### A RARE DX PROGRAM

Thanks to a great idea of Dick Cooper, an original contact by Lefty Cooper, and the way our members responded by sending cards and letters, asking Mrs. McNeil for a DX, the mail to HQ brought this welcome one from Mrs McNeil, of KGFX. " Dear Mr Cooper. We have made plans to broadcast for your Club 2:30-3:30 AM on Thursday AM December 12 as requested in your letter (CST) Excepting for frequency checks we have not for a long time broadcast in the night but we have returned veteran, Ty Rensch, who has an amateur station here before the war, who was a Capt in the Signal Corps during service, and I am sure he will be able to provide interesting conversation. Perhaps I shall also do part of the broadcast as I do most of what is done about announcing at the station, and have since Feb 1922. Before my Husband's death 1936 we had DX programs a number of times as he too was an amateur, having first set in 1916, then building anew in 1921. We became KGFX in 1927. One of my sons, Richard is an Ensign on the USS Tucson, having graduated last June at Annapolis and he too is in communications (Cont Page 3)

- 5-cent rate (each ounce) Anywhere in continental United States, Army and Fleet Post Offices, Alaska, Canada, Mexico, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Island of the U.S., Canal Zone, Guam and Hawaii.
  - 10-cent rate (per half-ounce) All South American countries, the Falkland Islands, Surinam, and Newfoundland.
  - 15-cent rate (per half-ounce) European countries including Azores, Corsica, Faroe Islands, Gibraltar, Iceland, Libya, Madeira Islands, Malta, British and Spanish Morocco & all U.S.S.R., and regular well-known countries of Europe.
  - 25-cent rate (per half-ounce) Asia and Africa, and various Pacific Islands.
- Hal had no report on Central-American countries, but we presume they are included in the 10-cent per half-ounce rate, as is South America. These rates went into effect 11/1/46.

To all NRC Members;

Since a Board Member asked a question of Bill Stone in regard to no Canadian DXes for the NRC, and Bill Stone answered also via the bulletin, it is thought by your Executive Secretary that a fuller answer should be forthcoming especially since he has received a great many inquires from the members.

As you will recall, last year, a DX gathering was held at the home of Phil Nichols. At this gathering ideas were brought up for a Club Cooperation Plan, whereas all DX programs would be dedicated to ALL CLUBS in order to get more reports to the stations DXing. Every one there thought it a good idea and so it was brought up to all Clubs.

Immediately after that gathering Bill Stone an NRC CPC Man started to have all his Canadian DXes dedicated to all clubs. He was informed that he should not do that because the Club Cooperation Plan had not been Oked by the Clubs and nothing in that line could be done until the plan had been OKed and adopted by each club. Bill then went back to dedicating only to NRC.

Back to the Plan. The NNRC-VRC and NRC named committee's and each one named its Chairman. Then they together named Al Bartholomew of the NRC as Chairman for all. Information from Bartholomew says he has written to all the Chairman of the different Clubs Committees and has not received any answers. So as you might know the Plan has not went any further, and is not any further than it was a year ago.

Bill Stone was a member of the Board of Directors of the NRC from Sept 1 1945 to Sept 1 1946 and he knew that this plan had not been passed by any Club. However at the annual NRC Convention September 1946 a meeting was held by the Board of Directors, that is the New incoming Board. After this meeting was over Bill Stone came upon Dick Cooper now NRC CPC Chairman and informed him that he again was going to dedicate all his Canadian DXes to all Clubs as he had received permission from the NNRC and VRC. Dick knowing that Stone was a CPC NRC Man and not connected with any other Club at this time informed Bill that If he intended to do that to leave the NRC out of his dedications, but that the NRC would publish all information regarding those DXes. Dick realized that this same question had been gone over last season and he felt that by informing Stone as he did, this would end the question right there. Later Dick informed me he had received a letter from Stone again asking about including the NRC in his DXes. Dick did not answer because he felt that the question had been settled and he had no authority to change it. So all in all Bill Stone was not given permission to include the NRC in the Canadian DXes even though Stone was a NRC CPC Man. Further more according to the plans of the Club Cooperation Plan this would not be done until the Plan had been accepted by all Clubs and their Board of Directors OKed it. One other reason was involved too.

Before Dick took over NRC CPC Chairmanship, it was held by Lefty Cooper who had contacted Mr Carl Horton of the NRC CPC asking him if he would agree to a plan of submitting his list of DXes to the NRC if Lefty would do the same for the NNRC. He suggested that both mail their lists to each other on a certain date and time, then if any conflictions occurred they could be ironed out before the stations came on the air. This plan was refused by Mr Horton. So Members I hope the above will straighten you out as to why Bill Stone was granted no authority to have his Canadian DXes include the NRC along with the other Clubs.
