Back again! Duke took up most of the time from February till June, and I had to keep my hands off the dial for a while. Summer DX so far hasn't been too exciting. Went over to see John Pohl about two weeks ago, but as yet he hasn't been here. Also went around and visited most of the local stations. WMMR's GE, Charles Hartwick, says the most distant report they received was from Ankara, Turkey. He says they get a great many reports from Long Island between November and February. WINZ is still using 50 kw. every once in a while. When they change to night power and pattern, they leave the air for 30 seconds. WPTT here (1490) has finally been deleted. WIRK-1290 West Palm Beach puts in a fair signal here now. WARM-1330 Fort Pierce is even with QMGB most of the day. Was visiting in Shady Side, Md. the first week in June, and got WKIK-1370; WPTX-1570 on a rather old radio. Also WHYL. From here, I have sent few reports. KSEP was logged on 6/14. QMOX (still 1490) can be heard any time day or night here. Oh yes, logged WMSO-1320 and WFBC-1330 from Durham on 5/21, and WHKK on 5/7. Nothing yet from WFBC. WSNB-1350 sent me coverage contours traced on a Gulf Road Map. WCOA and KRMG veries came the same day, and were very disappointing. WCOA returned my letter with an "OK" and the v/s on it; KRMG returned my letter with a parcel post sticker on it with the GE's name and signature. KRMG was the result of a f/up. Lately I have been interested in the other end of radio. I worked on the Duke station, WDIB, 560 (carrier current) for the last two months of school. One WPTT announcer has offered to let any potential DJ's take over his show for 15 minutes, so I'll be doing that Monday, 7/13. (OK if I verify it)? WQBS is having a regular announcing contest, with the two top prizes being trips to Cuba. Cuban veries, anybody? QMOY still hasn't sent those maracas they promised, way back. Well, that's about all for this time. 73s.

Hi. Another month is here and won't be long now before we start a new DX season. DXing was very good last season and hope for a good one this season coming. Not much DXing being done here, static conditions being very bad. No reports out in July but have quite a few out this year with not much results getting them in. Veries in since last issue are cards, KQEF-1450, WMSO-1320, a 5x8 blue card; WFLD1260, prepared card, WCAE-1250 and WYAT-1360. Letters are KOKK-1390, KFAB-1110, WKMB-1310, WMBD-1470, WHON-1400, WIVK-860, WARC-1440, KTLN-1150, KQJR-910, so you boys can see that veries have slowed down here. I still have 32 reports out for this year and 25 left over from last year. My total veries now amount to 399. I will try to reach the 500 mark by Jan. 1, 1954, when two years of reporting will be up. My new ones added to my log are KTLN-1150 on f/c 6/18 2:15-2:30. On 6/20, heard WKYR, new one on 1270 kc/s, on for ET, also on 6/21. 6/21, WETZ-1330 New Martinsville, W. Va. heard on their ET. QMY-550 on ES and KMO-1490 on their regular f/c per f/c list, first Wednesday, so guess that takes care of my doings for this past month. Thanks to Bob Gorsuch and Carroll Seth for their fine work with the contests. Will be in the East at Beach Haven, N.J. from August 23 to September 6 so hope to see some of you DXers. Write to me, Ron Schaller and Bernie Duffy, and maybe we can make some arrangements. Also hope to see Hal Williams if we can get plans made. All for now - best DX to all you fellows. So long.

Mike Ferguson - 3337 Prospect Street - Houston 4, Texas

Well I thought I would forget DX until October but such is not the case. Picked up a Hammarlund 120-X at Walter Ashe recently and have been fooling around with it a bit. I've noted several Latins coming in well on the splits. YSS-635 is stronger than neighboring WSM or XEB2 even on my GE portable. Another on 1075 would seem to be our old friend YSER although it is supposedly on 1070 now, or was a month or so ago. Running as high as 10 over 8-9 here at times. TIDCR-625 8-7 nightly. Unknowns, in Spanish on 916 or 917, 1243 or 1244, 1409, 1427 (sounds at times like a time signal) & 1352. Can anybody help with any of these? KQYN-1230 heard through XEB at 9 EST s/off, 6/19. Others noted recently are KDET-930, KMP-960 with baseball recreations via Gordon McLendon's Knickerbocker Network, and strong signals from KWOC-930 carrying Cardinal baseball. Took a short fishing trip to Wisconsin a few weeks ago and was surprised at the winter-like DX condx during two evenings there. Listening on an old portable at my uncle's place at Ladysmith, Wis. I heard KSGM and WIL at 6:45 GST with very good strength. Sure wish I lived up there in the summer; I could DX the year around. But the evenings are too cold there for me. It got down to 33° one night. Well, so long until fall.

Gene Cameron - 707 East Gordon Avenue - Spokane 22, Washington

DX has been pretty good here for this time of year, and I finally had time to send some second reports, so plenty of mail in both directions. In the last month I sent out 45 second reports and 14 new reports. This paid off with a total of 33 veries in a month. Veries received after follow-ups are: CHUB KBBW WKNK (yes, I know this one sometimes never answers) KOVO KYAK WOKY KODL KFLR WVOG KMBR KONG KIJ CKLN CIGAO KPOA KITO KFBB KIPA KINY & KLIF. "New report" veries received are ZYA KNOG KRIZ WMT KROP WBLE KFYN KLER KULE KMED KSYC KYJC & KGW. I have been sitting up occasionally just to get some of the closer stations. On June 9, I logged two daylight semi-lo-cals, KLER and KULE. June 14, I got KMED (1230) Medford, Ore.; KCBS ('Frisco); and KBYC (1490) Yreka, Cal. The next night I added KPHL (1230) Paso Robles, Cal. and KYJC (1230) Medford, Ore. On June 26, only CKBI (900) Prince Albert, Sak. On June 29, new ones were KGW (520) Portland, Ore.; KGAN (1230) Kingman, Ariz. and KPKW (1340) Pasko, Wash. I then had a chance to improve on my antenna, so I don't know if the band opened up or if antenna helped. On July 6, I caught WMBD (1470) Peoria, and WPRC (1370) Lincoln, Ill.; both on because of that terrible storm, and also WLAY (1450) Muscle Shoals, Ala. I heard a signal on 1400 which I believe was either CJFP or WJLB but I did not send to either. (WJLB is an all-nighter -Ed.) I also heard some one on 1340 at 5:07 on RS and I thought they said "Radio Week." Can any eastern help me on this? Does WOOK pronounce their call, and are they on at 5 EST during summer? (They s/on last winter at 5 EST which would be 4EST now with Washington on EDST -Ed.) I will not send a report unless I find out for sure it could have been they, so help, please! I asked for help once before and no answer, so someone please help. I'm always glad to help you. Does anyone else on 1340 at that time pronounce their call? A note to Everett Johnson - I have unanswered second reports to KAPA & KPHK; have not heard any of the others. Have a time at Convention - I'll be thinking of all of you.

Hank Ward - 404 North 14th Street - Ponca City, Oklahoma

Summer DX laden with Arkansas calls and until I started dragging them in didn't realize I needed so many, particularly being a neighboring state, hi. Anyway, here's the way it went: Sunday, 6/21 heard KXLO, Mountain Home, Ark. with a f/c, verified promptly by letter; Thursday 7/2, KANE New Iberia, La. f/ing, verified with a prepared card; Saturday 7/4 KBTA Batesville, Ark. as per f/c list, only they come on at 2:55 rather than 3:00. This is constant past few months. Sunday, 7/5 KBBS, Springdale, Ark. finally on RS. Had yet to hear their f/c or a decent log until this catch; KVSA McGehee, Ark. on RS, 1220 kc/s.; WHEP, Foley, Ala. with s/on at 6:44 and RS until 6:57 s/on from WDXI blocked them on 1310 kc/s. and lastly, KFYN Bonham, Tex. at 7:05 s/on and RS until nearly 7:30 when they faded out. KFYN verie received 7/8 via prepared card since they had ignored several f/c reports and one s/on. KBTA also had ignored previous reports so am giving him this one more chance, they will try prepared card. KBBS KVSA and WHEP are letting ride for a verie via the station giving them a chance to come through first, then if necessary, a f/up and prepared card. KFYN and KANE had had their tries before so I didn't take any more chances. Sent a prepared card with the new report and both came back promptly. Well, so much for that to date. But the three day holiday here was not a complete flop since I consider five new calls this time of year pretty good in a couple of tries at the dials. Also have a log on KWEN Fort Smith, Ark. with heavy interference from KXYZ Houston to get out. First time for them here too. Both 5000 watts and KXYZ dominates! COLOMBIA--JL reports a verie from HJCO (1160) printed QSL showing picture of building where station is located, signed by 3 people, Mario H. Franco, Director; Felix Miguel Diaz, Locutor, and another. Schedule is from 0700-2300 daily, Sunday 0930-2200.

EUROPE

AZORES--HT reports a fine air mail verie in from CSB-83, Azores Air Transport Station (1500) 250 watts. Says first report from USA. Because being on Portugese soil, no vertical radiator is used. A Marconi wire with drop feed and practically in parallel with New England. The CSB-83 stands for Standard Broadcast Station Number 83.

SPAIN--HH reports a verie from RNE (737) QSL for his 52nd country. HT has one from SEU (1300) Madrid, long hand verie by Antonio Pelayo.

MONACO--SW reports that correct call and frequency for the BCB outlet in this country is 3AM2 on 1466 Kcs., "Radio Monte Carlo".

PORTUGAL--JL has his verie from Porto (755) a QSL card in French, English, and Portugese showing map of the world, a nice positive verie, but no signer.

And UK reports Berlin III, a high powered transmitter on 831 Kcs., this one having come on in December. JL reports that AFN Frankfurt (872) returned his reply form, and that he has a verie from SWF Freiburg (827) a form letter in English. Finally HH also reports a verie from Rheinsender (1016) for his 15th German verie.

LUXEMBOURG--JL has a nice personal letter in English signed by Asst. Genl. Mgr., whose name he can't read, as well as his own reply form rubber-stamped.

CZECHOSLOVAKIA--JL has a verie from Melnik (1286) fine friendly letter in English with many stamps on large envelope plus printed magazine, etc.

ICELAND--Following is from UK reporting Hornafjordur (665) and Akureyri (737) both of which relay TFU in Reykjavik, which is on long wave.

ITALY--From UK via KM I quote "I have recently discovered that many of the stations belonging to the Italian National Network are giving local programs weekdays at 1330 GMT and onwards, and so can be verified individually. Also heard a lot of weaker Italians on 1331 Kcs. which couldn't be identified. Also Bolzano I (656) in German by 1400 GMT."

AFRICA

FRENCH WEST AFRICA--RA reports that after original report and two follow-ups brought no verie, a letter was sent to the American Consulate in Dakar. They had the station positively verified, and Rogernow has Dakar verified.

TANGIER--RP says he hears "Radio Africa" in the background behind Lvov on 935 Kcs. with arabic programs at 2230 GMT.

FRENCH MOROCCO--UK reports WNAF (1500) Port Lyautey, schedule 0200-1900 Weekdays, continues to 0200 Saturday, to 1900 Monday. This is an Armed Forces Station.

Arnold E. Schrock, RR 1, Paxton, Illinois: I enjoy reading through the TV column even though I do not have TV myself. We are located 100 mi. from the nearest regular TV services, which is Chicago. Neighbors have erratic service and usually plenty of snow, however, occasionally there is rare DX. I know Havana has been logged on rare occasions here in Ill. I have compiled a few items about Illinois TV from the newspapers that I will pass on to you readers.

WBLN, Bloomington, Ill. announces they expect to be operating by Oct. 1, on Ch. 15 UHF. They have signed up with ABC. Cecil W. Roberts is owner and expects to have a staff of 12 to 15. The first broadcast is to be 7-11 pm and later extended to 6-11 and still later to midnight CST. After a year he hopes to have WBLN operating 15-16 hrs. a day. WBLN will be GE equipment. The 1000-watt transmitter will give 20,000 watts ERP. The studio building, 20x30 ft., will be north of US route 66 a bit west of Route 150. The 400-ft. tower plus antenna itself will make 450 ft. overall height. The setting up cost will be about \$250,000.

WGLA-TV of Champaign, Ill. had hoped to be operating by Sept. 1 on Ch. 3 VHF. Midwest Television, Inc., owners, have been planning and building at the transmitter site at White Hoth, near Montecello, Ill., which is 28 mi. N. of Decatur or 14 mi. S. of Champaign. August C. Meyer of Champaign is President. A 1000-ft. tower was contemplated but recent complaint action to FCC by WTV of Decatur has delayed further WGLA construction. WTV Ch. 17 UHF, Prairie Television Co. of Decatur, who plans to start operating July 15, charges WGLA is too close to Decatur and will cause "economic injury." WGLA awaits FCC action and is fighting with very good grounds.

The University of Illinois TV service, Urbana-Champaign, Ill. will begin operating on a shoe string basis due to much curtailment of funds for TV university service. The University of Illinois has Ch. 12 VHF and has ordered GE equipment. The station will be located in the SE corner of the University of Illinois stadium and hopes for coverage of 25 miles. R. B. Hudson is director of broadcasting.

(Harold Schrock cont'd.) The only TV DXing I have done was back in 1935-36. I have 2 TV verifications from that period and it is interesting to look back at them.

WPKG, Purdue University, W. Lafayette, Ind. was verified 2-8-36. WPKG 2050 kc. had programs of motion pictures, newsreels, etc., 60 lines per picture and 20 pictures per second. Single spiral disc. No sound accompaniment; voice announcements only. Power varied to a maximum of 1500 watts. Scheduled broadcasts were Tuesday 7:30 pm and Thursday 8 pm CST.

WPAK was the experimental visual broadcasting station of Kansas State College at Manhattan Kansas verified March 29, 1935. Also using 2050 kc. with 125 watts. Scanning system 60 lines, 30 frames, disc speed 1200 rpm, scanning continuously left to right, top to bottom; images positive to negative per announcement. Their schedule was Mon. and Fri. 6:45-7:30 pm and Wed. 8-9 pm.

Other TV verified is 330 45 mc in March 1937. They state that "11 years ago when the BBC began using 40 mc frequencies that pictures were seen in the U.S. on 45 mc on skip occasions".

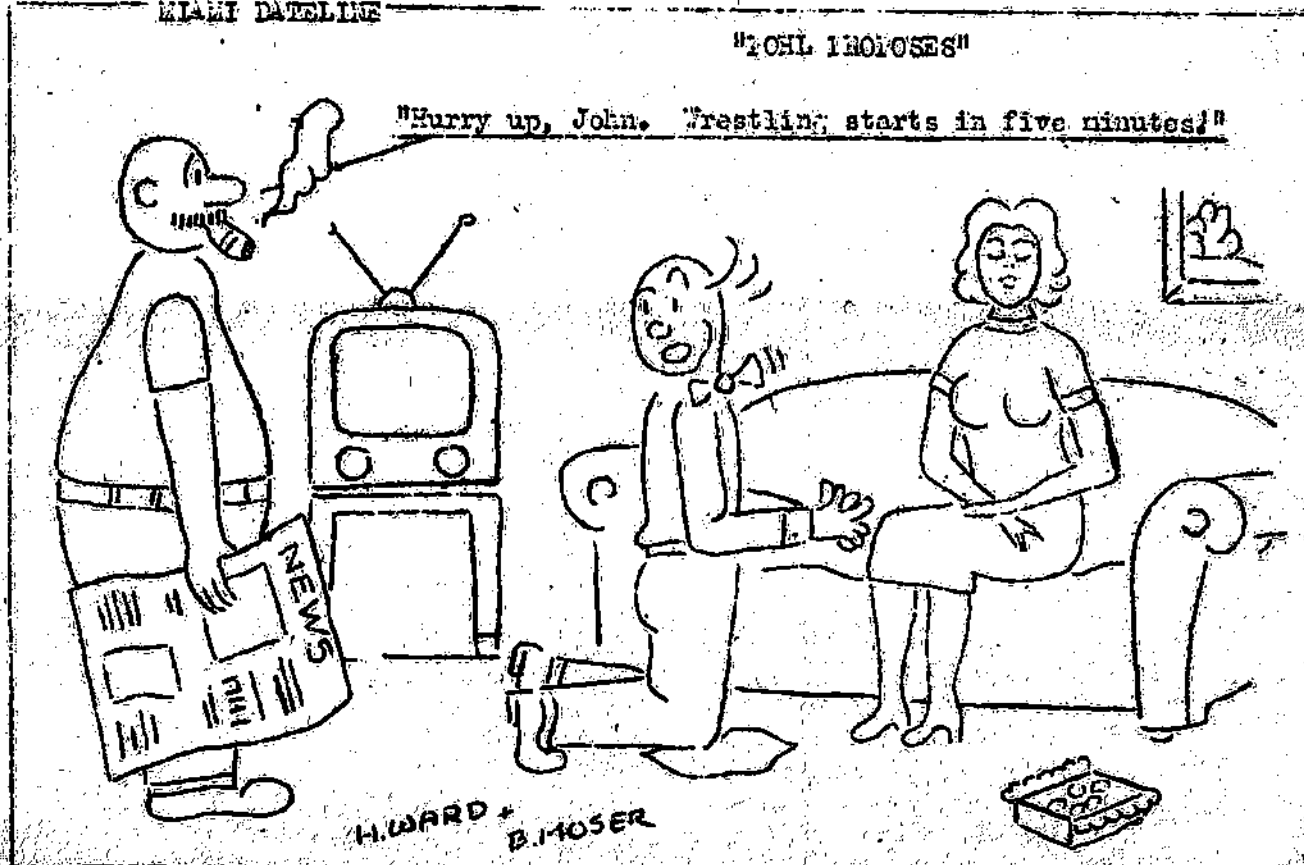

Hal Warner is right about airplane reflection of TV signals. For details, Jan. 1950 issue of Radio-Electronics, page 71 has info. How to report "strange things" in TV DX. On 6/22 WSAZ-TV, Channel 3, Huntington, W. Va. was seen and reported from sign on at 6:58 am EST to 8:35 am EST. They were telecasting "Today." John Clay, studio supervisor, has verified my report by sending a program schedule. At 9:35 am EST a station telecasting "Prologue to the Future" was noted interfering with WDTV on Channel 2. This station was not identified. At 9:47 the test pattern of KFEL-TV was also noted, and these three stations alternately appeared on Channel 2. TV stations still unidentified were carrying "Prologue" on Channels 3 and 4. WSAZ-TV was also noted on Channel 3 and 2 other stations, also unidentified, were seen on Channel 4 besides the station carrying "Prologue". The 3 stations on Channel 4 and 2, and the 2 stations on Channel 3 alternately appeared one at a time. KFEL-TV was reported, but they have not yet verified. Weather con-

WKY-TV has already been verified, so no report was sent. On 6/24 the following stations were seen: Channel 3: KMTV and WSAZ-TV; Channel 4: KRLD-TV, WDAF-TV and WOI-TV; Channel 5: WBAP-TV; Channel 6: WOV-TV; Channel 7: WMO-TV; Channel 9: WXEL; Channel 10: WBNS-TV. KMTV, WDAF-TV and WOI-TV were reported. WDAF-TV has verified with a nice QSL card which has no signal. WSAZ-TV had already been reported. KRLD-TV, WBAP-TV and WXEL were previously verified. Weather conditions were as follows: Temp.-79°, humidity-45%, barometer reading-30.19 and steady corrected to sea level conditions, wind-2 mph from the Southeast. On 6/25 WSAZ-TV, KRLD-TV and WDAF-TV were again seen. Conditions: 87°, 51%, 30.01 and steady and 18 mph from the Southwest. On 6/26 WBNS-TV was seen and reported from 7:50 to 9:50 p.m. EST on Channel 4. R. G. Burdower, Asst. Tech. Dir. has verified my report with a letter. Conditions: 64°, 92%, 30.18 rising and 10 mph from the North. Almost every day now, WSAZ-TV is seen in the morning. WKY-TV is now testing on channel 53. WQED are the calls of educational TV in Pittsburgh on Channel 13. WJBG-TV is now using 316 K on Channel 10. 73's to all from this TVviewer.

Bernie Duffy, 94 Lander Avenue, Staten Island 14, N. Y.: "Silent TV Pays! Canterbury, England, July 7 (Reuters).--Judge John Neal ruled in County Court today that the privilege of watching TV in England is worth \$7 a week. He ordered a local dealer to pay \$49 to George Lawson, who claimed he had lost seven weeks' viewing time because the dealer failed to service his set as agreed."

Pete Taylor, 5615 Orduna Drive, Coral Gables, Florida: On June 23 I decided to aim the TV antenna towards Cuba to see if I could get any sort of signal. Previously, I had seen CMO-TV Channel 6 in Havana once. So I got up on the roof and turned it around. It did nothing! That night however, Channel 2 was doing something, and as it was in English, I turned the antenna in a general northerly direction. It turned out to be WTTV Pittsburgh. The next morning, WGS-TV was really coming in very well. I first saw signs of it around 11:35; there was still some signal from it around 2 pm. Both times something was coming in on Channel 3, but overlap from local WTVJ on Channel 4 doesn't help matters much. WGS-TV could be seen on the other TV set, which just has a rabbit-ear antenna. Reports sent to both stations, but nothing back from either yet. WFL-TV Ft. Lauderdale, about 25 miles north on Channel 23, has been on for quite awhile, but they don't have enough power to effectively cover Miami. WTV Channel 17 won't be on for a few months at least; their antenna isn't even up yet. WTV is getting ready to construct a new 1000 ft. antenna and increase power to 100 KW. Some friends from the west coast were over for the weekend, and they say they could get WJBR-TV Jacksonville Channel 4 just as well as WSUM-TV Channel 38. They live 39 miles north of St. Petersburg, Florida. TV DX is pretty poor; Miami could easily use another station. Condenser in TV set blew out last week! Too much DX I guess. Well that's about it for now. (WJBR-TV heard here last week also Pete, but verified them last year. Ed.)

WESTON 93, Mass.: Nice piece of TV DX rolled in here on June 23. WDAY-TV Green Bay, Wisc. Channel 2 6:00 pm EST. Good audio and fair picture, but lasted only a few minutes. Ten minutes later two stations on Channel 2 were fighting to occupy the screen. They turned out to be WISN-TV Atlanta, Ga. and WDTV Pittsburgh, Pa. Nothing showed up on any of the other channels. Some regular DX from New York came in on June 25 at 9:00 pm. WGBS-TV Channel 2, WADD Channel 5, and seldom seen WOR-TV Channel 9. WABC-TV New Haven, Conn. Channel 6 also. In the am of June 28, WGBS-TV showed up. Local WABC-TV on Channel 7 hadn't signed yet so tried for WABC-TV. Could only get a frame once in awhile. No audio or picture. TV set here is a Philco 17" rectangular 1836L. Use an astatic booster which has one 6AK5 tube. Antenna is a double-Vee pointed east towards a hill where signals seem to bounce off on arrival from the west. No UHF stations are on here locally. WTAO-TV Cambridge is scheduled to go on sometime in late '53 on Channel 56. WGBH (TV) has applied for Channel 2 and CBS for Channel 5 in Boston. FCC is also considering an application from WCAK Burlington, Vt. for Channel 3. A news item in the local paper says Alaska's first TV station in Fairbanks will go on soon.

Two other applicants filed previously for the same channel. Tri-Cities is headed by Morton Frank of (1222 Woodland Ave., N.W.) Canton, publisher of the Weekly Canton Economist, the bi-weekly Stark County Times, and other weekly newspapers in Ohio. Texas Telecasting, Incorporated, of Lubbock, applied for two more stations, at Big Spring on Channel 4 and Sweetwater on Channel 12. The company has Lubbock station KQDE-TV.

"The F-C-C also received the following applications: K-X-O-C, Chico, California, modification of CF to increase nighttime power from five to 10 Kw and make changes in D. K-A-B-C, San Antonio, Texas, voluntary assignment of license from Alamo Broadcasting Company, Incorporated, to San Antonio Television Company.

"The F-C-C announced today that it has returned an application for an education television station at San Antonio, Texas, because of discrepancies in dates listed on the document. The application was filed by the San Antonio Council For Educational Television, seeking a station on Channel 9." (UPRLOS FC730F 7/7)

Hank Ward, 404 North 14th, Ponca City, Okla.: Verification received from WACE in Memphis, Tenn. from May 23rd reception on June 20th. Signer is E. C. Frase, Jr., GE. KFTV Hutchinson, Kansas is now on limited hours of operation with reduced power until later this month. KFTV's first transmission, a test pattern, on June 22nd was received here with considerable snow. Their signal has not been received since. Report was verified by Bill Mitchie, Promotion Dept. KFTV operates on Channel 12. On 7/9 the channels opened up for a little DX in the early evening. WJAZ-TV Baltimore, Md. was well received on Channel 2 with Orioles-Buffalo Bisons ball game. Interference was noted from two other stations on 2 but not identified. Then at 6:55 logged WFTW Washington, D. C. on Channel 4 with interference from WJAZ-TV Jacksonville, Fla. No voice back yet from them as yet. WJAZ-TV verified last year so no report submitted to them.

Tom Johnson, 766 Glendon Ave., Akron 20, Ohio: WAKR-TV is on air so thought I'd write and tell you about it. They are transmitting a test pattern from 10 to 12 am, 2 to 5 pm and 7 to 9 pm EDT on weekdays and 2 to 9 pm on Sunday during the last 2 weeks in June. Paper says picture is very clear at Kent (17 miles) and the test pattern was received at Mansfield (58 miles). I don't know how much power they have! I will let you know more before 7/14/53 for DXer. 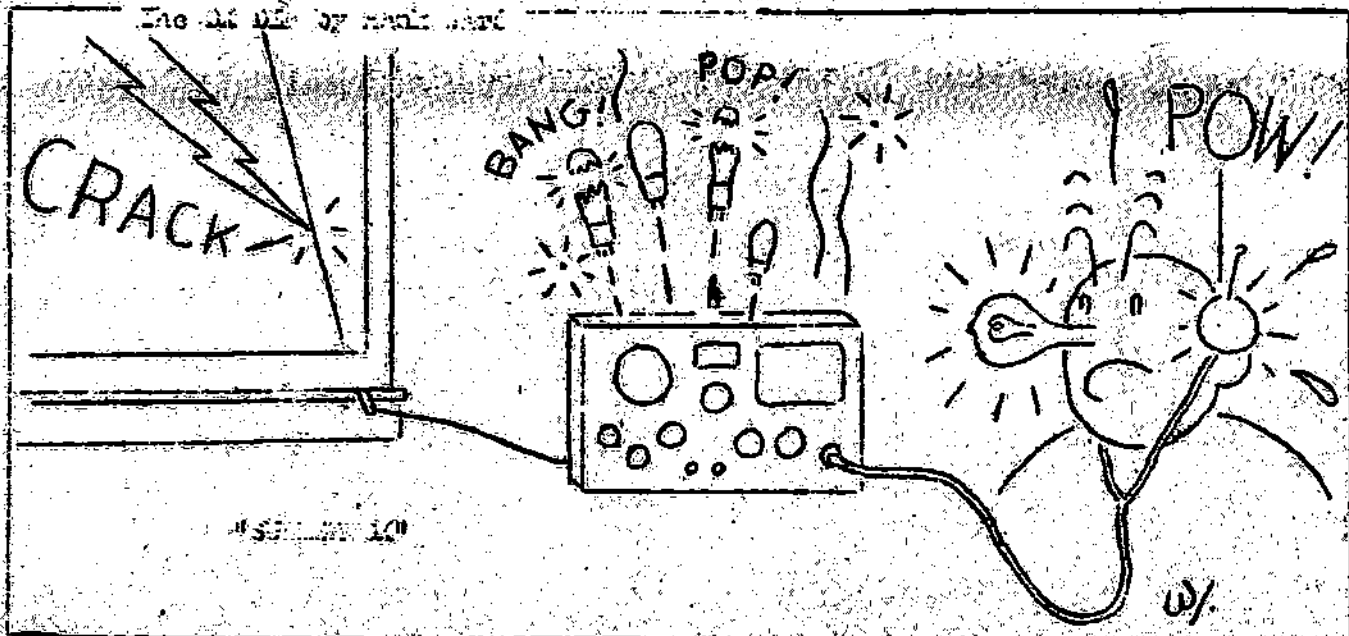
