Recent reports out to WTNS WDXB WBRW WSPC KRRV KJAY WBAC WREL WINA WOPI KVOD WPTR WJLJ & KGGF. Latest veries in from KCMC WRMN KOLN WAEB KCOK WGFG WJMB WGRM KEYE WEDR & WYVE. My wife, who is getting a little DX-minded, heard a news report on CHML to the effect that some Eastern Canadian cities will remain on daylight savings time until early part of December, which should give us a chance to increase our Canadian log. Noticed last night that WWSW still hasn't moved from the 149Q spot. They put a powerful signal into Milwaukee and unless another all-nighter starts here, should be a good frequency this season. Since last report, there's been a big improvement in reception conditions. New stations being as follows: 9/13 - WYVE, 1280, on ET and KOFO, 1220, on ET; 9/14 - WUUU, 1260, ET. 9/15, WSRB, 1490 on all-night Polio Drive program. 9/17 - WJBR on f/c and WWHG on regular schedule. 9/18, WBUX, 1570 on regular; 9/20 - WCOR, 900; WGGH, 1150; & WINA, 1280, all ET's; 9/21 - KGLC on regular (thanks, Ralphie) and CBX, 1010, at s/off at 2:01 a.m. 9/22, KSDN, 930, with special late program, KHUZ, 1490 on f/c, and KCNI, 1490, on ET. 9/24 - WRCS on f/c and KBRO with special late program. Veries came from WOSC WDOS WLIN WBUD WYVE WGTN WULA WSRB WEDR, all letters, also card from WULA and plain typed card from WRMN. On 9/22, 1490 was a hot spot with several on all morning, heard WWSW after WJBK off at 2:00 a.m., also traces of commercial program, maybe WTTT, KHUZ on f/c between 2:00 and 2:15, WVVW and WATO on tests, an un-identified ##### K-ET-er and lastly KCNI fairly clear through WWSW just before the mob came on at 5:00 E.S.T. At 5:00, heard CJIC and WSIP, both on regular at that hour now, WHAV, and several more. This morning, 9/24, was one of the best for coast in nearly two years, all regulars easily heard, a few harder ones quite clear. WJBK left 1490 at 2:00 and then KICO went off, so loud he nearly equalled WWSW. Later KBRO came out from behind the persistent Pittsburgher and was quite easily logged at times. I have started on my CPC assignment with the help of Mrs. Wharton - she typed 13 out of the 20-odd letters, five went out already, the others will go out 8 weeks before the requested program date. If they come through we will have some swell programs. I logged WYVE after coming from the Whartons' at 2:00 a.m. last Sunday morning. I completely endorse the proposal that each member contribute \$1.00 towards a new mimeographing machine - in fact, I will contribute \$2.00 and don't believe we will have any trouble in raising the required amount. I have just been looking over the last edition of "DX Down the Dial" and noticed the request for reports and decided it was high time that I contribute my meager offerings to the "Musings of the Members" section. First of all I was truly sorry that I could not have attended the NRC Convention at Buffalo; however, September is a poor month for finances. You see I had to pay tuition at Junior College for the coming semester and I also purchased a reconditioned National HRO Senior which set me back a few bucks. I will be interested in seeing how my HRO operates on the BCB band. I sent to Iowa for it and it hasn't arrived as yet. Up until now I have been doing all my BCB DXing on a General Electric E-91 receiver of 9 tubes which I judge was built around 1937 or 1938. I only paid \$20.00 for it and it sure has given me great service. BCB during the summer months was what you might call on the skimpy side. During the months of June, July, and August, I only sent out 9 reports. Reported to were (those underline have verified) WNAV WCTA WBBW WNNI WDAR KSGM KXLR WELO & WXYZ. This summer I did most of my DXing on the 20 meter band. I sent reports to 110 stations and have received QSL cards from only 40 stations, which is down-right awful. I have now DXed ham stations for the last 2 summers and my score stands 71 stations QSLed with 186 reported to - SAD - VERY SAD. I think I will stick exclusively to BCB DXing from now on. My average on the BCB band stands at 82.5% confirmed of those reported. My QSL total on BCB stands at 666 stations from 11 countries which include 4 stations in Hawaii and one station in Argentina (LRI on 1070 kc/s.) I have confirmed stations in 47 states with Wyoming being the only state in which I have not received or confirmed a station. My goal for the coming DX season is to raise my total to 800 stations confirmed. The following stations have been reported to this month: (those underlined have verified) WNOR WMOU WLAG WYVE KTFS & WMON. I sent one follow-up report to VP4RD which I received last January 16. This year's DX Contest looks very interesting and I think I shall join the foreign section. I will try to improve my status as a reporter and will endeavor to write more often. Guess that's all for now. 73's and good DXing during the coming season. (Thanks, Hank, and we surely hope for lots of reports from you! -Ed.)

Enjoyed reading about the Convention, was really disappointed that I had to miss it. Pope, WMNB, William B. Dailey, Chief Technician; WBGE, David J. Holt, Gen. Mgr., and C.E.; WENK - Clarence E. Pugh, Egg Dept; the latter also sent a very nice letter. I gave them enough time to verify before followup - WMNB two years, the rest, 1 year or over. 8/27 - Logged WRUF for report, WMBR also along with follow-up, WRMN on ET/## 9/7 - WJMA, 1340 kc/s., on ET. 9/8 - WJMA again, WSPC now 24 hours, 9/9 - logged WEMP again for another try, WCNX on brief test 1150 kc/s., 9/10 - CKFI heard at sign/on in the clear with the news, till QRM 1340 kc/s. TT and WINK carrier. Logged WCSH with 15 minutes of regular schedule, ditto on WNAW, 9/13 - KOFO on ET - very good signal on 1220 kc/s. 9/14 - logged WPTR on regular schedule 1/2 hour after sign/on, caught KBOA with f/c in the clear till WNYC s/on. 9/15 - WYVE on ET. 9/18 - WGGH, 1150 kc/s., with ET, 9/19 - WINA on ET, 9/24 - a very good morning for the far west, just missed KID and CJOC - just a word or two heard at s/off, I needed these two - a little sooner I could have sent a nice report. This took the sleepiness out of me but I didn't get anything worth while the rest of the morning.

I only wish that "Daylight Time" would last another week or more, so that I could keep up my "fast pace" of logging Eastern stations on regular schedule, in the Daylight Time Zones. Really logged some nice catches, in my estimation, the last two weeks of Daylight Time, in addition to others logged before that time. The latest catches included WENE (1450) Endicott, N.Y., on 9/12, on regular 5:00-5:15 a.m., signing on shortly before WWDC returned to the air. The morning of 9/13 at 5:00 a.m., found WGBI (910) Scranton, Pa., in the clear for their first half-hour of regular programs. On 9/14, WPRO, Providence, R.I. was "tops" on 630, and easily copied for a new one in my log. Station WQXI, Atlanta, Ga., also logged on 9/14 with regular schedule 5:30-6:00 a.m., fighting it out with WPIC on 790. Incidentally, WQXI now uses 5 kw. The monthly f/c on the 15th of the month, from KINE, (1330) Kingsville, Tex. was logged that morning from 5:45 to 5:55 a.m., with TT, and heavy QRM from WBBC. ET's from WYVE (1280) Whytheville, Va., and KOFO (1220) Ottawa, Kansas, logged on 9/19. Station WORK (1350) York, Pa., logged on regular schedule 5:00-5:30 a.m., beneath WADC on 9/19. The new WDKD (1300) Kingstree S.C. s/on regular schedule daily at 5:45 a.m., and heard good till 6:00 a.m. for a nice report on 9/20. The new Marion, Illinois station on 1150, WGGH, heard on ET on 9/21 at 4:30 a.m., while at 5:30 a.m. that morning heard the "Stars and Stripes Forever" being played to open the "Farmers' Almanac" program from WWHG (1590), Hornell, N.Y., listened to for 15 minutes, although QRM from WAKR. Then possibly the best morning in September was on the 23rd, when WCOR (900) Lebanon, Tenn., was on ET's with a good signal. Then amazed to find WNAW (860) North Adams, Mass., s/on at 5:30 a.m., and in the clear for 15 minutes, and a surprising signal for just a 250-watter, at this distance. Followed at 5:45 a.m. by the station I've longed for, none other than WHCU (870) Ithaca, N.Y., s/on and in the clear 5:45-6:00 a.m. when WWL s/on to erase their signal. The same morning at 6:00 a.m., logged for a half-hour the "Cuckoo Club" from WXRA, Kenmore, N.Y. (1080) with little QRM from WPGH. How was that for a morning at the dials? On the last "Daylight" morning, I again added 3 new stations to my log, all on regular schedule, namely WCSH (970) Portland, Maine, completely covering the 970 spot, even though KWBC was on the air at the time. Then at 6:00 a.m. found WGBS (710) Miami, Fla., atop of WOR, with their "All Florida Hour", and then copied for 15 minutes the regular schedule of a station very few DXers have in their logs, none other than WOAP (1080), Owosso, Mich., from 7:00 to 7:15 a.m. Station KRLD, 50 kw. station on 1080 must have cut their power down to 1 kw., as usually KRLD controls this spot, at this hour, as I've tried a number of times before. To some of the Eastern DXers, a number of the above mentioned stations may be heard regularly, but to a mid-western DXer, they are "toughies." On Sunday, 9/25, logged KCNI (1490) Broken Bow, Neb., on ET's, and sent a nice signal the 500 miles east. At the same time, Station KCUL (1540) Fort Worth, Texas, was also ET-ing, but the signals were anything but good; possibly directional to protect local KXEL the 50 kw. on the 1540 spot. Verification letters received since my last report in the bulletin were letters from WERE KDON WRNY WBUD WINR WENS WBEN WEDR WYVE. While WGBI sent a card with their "verification seal" there-on. The most unique verie of late, came from WPRO, in the form of an 8 x 11 inch card, of blue and white, which could certainly be framed. Station WLPO, La Salle, Ill., reported again on regular schedule, to replace poor postal verie, and this time a nice letter verification came back signed by L. J. McGann, C.E. It might interest some of the boys to note I have logged exactly 29 new stations to my log since September 8, my first morning of DXing this season.
