I still need Idaho and Wyoming. 5/4- KOH signing off at 3, then f/c from KLEA. I enjoyed the DX test from CJBR. They had announcements and songs both in French and English. I hope everyone has sent in their votes. The deadline is coming up, so if you haven't sent in your vote, do it before you forget Howard Harding, Norman Adams and I have a little rivalry going to see who can get the most stations. At the present time, Howard has 493, Norman has 272 and I have 600. I hope everyone has a wonderful summer vacation. 73. Here come a few words from a seldom-heard DXer - if I still can be called that! The number of additions to my log this past season is the smallest in several years. Since last September I have logged only 116 stations, bringing my total logged to 1,041, with 885 verified. Very sorry to report that I only managed to hear 40 of the winter's DX shows - the lowest number since I joined the NRC five years ago. I must attribute this poor score to conditions which are not the best in the Princeton dormitories and to too many other things to do. (What stations I did hear from January 30 on are getting reports this week, the first in June!) On the average, my loggings are just about the same as everyone else's. Some of my better catches included Bordeaux 1205, daytime reception in Princeton of WHCU 870, KUTA 570 on a weak report, CKBM 1490 on DX, and CJCS 1240 on DX. I also noticed that KVAN 910 came through very well during the month of March - first time I'd ever heard this one. My saddest tale deals with the lack of replies from so many of the stations heard. The ones in this category that really hurt are the ones from stations that have put on Specials, such as WSON 860, CJEM 570, WCCM 800, WPLM 1390, WSUX 1280, and some from past years such as WAGS 1380, KTXJ 1350, WCON 1450, CKTR 1350, CJMS 1280, WBYS 1560, WPPA 1360, and on and on back. All of these along with about 50 or more others, will receive f/ups, though the situation doesn't look too hopeful due to the death of the verie-signers column as a weekly, up-to-date, and vital part of "DX NEWS." Since joining I've seen many great additions to our club bulletin, but I feel that one of the most valuable parts was lost last fall. True, there was repetition in this column, but didn't we and don't we still have it in other pages? Enough on this subject. I guess I'd better stop now and get going on all those f/ups. Will be working again this summer in Prudential's Newark office, so I hope to log a few this year as I did last. A good summer to all! (Good to hear from you again, Bart! -Ed.)

## FCC IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

A standard broadcast station must identify itself (call and location) at the  
 beginning and end of it's operations each day and (1) on the hour, (2) on the half  
 hour or 15 minutes after the hour and 15 minutes before the hour. M Identification  
 must be made within two minutes of these times except in the case of variety shows,  
 baseball games and programs of similar nature of more than thirty minutes dura-  
 -tion in which basmadanatnchmebeginningbefide program; five minutes of these times.  
 Further should caseidentification interfere with the continuity of the program, ident-  
 -ification may be made at the beginning of the program, at the first interruption  
 in the continuity of the entertainment and at the end of the program. (The latter  
 applies to concerts, operas, speeches etc.) (The above summary is taken from the  
 Federal Communications Commission rules governing radio broadcast services)

STATEMENT OF POLICY FROM BOARD OF DIRECTORS  
NATIONAL RADIO CLUB.

June 16, 1956

In recent weeks it has been brought to the attention of this group that certain members have been guilty of violation of the Club's rules and by-laws. This is regarding the failure to enclose return postage with DX reports requesting verification. It is clearly stated in our by-laws that return postage must be enclosed.

We have heard much of late concerning the use of tentative reports and we believe that this sort of report has a definite place in our hobby-however it can be used in the wrong way- and we feel that those who may be writing such a report knows at that time whether or not he may be perhaps stretching the facts being claimed. We feel that there should be some concrete fact or evidence in hand to warrant the sending of such a tentative report. A tentative report sent without any basis of fact might damage the reputation of the National Radio Club, and the DX hobby.

Furthermore any correspondence from a member to a radio station should at all times be of a friendly nature and never criticize station personnel. Here we are concerned with correspondence such as that received several months back by KWCR wherein they were rudely criticized because a letter in reply to a verification request did not specifically mention "reception verified". This sort of thing hurts the National Radio Club and the DX hobby.

Therefore, we, the Board of Directors, elected to office by the members of the National Radio Club, to steer and direct the activity of the club, wish to advise all members that we intend:---

1. To safeguard the reputation of the National Radio Club.
2. To retain the kind feeling of radio stations and station personnel upon which our hobby depends.
3. To exercise the power given this Board by the rules and by-laws, wherein we can enforce expulsion from the club membership anyone guilty of anything which damages the club's reputation, namely:
  - a. Failure to enclose postage with verification requests.
  - b. Flagrant misuse of tentative reports.
  - c. Directing unsevere correspondence to any radio station.
