

Well here we are again with the beginning of this week's Bulletin. We hope to have a lot of interesting information for you again this week.

First of all we want to take this opportunity to welcome Mr. John S. Taggart, Jr. 19 Robie St., Bath, N. Y. as a new member in our club for a full year, and at the same time we want to welcome Mr. J. W. Wagner, 186 Nairn Ave., Toronto, Ontario and Mr. Kermit Geary, R.F.D. #2, Walnutport, Penna. as new members for the remainder of the present season. We hope that all three of these gentlemen will never regret having joined our club. We also hope that the older members will drop these three notes of welcome.

We want to take this opportunity to thank those stations that gave us such fine programs over this past week-end. They certainly were splendid programs and all were greatly enjoyed here at the club headquarters. Incidentally on Saturday morning, we ran across WJW, Akron, Ohio giving our club a special program. The station went on for us without notifying us of their intentions, and they certainly did give us a fine program, it is our hope that quite a few of our members were fortunate enough to pick up this splendid program. We are only sorry that we did not have the advance information on this program.

Well we wonder how many of our club members were successful in picking up CX26 on Saturday morning, we happened to stumble across them about 3:15 A.M., E.S.T. we do not know whether they were on any earlier than this or not but it is quite evident that they went on the air earlier than they were scheduled to go on, and at the same time we did not hear anything of them after 3:45 A.M., E.S.T. so that it seems as though they probably signed off earlier too than they had been scheduled to sign off. They certainly did come in fine here in York for being at such a great distance.

Next week we will have another opportunity to tune in another South American station in the form of CP4 - LaPaz, Bolivia operating on 600 kycs using 10,000 watts power. Then too next week we will have another opportunity to pick up HIX - Santo Domingo who are going to run a DX program on Thanksgiving morning. The times will appear for both of these broadcasts in our DX Calendar. Also in the very near future LR5 will broadcast a special DX program for the International DXers Alliance. In fact all three of these specials are for that organization.

We heard WNRA testing this past week several times, so that those of you that still need this station had better keep your weather eye glued on 1420 kycs and watch closely for this station.

We have the information that WKBV are now testing their transmitter in Richmond, Ind. and that station WKBB are now testing their transmitter in East Dubuque, Illinois, they are now operating on 1500 kycs instead of 1310 kycs where they had previously operated.

Our good friend, Ray Lewis asks us to advise our members that LR4, can be heard quite frequently coming in under WBE-WBZA in the evenings from 8 to 10 P.M. He also advises us that KSAE can be heard on 980 kycs

We told you that we had hoped to have some results to give you on stations promising to go on for us during the mornings of the 16th and 17th of December. We have had four replies thus far and three are acceptances. Incidentally all of these reports come from our very good friend, C.G. Huber, who is so graciously assisting us this time in lining up the stations for this party. The first one to report was CKTB-St. Catharines, Ont. and they advised us that they would be delighted to give us a program on Saturday morning, December 16, from 2:00 until 3:00 A.M., E.S.T. Then today, C.G.H. sent us a letter with replies from the following stations: 10-AK Stratford, Ontario, in which they advise us that they shall be pleased to co-operate with us on Saturday morning December 16, from 3:00 to 3:30 A.M., E.S.T. also a reply from 10-BP-Wingham, Ontario in which they advise us that they too will be happy to co-operate with us on Saturday morning, December 16, from 3:30 to 4:00 A.M., E.S.T. Then there is also a reply from CHLP-Montreal, Canada who advise us that they shall be unable to take part in this series of broadcasts. We certainly appreciate this fine work C.G.H.

At this time we want to extend to Art Collins, our heartfelt sympathy during the death of his little nephew. We hope that the rest of the ill ones in your family will soon be restored to normal health, Art.

Keith Freas sends in a few FRC decisions for us to list again this week. WPIW-Hopkinsville, Ky. has been granted a change in call letters to WAVE. WBZ-Boston, Mass. has been granted modification of license to increase power from 25 to 50 KW on present frequency 990 kc. WHAM has been granted the same modification on their present frequency 1150 kyc and also WGN-Chicago, Ill has been granted the same sort of a modification on their present frequency 720 kc. Keith also sends us a clipping concerning a new cycle of sun spots, which we think should prove interesting to you, hence we will copy it as it appears in the clipping: "The new cycle of sun spots has begun. Dr. Seth B. Nicholson of Mt. Wilson observatory has observed two spots opposite in magnetic polarity to the old procession of gigantic disturbances on the sun that have held sway for the past ten and a quarter years. One spot was seen the first three days of this week, while another very small one was observed Oct. 10.

It is now the time of sun spot minimum. The sun was nearly inactive in July and August, slightly active in September and nearly inactive in October. The new family of spots now beginning will continue to troop across the sun's face for nearly 11 years. "We suppose that most of our members are aware of the fact that for years scientists have been trying to link sun spots with radio reception and transmission, that is why we felt that you would be interested in the above article.

It has continually slipped our mind in getting out this Bulletin to inform you that the ED WYNN Chain is no longer in operation. It disbanded about a month ago.

Next week we shall list the stations that have consented to dedicate their december test to our club. However the list is not nearly as large as last month's owing to the fact that we have been busy planning our big party on December 16 and 17.

Since running off page one, we have had quite a few letters from the members of our club, advising us that they were successful in picking up CX26 last Saturday morning. We certainly are happy to know that so many of our members had this fine luck.

We are advised that CJOC-Lethbridge, Alta. is going to run a special DX program this coming Sunday morning, Nov. 26 from 2:00 to 4:30 A.M., E.S.T. For the information of our members that may not know CJOC's correct frequency it is 840 kycs.

C.G. Huber also sends us some very interesting information, which he located in one of the newspapers in his home. "There are 1426 radio broadcasting stations operating throughout the world, of which 585 are located in the United States.

Russia ranks second to the United States with a total number of 73 transmitters." He also sends us from the same newspaper a bit of short wave information which may be of interest to some of our members. "London is on the air daily between 4 A.M., and 8 P.M., E.S.T. with various programs intended for British colonies. GSA and GSB at London, transmit the Canadian program between 6 and 8 P.M. on the respective waves of 6050 and 9510 kycs. Other call letters and waves utilized by Daventry, Eng. are GSC 9585 kyc; GSD 11750 kyc; GSE 11865 kyc; GSF 15,140 kyc; GSG 17770 kyc and GSH on 21520 kyc."

We are in receipt of a card from Mr. Charles A. Morrison, President of the International DXers Alliance in which he informs us that they have succeeded in lining up KDKA-W8XK Pittsburgh to broadcast their tips for them this coming Sunday evening, November 26 at approximately 11:45 PM. CST. During this time two well known DXers will be at the mike in person to give you the Head Line Tips on both Short Waves and the Broadcast Band. They have requested that we urge our members to listen in and report reception of this broadcast to KDKA telling them how well pleased you are at their carrying these tips that evening. You might ask them to make this a weekly feature at that hour. If we play ball with the I.D.A. they have promised us that they will share some of this time with us in order that we may present some of our tips at that time. Let's all do our part and listen-in and help the I.D.A. to make this a regular weekly feature.

Again we want to call to your attention the fact that quite a few of our members haven't been sending in their reports on our specials. We hope that in the future you will report on all of our broadcasts, please remember that future DXes depend on these reports, so let's all send in our reports in order to assure ourselves of future DXes with the stations presenting these special broadcasts for our benefit.
