We have encountered bad static conditions and even a few distant rumblings from thunder storms. All of which only goes to prove that this season will soon be history.

To begin this week's Bulletin, we have a very interesting letter from Vincent Clarke, one of our Cuban members, and one who has worked faithfully for our club this season. In fact he and Alec Kinghorn certainly have done remarkable work for our club this season and we certainly do owe them a big hand for their fine support. Vincent says in his letter that owing to the unsettled conditions down in Cuba that everything is upsidedown. He says the people aren't allowed on the street after 12 P.M. at which time they begin to enforce the Curfew law and he says that until this law is either modified or abolished that it will not be possible to put on any DX programs in Cuba. Vincent adds that he is collecting stamps and has about 1000 duplicates that he will be glad to trade with any of our members who may have stamps that he needs. Address him at Apartado No. 2488, Havana, Cuba. He also adds that he now has a job as control operator at CMOX who are now operating on 1320 kycs.

We were very much surprised to hear the program which KIDW was putting on for the members of our club this past Sunday morning. We had quite a bit of difficulty on account of static to identify the station but were certainly agreeably surprised when we found that they were dedicating the program to NRC.

Miss Ida C. Henninger of Allentown, Penna. one of our faithful members, writes us that at last WCBA and WSAN of that city have consented to put on a DX program, a portion of which is to be dedicated to the members of our club. These broadcasts will take place on Sunday morning, April 7 from 3:00 to 4:30 A.M., E.S.T. or later, possibly. WSAN will be the first of these two stations on the air and naturally WCBA will follow them. These stations operate on 1440 kycs. We certainly appreciate the wonderful co-operation that Miss Henninger has given us in this matter; and in return we know that she is especially anxious to have NRC outdo any other club in the number of reports that these stations receive on these programs. Therefore won't each and everyone of our members that possibly can send in a report to these stations, and if you are unable to hear them owing to some reason or other, at least send them a thank you card or letter. We know that Miss Henninger will feel amply repaid for her efforts if we can outdo any of the other clubs on the number of reports we send them. Be sure to remark or indicate in some manner or other that you are a member of NRC when you send in your reports to WCBA and WSAN.

Morgan B. Kent our Daytona Beach, Florida member sends us word that WDFJ of that city who were recently granted a Construction Permit to erect a new station on 1420 kycs. are now finished building the station and have been testing during the past few mornings around 1:00 to 4:00 A.M., E.S.T.
