This week we have so much news for you that we have to omit our regular Club heading to conserve space. We hope that you will all find the news very interesting.

First of all we wish to welcome Vincent Clarke, Apartado No. 2488, Havana, Cuba as a new member in our club. We certainly hope that Mr. Clarke will find his membership in our club worthwhile. We might also take this opportunity to thank Mr. Clarke for having arranged a special DX program for the members of our club over COX 1325 kycs on the morning of December 13, from 1:00 to 5:00 A.M., E.S.T. We know our members will want to listen in as Mr. Clarke has informed us that he will do the announcing himself for that program.

At this time we take great pleasure in announcing that the Globe Circlers Radio DX Club of Hackensack, New Jersey have joined the NRC-IDA-CDXR plan of inter-club co-operation, this is another big step forwards and we hope that it will only be a matter of a short time, until all of the radio clubs will adopt this plan.

We feel that this is one of the most gigantic steps forward that the clubs have as yet taken in this inter-club co-operation plan, for these three clubs are going to all work together for a mutual benefit.
