SPECIAL SUMMER DX FOR NRC

June 24 KODL 1440 The Dalles, Oregon 1,000 watts 3:00 - 4:00 EST.

THEY WRITE:

"We have just completed equipment tests on our new facility - changing from 1230 kc to 1440 kc with one kilowatt. We are currently awaiting OK from the FCC for program test.

"Am wondering if we might arrange, as soon as possible, a DX test night in cooperation with your organization. Most any night would be satisfactory, though I believe there is a Pacific Coast station on this frequency that stays on all night on Saturday nights.

"I realize that propagation conditions are not as good Summer time as they are in the fall and winter. But if it can be done, we would like to make this test within the next month.

"Please advise if such an arrangement might be worked out.

Frank Wheeler, Box 176 R. D. 5, Erie, Pennsylvania:

Stations like WSPD, Toledo, Ch. 13 and WJAC, Ch. 6 starting to come in, first since last fall. So I guess things are starting to break. Received my first new one this year on Ch. 6, WJIM Lansing, Mich. 236 miles, had them 15% good, and a couple nights later 25% at sign off. I received a nice letter verie from them. No luck with WCNY on their TV DX, but I had something on three, a test pattern from 7:50-8:00 A.M. but too snowy to make out. My total is now 35 seen and 33 verified. My best catch (verified) to date is KRCA LOS ANGELES CH. 4, 2117 miles, and on Ch. 7 WKCB Chicago 405 miles. Will we have another TV Contest this year?? (Nothing in the hopper for a TV Contest this year, Frank. Ed.)

Don Roller, Route #1 - Dupont Road, Fort Wayne 8, Indiana:

Now that a long and successful BCB season has once again concluded, its back to TV for me again. Mary a station had been added to my TV log from the middle of November until late April! TV DXers are experiencing little or no difficulty in the matter of verifications, and in the matter of photo ID's, several NRCers take them as a matter of additional interest to this phase of the hobby, in ADDITION to their verification from the station! What's more, Fred Pardo, 34, the inventor, says he has already brought in London on his television receiver and claims experts of the National Research Council witnessed the fete and were astounded. Pardo said today as a result of his invention--time-spaced modulation--television relay towers and coaxial land cables for long-distance transmission will soon be out of date. He claims the invention ushers in an entirely new era in communications. **** In general use, time spaced modulation will mean that ten stations can occupy the same amount of wave band space as one station does now, yet each signal will come in as clearly as the present system of frequency modulation. **** Scientists who have watched the demonstrations at the Pardo Laboratory have been amazed by the operation of the equipment. 'It isn't possible,' they were heard to remark."

GREENLAND---Radio Station KOLD, The Voice of Information Services for Thule Air Base, operates daily on 1425 Kcs. in English from 0600-2400, power 1 Kw. Two other AFRS outlets are WXLS, Narsarsuaq, and WXLC Sonderstrom, but schedules not known. (WRH)

ECUADOR---New station is "Radio Ondas Nacionales", Quito, with 200 watts on 1380 Kcs., call HC1GT. Also "Radio Universal", Guayaquil on 1270 Kcs. with 250 watts, call HC2UM. (WRH)

Chile---CB114 sent airmail veric with pennant, letter signed by Joaquin Blaya Barrios, Jefe de Produccion, "Radio Corporacion, Huorfanos 1248, 10° Piso, Santiago de Chile. (WDR)

Argentina---ISWL reports station on 1150 Kcs. at Bahia Blanca using call letters LU7. (We list it as LU3, anyone know?)

Brazil---ISWL lists station on 1180 Kcs. at Rio de Janeiro as PRG3. We have it as PRB3. Anyone confirm which it is?

EUROPE

Norway---In the summer schedule for Radio Norway, only one BCB frequency is mentioned, 1578 Kcs. on the following schedule: 1755-1900 (Monday to 1920); 1955-2100 (Monday to 2120); 2300-2400 (Monday to 2420). This is apparently the only overseas schedule carried by BCB stations. (WRH)

Spain---"Radio Nacional de Espana" operates Home Service Program 1st Program on 1025 Kcs. from 0200-0700; 2nd Program on 585 Kcs. from ~~0700-1900~~ 0700-1900; 0700-1515 on 1025 Kcs; and 3rd Program on 1025 Kcs. from 1530-1730 and occasionally later. (WRH)

AFRICA

Madagascar---According to verification, "Radio Tananrivo" is broadcasting in French from 2230-0030 (Sunday 2300-0245); 0400 (Sunday 0330) to 0600; 1000 (Sunday 0915) to 1230 on 1550 Kcs. with 200 watts. (WRH)

MOZAMBIQUE*-CMS has a letter from "Radio Clube de Mozambique" stating definitely and emphatically that their station CR7BK operates on 917 Kcs. not 927 Kcs., as stated in a letter to FW. So no veric after all.
