SUMMER DX

W M I K 560 Middlesboro, Kentucky 500 watts 3:00 - 5:00 a.m., E.S.T. AUG. 21

Here's a station needed by most of us, and on Monday, August 29, they will be on for a DX-Test from 3:00 to 5:00 a.m. WIND will be silent from 3:05, but WFI will be on at 4:00, so the best time should be 3:05-4:00 for us. WIJK's 500 watts on 560 kilocycles are equal in coverage to 10,000 watts at 1120 kilocycle or twenty times the coverage at double the frequency. They have over 300 sponsors, mighty fine for a daytime-only station. "We feel your organization has the prestige and strength to give us a fair test of our programming and testing of equipment," writes Mr. Jack McPherson, Staff Announcer. Even though it is the off-season, let's tune this program in and send in a DX report for this pre-Convention DX Test. This was arranged through Sid Rosenbaum.

Same AM, 4:46-4:56 on 1240, KIYI add f/c. On 1380, WTSP signed on at 4:59 same AM. Monday, 7.18 found on 1450 KPAL on f/c 2:10 to 2:18. From 3:51 to 3:58 I found CBX and CBXA testing on 1230, how come? Reported them. Other reports have gone to: 590 KCSJ, 620 KGW, 1380 KRKO (Seattle baseball network), 550 KSD, 1400 KONI, 1450 KOPO, 930 WKY, (Monitor program), 1490 KICO, 580 WIBW, 1440 KODL (f/c) 1240 KRDU, 1400 KPIL, 1240 KIYI, 1380 WTSP, 1450 KPAL, and 1230 KXO. None spectacular, but needed. Veries have been received from: 550 KSD, 580 WIBW, 590 KCSJ, 620 KGW (QSL) 930 WKY, 970 KNOK, 1240 KCLV (prepared form), 1240 KRDU, 1280 EKDA (picked up personally), 1290 KRGV, 1340 KFGT (Thanks, Marvin Robbins), 1360 WPPA, 1400 KONI and 1450 KONI (prepared form). Very good vacation. Enjoyed visits with Abe Cohen, Roy Millar and John Boase in Seattle, and Gene Cameron in Spokane, all swell fellows. Found 1460 KPLK on the air; 1290 KLIQ not on; 1220 KBAM not on. Good vacations and DXing to all, with all verified.

Well now, after having been a member of the NRC for 2½ years, it's about time I sounded off and sent in a report. I have been DXing from Los Angeles, Cal ever since 1938 until this summer when I packed up the family and the HQ129 and came up to Anacortes, Wash. on a job. Talk about DX! These Washingtonboys have more DX in the summer than I ever had in the middle of the winter. Have heard four 250 watt Alaska stations, three of them on RS and one off f/c. Verie letters received from AFRS King Salmon, Alaska on 790 kc/s, 250 watts, KABI Ketchikan on 580 kc/s. with 1,000 watts and two Monday f/cs 4:00-4:15. KULE Ephrata, Wash. 730 kc/s. said nighttime f/cs are now discontinued so I guess June was the last one. Mentioned CE for 1,000 watts. KRCO 690, KPUG 1170 KTAR 620, KLCB 1230, who said they were using a 150' smokestack for an antenna, KXLE 1240, KOVC 1490, KFGO 790, KBLF 1490 KIT 129 KSPO 1340 and a five color card from JOLF 1310 kc/s. who asked for more reports. Twelve reports still out for June DX. Seven out so far for July DX which include KSEW 1400 250 watts on f/c July 4 from 5:24 to 6:00 with signal 30 db. over S-9. JOKD 1390 kc/s. 10 kw. from 6:17 to 6:51 with an S-9 plus signal, and this is summer time when there is no DX, they say - KTHE 1240 kc/s. new station in Thermopolis Wyo. heard f/c with ?? Ogden, Utah on July 2 at 3:20. KPIL 1400 new Carson City Nev. station heard on f/c June 27 3:37 to 3:46. Want to come to Washington? I had to come all the way up to Washington before I met Jim Critchett and his wife who were up here on their vacation. Jim only lives 90 miles from our home in California and I had never been over to his place. Also met those Seattle aces, Abe Cohen and Roy Millar. However, I'm going to concentrate on the Auasies, Zedders and the Philippine Islands stations. I've never heard a station in India, Siam or South Africa so will devote some DX hours to their frequencies. If we do, John will have to move to another continent as he verified just about every European. Can't seem to get him to verify. This morning, KACT 1360 and KMMJ 750 were added; KACT on f/c and KMMJ testing. All who have received their "Americas" Logs will automatically receive the Pacific Section.

We have a nice letter from Joe Lippincott bringing his supremacy totals up to date and also mentioning the fact that he didn't do much DXing the past season. Joe blames lack of time and a poor-acting S-76. While mentioning DXers, I am happy to report that Herb Campbell who was an NRC member will probably be back in the fold again shortly. He had a cataract removed from one eye, and the operation was a success. He looks forward to being able to see the dials as well as his copy of DX NEWS again.

While I think of it, Stan Stanbury mentioned buying stamps from a stamp dealer. I do it all the time, but perhaps you all haven't been doing this. It usually costs less to buy current stamps of the correct denomination than it does to buy IRC's, and the stamps leave no trouble at all for the sender. Even if it does cost a little more, the stamps will insure a better percentage of replies. We have listed in the INTERNATIONAL LOG the amount of postage required for return postage from the various countries. If you don't have an INTERNATIONAL LOG, this information is given in the postal guide, which all post offices have available. Just ask your postmaster about the country in which you are interested. I had a reply card printed in both Spanish and English which I use, and my percentage of replies is good.

Here is a note for any domestic DXer who may have gotten this far in reading. I spent some time at WJUN (1220) Mexico, Penna., yesterday afternoon. They expect to be on the air by Sept. first, and should be testing in another two weeks. They have 250 watts and intend to cover just one county. Mexico at 275 may be about the smallest town in the country to have a radio station. WJUN is owned by the same folks who own WIRF in nearby Lewistown. I'll try to keep you informed about WJUN, but watch for their tests in late August.

And that about covers everything on hand here for this month. I start my vacation in two days and am looking forward to it. '73's.

Test pattern, 80% clear, 819 miles. On their verie they were surprised that they were received so far away. WSB-TV Atlanta, Ga. Ch. 2 1:00 P.M. 1st one that I got with only sound and no picture. 630 miles. KGEQ-TV Enid, Okla. Ch. 5 1:35 P.M. 1025 miles, 80% clear Test pattern. WDBO-TV Orlando, Fla. 7:30 P.M. 65% clear 953 miles, Ch. 6. On their verie they mentioned that my report was one of the most detailed and informative that they have received to date. WDSU-TV Ch. 6 New Orleans, La. 1005 miles 80% clear. All time EDST. I also got WEAR-TV for the second time, but 1st time this year. July 13: 7:00 P.M. KEDX-TV Wichita Falls, Tex. 70% clear 1144 miles. July 14: KCMC and KOET battling it out on Ch. 6. Received KOIC-TV 70% clear 969 miles and KOET Tulsa, Okla. 40% clear 8:05 P.M. 943 miles. Since then TV DXing has simmered down a little. On July 20 I received WPEM Traverse City, Mich. Ch. 7 just barely making out the picture. On July 29 WCFY Carthage, N. Y. 267 miles Ch. 7 at 7:15 P.M. again, just barely made them out with their picture. On Aug. 3 at 12:30 A.M. and 7:30 A.M. WTRF Ch. 7

Frank Wheeler continued: Wheeling, W. Va. 149 miles 60% clear, and 7:25 A.M. WSTV Steubenville, Ohio 60% clear, Ch. 9. I received these last two on a crippled set, it is now in the hospital for repairs. Veries received since last reporting: WLWC WKRC KFEQ KFEL KMTV KREL WDBO WSB KFDX KOTV KOA. Totals 54 received 44 verified in 17 states.

Maurice W. Mittler, Box 94, Geneva, Nebraska: TV DX has been almost nil at this location. Haven't added a single new one since the July report. About the only ones seen out of the ordinary were KNXT-2 and KLRJ-2 both on July 22 in the early evening with fair signals. Also had something bothering KMTV-3 in Omaha but could not ID it. Veries have come in this season from WLWC-4 KDKA-2 WHAM-5 WGR-2 KCKT-2 KPRC-2 KLRJ-2 WUSH-2 and WTAR-3. Was surprised at the logging of KPRC-2 in June as my antenna is pointed Northeast to pick up Omaha and this is the first time I have been able to get anything except Kansas from south of here. They verified with a nice QSL card for my 28th state. 73's.

Hank Holbrook, E. Bowman Apartments, Bayshore Road RD#1, Cape May, N. J.: The following new stations were added via the video route since my July report. On July 25 station CMA Ch. 2 was received with a poor signal through WCBS-TV between 11:01 and 11:10 AM. Seen with a test pattern. Have verified with a mimeographed letter for my 4th Cuban veric. On the next day WHEF managed to break through on channel 4 for a short period between 8:59 and 9:10 PM. A letter QSL has come to hand. Also on July 26th WCCO on Ch. 4 was received with a good signal between 9:59 and 10:30 PM. This station has verified with a printed card. From 11:30 to Midnight on July 27th, experimental station KEsXND owned and operated by the DuMont Labs in NY was received with a fair signal on audio only. On the 30th some nice Tropospheric DX was received on channel 12 as WHEF broke through between 7:40 and 9:00 AM with poor to fair signals. A letter QSL has been received. The first day in July produced my third Texas catch as WBAP ON channel 5 was received for a brief period from 7:28 to 7:31 PM with fairly good signals.
