand for isolationism in America. The address. entitled "An Isolationist's Change of Heart," originated in the studios of WABC, 10:35– 10:45 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 21 THRU SEPTEMBER 26: CBS covered the 22nd convention of the Ameriean Legion in Boston with a diversified series of programs covering all phases of the veterans' activities. On September 21, Columbia listeners were taken "Behind the Scenes," as then National Commander Raymond J. Kelly and Glenwood J. Sherrard. Boston Convention Corporation president, discussed arrangements for the Convention with a CBS announcer (5:30-5:45 p.m.).

On the following day, Katherine F. Lenroot, chief of the Children's Bureau, U. S. Labor Department. and Ed Morgenstern. Legion child welfare committee chairman, spoke on the veterans' \$4,000,000 child aid campaign (2:15-2:30 p.m.). The first of two programs on September 23 brought Mrs. Corwith of the Legion Auxiliary to the microphone, while the second featured the winners of the Legion drum and bugle corps tournament (11:15-11:30 p.m.). On September 26, a "Hail and Farewell" broadcast included addresses by retiring Commander Kelly and by newly-elected Commander Milo Warner, 5:30-5:45 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 24: CBS broadcast addresses by John C. Paige and William W. Warne from the National Reclamation Association Convention in Great Falls. Montana, 6:15– 6:30 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 28: President Franklin D. Roosevelt was heard in an address at the cornerstone laying ceremonies for the Washington National Airport's Terminal Building. The President, discussing the general question of preparedness. promised the United States that it would be impregnable in the air, 3:30-3:45 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 10 THRU SEPTEMBER 14: Ted Husing brought CBS listeners vivid descriptions and summaries of the play in the National Amateur Golf Tourney. held this year at the Winged Foot Golf Club in Mamaroneck. Husing's reports started with summaries of qualify play (September 10. 5:30-5:45 p.m.) and of the first four rounds of match play (September 11. 5:30-5:45 p.m., and September 12. 5:15-5:30 p.m.). On September 13. he summarized the semifinal round of match play (5:00-5:15 p.m.) and on the morning of September 14, he summarized the morning round of finals (11:30-11:45 a.m.). Husing's series was climaxed by a play-by-play description of the afternoon round of finals. 2-4 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 15: Richard Llewellyn. author of the best selling novel. "How Green Was My Valley." spoke from London in a special Welsh Day broadcast over CBS. Llewellyn was granted leave from military duties for the broadcast. 2:45–3 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 15: Another CBS sports exclusive brought Columbia's audience an eyewitness account of the 1940 national open polo championship finals from International Field. Meadow Brook Club. Westbury. Long Island. Ted Husing. assisted by Jimmy Dolan. presented the running account of the contest. 3:15-5:30 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 21: Ted Husing's full and exciting September sports schedule brought him to Aqueduct, where he described the running of the Beldame Handicap at the track's closing for the season. 4:30–4:45 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 23: Ted Husing and Jimmy Dolan covered the 48th running of the Lawrence Realization, highlight of the opening day of the Belmont track's fall meeting. 4:30-4:45 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 28: Columbia presented the first in its series of descriptions of major football games—Ted Husing's colorful playby-play of the clash between Minnesota and Washington. 3:45-6 p.m.



Election Returns

SCHEDULED PERIODS TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 5 CBS' board of political correspondents—Elmer Davis, Bob Trout, and Albert Warner—broadcast election returns as they come by telephone and press association tickers to CBS headquarters in New York. In the early evening, when returns are sparse, they broadcast during the regular news periods with an additional program each hour; but starting at 9 p.m. EST, when the results are fuller, they remain on the air until Franklin D. Roosevelt or Wendell Willkie is elected President of the United States. Elmo Roper. director of the Fortune survey, joins the CBS corps of more than 40 experts to analyze the returns in the light of the straw polls.

OCTOBER 15: Gene Timney, chairman of the National Foundation for American Youth, called on 9,000.000 American youth to exercise their "first votes" in the 1940 presidential election. Mr. Tunney presented F. Stephen McArthur, Jr., president of the Young Democrats, and Charles Whitman. Jr., young Republican worker, 6:15-6:30 p.m.

OCTOBER 15: Lt. Col. Lewis B. Hershey. acting director of Selective Service Act.spoke on the eve of the registration of 16.000.000 young Americans for national defense. 11:15-11:30 p.m.

OCTOBER 16: President Roosevelt was heard in an early-morning message to the millions of Americans about to register for conscription. 8-8:07 a.m.

OCTOBER 16: After registration for the draft was finished, Columbia reporters in four cities interviewed men-on-the-street on their attitude to the conscription of the nation's manpower. The cross-country program included pickups from Washington, New York City, Chicago, and Hollywood, 10:15-10:30 p.m.

OCTOBER 19: Columbia broadcast a special. transoceanic broadcast from a London air raid shelter, 6:15=6:25 p.m.

OCTOBER 19: Charles Boyer, the French movie star, told why he believes alien registration is important to the safety of the United States. The film actor's talk, originating in Hollywood, was the second in a series of addresses on the importance of enrolling aliens. 10:15-10:30 p.m.

OCTOBER 23: Wendell L. Willkie, Republican candidate for President, presented his views on American defense in an address broadcast from the teuth annual New York Herald Tribune Forum on Current Problems, 10:31–11 p.m.

OCTOBER 24: President Roosevelt spoke from the White House to the Herald Tribune Forum assembled in New York City. The President's remarks were directly rated to the theme of that day's Forum session. "Saving Democracy in the Western World." 4:45– 5:15 p.m.

OCTOBER 24: Brigadier General Raymond E Metcalfe of the U.S. Army Medical Corps revealed how the medical profession is adapting itself to the national defense program. Dr. Metcalfe's talk originated in Chicago during the evening session of the Clinical Congress of the American College of Surgeons, 10:45–11 p.m.

OCTOBER 26: General Robert E. Wood. chairman of the board of Sears Roebuck & Company, spoke on "Onr Foreign Policy" under the auspices of the America First Committee. He presented the Committee's stand, which is opposed to extension of aid to the Allies beyond the limitations of the strict cash-and-carry law, 10:15–10:30 p.m.

OCTOBER 27: CBS joined in the nation's celebration of Navy Day, 1940, with a special half-hour program, climaxed by a talk by Secretary of the Navy Frank Knox. The early part of the broadcast included an address by Admiral Harold R. Stark, Chief of Naval Operations, and interviews of a newly-enlisted man, a veteran sailor, and a Marine. Lieutenant Commander Arthur Godfrey, U. S. Naval Reserves and an announcer at WJSV. CBS station in Washington. acted as master of ceremonies, 2–2:30 p.m.

OCTOBER 29: CBS brought its listeners a word-picture of the ceremonies in Washington, as Secretary of War Henry L. Stimson drew the first number in the national draft lottery. Bob Trout, ace CBS reporter, described the scene as Secretary Stimson drew numbers from the same goldfish bowl used for the draft in the World War, 12–12:45 p.m.

OCTOBER 6: Heralding approach of the most sacred holiday on the Hebrew calendar, CBS presented a special Yom Kippur program from its New York studios. Rabbi Israel Goldstein of Congregation B'nai Jeshurun, New York City, delivered the Yom Kippur address, 2:35–3 p.m.

OCTOBER 12: Dr. Robert L. Swain, winner of the 1940 Remington medal in pharmacy, spoke to the Columbia Network audience on the relationship of "Advertising and the Consumer's Dollar," 2–2:10 p.m.

OCTOBER 12: CBS broadcast an impromptu round-table discussion of safety from Chicago, in connection with the National Safety Congress. Participants included a champion truck driver, a woman driver, a taxicab pilot, and a pedestrian, 2:15–2:30 p.m.

OCTOBER 10 AND 17: CBS broadcast two programs from the 53rd triennial session of the Protestant Episcopal Church in Kansas City. On October 10, the speaker was the Most Rev. Derwyn T. Owen, Primate of Canada; on October 17, the Right Rev. W. Appleton Lawrence, Bishop of Western Massachusetts, 5:15-5:30 p.m.

OCTOBER 12: Dr. Oscar Blackwelder, pastor of the Lutheran Church of the Reformation in Washington, analyzed "The Contribution of the Christian Faith to the Present Hour" in a special address over CBS. His talk originated at the 12th biennial conference of the United Lutheran Church of America in Omaha. 6:15-6:30 p.m. OCTOBER 12: Leopold Stokowski, famed music conductor who recently returned from a South American tour with the All-American Youth Orchestra, spoke over CBS in connection with Founder's Day of the Young Men's Christian Association. Theme of this year's celebration of the anniversary of the birth of Sir George Williams. founder of the Y. M. C. A., was "Youth Rises in a Crisis," 6:30-6:45 p.m.

OCTOBER 19: Pope Pius XII was heard over CBS in a special message from Vatican City, 1:30-1:48 p.m.

NOVEMBER 11: Wendell L. Willkie urged his followers to maintain a "loyal opposition" to the Democratic administration in a special address from New York City. 10:30-11 p.m.

NOVEMBER 15: The Hon. Herbert C. Hoover, ex-president of the United States. broadcast from Vassar College in Poughkeepsie. 9:30-10 p.m.

NOVEMBER 19: Governor Harold E. Stassen of Minnesota submitted to the nationwide Columbia audience his program for economies in local government as a means of reducing the tax burdens created by national defense. His address was broadcast from Springfield. Mass.. where the National Municipal League had opened a three-day convention. 10:30–10:45 p.m. NOVEMBER 20: The Committee to Defend America by Aiding the Allies presented its program of strenuous aid to Great Britain in a special quarter-hour broadcast from New York and Boston, 11:15–11:30 p.m.

NOVEMBER 22: Philip Murray. head of the Steel Workers Organizing Committee and newly-elected President of the C. I. O.. was heard in an address from Atlantic City, where the C. I. O. elected him to succeed John L. Lewis as its leader, 9:45-10 p.m.

NOVEMBER 23: Frank T. Bow, General Counsel of the National Council of Independent Unions, spoke on "Undominated Lahor" from the studios of WGAR. Columbia's station in Cleveland. Ohio. 10:15-10:30 p.m.

NOVEMBER 27: The food industry's important role in national defense and the measures being taken to safeguard the public from profiteering during emergency periods were discussed by Paul S. Willis, president of the Associated Grocery Manufacturers of America, in a special CBS broadcast. 10:15– 10:30 p.m.

NOVEMBER 30: Franklin D. Roosevelt, Jr.. Betsy Barton. and Dr. Frank Kingdon were heard in a special broadcast jointly arranged by CBS and the newly-formed Committee of Thirty Million, "A Roll Call of Youth for Democracy." 10:15–10:30 p.m.

SPECIAL EVENTS

NOVEMBER 12: Columbia broadcast a special program in connection with the "National Conference of Catholic Charities," from Washington, 5:30-5:45 p.m.
