W E C O - 1240 - Eustis, Florida Word on this program arrived here one day too late for last week's issue, and we are hoping you were able to log it, but perhaps the station has postponed it to a later date. WSUX is a 500-watter, non-directional, and this test will afford all an opportunity of logging that rare state of Delaware, while for others, it may give you the chance of completing that state. Hi, gang. December seems to be a big month in DXing with all the fine specials being arranged. On 12/3 managed to log a little of the WCCM-dx but really a struggle with splash from both KCMO and KABC. The next AM managed to get the WMOP f/c (900) thanks to tip on back page, then on 12/5 it was a big morning again with all the DX specials. Managed KWJJ-dx (1080) with fair signals. KODE-dx (1440) with slight QRM, WJMB (1340) DX through some frightfully heavy QRM (CJOB and KSET), WKC dx (1240) logged through WEDC, KEOL-dx did not show. Instead I heard WAEJ with musical check just as clear as a bell. CHLN-dx was another rough one, but believe I have enough for a verification. Modulation was not up to their signal strength unless someone was on top of them with an unmodulated carrier. Very tentative one on WIKI-dx, just a few selections and an occasional announcement. You fellows certainly took me at my word when I asked for report I've really been swamped. Now, I hate to do this, but several came in single spaced and with stations all mixed through the report. I'm sorry, fellows, but I just do not have the time to unscramble your reports, and if the DIGEST is to be a worthwhile thing, you will have to help on your end by grouping your reports by country, and by listing everything that way. Please double-space and list your material exactly as it appears here. If you have unknown stations, list them under a separate heading, just as we do in the DIGEST. In that way we can keep the material up-to-date and concise in the DIGEST and I won't have to put reports off for weeks until I have the time to unscramble them. Now let's see what was really in the mail-bag.

NORTH AMERICA

PANAMA*-HOL (1390) "Radio Atlantico" has English daily at 0900-1100, 1600-1800, and 2100-2200. (WHH)

COSTA RICA*-Information still centers around TIFC, heard well all over the country and verifying promptly and with a nice card. Frequency 995 Kcs. and slogan "Faro del Caribe", Apartado 2710, San Jose, Costa Rica. Verified for HJW in 15 days signed by Philip Smith. In Pacific Zone good from 1800-1830. In Central Zone late evenings by HS and in Eastern Zone 1900-2100 by GB. GB also reports a verie listening power as 10 Kw. Other Costa Ricans are reported by HS in TIDCR (625) at 0400 12/25 and TINS (918) at 0400 on 12/26. This one is all night most nights and was also noted by MER while trying for the WKVA DX. This is "Radio Athenea", but no one has received a verie recently, although most of us have written. MER also noted TICS (855) around 1930 with fair signals on 12/23 announcing as "La Voz de America en San Jose, Costa Rica". CF adds that his information on TIAC (955) is that slogan used is "Radio Fides", Apartado 1933, San Jose. (Cur info. here is "Radio Accion Catolica", but QRA is probably OK. (FV)

MEXICO*-Some of us don't consider Mexico as true DX, but I feel that there is a lot of good stuff there, and each week someone seems to ferret out something new and good. MER had good luck on 12/19 in logging XMTQ (870) Orizaba, when WWL was silent, with program from local night club. The same morning XE40 (910) Mexicali, was also heard with quite readable signals with local commercials and music. (Here is another notorious non-verifier) MER also notes that XET (990) Monterrey can usually be logged during the evening well on top of CBW and WNOX. His logging was 10/31. LS notes that he is hearing XERON (1110) during the evenings. EJ reports that his veric from XERON had no signer and was a postal picture. Address given was Lucareli #12, Mexico, D. F. HS reports a Mexican on 1590 which sounded like KELC, but didn't see this one listed on 1590. Heard at 0200 on 12/8. Thinks maybe XEMC. (Maybe, Hal, but KELC La Piedad, is on 1600 Kcs., and Mexicans have drifted in the past.) CPA reports that XENA is still going strong on 540 Kcs. and was S-6 at 1945 on 12/29. DK reports that XE1F (1570) even gets into Iceland. Now for the veric department with CF reporting one from XECL (990) signed by A. Maldonado Sotomayer, Gerente. Address: Av. Madero 621, Mexicali, or P. O. Box 1010, Calexico, California. CMS adds that he has verified his best Mexican in XEAB. Finally from DR a veric in from XEFX (880) gives power as 250 watts with address: Jordan Y. M. Aleman, Aptdo. 201, Guaymas, Sonora. Signer is Ramos y Acosta, S. on N. C. DR also had one from XE1W (1240) in Ciudad Delicias, Chih, heard S-8 0654-0709 on 12/12. Veric back in 15 days signed by Ramiro Hormosillo O, Gerente. Address Apartado 163.

PUERTO RICO*-This is at times a rather elusive country, and our reporter this week is MER who noted WHDD (1490) Pajardo, during an apparent FC the morning of 10/10. Gave call letters frequently and used tone. Also WABA (850) Aguadilla, heard 12/19 with FC for Riverhead, also giving call frequently and fair to good signals. He also has noted WIAC (740) after sign-on on 12/23 with excellent signals with news program interspersed with local slogans. Gives location no as San Juan instead of Santurce.

CUDA*-This is perhaps our most often reported Foreign Country, and this week is no exception. First of all in 12/24 DIGEST we said that CMCD was on 790 Kcs. TAIN'T SO. As far as we know CMDD is still on 740 Kcs., and we apologize. Thanks to JDI for catching us on this. He reports correctly that CMCH "Radio Cadena Habana" is the station there, on 12/25 and 12/26 on as late as 0230. EJ also noted CMCH on 90 in clear on 12/28 from 1800-1830. EJ also adds that CMCY (590) was covering WOW at 1850 on 12/28. CF has been noting new Cubans for him due to strong south signals these days. He lists CMHW Santa Clara on 810 Kcs.; CMKS (1170); CMER (1210); and CMBS (1090), with only the last reported. MER pulled CMKJ (730) through XEX around 2100 on 12/8 with fair signals. Also QRE from CKAC. And also from MER on 12/19 who logged CMHW (810) "Radio Reporter" outlet in Santa Clara, on for special program. Then on 12/25 he logged CMHD (890) Union Radio outlet in Santa Clara, paralleling CMCF just 30 Kcs. up, fair signals with program from local night club.

EL SALVADOR*-YSS is this country's most reported station, with someone reporting him about every week. This week GB has been hearing him evenings most of the time, and has an unanswered report out. DR also heard him at 2200 on 12/30 with classical music and S-8 signal. DR also reports seldom-heard YSN (780) on 12/30 at 2145 about S-7 fighting it out with WRBM.

GUATEMALA*-TGW (640) provides us with most of our information from this country, and if you don't have him verified, please give it a try, for his card is a beauty. DR suggest Monday morning for PST listeners when KFI off at 0730 sign-on.

DR also has logged TGJ (880) "Radio Nuevo Mundo" most evenings, but he warns not to confuse with new Mexican XEFX, also heard evenings.

JAMAICA*-Jamaica is not reported too often now, but DR has noted 2QI (720) signing on at 0600 when WGN was faded out. (Sun spots)

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC*-LI3T (620) was reported by CF heard through heavy QRM on 11/4. No reply yet. (He did verify, as I have a nice card from old 1040 Kc. freq.) HS has heard HIL (890) on 12/25 in clear at 0530, announcing "La Voz de Tropico".

NICARAGUA*-CF asks what happened to YNW which used to be strong on 935 Kcs. (No change reported here, but govt list shows assignment as 930 Kcs. Maybe back there now. FV)

SOUTH AMERICA

TRINIDAD*-Both WVDI and VP4RD are in the news this week with more results coming in of the WVDI DX. HS is not sure if heard, but did log station with light music at 0435. Wonders if this was WVDI? EP says he heard it definitely, but not well enough for log. He had line noise from furnace until he turned it off in time to hear ID and a loud carrier pop on, probably WPDQ. EP also noted VP4R at about 0500, but also too weak to log on 12/19.

VENEZUELA*-Not much from here this week, but DR reports YVKS (750) "Radio Caracas" copied S-7 from 2124-2138 on 12/30 overriding WSE. Also YVWH (700) fighting with WLW nightly. HS reports a Venezuelan on 780 Kcs. at 0530 on 12/25, but not identified. (Hal, that would have to be YVOB, San Cristobal, FV)

BRAZIL*-Interesting to note that Brazilian stations are now broadcasting some in Japanese, so don't be surprised at what you hear from a supposed-Brazilian. According to WRH and DW PRH7 (620), PRA5 (1260), and LY04 (960) as well as seven low powered stations are now carrying regular programs in Japanese. WRH notes a new station in Florianopolis, Santa Catarina, on 1010 Kcs. with 250 watts using slogan "Radio Diario da Manha". ZYF6 (1460) and PRG2 (1040) have been heard in Europe recently. (DW) DK reports Brazilians are getting in Iceland with PRG3 (1230), PRB9 (1000), PRG2 (1040), PRE3 (1180), PRE9 (1200), PRA9 (1220), PRH6 (1340), PRE7 (1410), PRE8 (980), and some unidentified ones on 1110-1500-1520-1440.

British Guiana---Latest schedule of ZFY (1230) is now 0542-2115. Slogan is "Radio Democrata". (WRH)

COLOMBIA*-HJDK (770) Bogota, was heard on Christmas morning by both GB and HS. Whoops, he is in Medellin, not Bogota, and time is 0400 by HS. DR has a little Colombian news for us with HJCC (or E) (1020) "Emisora Mil Veinte" in Bogota copied 2215-2301 on 12/27 overriding KDKA. (HJCE is correct, HJCC is on 860 Kcs.-FV) LJCI (890) had S-8 at 2200 on 12/27. And finally HJEL (1215) "Emisora R D O" heard almost nightly about 2300. (DR)

DUTCH WEST INDIES*-PJG2 (865) is still in the news with CPA reporting him on 12/23 from 2000-2200 with excellent signal. On 12/28 logged from 1815-1900, also by CPA. CF also has heard them but not

reported, as he didn't think they were verifying. (I think veries have been received, although I don't have one-FV)

Peru---WRII reports a new station OAX5E (730) Ica, Peru, with 1 Kw., slogan "Radio Independencia". And also another new one by "Radio Nacional del Peru", OAX8A, in Iquitos. Schedule is 0900-1315 and 1800-2300. Address is Radio Nacional del Peru, Palacio Municipal 3° piso, or P. O. Box 140, Iquitos. (Etersvop via WRII)

EUROPE

WEST GERMANY---HS reports first weak signals from 1538 and 1602 heard on 12/27 but faint. DK reports a lot of West Germans logged as follows: Frankfurt (593) on 12/3 at 1600; NWDR (701) Aachen, sign-off at 2010; NWDR Hamburg (971) sign-off at 2010; SWF Rhinssender (1016) best at 1925; BEC Norden (1295) at 1930; SWF Ravensburg (1538) sign-off at 2000; NWDR Flensburg (1570) sign-off at 2010; NWDR Oldenburg (1586) sign-off at 2010; Nurnburg (1602) sign-off at 1900; and AFN Frankfurt (872) sign-off at 1905. Also reports AFN (1304) on top at 1905 sign-off, location unknown. (Was Trieste, but doubt if on any more-FV)

EAST GERMANY---CMS reports a verie card in for DDR station on 1043 Kcs. It verifies reception but does not specify frequency or location. Country #74. DK reports following Deutschlandssenders: Schwerin (728) at 2005; Berlin (783) at 1710; Erfurt (854) at 2035; Königusterhausen (881) at 1920; Dresden (1043) at 2015; and Bernburg (1196) at 2015. All on 12/3.

FRANCE---A few French stations coming through with HS hearing ones on 1554 and 1376, first at 0040, second at 0032 on 12/27. GB also reports Lille (1376) on 12/22 for first time this year, strong, but didn't last long, gone by 0330. CMS reports verie letter in from Paris for Nancy I. DK has logged Rennes (874) at 1800 sign-off and Paris (863) at same time on 12/3.

ROMANIA---This is a difficult one this season, but we at least have a verie to report for CMS, definite, attractive card which specifies frequency. This from Bucharesti II.

SPAIN---Information from this country comes from several sources. CMS has logged EAJ7 (782) Madrid at 1700 on 12/18. DW reports logging of EAJ5 (800) at 2100 on 12/2. DK has heard RNE Madrid (585) at sign-off 1903 on 12/3; also RNE Seville (638) at 1800, and Radio Madrid SER (782) at sign-off at 1930. WRII notes that EAJ28 (1133) Bilbao, will broadcast a DX program for Norwegian DXers in many languages on January 22nd from 1800-1900. Will verify for an IRC. Perhaps some of our East Coast DXers might be able to get this. DW notes a not completely identified station as "La Voz de Madrid, la emisora de la buena musica", on about 1250 Kcs., although it was higher and QRM'd Tangier on 1232 Kcs.

PORTUGAL---GB reports a verie in from Lisbon for 665 Kcs. station received about 8 months after report send. Not heard this season. DK notes the station on 12/3 at about 1650.

Czechoslovakia---"Radio Prague" is now broadcasting in English on 1286 Kcs. at 1700-1730, and 1810-1910 on 1097 Kcs. Many languages are used on 1286 Kcs. other than Czech or Slovene, so be careful on your identification. (WRII)

SWEDEN---A new European service will commence on 1/2 and will be aired nightly over Horby on 1178 Kcs. at 1800 in German, 1830 in French and 1900 in English, each lasting ½ hour. (SW)

MISCELLANEOUS---Since the rest of our European reports are from DK, I am grouping them here: Belgium: Brussels I (620) French at 1535; Mire: Athlone (566) English and sign-off at 1900; England: ELC Daventry (647) sign-off at 1800, as did Moorside Edge (692) and Bartley-Clevedon (1457). Holland: Hilversum I (746) good at 1720; Iceland: Unknown (548) sign-off at 2000; TFE Eidar (611) good 1605, off 2000.

Roofn (665) sign-off at 2000; unknown (728) sign-off at 2000; Akureyri (737) off at 2000; Italy: Rome I (845) good at 1915. Luxembourg: Radio Luxembourg (1459) at 1925; Norway: Vigra (629) good at 1645; Stavanger (1315) good at 1720; and Fredrikstad (1578) good at 2005. Scotland: BBC Burghhead/Westerglen (809) good at sign-off at 1900. USSR: Radio Moscow over Vilnius (665), Leningrad (800), unknown (1250) and (1439) good, Lvov (955) at 2015 on 12/3, and Kishinev (998) good at 1910. Wales: BBC Washford (881) sign-off at 1800. (All above hrd on 12/3) (DK)

AFRICA

FRENCH CAMEROON--"Radio Yaounde" at Yaounde is operating on 1538 Kcs. with 1 Kw. 1200-1500 daily after 2/1, now experimentally on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. (WJH)

FRENCH MOROCCO--DK has logged Sebba Aioun (611) in French at sign-off at 1900. Also Sebba Aioun (701) in Arabic, sign-off at the same time on 12/3. AFRS Nouassour (1592) also logged good at 2130.

TANGIER--Tangier (1232) in Arabic at 1725 on 12/3. (DK)

LIBYA--Radio Tripoli has been logged on 1552 Kcs. with arab music. (DW)

ASIA

Saudi Arabia--The Saudi Arabian Broadcasting System is broadcasting four programmes in Arabic daily at 2240 and 0640 and at 1125 and 1255 on 725 Kcs. There is also a program in Urdu at 0300 and in Indonesian at 0900 over 1190 Kcs. (WJH)

India--- DW reports the call of the Jullunder station on 710 Kcs. is VUJ.

LEBANON---"Radio Liban" on 836 Kcs. starts its evening transmissions earlier than 1000 with Arabic talk and music. Uses English at 1000. (DW)

CHINA--DR reports that he thinks that Peking (750) is the Oriental heard near 0600 with definite ID still lacking. (I think you're right-FV)

JAPAN--Japanese still coming into the Pacific Coast with DR reporting on 12/26 JONK (890) good; JOLE (830) good; JOQC (770) fair; JOKR (950) good; JOQB (1030) fair; JOHB (1090) fair; JOQR (1130) good; JOCR (1220) good, JOKD (1390) good even in QRM; JOQK (850) in QRM; JONR (1010) in QRM, all between 0415 and 0630. AEL adds JOKR (950) JOQR (1130), and JOLE (1310) heard between 0440-0545 on 12/26 also. These in Tokyo. AEL also heard JONR (1010) Osaka with play 0613-0618 same date.

PHILIPPINE ISLANDS--VOA (1140) provides the best chance to log this country, and DR reports him on 12/26 near 0530, not very loud.

OCEANIA

BRITISH SOLOMON ISLANDS--Present schedule for VQO (1030) at Honiara, is 0200-0300 weekdays only. (WJH)

WAKE ISLAND--NARC via CMS reports that the CAA operates broadcast station WAKE on 1450 Kcs. with 20 watts.

AUSTRALIA--3CI (830) Sale, verified on a regular ABC card for report by HWJ of 8/28/55, card showing date and time heard.

NEW ZEALAND--EP says that Zedders are coming through with 1YZ heard on 12/15 and almost nightly since. Best reception was 12/26 when logged from 0430-0505 on 800 Kcs. Other English speakers on 780 and 900 Kcs. The 780 signal was about S-6 on peaks, 1YZ was S-8 to 9. (DP) The New Zealand Listener of NZBS mentions that LXN Hamilton (1310) and ZZA (940) Palmerston North will both be full-time commercial outlets and will commence broadcasting one hour earlier now.
