CHESTER KOMOROWSKI-Norwich Conn. This report which is my first to the NRC summarizes the past season's DXing over here in Eastern Connecticut. This year concludes my third year as a BCB DXer.My log of about 400 heard and 110 verified indicates that I am not to active in the game. Most of time I have tried to log and verify foreign and distant U.S. stations to the west, of which so far I haven't too many..Considering the small amount of time I spent in this dial turning hobby the past winter I can boast of several fine catches. This is the truth though you may not believe I DXed but one day a week at an average of two hours every Sunday morning, with the exception of three occasion's when I got up to log or try to log stations on other days of the week. I did considerable more time tuning the ether during evening hours. The new foreign stations are: -LKA LR3 LS11 PRG2 PRF3 HJ3CAC (870) HJ1ABH (1080) HJ1ABN (1190) HJ3CAE (1220) YV5KL (1167) TIPG TIEP TG1 TGW XEQ XEN XEAC XEB XERB XEL XEDH XEFC CMHW CMKS CMKW CMCP CMHI CMJW CMKM CMKE CMHM CMC CMBF CMRT CMBH ZNS.. Those underlined already have verified, and none of the Colombians did as yet, reply. As for some of the Cubans I decided I should forget them and their long-awaited veries.. I use an 8 tube Zenith 715 with a V shaped antenna, generally directional to the South.During January I logged my first and only European, it being Poste Parisien. I noticed the European stations were mostly received during the week by the reports of fellow members.. There wasn't anyone who reported good trans-Atlantic reception on Sunday mornings.. Enough of this lamenting of mine, and in closing I wish every member the best of health and plenty of sunshine . . . (Thanks OM for your report and hope that we will hear a great deal more from you this season how about it Hi(Harry)

JOE BECKER-Hamilton Ohio. No new veries lately and the ole log still stands at 1218 Verified and 1225 heard, reports out to CMCH CMKZ TG1 TIXD XEAU XEAI CMHP, and these 7 I have written down in My little black list book. I have written then 2 or 3 follow up letters, even sent Cuban cards all filled out ready to sign... (Cont next page)

Cont Joe Beckers Report: -WFMJ not ready to come on the air and WDSM will not be on the air for quite some time....

RANDOLPH HUNT-Leucadia Calif. We noticed on May 28th that XELO shifted back to 670 kcs from 730. XERB is only on the air two hours per day, 5:30-7:30 PM PST. Veries since last report and days out, JOBK2 40 days out, JOMG 52, JOUK 53 and JOPK 61. Fastest time on a verie from Japan was JOBG 35 days, longest time was also from JOBG and was 372 days. Now have 102 J0 veries (35 different stations) it took six years, one month and one week to reach the 100 mark. All except four of the reports included the call letters. Only once have I ever heard a J0 give call except at sign off. I think that a lot of J0 veries held in the U.S. are for reports on the five minutes of news in English from 1:55 to 2:00 AM PST. One lad in California got some J0 veries by writing a fancy letter about how he enjoyed the programs etc, and that he heard the station give its call at a certain time, all this DXer did was to use the beat frequency oscillator, in this manner he could tell when the station left the air...
