IV - "THE BENCH QUARTER."

Yes, the football season is once again upon us, and again, it influences DX, at least a little. With two major league Football groups operating, and with several teams on the West Coast, and with several games to be played at night, very often that last quarter of the game may be heard for goodly distances! And often, when an Eastern team is playing in the far west, the station back home also carries the event, giving DXers the chance of catching them. Now that also applies to night college games, and sometimes it also means that a daytime station will be given special permission to remain on the air in the evenings with the description of the game, so it might be a good idea to have a look at your Friday paper's sports pages for such Friday night games, and also for Saturday night games. Now, as the football season wanes and fades, the basketball season comes upon the scene, and again, there are frequent games on the air later than the usual schedule of the stations. In basketball, almost all the games are at night, with the accent on Friday nights and Saturday nights. Remember there are professional leagues here, too, as well as myriads of college games. Some stations in small towns sometimes even broadcast high school basketball games, so be on the watch for them. One way of identifying the station is by listening for the names of the teams playing, then consulting your Art Foerster Radio Log for stations in that town. And, then in Canada, hockey will be getting under way in a few weeks, and that means more broadcasts for you to be on the alert for. Toward the end of the hockey season -that is along about March - the big play-off games, if tied, go into extra periods, until some one scores, and there again, you have a wonderful opportunity of catching a seldom-heard station. Canadian stations are also heard on late fronttime to time with curling matches. Be a sports-lover and a DXer, then, at the same time! NEXT WEEK - ROAR, AURORA, ROAR!

With the DX season well under way and two radio stations under construction in Kittanning, I think it's high time to get a report in for the bulletin. Finally got going again with my DX and new veries are in from WHOD WABA WEAP WQUM WETB WQXJ WHIN WVEC WNEC WWSB WLIO, all letter, with cards coming from WONE WCPA WNDR WMNC. WMNC has been out over a year and came through without a follow-up. I have reports out to WTCO WGTL WEUS KHER WILE WABZ WABJ WRPE WORA KIMP. Added KHER on 10/4 asking for reports, and KIMP, 960, Mount Pleasant, Texas testing all morning. WORA, 1150, checking frequency at 4:00 a.m. Most of the others logged at sunset or regular schedule. WKIN will have Raytheon transmitter. I feel sure both stations will verify promptly. May I suggest that the members can be most helpful in reporting frequency check schedules in "DX Down the Dial."
