These changes were effective on December 1st so that we would advise you to watch these waves for some new stations.

Mr. Charles A. Morrison, president of the IDA asks that we quote a paragraph from their monthly Globe Circler. "KDKA-W8XK - Did not go on, as you all know by now. According to an official statement received from Mr. Stokes, they made a last minute decision that it would be unwise to put on such a period dedicated to any one particular club. My one aim is to get this valuable DX information out to our members and DX'ers, who need it. As long as this information is transmitted, we would not be so selfish, as to deprive those needing it from getting it, simply to get a few I.D.A. announcements. THEREFORE I SUGGEST MEMBERS OF ALL CLUBS, that every one of you write to KDKA and request such a period freely thrown open to all clubs, favoring no one, but each club co-operating with KDKA, in putting on such a period, with no further thought, than for the ultimate benefit of all DX'ers everywhere. Let's all get together and show Mr. Lynden Morrow, of KDKA, the real spirit of true fraternal cooperation. Signed Charles A. Morrison, President of I.D.A." We feel that such a period over KDKA would be greatly appreciated by DXers everywhere, hence we hope that each of our members will follow Mr. Morrison's suggestion by writing to KDKA for such a period devoted to DXers everywhere.

We are in receipt of a letter from CKX, Brandon, Manitoba in which they have notified us that they are going to dedicate a program to the NRC and the ARC on Sunday morning, December 17 from 4 to 5 A.M., E.S.T. They also advise us that they are now operating on 1450 kycs and ask us to call the attention of our members to this fact. The time and date will appear in our DX Calander on page four of this week's Bulletin. This will be an excellent opportunity for our members to try for this

station, and what is more they promise to verify all correct reports for return postage. We certainly hope that you will all be on the watch for this station.

We regret to announce that there were two errors made in our Bulletins in the past several weeks which we wish to correct at this time. First of all that station which was supposed to be CX28 which comes in on 1095 kycs in the evening has been definitely identified by Ray Lewis as being XEWW a new Mexican station in Vera Cruz. Ray also says that that Spanish speaking station on 1125 has turned out to be CMHJ. The other error that was made last week when we said that that Spanish speaking station on 875 kycs was XEAD we have since found out that it was CMX. We beg your pardon for these errors.

We received a letter from Mr. Nichols at KDFN Casper, Wyo. in which he informs us that the frequency tests over their station will not be conducted at regular intervals but that he will do his best to notify us in advance of these tests as they are scheduled, he also advises us that as yet they have not scheduled any DX programs, so that those of you who still need KDFN will have to watch very closely for this station either on a surprise frequency test or else through the Bulletin, providing Mr. Nichols is able to get the news to us in time..

We have just received several more Canadian acceptances for our big Canadian DX Frolic this coming Saturday and Sunday morning. We shall go into detail a little more on these later.

There certainly are going to be an enormous bunch of stations on the air Sunday morning and we are going to try to persuade the York Broadcasting Co., to give us a few minutes sometime Friday, preferably around 5 PM to give you all the latest tips, while we can not guarantee that we will be successful in our venture, we would suggest that those of you who can listen to WORK between 4 PM and sign off time Friday afternoon. Mr. Gulick the manager of our local station has always been very courteous to us and we sincerely hope that he will grant us this privilege.

Now for the information on those Canadian stations. Good ol' Ray Lewis sends us a letter from CHNC New Carlisle, Que in which they promise us that they will be on the air during our Frolic on Saturday morning, December 16 from 3 to 4 A.M., E.S.T. This according to their letter is an entirely new station from the old CHNC which used to share time with CKGW. We know that quite a few of our more Westernly members will welcome the opportunity to hear this station.

Secondly, we are in receipt of a letter from CRCS Chicoutimi, Que. in which they too have promised to take part in our Canadian DX Frolic. CRCS is scheduled for another program tomorrow morning, but it may be possible that the one for tomorrow will be postponed till this coming Sunday morning, December 17 from 4 to 5 A.M., E.S.T. They advise us that they will be glad to verify reports that are correct and that they want particularly to know the signal strength and modulation at which they are received in the various parts of the country. They also mention that they will stay off the air until a few minutes past 4 A.M. in order to prevent clashing with any other station that may be on 1500 kycs till that time.

This morning we received still another acceptance which made us feel very good. It is from station LOBU Canora, Sask. This is a real opportunity to pick up a dandy catch from Sask. and we advise you all to be on the lookout for them. They too advise us that they will be
