Feb. 3, ranning, 38 deg, static. Hrd KGFI at 2:10 R/5, WBNS at 2:30 R/9, WLLH at Lawrence Mass at 2:48 R7. Febr. 4 Cloudy, 28 deg, static. Hrd CMBC at 1:49 R/9 on new freq of 690 kcs, WMAL at 2:25 R/8, WSYR on all night R/9, CMBX at 2:34 R/8, KSAL at 2:40 R/4, KTEM at 3:25 R6, KUSD at 3:30 R/6, WHIP at 3:45 R/9, WCSC at 4:05 R/3, KGHL at 4:26 R/7. I notice Nick Evangelista said there should be a watch for the TPs now, as they were beginning to break through. What did he mean. Did he mean that the TPs do not come in up there all during the winter. (Yes OM we have our best TP reception in the Fall and Early Spring. Thats the peak) My goodness the "Aussies and Zedders" come in here the year around-Spring-Summer-Autumn and Winter. Ive never found such a thing as a TP season.
