Don Reynolds - 630 Figueroa Drive - Altadena, California

No DX activity here so I'll just review last season's results a little. Only two veries received during June came from CMKP (670) of the Radio Progreso network and a self-prepared International Reply Card from TICS (855) "La Voz de America" for reception of last Nov. 13. These two represent my final entries in the contest. Maybe they'll be sufficient (if Roy Millar's mailman forgot his address, hi). The prepared card for TICS was signed and rubber-stamped by the Gerente but signature is illegible. This gives me a total of 136 veries for the season with 51 foreign in 17 countries. Though my main attention was foreign DX, I did verify 35 states and three provinces. Still unanswered are 71 reports of which 51 are foreign. So on foreign reports I have just a 50% return. Of course, of those unanswered, 21 are Mexican and nine Cuban, six Colombia, four Venezuela, two each in Dominican Republic, El Salvador, and Japan. So much for the veries! Total heard log is 674 in 42 states, five provinces and 25 foreign countries (total foreign, 231). Even though I didn't get started until late in the season, I feel that I have had a most successful season not only from the standpoint of veries and statistics, but for the good wholesome enjoyment and relaxation in the time spent in this fine hobby of ours. Also for knowing such a fine fellow as Hank Wilkinson, and meeting our other Los Angeles area dial-twisters, Ted, Mort, John Boase, John Alexander, and Bob Morris. Hope to meet them all again (and more, too) at the big NRC get-together at Hank's on July 21 when old-timer Joe Lippencott will be visiting from the East.

Karl Raymond - 753 29th Street - Manhattan Beach, California

A little DXing to report. On June 4th heard KENL Arcata, Cal. 1340 kc/s. on f/c; KHAM, Albuquerque, N.M. 1580 on ET and KRIV 1480 Camas, Wash. on emergency flood broadcast, verie received from the latter. Only other verie received from KFTB 540 San Diego, Cal. wrote to them more in the form of a thank you letter for their programming and received two letters in reply. Their sales manager for their TV section, Dan Bellus, used to be with KXXX in Colby, Kansas. Several years ago I had a nice letter from him when I reported that station; happened to remember his name. About 3rd of July picked up station on 1600 kc/s. evidently ETing with prerecorded tape and used the old call letters KPMO which is now KWOW in Pomona, Cal. unless they have gone back to old call which I doubt. On July 9th heard KFTM Fort Morgan, Col. 1400 kc/s. on their new frequency. They never answered previous reports on 1260 kc/s. so didn't copy. Have sent f/ups out to KWIP WBEU and KNCO without success. KDTA 1400 has one coming but Jim Critchett has had no luck with a f/up to them so will hold off for a while yet. Hank Wilkinson is having a get-together at his place July 21st and expects quite a gathering of West Coast DXers to meet Joe Lippencott, veteran DXer from the East Coast. I see permit listed for 1490 kc/s. in Bijou, Cal. Someone may be wondering where this place is if they don't have a large detailed map. Bijou is located at the south end of Lake Tahoe about a mile west of the Nevada border line. I can't picture a radio station there as it is strictly a summer resort but stranger things have happened in radio I guess. Mort Meehan and I are looking forward to getting a seven tube AM and FM Grundig-Majestic radio shipped overseas through the kindness of a teacher friend we have over in the American section of Germany. The cabinet is plastic but even so a good buy we \$69.1, and both have never had FM here but like it from what we hear from the boss'es set, a Sears-Roebuck one, in our office. I seldom DX now, yet the few mornings I tried, I got the following: KGHM 1470, Brookfield, Mo. as they f/ced 6/20 at 1:30-1:45; WCPC 1320, Houston, Miss. as they f/ced 6/27 at 1:45; WHHH 1440 with its daily RS at 12-1 a.m. with an excellent signal, and 7/8 WZKY 1580 Albemarle, N.C. ETing atop XEDM at 1:15-1:30. 7/12- KFML 1580 Marked Tree, Ark. came in fine, atop the big Nogales station, and KFMA at 1:30. The Davenport station said they f/c at that time second Thursdays. In addition I get unknown all-Spanish speakers atop CMCB 1330, probably a Colombian, and the same type programmed station on 860. Each seems to be 24-hour-a-dayers. Recently arrived veries are letters from WCPC WTOE KGHM KLRS and KUTI. Oddly enough, the CE at the latter, Yakima, station, Don Gay, is a former Staten Islander. Hence he was pleased to know he had been heard in the "old home town." He welcomes reports on KUTI's third Monday 3:00 f/c. Our fellow NRC DXer, Erick Johnson, of the Bronx, New York City, is undergoing major surgery. Let's all hope and pray it'll be successful, and that he'll soon be OK! Well, for some reason, veries have been better than in summer although DX is rarer. Cards are from WISR 680, WKBN 670. A friend got a WKBN card a week before me which was totally different), WJR 760, WKEW 1520 (heard with a DJ program called "The Sound of the Hound"), WGAR 1220, WADC 1320, WWSB 590, WTOP 1500 (oversized) KDKA 1020 (oversized) WBT 1110 (oversized). While speaking of oversized cards, WIND's is as big as four regulars. WNAE 1310, WVLK 590, WFME 1540 and XEW 900 (whom I heard in April). Letters are from WBVP 1230 (f/c is the second Thursday from 2:00 to 2:30 EST), WBBW 1240, WFMJ 1390, WHOT 1570 for all Youngstown verified, WHHH 1440 sent a handwritten postcard, WHEB sent a mimeographed postcard (620), WMOD 1370 says on their postcard that they occasionally operate between 12 and 6 for experimental purposes. Just a short note. Missed last issue, but didn't intend to. Last DXing done May 13. Got orders to report to Uncle Sam June 21, so decided there was no percentage in reporting (DX, not Uncle Sam!) after that date. Have sent out 97 reports, verified 60, between 3/17 and 5/13. Best veries so far from KTOH-1490, XEBN-1240, and WOWL-1240. Best DX heard in two-month period; an Aussie which I assume to be 2CN-1540; KBYR-1270, JOOR-1210, JOLF-1310. All reported but none verified yet. Roy Miller and I are corresponding on one idea. We've noticed on several occasions that a fairly strong open carrier clears up a frequency nicely as far as noise is concerned, allowing a signal to be identified under the OC. For instance, on date that I heard KBYR with AN program, noise level was high, but KCOK, Tulare, Cal. and KTFI, Twin Falls, Idaho, both were testing with OC. The OCs ~~was~~-rode the noise, and I was able to take a good log on KBYR. I've never heard them since. And I've heard Roy's tape of an Indiana station on 1230 he managed to hear, rather, and Illinois station, who did DX same night as KRXX. The Illinois station was scheduled to close DX at same time KRXX started theirs. The frequency was virtually a blank until two minutes before end of Illinois DX. Then KRXX opened carrier preparatory to signing on and Roy got a good ID tape. On Roy's suggestion, I asked KCOV CE how using a signal generator with unmodulated RF on specific frequency would do in simulating OC CX and he seemed optimistic. Roy, I believe, is going to work on it, so follow him. Believe me, I think it's a good idea to block off some of that noise and drag in some good DX that otherwise couldn't be heard.
