DX NEWS

FEBRUARY 14, 1934.

The first thing we want to comment on this week is our Mid-Winter DX Frolic which was quite a success, even in spite of some of the worst reception conditions that we have ever seen or known. In the first place here at headquarters we were bothered with a terrific local interference which just about ruined several programs on both mornings.

We shall now give you a brief resume of how it sounded here in York this includes the reception reports of both ye Editor and Harold W. Criswell. We have not yet seen our other York member to find out what sort of luck he had on Sunday morning, nor have we seen any of the other York DXers to get their reports. WGBF came in mighty fine with a wonderful program and gave us lots of nice publicity. As for CKCR and CKTB we were not able to hear either of these stations, we don't know whether they weren't on or whether they didn't come in owing to the severe local interference. We listened for CHNC but they didn't come in so we supposed that they didn't come in but we later found out that they were on and coming in fine from 5:00 to 6:00 A.M., instead of the hour that they had been scheduled for. KFBK and KGKL were two other stations that we were unable to hear, we suppose that it was owing to reception conditions being so poor that we did not hear them. WAWZ came in fair during the first half hour of their broadcast during which time they were fighting it out with KWK but after the first half hour KWK signed off and then WAWZ was splendid. We did not hear a thing of WTAW, LOBQ, LOBP nor any of the others scheduled for that morning. This just shows you how poor reception was here in York. We certainly hope that the rest of you had a better break than we did here in York.

On Sunday morning we again listened to the various stations taking part in our Mid-Winter DX Frolic, while Sunday seemed much better than Saturday, it was still far from being nearly as good as it should have been. To start with we heard WJEJ, WFBC, WOW and WMMN giving us a splendid start for Sunday morning. We want to take this opportunity to thank these stations for giving us so much fine publicity. KALE was another station that we were unable to hear, however we had quite a pleasant surprise when we tuned in KWSC and found them to be dedicating their program to the members of our club. We also forgot to mention that Saturday morning we received a letter from CFCT Victoria, B.C. informing us that they were going to take part in our Mid-Winter DX Frolic on Sunday between 3:00 and 4:00 A.M., E.S.T. however we were unable to hear them too. WIND came in very strong and clear but we did not hear them make any mention of our club. KOOS was not on, for when they found that KVL would not be able to give them a clear channel during their program for our club they said that they did not think it any use to go on, but have promised to give our club a portion of a DX program that they are planning for Saturday morning, February 24 from 4:30 to 5:30 A.M., E.S.T. WMMN failed to leave the air after their hour as we had requested with the result that they were still on when KUSD came on and the result was a lot of interference on WMMN by KUSD. We hope our more Westernly members were able to hear KUSD alright. The first half of the KGRS program was spoiled by WHBL but after they went off the air, KGRS came in very nicely. KGIW and KJBS were two more stations that we were not able to hear. CKX was coming through but very poorly and they seemed to be on 1430 kycs rather than on 1450 kycs. KVOA, WJAS, KVL and KVOS did not put in their appearance here in York. We do not believe that WJAS was on at all. KROW came through quite well and we want to thank them for their

success. We certainly appreciate all this fine co-operation and we hope
that you will all receive a lot of excellent reports on your broadcasts.

We are in receipt of a card containing the information that WCBM
Baltimore, Maryland will run a DX program on Friday morning, February
16 from 6:00 to 7:00 A.M., E.S.T. Three worthwhile prizes are being
offered for reports on this broadcast.

We are also in receipt of a letter from WBSO Babson Park, Mass.
in which they have notified us that a portion of their DX program on
Sunday morning, February 18 will be dedicated to the members of our
club. We hope that you'll be listening as they say this will be the on-
ly DX program that they will run this season.

We learn that that mysterious station on 1456 kycs that both C.G.
Huber and Luther Grim heard last week is HeCamp, France who are now op-
erating on that frequency. C.G.H. also sends us the information that JONK
are now operating on 635 kycs.

Howard Schlobohm sends us the information which he has received
from WILM which states that they run a test program of recordings every
2nd & 4th Monday mornings of the month from 1:45 to 2:00 A.M., E.S.T.
Here is your opportunity to hear this station.

C.G. Huber also sends us the following FRC information; WCAH chang-
es their call to WBNS. A construction permit has been issued to erect
a new station in Nacogdoches, Texas on 1420 kycs using 100 watts power.

Donald Barnes has a question that he would like help on: What sta-
tion is operating on 1160 kycs or thereabouts until 5:30 A.M., EST al-
most every morning? Don says their language is not German, Spanish,
French or Jap. He can be reached at 521 Spring St., Grinnell, Iowa,
we know that he will appreciate any help that any of you can give him
on this station. He undoubtedly will take part in the KFJB broadcast
and we hope that you will listen for Don.

We have still another member to welcome at this time and his name is Mr. Paul D. Lunny, 422 Willow St., Scranton, Penna. We certainly hope that you will enjoy being a member of our club.

We received a letter from Keith Freas today in which he mentions hearing KFBK during their DX program for us on Saturday morning. He also says that he is now in a position to get German, French or Spanish verifs translated when you send them to him. He also says that those of you who have already received your verifs from LR5 are to just keep them as he has already gotten four of them from the members to be entered into the S&E contest as it is. He also suggests that we tell the new members the price of our stationary and stickers, therefore may we call to your attention the fact that club stationary may be had at the rate of 55¢ per hundred and club stickers at the rate of 20¢ per hundred.

With this issue of the National Radio Club DX News we begin to exchange Bulletins and tips with the Universal Radio DX Club of San Francisco. We are in receipt of a very fine letter from Mr. Russell K. Keller, Vice-President in which he sends us quite a list of stations that are giving their Club special programs in the near future. Quite a few of these specials are listed on page four of this week's bulletin in our DX calendar.

We have just received a letter from Howard Schlobohm from station WKAQ, San Juan, P.R. in which Mr. Agustí, station manager, advises us that it will necessary for them to change the time of the dedication to our Club on Sunday morning, February 18th. The time he has now scheduled for us will be from 1 to 1:30 AM, EST. All of our members are urged to report on this program.

Good old C. G. Huber sends us the following information: first of all he sends us news regarding a new station being built in Erie, Pa. This station will operate on 1420 kcys with 100 watts at night, 250 watts daytime, with unlimited time. He also informs us that the FRC has granted two construction permits for new stations in Waterbury, Conn., 1120 kcys, 100 watts daytime, and Modesto, Calif., 740 kcys, 250 watts daytime. He also advises us that DXers who have not received their verifications from XEAE as yet can write them, care of Mr. L. R. Parkerson, P. O. Box 283, San Diego, Calif.

Henry Allen also contributes some FRC news which we feel will be of interest to you: granted new station to operate on 1310 kcys., with 100 watts; owned by Northern Bro. Co., and located at Lacoria, N. H. Frequency changes: WOKO from 1440 to 1430; WHEC from 1440 to 1430; WFEA from 1430 to 1340. Power changes: WGAO 200 to 500 watts; WCAC 250 to 500; WIOG increase night power to 500; WCAH (WBNS) increase night power to 1 kw.

We want to take this opportunity to thank Eugene Shook for sending us the list of stations that he has lined on 1370 kcys for the NNRC on Saturday morning, February 24th. This list will also appear in this week's DX calendar.

We are in receipt of a letter from Mr. Edgar M. Anzola, Director of radio station YVIRC, Caracas, Venezuela in which he advises us of a special program that they are broadcasting on the occasion of the celebration of Pan-American Day on April 14th. This program will be broadcast from 9 to 10 P.M., EST. on that day. Mr. Anzola says he hopes that some of our members are successful in bringing in their program at that time.
