Huber, our excellent friend and advisory chairman mentions hearing a station on 910 kycs lately and is wondering whom it might be, any information concerning this station will be greatly appreciated by good ol' C.G.H. Also both Warren Routzahn and C.G.H. have been hearing a station on 815 kycs, not XEAT, heard last on January 10. Information on this will be appreciated by both of these members. Incidentally the one on 910 kycs is not Poste Parisien, Mr. Huber is certain of that.

We also note that CMJP was on the air this morning for the NNRC, we noted that in their Bulletin last week but thought that it was an error of date owing to the schedule DX from this station on January 20 by Mr. Roberts, Newark, Ohio. However, we feel certain that you will have another chance to tune them in next week.

We want to thank WPFB for dedicating a portion of their DX program to us this morning. Also WRUF for their fine program. The broadcast from KFJB was mighty fine this morning and we are hoping that quite a few of our members will be among the winners of those 25 prizes that they offered.

There is the mail man now, time out while we go over the morning mail. One of the letters received is from C.G.H. and in it he says that we overlooked calling your attention to the fact that CJRC was on the air on Sunday morning, December 31. He says that this information may be of help to some of the members of our club who may have heard this broadcast without knowing who it was. Thanks for calling our attention to that fact C.G.H.

Since last week's Bulletin went out we have had several replies from stations regarding our Mid-Winter DX Frolic, the only acceptance being CKTB who will be on Saturday morning, February 10 from 2 to 3 A.M., EST. They may be on an hour longer, however, pending whether or not the station to follow them in our Frolic accepts our invitation or not.

We just received word from Stew Miller that KVOA will give us a program tomorrow morning, (Sunday), we are sorry that KVOA waited so long to notify us of their intentions. We hope however that a few of our members will be fortunate enough to pick up this special for our club. We shall try for them and give you a report on them if possible.

Still some more very valuable information has been passed on to us by good ol' C.G.H. He says that he and Mr. Medkin our other Greenville member, along with several other Greenville DXers have heard quite a few European stations, he calls your attention to Poste Parisien, FeCang Stuttgart, Heilsburg, Horby and Leipsig. European reception has been grand lately and we hope you'll take C.G.H.'s tips and try for these stations, although we don't know yet what difference shifting frequencies will have on them on January 15. P.P. was heard in York every morning

last week. We certainly hope that the change in frequencies of these Europeans will not affect their reception over here.

It is now Monday and we can report on the stations that gave us DX programs yesterday morning. We certainly do want to take this opportunity to thank both WEEU Reading, Penna. and WMAZ Macon, Georgia for the excellent DX programs that they ran for our club. They both came in here with lots of volume. As for KVOA we were not able to hear them and it may be that they did not go on for us after all. Incidentally ye editor heard a station on 830 kycs or thereabouts just shortly before 3 AM at which time WEEU came on the air. Did any of you hear this station, it just wondered us who it might have been.

We are in receipt of a letter from WTMJ Milwaukee, Wisconsin in which they state that they will not be able to go on the air for us during our Mid-Winter DX Party but they are kindly offering to take their part in this party on this coming Sunday morning, January 21 from 1:30 to 2:30 A.M., E.S.T. We gladly accepted their offer so that you may expect to hear WTMJ on for us Sunday morning.

This morning we received a letter from WIND Gary, Ind. in which they have kindly accepted our invitation to join in our party on Feb. 11 from 3:00 to 4:00 A.M., E.S.T. This makes another acceptance for our party. Mr. Griffin of WIND promises to co-operate with us to their fullest extent and we feel sure that their program will be a very interesting and worthwhile one.

Once again we want to thank Gene Shook for sending us advance notice of some specials that he has lined up for the NNRC. For February 24 from 3 to 3:30 A.M., E.S.T. 1370 kycs KMAC San Antonio, Texas and also on 1370 kycs KFJZ Ft. Worth, Texas from 5 to 6 A.M., E.S.T. on the same morning.

From the CDXR we learn that KVL Seattle, Wash. will broadcast a DX program on Monday morning, Feb. 26th from 4:00 to 6:00 A.M., E.S.T. Also from the same source we learn that CKCO Ottawa, Ont. will run another DX for the CDXR on January 28 from 4:00 to 5:00 A.M., E.S.T. This gives our members that missed them before another chance to try for them.

Mr. Harold W. Criswell, one of our York members, received a card from that Mexican that has been operating on 820 kycs during the past two weeks and he says that their call is XBAC and not XEAT nor any of the countless other calls that we had been hearing about from our DX friends, just a trick that nature has been playing on our hearing we guess.

Hal Buttles sends us some additional information concerning XENT. Says in a letter from that station, that they inform him that they are testing on 1115 kycs from 9 to 10:30 or 11 PM E.S.T. some evenings. The letter also continues by saying that they do not expect to be on the air with regular programs until October. Hal gives their address as being; P. O. Box 163, Laredo, Texas. He says that we had all better try as often as we possibly can to bring them in for he does not know how soon they will cease testing.

Keith Freas writes that interest in the S&E contest is becoming keener every day and that next week will find a big change in the status of the contest, owing to one of our prominent DXers entering the contest that had not been in the contest before. We would therefore advise you all to keep your eyes open for some radical changes in status if the interest continues as long as it is for a couple of weeks.

Since running off page two of this week's Bulletin news has been coming in galore and we are afraid that we may have to hold quite a bit of it over until next week. Inasmuch as the European stations still continue to come in so fine, they are the chief topic of conversation; hence the list that C.G. Huber sends us proves to be very appropriate. He sends us a list of the early morning Europeans and the time they come on the air. He says he received the information from the URC. Come on the air at Mid-nite E.S.T. These come on the air at 12:15 AM 841 100KW Berlin, Germany; 785 120KW Leipzig, Germany; 922 32KW Brno, Cg; 1031 60KW Heilsberg, Germany. This station on at 12:35 AM 950 60KW Breslau, Germany. This one on at 12:50 AM 556 60KW Beromunster, Switz. These come on at 1:00 AM 677 25KW Sottens, Switz. only on for 15 min; 1176 20KW Copenhagen, Den;. On at 1:05 AM 895 OFA Helsinki, Fin 10KW. On at 1:15 AM 638 120KW Prague, Cz. 1158 11KW Moravska, Cz. On at 1:20 AM 704 55KW SBA Stockholm, Sweden. On at 1:45 AM 713 50KW Ilro Rome, Italy. 1:50 AM ??? 60KW Stuttgart, Germany. On at 2:10 959 60KW P.P. Paris, France. On at 2:15 AM 1095 7KW Barcelona, Spain EAJL; ???? 10KW FeCamp; France. On at 2:40 AM 995 20KW Hilversum, Holland. On at 3:00 AM 1022 3KW Madrid, Spain; 776 120KW PTT Paris, France. On at 3:20 AM 592 120KW Vienna, Austria. We sincerely hope that this information will be useful to you in bringing in Europe.

We are in receipt of four more acceptances for our Mid-Winter DX Frolic. The latest ones being 10BQ Brantford, Ont. For Saturday morning, Feb 10 from 4 to 5 A.M., E.S.T. This one was lined up by our good friend Howard Scholobohm. Ray Lewis has succeeded in lining up WOW Omaha, Neb. for Sunday morning, February 11 from 2 to 3 A.M., E.S.T. While ye editor has succeeded in lining up WJAS Pittsburgh, Pa. for Sunday morning, Feb. 11 from 4:00 to 5:00 A.M., E.S.T. and WJEJ Hagerstown, Maryland for Sunday morning, Feb. 11 from 2:00 to 3:00 A.M., E.S.T. We hope that you'll make a note of these acceptances and try to be on hand to hear the excellent programs that these stations are going to put on for your benefit.

Ray Lewis also advises us that he is attempting to line up some fine Cuban specials through the co-operation of Mr. Alec Kinghorn, we certainly do hope you will be successful Ray old timer.

We found out last week that the starting time for those KDKA tipbroadcasts are 12:30 AM Sunday mornings instead of 12:45 AM. We would advise all of our members to listen in and send KDKA a letter of thanks for their co-operation by reading our tips during this broadcast.

Howard Schlöbohm sends in several clippings which should be of interest to you. On the first one we find that the call letters for the new station in Chelsea, Mass will be WMEX. They will operate on 1500 kycs. On the second one we read that WNEW which was formed by the merger of WODA and WAAM will be in operation by February 1. They have purchased the old 5KW transmitter owned by WABC.

C.G. Huber reports hearing TGW this past Sunday morning, we hope that this will help some of our members to identify this station, in the event that they heard them and did not know who they were. He also sends us some clippings which should be interesting to you. "The Federal Radio Commission is engaged in compiling an up-to-date list of radio stations and call letters. It will be mimeographed and made available before the end of January." "Fifty-six cities reported 15,604 arrests made in 1933 through the use of police radio; 232,838 emergency calls, and twenty-nine cities reported the amount of property recovered as valued at \$223,689, according to the Federal Radio Commission."
