Have received my verie from WNCE and was signed my Marian Call, Asst General Manager...On the 21 and 22 of July Harold Burstrom was down to pay me a visit...On the 16th of July I hrd a station on 1500 or 1520 reception very good, but they gave no call letters, it was not WJBK...Also have report out to WING formerly WSMK...

DICK COOPER-Kittanning Pa. Havent been doing any DX and havent had time to do much writing. KFPA 1500 Amarillo Texas goes on the air Aug 1st..CBK 540 kc., Watrous Sask was due July 15... WPG is sold and soon will be deleted, also WBIL or WOV will be killed. KEHE deleted and KECA moves to 780 kc., WING new call for WSMK. Does any one have the freq sked of WMRO or do they have a day freq check...

JOE BRAUNER-Williamsville N.Y. Nothing to report on recent DX catches except WNOE, formerly WBNO, the new call indentifies the station owner, a Mr. Noe, who represents his state in Washington..The FCC has approved a permit for a new station at Niagara Falls N.Y. to use 1000 watts; daytime only, on 1260 kcs...Checking over the log, I find that between April 30th, 1938 and the same date in 1939 I logged 75 catches on BCB, increseing the log from 1,380 to 1,454... New stations which I believe are active now, ans which I still need to log are WTMC WCOS & KWFT...In Canada I lack CFPR CBA CJCUCBJ & CHGE, pluss any recently licensed stations...(Time this bulletin goes out Om you will have several more USA stations to get, hi.)

CARL FORESTIERI-Bronx N.Y. After ten years that I have spent DXing where I got many hours of trills and pleasure I now strongly consider my retirement of this fine hobby. It cost a little and when we consider that many stations pockets our stamps, dimes and IRC I doubt if it pays to continue yet. However when I look in my logs where I keep over 1000 BCB stations veries, in 27 Countries and over 200 veries in 43 Countries on SW. I hate to depart from this hobby the best of all. During the ten years as a BCB DXer I have completely logged and verified all the States with the exception of California, Washington Oregon and Montana. Now all the other states are to be completed once more with the many new stations that are licenced often I doubt if we can repeat again when at one time I completed all the W's calls and had only about 40 K's to log. In this ten yrs I have DXed with only two sets A Zeneth 35 PX from 1929 to March 1934 and the Atwater Kent 711 ever since 1934. I have been in four location though but all in a half mile radius, here in the beautiful boro of the Bronx. I was one of the first DXer in New York City, if not the first to Log European on the BCB, it was Radio Trieste on November 29. 1932. At that time many DXers said that my log of Trieste was fishey, but time gave me many more as well as the other DXers, as for my part I am proud of my European log on the BCB as I have logged 13 stations in France, five in Germany, five in Italy and one each in Portugal and Ireland. Austria I have 2BL 4QG 5CL 5CK New Zealand 1YA. Hawaii KGMB KHBC, South America counts 7 in Argentina 3 in Brazil, 5 in Venezuela and Bolivia two. One each in Uruguay, Guatemala, Haiti, Columbia, Bahama Island, Miquelon and the thrill of them all a verie from Radio Algeris and one of Radio Maroc.

PAT REILLEY-Jamestown N.YA short report on my 1938-39 DX activeties. Heard 89 new ones, verified 67 and 22 still out yet. percentage of 753 verified 4 new candians, 6 Aussies and Zedders. 4 Mexicans, 5 Cubans, 3 South American and the rest were in U.S. for a total of 1063 verified calls, all but 5 of the 22 reports still out are from Spanish stations in Cuba, Mexico Central and South America..

HAROLD CRISWELL-Spring Grove Pa. DX season that has just ended was the best for several years in my estimation with improved reception from all over the country with some of the 100 watters on the Coast coming thru with almost unbelievable signal strength. On several mornings KSAN KRE KVEC KGAJ were very good, although there were'nt as many programs schedule as in previous years. Not much luck from TP's or TA's stations although we didnt try much. Added 115 new veries to my collection besides several repeats. Some of the best veries being. KPPC KSAN KVEC KLBM PRF3 LRA KGMB KELA KQRS KUTA KSVB KWEW KAWM KWJB. 115 veries from 124 stations reported, heard some stations I had been listening for several years. And received veries from several stations I was nexer able to get veries from befor. But some still refuse to verify particularly KVNU which I cant get anything from, last station heard being WTMC June 22nd...

MERLIN N. STEEN-Decorah Iowa: On Dec 11 1934 I became the owner of a 6 tube, 6 volt Kolster Radio It was second hand and I didnt make it work till Jan 5 1935, on the first eve I had it working DX got the best of me, began making out a log, however I did not find out about FCC tests till early 1937, In Nov 1935 I had my set changed from a 6 volt to a 2 volt to lessen battery operation cost. My first verie was from KFXJ Grand Junction Col on March 10 1937-2nd verie WLB. I came into the VAS class in Jan 1939 by verify'ing WLNH and WCOU In Sept 1938 my Kolster broke down and I obtained a 5 tube Setchell-Carlson Radio which still works very well. It was not untill I got this that I heard TGW TGI IYA 4YA LRA KPPC etc. To date (July 23) I have a log of 301 heard and 480 verified. The following staes are all verified Minn Miss, Mo, Neb, Nev N.D. Tenn, W.Va., and Manitoba (This is correct up to Feb 28 1939) Some new stations have now been licensed in some of these states, giving me something to do in 1939-40 Hi. WOC WCLS KLCN WDEL WAVE KGFL WKY KASA KGFY WJAR WPRA WCLO WRJN are still eluding me. Have wrote WOC three times. If they dont come thru I'll have to wait till the National Corn Husking Contest near Davenport in 1940 and see them personally while I am down there. Well members I will be all set to go when the DX season roll's around and I wish you all the best of luck.... Will meet several of you boys at the convention this year. Hi, untill then signing off.

MAX DEMULING-Erie Penna. Havent done any DX'ing during the summer-A few veries returned including HJLABN CBA XEDH YSS OAX4A 2NR and 2CY... All preparations for the NRC convention are nearly completed. A big turnout is expected as enthusiasm is running high as the time draws near.....

ED FEICHTNER-Erie Pa. The pass DX season was a very good one for me.

No reports from LR3 LR6 LTI YVIRF, also KVNU has not replied as yet. KRQA is another who failed to come back, this one will be lost due to change of call letter. The slow Cubans and Mexicans are XEC XEL XEQ CMCM CMBF CMCX XEAI XEDF CMHW XEBW CMK. The only Canadian that failed to come back was CHGB, I sent follow up's to most of these. I had fairly good luck with some of my Follow up's receiving veries from KASA WNBO CMCB XELO CMCH CMHP HJLABN HJLABH (veried on Emisora Atlantic a card which was with HJLABG their short wave station) CMKW CX18 and XEM... I hope the next season will proof as good as last. I want to thank the Burstrom and Edge family for the fine time given to us Erie boys on our visits to Cleveland and Buffalo this summer. I'm getting in shape to eat at Pat Reilley's house in a few days. Hi Hi....
