Please listen in and tune us again. (The time is EWT) This time schedule is quite close to the COLOMBO station and there is a possibility of mistaking ours with Colombo or visa-versa. DXed a little the other AM and added a couple nice catches, namely VE9AI-JRAK-VLC6 the best Aussie hrd here a Q5 R 10-PIAM Radio Rangoon-Radio Shonan-~~ZZAM~~ JZHA, Solomon Islands, Azad Moslem Radio-GWN-PRLB-Madagascar Radio Tananarive-Ceylon-JCJC in Cairo and also WMOH in J Becker's home town in daytime. Veries in from VE9AI-CX6-VBF and a couple more. No news from Ripley here. (Just as I said in letter-Ray)

When I do I'll be needing a 3 day pass to read it. With another DX season coming up I hope the club continues to go strong. Naturally I wont be doing any DXing but at least I hear a radio once in a while. Its quite a novel experience to be planted in a country like this. Many of the natives still wear robes as they did centuries ago. Far from clean and they sit and lay around streets, alleys, doorways. They figure all Americans are rich and they use their ingenuity to gyp us. That wasnt hard either till we got used to their money. They pay us in the darn stuff. A few days ago we visited Cairo and saw the stage show "This is the Army" Then around town and the thives, beggars, gyps and peddlers and magicians swarmed around. Some where amusing but most of them were a nuisance. The streets are dark and crowded so we had to be careful. We get our normal needs at a PX here and the Red Cross has radio, records and piano. There is no waste of spare time and I want to see all I can while I'm here. (OK for the swell letter Warren and lots of good luck to you from all)

If anyone know who it was and if it was YV5RB please let me know as I have plenty material for a verie. Also who is the code station on aprox 1238 kc often hrd about 3 AM. He is definitely sending in some foreign language and I am sure it isnt Spanish-German-French as these just wont work unless it is code groups and it doesnt sound like that. Also who was the station testing on 1580 kc at 3:40 on 9/19 with raw AC on final. Lousy signal but very strong. A few of the members have written in saying that their bulletin did not arrive, this being a week or so after it was mailed. It has been investigated at this end and you can be sure that your bulletins are sent on their way within an hour after they are delivered at the Main Post Office here in Buffalo. The hold up seems to be at transfer points along the way and this is caused by the large increase in all mail. If you will remember that before this war your bulletins were arriving in very good time, those up to the Mississippi getting theirs on Monday and some of you west of that river also receives your bulletins on Mondays regularly.

Due to this hold up at the different transfer points nothing can be done about it and you will just have to wait until it arrives, however if you do not wish that you can have your bulletin mailed from Club HQ via first class mail but you will have to pay the additional postage because paying even 3¢ per issue and there being 3 1/4 issues it would take \$1.02 of your annual \$2.00 dues for postage, leaving only 98¢ to cover the cost of paper-envelopes-mimeograph ink and stencils which would not be enough. Then if the bulletin ran over 4 sheets of paper it would require 6¢ postage which would again take more of your dues. So if you do wish this service you can send along \$1.00 and the club will pay the 1st 1-1/2 ¢ postage and you pay the rest, thus it will cost you 1-1/2¢ on a 4 page bulletin or 4-1/2 ¢ postage if it runs over 4 sheets of paper.

Some of you have asked for another bulletin which was sent at once but it must be remembered that we do not print a lot of extra copies of each issue because that would be a waste of paper as they would just be laying around and no one could judge as to how many would be used. Your editor addresses the envelopes the first part of the week and when it comes time to print the bulletin he prints them according to the amount of envelopes to be used. I hope that you will understand and if your bulletin doesn't come too soon please wait as it will arrive as they will be mailed from Club HQ on schedule. It has been learned that in cases where the bulletin was not received and another one was asked for, the first one was received before the 2nd one arrived.

Now to a little talk on the Club becoming just a BCB Club. If you read the SW section of the Sept 9th issue you will know the answer, so I am asking you to do the following things from now on. Please use the Frequency Frolic Column more often and use it for the important items, not with every thing you hear and PLEASE list the items according to FREQ-LOCATION and then the remarks. By doing this it makes it so much more easier here as that column isn't made up until the last thing so that everything important that comes in can be listed and not held over from one week to another. That is why I ask that these items be listed on a separate sheet of paper, it need not be a full sheet, any clean or piece of scrap paper will do, just as long as it can be kept separate from your regular report. Also send in your reports as soon as possible and I am making THURSDAYS the deadline for everything.

One of the FIRST improvements in our BCB Bulletin is that in cases of stations notifying us of a DX or some other important item pertaining to DXes or so a card will be sent you if it can not be given to you in a bulletin that will reach you in time. IN ORDER TO GET THIS SERVICE YOU MUST REGISTER WITH DICK COOPER-956 ORR AVE., KITTANNING, PENN AT ONCE. There will be no cost to you, but YOU MUST REGISTER. However those on the west ~~xx~~ coast who desire Air mail service must also send in 7¢ for each card they wish mailed that way, there will probably be only five or six such occasions. But register in order to get this postal service.

You notice that a couple different colored pages are used, this is not caused by a paper shortage here, its only that I am using some extra paper that was obtained from our member Bob Spencer, the white is and will be used as soon as this is gone. We have plenty on hand here.
