Six Mexican 1-A Channels are specified in the petition. They are 730, 800, 900, 1050, 1220 and 1570 Kilocycles. Thus is the winter time WACE cannot sign on any earlier than 7:30 and would have to sign off as earlier as 4:45PM. About 106 stations are affected by this Agreement.

If Carol Seth can write a poem and Sully Sullivan send in a report, I guess I can find time to dash off a DX report. Since my last skit in these pages much water has gone over the dam, but not too much DX. I have now fallen some 300 veries behind the Brooklyn Cooper despite the fact that I used to lead him by 50 or 60. But though the flesh is tired and incapable, I am, in spirit, just as much a DXer as ever, and when work will permit I shall return to the dials. Meanwhile, it will be limited. Enjoyable visits during the past ten days with NECers Harold Wagner, Sully Sullivan and Joe Pelletier and their families have sparked a new interest in the hobby for me. Sullivan has challenged me to a private contest. Since this is a DX report I must add that new veries are at hand from KCKW for my 100th Canadian, KDMO KLKC WJJM KGBC & KTIW. The latter two were among hurricane broadcasters. WJJM verified on my report form. KLKC was a friendly lengthy letter and advises of a monthly check each first Tuesday from 1:15 to 1:30 a.m., E.S.T. The program is unique. Engineer J. L. "Pappy" Teats is at the mike and he ranks among the old-timers. AND - I have something to brag about - I think. I logged WMDD, Pajardo, P.R. on October 10 through WWSW and received a lengthy letter from Chief Engineer H. K. Honess. He says in part, "I am very happy to received your report because the times and procedure were accurate. I have received many reports from short-wave listeners in the States but none of them were complete or accurate enough to warrant sending a verification. I have received reports when the station was not even on the air.... I will be happy to send out verification if the reports from the listners accurately tell me the duration of the 1,000 cycle tone and the time that the tone starts and stops. The clock here is set to WWV and the timing is different for each frequency check. The tone may start at 1:05 and last for three minutes with one minute of silence or call letters with tone returning at 1:09. Your report was accurate even to the sign-off at 1:25 a.m. Congratulations for sending in the first accurate report in our two and a half years of operation and here's wishing you the best of DX." He also mentioned that WMDD tests on the tenth of each month. This verie has given me a "shot in the arm" so watch out, fellows! We are trying to talk Joe Pelletier into the Chief Engineer's job with WACB. If Joe comes to Kittanning, we're sure to set some DX records. Incidentally, if any of you who did not receive a verie from WACB will send me a duplicate report, I'll see that your verie is sent you. WKIN took care of all the DX reports, but a good many to WACB were never answered. (Welcome to these pages again, Richie - how's about Seth sending in a dx report, and you writing a poem, hi? -Ed.)

Only 1 veris was received this week & that was a very friendly letter from Robt. Schilb, CE at KJMC. He stated that my report of reception was one of the most accurate he had received from a distant listener. He also stated that their f/c is the 2nd Thurs. listed in f/c list & stated that at some future date he might run a test consisting of musical selections with s/i announcements. My goals for this season are to bring veris total to 800, to receive & confirm my first TA, TP, & Alaskan stations, to receive & confirm Wyoming & to receive & confirm my first 250 watt Coaster. This will be probably my last rpt for about 3 or 4 weeks since I have mid-semester exams coming up soon plus 2 term papers which are due in about 3 weeks. So I will have very little time for DXing. Musings of the Members

Derek Wharton - 1231 Norwood Street - Chicago 40.

Guess it's about time I sent in a decent report for the gang to read - first of all, I'm going to beat my friend Don Frey to the punch on this C.P.S. business - it is the technical term for "Cycle Per Second". On f/c's the average is 500 or 1,000 C.P.S. which varies the tone of the test. While I'm on it, the odd doubletone TT that has been heard on 1590 kc/s. is a howl-type hetrodyne caused by XEMC and a weaker signal in the U.S. I remember a report with a thought. Why is it so difficult to get 1 kw. and 5 kw. etc. stations today when in the old days 5 and 10 watt stations used to come in better? The old antenna systems, inverted L, and Zapp types, flat-tops and cage-types respectively were not mainly for local coverage because of less wattage. These types radiated a more intense distant signal - therefore they (the stations) covered a larger area - say 50 watts or 100 watts with a good antenna would cover what a 1 kw. with a vertical antenna does today. 150 miles radius today is considered good with 1 kw., but in the old days, 100 watts easily covered that and more - Directional arrays don't help DX programs, and vertical antennas being mainly for local consumption. DXing today in my opinion is just as much fun as it was in the old days. More so because it is harder to get real good catches. 'Tis enough of rambling for now so here are some stations heard since Oct. 5 first day of DX for the season.
