She is very nice indeed, you may recall her picture in May "Radio Best" magazine. 10/26, logged WNEF on DX, WMGR logged on f/c, WSRS on ET. 10/27 - KQV on DX, WKDA on f/c, WDUK on DX, WSIR on f/c, 10/28 - WJMW on ET kicking WINS around, WMOG on f/c, WIBB on ET back of WDSU, 10/29, WIBB again, on top of WDSU with ET, WMBS on DX. 10/30 - KXAR on f/c back of WWSW with s/off 2:35 a.m., WKOP on DX, WWXL on DX, 10/31 - WGAT testing on 1210 Kc/s., WJVB on DX with R-8, with fade-out after 6:53 a.m., 11/1 - WWNY on DX, WCRA on DX, KTNM on DX and in the clear, WCHA on test. 11/4, WSCR on DX, WVCG on f/c, 11/5, Heavy static, back to bed to catch up on sleep. 11/6, XET on supposed-to-be DX program, KTYL on f/c at 4:00 to 4:15 a.m. 11/7 - KAYL Storm Lake, Iowa, on 990 Kc/s. with ET, logged from 4:12 to 4:35 a.m. which was sign-off. Also on 11/7, reported WOBS and WSVS on regular schedule. Checking my DX cards and letter, I find I did some DXing back in the early 30's, XED verie card in 1931, CKOK letter and EKKO stamp, W1XAU, Boston, Mass. both in 1932. KPSD letter and EKKO stamp, WHBC, Canton, Ohio, verie card then only 10 watts on 1200 Kc/s., in 1933. 1934 only verie was KPCR with thank-you, your report checks with our log. Radio used back at that time was a 6-tube table model Aircastle Radio from Spiegel's. Took a long recess till 1939, then went at it very strong with another Aircastle 6-tube set till 1942.

Radioph Hunt - Leucadia, California

Nov. 1-5 there were 9 stations listed in DX Calendar. I took check on all of them. Listened to Ken Albrack at KLOU for an hour. Found KVNI blocked for over two hours by carrier etc., then found them in the clear and sent what I hope Mustoe considers good report. KTNM, Tucumcari was on for more than half-hour and copied, lots of noise. On 790 trying for WWNY, Watertown, N.Y. I made a few notes that could have been sent to station on DX, but at end of the hour I heard call and it was KTQD in Anchorage, no report, but during the hour WEUS in Eustis, Florida came on from 3:40 to 3:50 with f/c sent report. Of course WWOL ran into KMOX having decided to be on all night. Others were not heard, being blocked in the west, however the hearing of KVNI made it all worth while. One night there was no XEW on 900 kc/s., and reported CJVI. Now have 15 reports out for the season, one feature of this year's Contest better than last year's is that one does not have to write so many stations, once a contestant gets two 250 watters in an area he can more or less rest on his laurels until a Club Special comes along. Len Kruse has a lot of good info for me in recent DX Down the Dial the s/ons of stations in the South.

Fred Van Voorhees - Camp Hill, Pennsylvania

Have had a few mornings to DX with excellent results since the last report. Veries have come in from WDUK & KLKC. New reports went out to WPRA WPRP WIBS WAPA WLAC WENA WVNJ & WSCR. Hope to get a few more written today. 11/2, up for any pre-election programs that might be on and found a Puerto Rican network on with a speech in Spanish from 3:00 until after 3:30. I heard it on WPRA WPRP WIBS WAPA WLAC and WENA. It may have been on others. 11/4, up for one of the worst mornings in my DX history, but still got WVNJ 2:42-3:00 with a test. Also copied WSCR with special, but he was never over S-4 although he is 100 miles away. Mostly S 2-3. 11/6 added 4 more to the log with WENC copied through the mess on 1230, 3:08-3:20. WIOU testing 3:22 to 3:44. WALE through WEBQ on 1400 from 3:45-4:00. WARE finally with what sounded like an early sign-on from 4:00-4:15 on 780. 11/8 for an equally good morning with WEBJ f/c on 1240 3:03-3:15, KCCA f/c same frequency 3:13-3:30 a.m.; WKCT with ET on 930 3:30-3:45 a.m. Then special from WOOF on 560 4:05-4:20. Passed up reports on WEKR and WCLA, the former due to not enough material, and the latter because I wanted to copy WOOF and go to bed. Wish the quality of DX would pick up. The quantity is there all right though. Put my antenna up again yesterday, so am hoping for bigger things.

HELP TO PUBLICIZE THE NATIONAL RADIO CLUB BY MENTIONING MEMBERSHIP IN IT WITH REPORTS.

Musings of the MembersKermit Geary - Walnutport, Pennsylvania

In the October 30th bulletin it was stated that the Atlantic Radio Club was the grandfather of the N.R.C. In order that the facts may be known, I quote the first item on Page 1 of Volume 1, #23, of the National Radio Club bulletin dated Jan. 24, 1934: "With this issue we have some very important news concerning the merger of the Atlantic Radio Club with the National Radio Club. We are indeed very sorry that the A.R.C. could no longer continue after a successful showing since its origin but we wish to take this opportunity to welcome the former A.R.C. members as members of the National Radio Club, with all the privileges of original N.R.C. members. We certainly hope that we can please them with our efforts. The merger becomes effective this week and henceforth former A.R.C. members will receive our bulletins." A swell letter of verification was received from CMHE, "Radio Encrucijada Cuba," 250 watts, 1090 Kc/s. This station was constructed by the 21-year-old son of the owner, and his picture was enclosed. They state that my report was submitted to the Director of Cuban Radio to serve as proof of the perfection of their transmitter, with the request that he return it since they want to preserve it in their files as a souvenir. The only other verie received this week was a neat printed card from KHOF. Reports were limited to the following: 11/6, WHFE, on regular schedule from 7:05 to 7:30 a.m.; 11/7, KAYL, Storm Lake, Iowa, 990 Kc/s., on ET from 4:20 to 4:35 a.m., and WFUR on regular schedule from 5:00 to 5:15 p.m. sign-off; and 11/8, WLOU, Louisville, Ky., 1350 Kc/s., on ET from 3:32 to 4:00 a.m., and WOOF on its DX program from 4:10 to 4:24 a.m. On 11/7, a station was heard on 1030 Kc/s. at 5:45 a.m., announcing as HJBC, "La Voz de Cucuta." However, the frequency was stated as 1270 Kc/s., to which they are assigned. Either they had slipped a good long way from 1270 to 1030 Kc/s., or they were being relayed by some other station. The program was a special sporting event. I'm sure that the discussion currently going on in the bulletin will effectively serve to discourage prospective C.P.C. men. Can't for the life of me see how a C.P.C. man can be held responsible for veries.

Here is another small report. Heard on November 1 - WMGM WMID KLWT WHTC WSSO. November 2, no luck on any new ones. Nov. 3, did not DX, but I did sleep 11 hours. Nov. 4, KXRX, KFSB, WSCR. I do not think that reception this year is as good as it was last year at this time. I like my Hallicrafters set very much, one thing I like very much is this - I can go from one end of the dial to the other, in a very short time. The noise limiter is also good. WSCR put on a very good show. WJMW, Athens, Alabama, was giving out names of DXers reporting their reception, and quite a few NRC members were mentioned. IX. IS YOUR DIAL WORMY?

Well, in one sense, all dials are wormy - they have two ends. Well, that may be a poor pun, we'll grant, but it is one thing some DXers forget at times. Many a good catch on the low end of the band has been missed, only because the dialist stayed on the high end all morning. One can never tell at what time a rarely-heard station, like ~~WJMO~~ or KGFY, or other daytime stations, might come on the air for a frequency check, or a test. When DX is good, it is entirely possible that the Hawaiians and Alaskans might be heard on the low end of your dial - try every morning for them - there may be only one or two mornings when these will come in for you, so don't let it pass, un-noticed. Our suggestion is to make a tour of the dial, from 540 to 1600, at least every quarter-hour, while you are DXing, and make sure you are not missing something you have wanted for a long while. Maybe a new tester is holding forth on one of the low channels - maybe there's a short tone test or frequency check going on down there! Tune down from time to time, then, while you are at the dials, lest you now be left out in the cold when some one else is catching a red-hot rare station! There are many high-powered Europeans on the low end, too, and they should be heard till 3 a.m. E.S.T. on good mornings for DX. Don't pass it up! Have a look, and a listen, and add a corking good catch from time to time! NEXT WEEK - ALL-NIGHT REMEDIES.

We've noted when columns of questions were started in other years that the percentage of answers was very slim. That is why we have cut these items so much, particularly those in which no lead is given at all. If the asker would put down, such items as the program was organ music, or polkas, or band music, or if he could give the state the station was in, or the time used, or that a foreign language was used, or a split frequency, then we would feel justified in printing such questions. But when you ask "What station was on 1230 kc. at 3 AM on 11-12, then we don't print it. There are far too many possibilities, and if you don't have enuf to give a lead to the station then we don't believe you have enuf for a veri, so why worry about what station you heard. That's our idea of it, if you think differently, lots hear about it.
