WJLL finished up the A.M. with his DX Test for a moment. On March 1, KMYC, 1450 Kc/s., Marysville, Calif., was logged on test, 3:00-3:45 a.m., QRM from WWDC. My best DX this A.M., KVDS, 730 Kc/s., Bellingham, Wash., was logged on DX 3:45-4:00 a.m. E.S.T. with QRM from a TP. Not sure, though. KFCO signed at 3:45. He was really tough here. New WBBW, 1240 Kc/s., Youngstown, Ohio, was logged on sign on at 5:30 a.m., E.S.T. on top of 1240 Kc/s. WOOD, 1300 Kc/s., Grand Rapids, Mich. was my final report for the A.M. and have been after him a long time. He signed on at 6:00 a.m. March 2 - KWRE, 730 Kc/s., Warrenton, Mo., was logged on ET all A.M. On March 3rd, WFBG, 1460 Kc/s., Fuquaya Springs N.C. was logged on first ET asking for reports. Static increased rapidly to a high level after 2:00 a.m., KSGN-DX heard with difficulty through heavy static. On 3/3, WBIG KCMO KYW CFRB, all heard early twilight. On 3/4, WKAR WKDA KSIX KWK KFBK KPRC KPRO. Veries received - nice card from KFMO, Mr. James, C.E. noted on card "N.R.C. a fine organization." Letters from WQVA WLEA WLSI WNEZ-DX KPDA KWYO KROP. Mr. Ernest R. Cooper, Dear Sir:

"This will acknowledge your letter of February 16, 1949, in which you request information regarding stations KTTO and KTTA, as well as information concerning the early morning tests now being conducted by certain radio stations at the request of the Commission.

"Records of the Commission indicate that the call letters KTTO are assigned to the ship "Jean Nicolet" and that the call letters KTTA are assigned to the ship "Wellesley Victory." Neither of these ships are licensed for operation at present. Other than this information, no further data or explanation can be offered by those observations.

"The test transmissions requested by the Commission, which you have observed during the early morning hours, are a part of a measuring program which is being conducted for the purpose of assembling information on directional antenna systems used by standard radio broadcast stations. The information thus accumulated is to be analyzed and utilized in conjunction with other engineering studies preparatory to this government's participation in the approaching North American Regional Broadcasting Conference to be held in Canada beginning on September 13, 1949.

"Following is a schedule of the remainder of the tests:

"The scheduled stations operate from 1:00 a.m. to 4:00 a.m. Local Standard Time during the tests, while all other stations operating on the same frequencies have been ordered to remain silent from 1:00 a.m. to 4:00 a.m., Local Standard Time on the dates for which tests are scheduled, except in a few special instances.

"The tests commence at 1:00 a.m. Local Standard Time with each station beginning operation on the non-directional condition and continuing to operate in this manner for an interval of 9 minutes. During this time voice identification announcements will be made. At the end of the 9 minutes interval the carrier will be cut for one minute during which time changes necessary for directional operation will be made. At the end of the one minute pause, directional operation will begin and continue for a total of 9 minutes. During this interval the transmitter will be modulated approximately 75% by a 1000 cycle tone. Throughout the test period the station will operate alternately non-directional and directional as outlined above. The announcements will continue to be made at the beginning of each 9 minute non-directional interval and the tone modulation will continue to be used throughout each 9 minute interval of directional operation. In some instances different power will be used for each mode of operation. No further tests of this nature are anticipated in the near future.

WNGA, 250 watts, ABC affiliate on 1340 kc at Asheville N.C. has notified FCC that it will surrender its license and cease broadcasting as of 12 o'clock midnight March 31st. Robert M. Lambe, Jr., station's general manager, emphasized that WNGA is relinquishing its license voluntarily and commented that "While there have been a few instances of stations leaving the air voluntarily, this is the first time - to my knowledge - that a profitable operation has done so. WNGA plans to give each of its employees two weeks severance pay as of April 1 1949, Mr. Lambe said." So you boys who have not WNGA verified, try for them.
