Musings of the MembersKermit Geary - Walbridgeport, Penna.

Reception conditions were poor during the past week, with only 5 new ones logged. However, the 10 swell veries received amply made up for the dearth of catches. The best one of the lot came from Holland, verifying my reception of their transmission on 1222 kilocycles on the morning of 1/19/48 from 2:10 to 2:30 a.m. At the bottom of the regular 4-page verie issued by the Holland stations, the Chief Engineer wrote the following: "This program is broadcast by the regional 245 meter transmitters (1222 Kc/s.) at Hogezand and Beek with a power of 4 kw (!!), although it is unbelievable that you picked up these transmitters, but the items and announcements you heard are correct!" The exclamation points are his. It looks like I was one of the first to report them, or else they wouldn't have been so surprised at being heard over here. These synchronized transmitters are located near Groningen on the north coast and near Maastricht at the southern tip of Holland, respectively. No. #2 on the list came from "Radio Trinidad," a yellow QSL card verifying reception of their DX program. A nice QSL card in an envelope was received from KWIK on 1490 Kc/s. Their card is a duplicate of KXLA's. The other 7 ~~days~~ were letters, coming from KFGO WATO XSBW WDNE WHED WLOF & WVJG. After the big morning of 3/15 when PRE-4 and CX46A were logged, new catches were limited to fairly local ones, as follows: 3/17 - WMMI, Marquette, Mich., 970 Kc/s., on ET from 2:53 to 3:06 a.m., and WFUS on DX program from 3:05 to 4:00 a.m., with weak signals and QRM from KXCO. 3/19 - WNAM on f/c from 4:45 to 5:00 a.m., through terrific QRM from WOV & WJEU. 3/20 - WIEB, Enterprise, Alabama, 1230 Kc/s., testing at 3:06 a.m. 3/21 - WANE, Fort Wayne, Ind., 1450 Kc/s., on ET from 2:15 to 3:45 a.m., and 3/22, static so heavy that, like Pat Reilly says, you have to be afraid that the set will jump up and bite you. WOR was off, and WKERG was heard testing from 2:44 to 2:53 a.m., I believe I copied the call correctly, through the high noise level.
