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 The above information was taken from "The Sporting News" of a recent issue. We hope it is of interest to many of you, and then again, it might help you log a station with an extra-inning night game, you know.  
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We quote you herewith a letter from the Department of Transport, St. Johns, Newfoundland, Canada, sent in reply to one sent to the Chamber of Commerce, St. Johns, by your Editor. It contains interesting DX information, so herewith the letter:

St. Johns, Nfld. May 12, 1949

"Dear Sir,  
 Your letter of the 2nd April addressed to the Chamber of Commerce was referred to me a few days ago.  
 The only change in call signs concerns stations taken over by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation, that is, Corner Brook CBY, Gander CBG, and St. John's, CBN.  
 The stations owned by the U.S. Army are still in operation using the same call signs, but I am unable to say how long they will continue.  
 The new station on 1230 Kcs to which you refer is operated by the Nfld. Association of Seventh Day Adventists, call sign VOAR using 250 watts. This station usually comes on the air Saturday evenings and Sundays.  
 The station at Grand Falls is likely to be in operation within the next month, but I am unable to give the call sign at the present time.  
 As far as I am aware, Nfld. Standard Time and Nfld. Daylight Saving Time will continue in effect."

Newfoundland Time is 1 1/2 hours ahead of E.S.T. - that is, when it is 6:00 p.m. E.S.T. it is 7:30 p.m., Nfld.S.T. We thought that with Canada taking Newfoundland in as a province, that Newfoundland might switch to A.S.T., but apparently not. The call of the Grand Falls station has since been announced as CBT, and they may be on the air by now. Their channel is 1350 kilocycles. So, VOAR and VOWR, religiously-owned stations, continue with those call letters, as do the U.S. Army stations, VOUS, Fort Pepperrell, and VOUG, Goose Bay (Labrador) & VOHF, Harmon Field, on 1480, 1340, and 1490, respectively. Your Editor suspects these calls may be changed at some time in the near future, but as the above letter states, this has not happened as yet. We like to get such information as this direct so watch our pages for the latest and the most accurate information on DX

A report on the DXing here since last "DX News." Not very much for tuning was limited and no doubt much was missed. New stations were 5/20 - WSNW, 1150, with ET. 5/26 - WLRP, 1570, ET. 5/30 - KVVV, 1590, regular schedule, to 3:00 a.m. Fairly clear of QRM Monday mornings. 6/3, CKOY, 1310, on regular schedule. 6/5 - WNER, 1450, ET. 6/6 - WMOU, 1230, on monthly test to 1:30, and KWBE, 1450, on ET. 6/7 - KWKC, 1340, on a freak reception, a poor DX date when this one came in louder than WEXL, etc., at 4:50 a.m. Veries came from WJBB WNAV WRXO KMHK WSNW WGEM CJRW & KAAA in form of letters, card from WROW and my own cards back from KJCK & KECK. Also WTTS sent some stuff in an envelope including a card supposed to be a verie. DX has been good for June, but then, weather has been more like April too, cold! The morning KWKC came in, DX was very poor, with only a few southerners fair, WBGE had been on top of 1340 earlier, neither WEXL nor WEDC had been coming in. CKOY is a new call on 1310 at Ottawa, Ont., and seems to be on every morning at 3:00 a.m., E.S.T., maybe all night, except Mondays. Very little announcing except on the hour when they have news. About as loud as CKCO used to be. (Hope to see you at Convention, Joe - and could those times above possibly be E.D.S.T.?)

KCKY on f/c, QRM mostly all the way, KBAL topping KCKY with brief carrier and identification at 3:05 a.m. 6/12 - KGKL on with band music, off at 2:50 a.m., WIEV on test, off 3:30 a.m. All time given is E.S.T. The static has not been too bad as yet, many good mornings for DXing but nothing much on to report. On 6/6, received 5 veries, the best day's mail since the DX season. Long over-due was a card from WROW, Charles R. Heisler, C.E. Very nice long verie letter from Gilbert S. Andrew C.E. from Radio Station KROS in Clinton, Iowa. It was the best received for quite a spell. The C.E. writes and I quote, "We were at the time just giving out Transmitters a complete check-up and cleaning and decided to modulate with one of our test program recordings just to see if any DXers might happen to catch us. Not much to report, but thought I'd send in what I had. No DXing here. I had my set gone over, and it is a lot better, but not 100%. New ones for me since my last report (April 2) are WNBH WPIT WNAV WARC WEBR WPPA, all received either on sign on, or sign off, that is, all except WNAV, which was received at 3:38 a.m., E.S.T. We thought you'd be interested in this item from "Broadcasting" submitted to them by Arthur T. Cushen, well-known New Zealand DXer, which was submitted to us by Len Kruse as well as by Bernie Duffy:

"I appreciate your publication, for a DXer the information is very find and helps very much in the knowledge of new station changes.

"Reception here from North America is very good, some of our members have up to 1,000 verifications, as many as 600-800 from stations in North America, so this will give you some idea of reception. Any night we can listen to WCKY, KMOX, KSTP, KGA, KFBK etc. at strength as good as many New Zealand stations and many at times at just on local strength. Many of the frequency and equipment tests are also heard, and it is in this matter I wondered if you could help. For many months, with the many new stations testing, we have heard some very find tone signals and equipment tests, but very seldom any station break or announcement. I know there is no FCC control on this matter, but it makes us a little mad "sitting" on a 250 watter on test for an hour without any break in the tone or announcement. It would be a "feather in the cap" of the station to get a report from here, at least 8,000 miles distant, on a new 250 w. test, so we not only don't get the chance of sending a report, but some station may never again get the chance of receiving a report from such a distant point. So engineers, when you test, please make a few station breaks and announcements, and we will send you a report if you are getting out here.
