- W F O X** Milwaukee, Wisconsin. We do not know how long WFOX will remain on the air, so George A. Dodge, Chief Engineer / we suggest you tune in very early. This happens to be Thanksgiving Day, a holiday for most of us, and this program from the very choice DX catch in Milwaukee will give us something to be thankful for. This is a test, and the length of the program is contingent on the success of their experimentations. This information came from the N.N.R.C.
- C F O S** Owen Sound, Ontario. This will be CFOS' first DX program since changing R. Turnpenry - Chief Engineer to high power, and this should mean a much better chance of logging CFOS. XESM will provide some interference, but their distinctive Latin American music is easily discernible. We look for another fine program in a series of Canadian DX programs, so be sure to take in this program, something else adding to our Thanksgiving! Arranged, NNRC
- C H N O** Sudbury, Ontario. Another first - this being CHNO's first venture A. J. Robinson, Station Manager into the realm of the DXers' world. This, then, means that CHNO is needed by almost all the fans across the nations. And, it looks like a clear channel, too! They will play band music and popular music, alternating each 15 minutes. So, set your cap for CHNO, and be there when "the band starts playing." Arranged by the NNRC.
- W A W Z** Zarephath, New Jersey. WAWZ has long been very much interested in DXers, N. L. Wilson, Chief Engineer and this time they are teaming up with KPOF, their sister station, to bring us a "one-two" punch we will long remember in the annals of unusual DX programs. WAWZ will have a clear channel, in all probability, except for the Hawaiian, KHON. Be sure to tune in the Eastern "Pillar of Fire" station, then. Arranged by the NNRC
- K P O F** Denver, Colorado. Part II of this duo of DX programs will come Paul H. Schissler, Chief Engineer from the Western outlet of the "Pillar of Fire," KPOF, in the Mile-High city. This channel is expected to be clear, also, and the second half of this program will be, of course, their regular fourth Friday frequency check program. We hope you'll all be successful in logging WAWZ and KPOF in these twin DX programs. Arranged, NNRC.
- C K O K** Penticton, British Columbia. There is some doubt of the date for this program. If CKOK gets its station on 800 kilocycles by Nov. 28, they will be on on that date Harry O. Watts, Manager from 4:00 to 5:00, E.S.T. If not, then the program goes on Dec. 3, 3:30-4:30 EST, on their present channel, 1550. Both should be clear at the given hours, so check both. The power, on either frequency, will be 250 watts. Arranged, NNRC.
- W A T N** Watertown, New York. Harry's wonderful frequency check all-request programs Harry Righter, President have run into all-nighters and lots of interference, but please note that this is a Monday, which right away eliminates WRIR. WWWB may or may not be on. This is your best chance of logging WATN for those 3 big contest points, on this Monday date. Remember, for your request, shoot a card to Harry Righter, NRC member, now, and you'll hear it Nov. 29.
- C K U A** Edmonton, Alberta. We believe that this channel will also be clear for J. B. McRae, Program Director CKUA, a station needed by many DXers in the east. CKEY will not be on - now it is up to KMF. Out in Alberta, this station should sail through if we get a good morning for DX, so let no one miss this chance of landing a really good catch. Will you be there? We hope so, and our thanks go out to Mr. McRae and CKUA. Arranged by NNRC.

- C K P** OC Brantford, Ontario This station was heard by many of you DXers when they used but 100 watts, but now, with a full kilowatt, CKPC should boom across the cool night air into your homes. Again, the only expected QRM will be KHON, out in Honolulu, which means that almost every member should have a fine open shot at CKPC. This, too, is a Thanksgiving Day program - let's tune in! Arranged, NNRC
- W K N X** Saginaw, Michigan Last season, WKNX put on the air a special test program, and they also put on some fine entertainment, while testing. Again, comes a test from this station in Saginaw, and on this almost-always clear channel, there should be a real chance for every member to hear this fine station, which relishes its long distance reports. This will be, we repeat, an equipment test. Info came from NNRC
- "Radio St. Pierre"** Miquelon Islands. We got the tip that this station is on 560 Kc/s. but believe it incorrect, and that they are on 670 Kc/s. This station, with a very limited schedule, is a real catch for any DXer, so be sure to tune for this 1½ hour show. St. Pierre and Miquelon are north of Prince Edward Island, a French possession. Address: The Manager; Bureau of Service & Information, "Radio St. Pierre," St. Pierre et Miquelon. Arranged, NNRC.
- C F A R** Flin Flon, Manitoba "We have just installed a new 280' vertical antenna, & now are in the process of installing 1,000 watts. We expect to be on the air between Nov. 14 & 30 with this increased power & your clubs will be able to give us some indication of how strong our new signal is." CFAR, in the heart of a vast metal-deposit area, is hampered by it to a great extent, and even at 1 kw. is a terrific DX catch. Arr: NNRC.
- C H A T** Medicine Hat, Alberta "We are operating into a directional two-towered array, utilizing two guyed uniform-cross-section masts, each approximately 200' physical." Well, this too is an excellent DX catch, on what is generally a clear channel at this hour, giving you all a real opportunity of landing a goodly distant station. CHAT is a real friend of DXers, this being their third such venture. Arranged by NNRC.

Veries from KXOK WEWQ WGAT & WBTM, all letters. Reports are out this week to WTRR WTCH WAVU WKID WLEJ & KPAC. This is the third try to get a verie from KPAC dating back to 1940. WAVU came in good on their test. Will have a chance to do a little extra DX next week with the Thanksgiving Holiday. I have had a constant electrical noise that makes reception of distant stations almost impossible. I made sure every knob in the house was well-grounded but the noise still continued. Finally took a portable radio (as a direction finder) and traced the noise to where the main power line enters the house. As my neighbors don't experience this noise, the trouble must be between the house and the pole. I will contact the Electric Company this week and then maybe I can DX. Musings of the Members

Randolph Hunt - Leucadia, Calif.

Near the close of last DX season, a letter was circulated among the DXers of the west coast, this was complete with channel by channel listing of stations needed by west coast members of NNRC & NRC, also suggestions as to time eastern DXes should start to prevent blocking by western stations. The letter also stated that the 2 clubs had some DXes in our backyard and not many for us in the east, meaning that little though had been given to starting time. This letter was to be sent to head man of CPC's of both clubs with the hopes that due consideration would be given to suggestions set forth. So far this season I have not noticed any improvement tending to give us west coasters an even break. During last season I commented many times on the blocked DXes and some members indicated that I wanted clear channels for every DX and was not willing to fight through a crowded channel to get a station. I believe that a member in New Mexico agreed with me, now if early hours of DXes are bad in MST, they are worse in PST. Not long ago John Brierley of Calif. mentioned the cluttered-up frequencies and no doubt Mort Meehan finds different conditions here than in the east. The above is background for the following: It is not fair in present contest to give "bribe" or bonus to members for a verie from all the miscellaneous DXes, tests, f/c's, etc. as listed in "DX Calendar." To prove point, there was test from WJDS-my report was second from Calif. in 7 years of operation, they received 12 other reports from 8 states and Ontario, it is assumed that mine was most distant and I receive 3 points, all others reporting who are in contest, and much, much nearer also get 3 points. I have report out to test of KTNM a courtesy program for NNRC, this is good for the 3 points in NRC contest even though it was for another club, and if and when they verify I get the points even though others in the contest who heard this station no doubt had more trouble picking them up, besides being much farther away. I suggest the rules be changed to give one point for up to 500 miles, 2 for 500-1000, and 3 for over 1000. If dedicated programs were such as the NNRC DX from WTIC last Feb. 9, it would not be necessary to offer bonus points to members to tune in, there are all too few such programs in these days. Since Dec. 1946 I have been trying for stations in each state, as far away as possible in each state (Plenty of states not heard yet). I had verie from WTIC last season on regular program and received points for miles in contest them going on, but since Dec. 1946, I had no verie from N.Y. State. I tuned in for WTIC to get another 3 points (here again 3 points for DX and no mention of NRC) the program was so interesting that I did not try and copy the Kermore, N.Y. station that was testing from time to time, I just listened to Bud Rainey and his able handling of a DX program, and passed up the addition of N.Y. State to my 'modern' log and also 4 points for mileage in the contest, I settled for the 3 of WTIC, that DX could be called "For your listening pleasure" - phooey on these current "silent dedications."

Still having trouble getting "in high" this season but am sending out a few reports, those including recent ones to KASI WVKR KULA KMVI WVOK WDXI WRFD KCMO KEYE KEAD WWVB KAYL KMO & WMRP, with veries from WGNH KCOH KSMN KTLW WCLA KVOA KROF WJIG, in addition to those underlined above. Heard XEX mentioning an FM affiliate, the first Mexican I've heard do so, although there must be others. Incidentally, has XEX verified for anyone? Report to KEAD was my first to a Mexican this season, as I find most to be a waste of time and postage. Too bad, too, as there are from 27 to 30 frequencies dominated by XE's and CM's here in the evenings. 11/10 - at 3:40, WVRG's carrier on 710 Kc/s. with only an occasional announcement. TIMELY TIPS ON TUNING TOUGHIES
X - ALL-NIGHT REMEDIES.

Where there's a will, there's a way - well, almost, anyhow. There are, as we all know, many all-night stations on the air these days, but with at least half of them, there is at least one silent morning a week. As far as your Editor, situated on the East Coast, is able to discern, the only channels on which there are all-nighters with no silent mornings are: 610 710 750 840 970 1080 1100 1130 1150 1160 1230 1240 1330 1340 1350 1400 1470 1500 1590. Other channels where there are all-nighters, but with silent periods, are: 560, 570, 580, 700, 800, 950, 1010, 1120, 1280, 1410, 1450, 1490, 1520, 1530, & 1600. Let us, then, list the silent times for these channels.

- 560 - WIND. Signs at 2:05 a.m. Mondays. Channel open till 5:15 carrier of WFIL.
- 570 - WMCA. Signs at 1:05 a.m. Mondays. Channel open until 5:45 a.m. or so.
- 580 - CKEY. Is silent Mondays, 1:00 - 5:00. KMJ may be all-nighter, however.
- 700 - WLW. Silent Monday mornings, approximately 2:00 to 5:00 a.m.
- 800 - XELO. Is now silent Sunday mornings, most of morning. Channel open then after 4:00 a.m. sign off of CKLW.
- 950 - KFEL. Signs off 2:05 Mondays. Channel open till 4:45 a.m. WIBX carrier sign-on.
- 1010 - WINS. Is silent Sundays, 4:00-7:00 a.m. Channel then open.
- 1120 - KMOX. Is now at the all-night game. Believe silent Mondays - not certain.
- 1390 - WDSU. Is silent every Monday. Channel clear until 4:15 a.m. WOV carrier.
- 1410 - WING. Has two silent periods - Monday mornings, after 1:00 a.m., and Sundays after 5:00. Believe CKMO is also an all-nighter - not able to tell, here in the extreme east.
- 1450 - WWDC. Is silent Mondays, 1:00-6:00 a.m. Carrier still on here, but FCC is supposedly closing in on this baby.
- 1490 - WWSW. Signs off at 6:00 a.m. Sundays, till 8:45. Also has half-hour of silence second Wednesday for f/c's of WMRN & WCKV, 3:45-4:15.
KPIK. Is on till 6:00, we believe, daily, but off at 5:00 on Sundays. However, channel is never absolutely clear.
- 1520 - WKBW. Is off Sundays all morning, and Mondays until 4:00 a.m. test.
- 1530 - WCKY. Maintains silent period every Monday, until about 5:30 a.m.
- 1600 - WVOM. Also silent Mondays, often tests till around 3:00, but usually silent then until 8:00 a.m., opening the channel.

On 1230, there are silent periods for WITH (Tuesdays, 3:00-5:00), and WCPO (Mondays, 1:00-6:00), and we believe KXXL is also silent Mondays. KLAS now reported to be on the all-night band-wagon. On 1240, WBIR is silent Mondays till 4:58, but WRUC holds on. WWVB is a new re-addition to the all-night ranks, but look for it to be short-lived. On 1340, KRUX & WBGE are off on Mondays. WEXL & WHEM apparently have no breaks. WXGN is all-night frequently - believe only Saturdays and Sundays, but not sure here. 1400 now is adorned with WHEQ, with seemingly no breaks, but KERO is now knocking off at 4:00 a.m. The all-nighters on 1150, 1350, 1470, and 1490 are Mexicans, which don't annoy most of us too much, with the possible exception of XEMC.
