DX NEWS OCTOBER 17, 1934

This week we have so much news that we hardly know where to begin. We hope however that we will not overlook a single bit of it and that you will all find it very interesting.

First of all we want to welcome Mr. S. F. Batchelder, 114 Bradford St., Everett, Mass. as a new member in our club and we certainly hope that he will find his membership in our club very beneficial.

Mrs. A. C. Johnson, Henry, S. D. sends us the following information which she gleaned from one of her local newspapers. "The Federal Communications Commission has approved the application of the Aberdeen Broadcast Co., of Aberdeen, S. D. for permission to construct a radio broadcasting station to operate on 1420 kycs. with 100 watts power, during daylight hours."

We are in receipt of a letter from Mr. Glenn R. Dolberg, Program Director for stations KFI and KECA Los Angeles, Calif. in which he advises us that KFI 640 kycs. Los Angeles, Calif. will broadcast all of the latest advance information for the short-wave and broadcast band DX Fans. This broadcast is to take place each Sunday morning from 2:30 A.M., E.S.T. on. It is with great pleasure that we announce that we shall be glad to co-operate with KFI in sending them all of our latest tips and news.

We also received a letter this morning from station WNRA in which they advised us that the DX program which they ran yesterday morning was to only be from 2:00 to 3:00 A.M., E.S.T. as Joe Becker thought. They also say that they shall be glad to dedicate programs to our club.

Benjamin Genung, our Spring City, Penna. member advises us that he is unable to secure International Reply Coupons at his postoffice. May we state for his benefit and any others who may be in the same circumstances, that we here at headquarters will be very glad to get these Coupons for you from our local postoffice. Those of you who do not know what I.R.C.s are for, may we say that they are used to cover postage in securing foreign verifications as they are redeemable for 9¢ in any country in the Universe. These Coupons can be had at our local post-office at 9¢ apiece and we shall be very happy to serve those of you who can not get them in your own communities.

We are in receipt of a letter from KWYO 1370 kycs. Sheridan, Wyo. in which they advise us of their intention to run a DX program on Friday morning, October 19 at 3:00 A.M., E.S.T. They have promised to mention N.R.C. during this broadcast, we hope that our members will listen in and send in their reports on this broadcast.

Alec Kinghorn advises us that owing to very serious trouble down in Cuba that the DX'es which he had scheduled for this month will not take place, that is unless the situation should be cleared up. He further informs us that quite a few of the Cuban stations have been ordered off the air for the month of October because these stations talked over the air, against the Cuban Government. Alec says however that he thinks CMBG will be on for our club on October 25 although at present he is not sure of the frequency that they will use, inasmuch as many of the Cuban stations have changed their wavelength again. At pre-

sent Alec says that it is dangerous to venture into the streets owing to the disorders. We certainly do hope that everything will soon right itself and that things will be peaceful once again in Cuba. Perhaps the DXes which Alec has scheduled for November will take place.

We have a correction to make, we stated in last week's Bulletin that WLLH, 1370 kycs. Lowell, Mass. tests every Tuesday and Wednesday morning at 1:00 A.M., E.S.T. We misunderstood what Keith Freas meant, for he tells us that those tips were for last week only, in other words those broadcasts will take place this week, but not in the future unless we hear otherwise.

Owing to the excellent manner in which the Australian and New Zealand stations are coming in at present, Mr. Huber our Advisory Chairman has secured a list of the New Zealand stations with their time on the air each week from a New Zealand correspondent by the name of R. J. Mullen, we appreciate this information very much and it gives us great pleasure to list it for you.

At the present time the big 4 seems to be 2BL-855 kycs; 5CK-635 kycs; 4QG-760 kycs. and 3LO-800 kycs. Watch for them very closely, for we are sure your efforts will be rewarded.

We received a fine card from Clifford Van Tassell this morning, advising us that he is now at home after a month or more in the White Plains Hospital. Van broke his leg in a bad fall and we are glad to know that he is at home once again.

John Barlow sends us a card telling us of still another acceptance for a DX for the members of our club. This time it is KFJZ 1370 kycs. Fort Worth, Texas to be held on Sunday morning, January 13, 1935, from 2:00 to 3:00 A.M., E.S.T. We thought we would notify you real early of this broadcast in order that it may get world wide publicity. Congratulations, John on the fine work.

Jacob N. Mitchell, 2616 Buehler Ave., St. Joseph, Mo. reports hearing a station on 990 kycs from around 3:00 A.M. to 3:45 A.M. C.S.T. on the morning of October 12. He says during the course of the program he heard duets; yodelling; guitar solos and tenor solos. He says that during all of his efforts he could not hear any announcement. Can anyone identify this station for him? Write him direct if you can assist him.

William H. Ansell advises us that by special arrangement with the International DXers Alliance, the management of VK2ME, Sydney, Aust. have agreed to dedicate three special transmissions to the Provinces of Canada, Alaska and Ykon, to be transmitted on 28.5 metres during the early morning hours from 2:15 to 3:00 A.M. and 6:30 to 7:00 and 7:00 to 7:30 A.M., E.S.T. on December 9, 1934. VK2ME are very anxious for reports on this broadcast and we are asking those of you who have short wave receivers to listen in and send in your reports.

The Canadian Radio Broadcasting Commission through Lt. Col. W. Arthur Steele, has advised Mr. C. G. Huber as following under date of October 9: "We have your letter with regard to monthly frequency tests being made on certain Canadian stations. These tests are conducted by the frequency monitoring station of this Commission, but the schedules have never been put into printed form for distribution." This most certainly indicates that there are frequency checks in Canada and we regret that we are unable to give you a list of the stations taking part in these tests. However so far as we have been able to determine the tests are conducted between 1:00 and 4:00 A.M., E.S.T. on the 18th, 19th and 20th of each month and that the tests are of eight minute periods on two successive mornings. So far we have a record of CFCY; CRCS; CHSJ and CJKL as to the times these stations test each month. Mr. Huber has suggested that we ask members to report to us of the Canadian stations they hear testing on these mornings and we will attempt to make some kind of a schedule from these reports, for later Bulletins. He says that you should report time and dates that you hear these tests. Let's have the support of each and every one of you and by doing so we hope to be able to give you a schedule that is nearly complete.

We want to thank all of the members that sent us information concerning the KWYO Sheridan Wyoming DX broadcast on Friday morning, Oct. 19. There certainly was a lot of fine co-operation shown by the members in notifying us of this broadcast.

We want to take this opportunity to call to your attention the new club sticker which appears at the top of page one of this week's Bulletin. It is the new official National Radio Club sticker, however the ones we sent you on these Bulletins are slightly soiled as they had been marked as such. We thought we would use them up by sending each of you one of them, so that you could see what the new NRC sticker was like, they may be ordered at a rate of 25¢ per hundred and fifty.
