FREAK CONDITIONS BLAMED FOR CROSS-UP IN POLICE RADIO SYSTEM

Mrs. Edith Hunt, Towanda Borough secretary, was greeted with a torrent of Spanish when she reported for work on the morning of March 6. She learned from police chief Dean Meredith that the flood of Spanish ~~XX~~ over the police radio receiver was coming from a forestry station in Venezuela.

The police radio station at Athens, Pennsylvania KGB232 was picking the Venezuelan up directly and unavoidably rebroadcasting the Spanish messages to the unit under its control. This because KGB232 and the Venezuelan both transmit and receive on the same frequency 39.18 Megacycles. Ordinarily radio waves of this VHF type cannot be received beyond the local area but because of high sun spot activity on that date, conditions approaching ~~XX~~ those on Short Wave ~~XX~~ prevailed.

The LA was heard by police radio stations in Binghamton, N.Y. (KA6401) and Utica, N.Y. (KEA784). As the Spanish operator spoke English as well, he was able to converse with the Americans. He told them that his station was located in the West coast mountains of Venezuela which ~~XX~~ range up to 15000 feet. The Pennsylvania and New York stations could be heard clearly at his location. (HERB CAMPBELL)

APPENDIX

If your editor may, he would like to add a few notes to the very fine article by Norm Mangube which appeared in last week's DX NEWS.

First, as Hal pointed ~~XXX~~ out, a very detailed description of certain foreign stations' programming is available to the general public. Therefore it follows that any deviation in this programming would be a very potent item in getting a verification. A speech not consuming its full time block thus necessitating a musical fill in or a play which didn't run quite long enough would be obvious deviations to any alert DXer.

Secondly, if it is a play you have ~~XXX~~ logged, it often helps to give a portion of the plot. This was a key factor in your editors verifying 5DR.

There is another point. If you want to be an International DXer, if you want to log and verify the rare ones ~~X~~, you've got to scramble for them. An international DXer's method of DXing must vary from station to station. So does his method of reporting. He must be able to adjust to the conditions that face him.

Many times when logging a tough station, "orthodox" program items are unobtainable. In such a case, a DXer must use his own ingenuity to prove that he heard the station. In this connection, your editor believes there are two DON'TS. Don't give items which do not distinguish the station from any other station or that tell nothing of the station's programming. An item must do one or the other. For example, the following would do you no good at all:

2302 EST Man talking

And don't give items you KNOW the station can't check.

Finally, there are always going to be a few chief engineers (or who ever it is that does the verifying, in Latin America usually the station manager) who demand something special, something extra. Usually the DXer does not know this. All he can do is hope he is not reporting to such an individual or by some good fortune has given in his report what the gentleman had his heart set on. If he is unlucky in this respect, the only thing left is to try again.

WADS

Harold Williams advises that WADS the station on 690 kc in Ansonia, Ct. now expects to be on the air by April 1. Hal has promised the General Manager, Sydney Byrne 25 NRC report so come on fellows, don't let Hal and the ~~X~~ prestige of the NRC down. All reports should go to Mr. Byrne.

IN THE NICK OF TIME

Probably the most "timely" DX program of the season was that from WESK 1490 kc in Escanaba, Michigan because on February 29 this station left the air permanently. They verified promptly which was also very fortunate. † (JOE BRAUNER)

(1360 Kcs.) Guess that is all.

INTERNATIONAL DX DIGEST

Another week has gone by, and with it a little DX information, but not as much as we would like. Our apologies to those whose reports did not make this deadline, which was advanced to Monday morning because of my schedule. Well, here goes with what's new.

NORTH AMERICA

MEXICO--XERCN (1110) was almost completely covering WBT as early as 1930 on 2/27. (JB) An excellent letter in English from President of XEW in Mexico, D. F., reveals that it was XEWB in Veracruz that was logged on 1/30 before midnight relaying XEW. XEWB was on 760 Kc. and began operations that date with 50 Kw. Day and 1 Kw. Night. This station will soon increase its power to 5 Kw. Night with a directional antenna towards the South "so that it will not be heard on the U. S. border". Perhaps we all better try to pick this one off before they get their directional antenna operating. Same letter also notes additional XEW relays in XEWA (540), and XEWQ (1190), the latter in Guadalajara. This was indeed one of the finest and most informative communications that has been received from LA broadcasters. (RHM) XET (990) Monterrey, N. L., was logged and reported too on 2/29 from 0648 sign-on. (RHM) XEDM (1580) received a second report on recent logging. (JH) XERF (1570) heard, but already verified. (JH) XEBG (1550) now here, report sent. (JH)

ALASKA--KBYR Anchorage, is now in operation on their new freq. of 1270 Kcs. from 1240 Kcs., and may be deleted there. This station is operating with 1 Kw. Non-Directional, unlimited time. (FCC)

PUERTO RICO--A new station has been assigned to Island of Vieques, on 1370 Kcs. with 1 Kw., non-directional, unlimited time. (FCC)

CUBA--CMCH (790) Havana, heard from 0617-0625 on 2/29. (AEL) CHMP (670) Holguin, heard from 0528-0535 on 3/1. (AEL) CHHU (720) wipes out WGH now and then for a time, with WGH catching up later in the evening and going out ahead. (JB)

COSTA RICA--JB also notes that TIRS almost cut out the WPKY DX program at his location, and TIRS has been heard many times lately on JN program on 920 Kcs. JB also took long log on TIPG (625) he says, and then realized he already had them. (Joe, TIPG has been off for several years now, and TIDCR is the station on 625 Kcs. They send a very nice veric card if you haven't it yet. Better check that log again-FV) JB also notes that he did get a veric from TIFC.

SOUTH AMERICA

COLOMBIA--JB notes that BJKC (840) has been almost completely blocking WLAS at all times after 2000.

URUGUAY--CX44 (1410) has been logged in Europe at 2047. (DW)

TRINIDAD--A reporter to DW has noted that "Radio Trinidad Rediffusion and Golden Network" is scheduled 0400-1445 on 5978 Kcs. and 1445-2200 on 3250 and 1223 Kcs. Has anyone in this club heard the 1223 Kc. outlet. If this is correct, we assume this is a secondary network to the regular "Radio Trinidad" broadcasts.

BRAZIL--Following Brazilian stations have been regularly reported in Europe via DW: PRM9 (1220), PRB3 (1180), PRF7 (1110), PRB9 (1000), and PRH9 (840). Wonder why they haven't been coming this way.

VENEZUELA--YVKY (710) "Voz de la Patria", Caracas, sends out a QSL letter with sample of magazine "La Religion". The Director is Dr. Jesus Maria Pellin, to whom reports can be directed. (DW) YVOD (780) "Ecos del Torbes" San Cristobal, also sends a QSL letter with signer G. Gonzales Lovera, Director and Proprietor. (DW) YVIR (1490) "Radio Barquisimeto", Barquisimeto, is using 4 Kw., and the correct address is Avenida 20 No. 493 or Apartado Postal 76. Signer was Mr. R. A. Segura, Vice Presidente. (DW)

SPAIN--*--New station call EFJ15 has been heard on 860 Kcs. in Sweden from 1900-2000, fair to poor signals. (DW)

AFRICA

TUNISIA--*--DW has published a possible correction to an item which we had copied here. It was reported that Tunis was operating a transmitter on 677 Kcs. An observer in Europe has been listening on that frequency lately and reports nothing but Ramallah was heard. This same listener has a letter from Tunis stating that they operate only on 629 and 962 Kcs. (DW)

ASIA

SOUTH VIETNAM--*--"Radio Franco Asia" has ceased broadcasting, as the local government has established a monopoly, and other broadcasting stations are not permitted. Was on 1360 Kcs. (DW and WDR)

SOUTH KOREA--*--ILKY, The Christian Broadcasting Station at 91 Chong No. 2Kil, Seoul, is using a frequency of 840 Kcs. Power is 5 Kw with 10 Kw planned and approved, but held due to lack of funds. (DW)

CYPRUS--*--Sharq Al Adna (638) has been reported in Sweden during our evening hours. (DW)

OCEANIA

NEW ZEALAND--*--3YA (690) Christchurch, heard poorly from 0400-0432 on 3/1 and 0332-0444 on 3/8 with QRM from JOAB. (JEL)

MYSTERY

BD reports that subsequent information has indicated that the mysterious "VBR" which he heard on 1490 Kcs. was actually KBUR which was reported by others at the same time he reported VBR.

EC asks for the correct address of WJCN reporting that his report was returned by the post office. (Lefty, you haven't been paying attention either. That address change has been given here at least twice. Since I don't have my back DX NEWS' with me, you will have to leaf back a few issues to find it.-FV) EC also asks who the Spanish speaker on 860 Kcs. is with heavy classical music Saturdays and Sundays to about 0200 sign-off. (May easily be XEUM owned by the Univ. of Mexico, and quite likely to use that type of music.-FV) Also who is the Spanish language station on 600 Kcs. who signs on Mondays at 0400 and soon fades out?
