THIS WEEK'S SPECIAL DXes AND TESTS FOR NRC

W A O K - 1380 - Muleshoe, Texas. Frank Fléenor, C. Dec. 3, 5:00-5:30 E.S.T.

The hour is rather late for such a test, but KMUL can go on the air after 4:00 a.m. 3-CST with no conflict. Now WAOK signs on around 5:10 a.m. and WLOS around 5:15, so be sure to be there right at the outset if these stations will spoil your changes for KMUL. A very attractive letterhead has KMUL, one you'll all want. KMUL is known as "The 500 watt station with the 5,000 watt Kick." STAN MORSS

C H W K - 1270 - Chillwack, British Columbia. Robert L. Cartwell, Tech. 12/5, 3-4.

This is CHWK's eighth appearance on "Canada Promenades". CHWK is directional, radiating the equivalent of 1,600 watts east and west, 1,000 north, and a null toward the south. A lively show has always been featured by CHWK, so an interesting hour is in store for all of us who get them. 1270 is expected to be completely clear affording everybody a real chance to make a nice logging. C J C A - 930 - Edmonton, Alberta. Gerry Gaetz, Manager. Dec. 8, 3:00-4:00 EST

Also program #3 by CJCA on this series. They are preparing a very special program for us, and will air it on what we believe will turn out to be a completely clear channel, coast to coast. CJCA's 5,000 watts often pound in in the eastern part of the continent, so those in that direction should have little trouble in hearing this program all the way. Be sure to send in those DX reports! C H A B - 800 - Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan. Merv Pickford. Dec. 8, 3:30-4:30 EST.

CHAB telegraphed their acceptance to join "Canada Promenades" this year, and they too have been on all the series in the past. Those who have heard any of these CHAB DX programs can attest to their interest, and entertainment. After 3:00 1470 will be clear in the West giving you out there an equally good chance. Pat Endsley, DJ at KWRD has prepared for us a special program of country and western music, so let's be there! C F N S - 1170 - Saskatoon, Saskatchewan. Charles Papen, Manager. Dec. 10 3-4

CFNS is a French Language station, and on this, their first DX broadcast, they will bring us a sample of that type of music with bi-lingual announcements. CFNS is directional (we don't know here which way) and use a three-tower array, Northern Electric equipped throughout. Another old friend of the DX family, CFJC will honor us with an hour's DX entertainment, featuring information about their home city and surrounding territory, and playing familiar musical recordings, with plenty of station identifications in between. C K P G - 550 - Prince George, British Columbia. Jack Carbutt. Dec. 10, 3:30-4:30

KAFY,akersfield, Cal. has been asked please to stand by for this DX from CKPG. Time hasn't permitted us to receive their answer as yet. If KAFY cannot comply, then the CKPG program will be canceled, for their 250 watts would not fare too well against KAFY's thousand. C J E M - 570 - Edmundston, New Brunswick. Robert Beaulieu, Ass't Mgr. 12/10 4-5

We do not know just what type of program CJEM will be presenting, but rest assured, according to r. Beaulieu that it will be an interesting one! Now 570 should be clear of everybody except KLUB, Salt Lake City, so most of us should be able to hear this program with not much trouble. This is CJEM's second program for us on 570, and they DXed for us also when they operated on 1240 kilocycles. BILL STONE

C F J B - 1090 - Brampton, Ontario. John Fox, Program Director. 12/10- 4:30-5:30.

Mr. Fox advises us that on this special equipment test, CFJB will be making many station identifications, for they want to find out how far away they can be heard, and want you all to know to whom you are tuned. C H F A - 680 - Edmonton, Alberta. Charles Ferland, Chief Engineer. 12/11, 3-4EST

We asked CHFA to switch to this date to avoid conflict with KNBC's changed all-night schedule, but we now learn that WMPS, Memphis, may be on, and also WINR in Birmingham, but we are not certain. CHFA is also a French language station, and consequently we can look forward to some of their fine musical renditions. CHFA is directional, mostly to North, so it may be a bit of a do to get them. C K G B - 680 - Timmins, Ontario. E. D. Mott, Supervising Engineer. 12/11, 4-5EST

Mr. Mott tells us that if any other station is to be on 680 during the course of this broadcast, that regulations will make it mandatory that they use their nighttime directional pattern, which is directional towards the North, we believe. Here it is time for another report already. I had only fair luck on the DXes of 11/19. First off I tried for the DX from CJRL (1220) but not a peep out of them as it sounded like someone had a carrier open. The NNRC DX from KVGL (1270) really boomed in here for a new catch. Also heard the NNRC DX from KORC (1140) for another new catch. WAMW (1580) heard on DX for another new catch and was not too good here although plenty for a report. I didn't think I was going to get CKSB (1250) but they finally came through fairly well the last ten minutes. Believe the other station on 1250 was WJLP which I understood was supposed to stand by. No chance for CHSJ (1150) as KRKD has apparently decided to stay on AN on Mondays too. No sign of CKLY either with a clear frequency but was very noisy here. Also no CJET here. Someone was on 1070 with a tone for a while and then a Spanish speaker heard which brother Maurice says was HJZD. This morning, was up and tried for the DXes from CFOB and CJBR. CFOB heard very poorly but not needed as heard on last year's DX. Not a peep out of CJBR with 900 clear here. Only other new additions to my log were on 11/20 when I added WAMM (1420) Flint, Mich. on RS at 5:09 and KVHL (1320) Homer, La. on a f/c-ET 5:43. Veries came in well this week as I added KLEN-dx WTAM-dx KSFO (560), KQVT (390), XEGM (950), WZOB (1060), KRMG (740), KGFJ (1320), KINE (1330), KNOR (1400), KLEC (1480) and KTLI (1590). Forgot to mention I logged WINN (1240) on 11/19 on RS AN so guess they are now on Monday mornings too. This was the first time I had ever heard WIN. 73s.

Maurice W. Nittler - Box 94 - Geneva, Nebraska

Time for another DX report to my favorite publication. DXing has been good when I listened. Monday, the 19th was a big morning although only one of the NRC Specials was heard and that one being WAMW-1580 which came in good here until KHAM came on and fouled it up after the first 15 minutes. Others heard were: KVNA-690 s/off 2:05, KBEN-1450 on f/c as listed, WINN-1240 on AN s/ed battling with WEDC. XETX-1110 was heard testing until 3:30 for a good catch. Last but not least, heard three stations in Colombia but took no log on them. They were HJAT-1080, HJZD-1070 and HJCM-1100, the latter being the strongest of the three. Heard my first station in South America last Monday morning with HJAL and now three more, all in a week's time. Doubt if CJET was on as HJZD was blasting right through at times on 1070. Likewise the rest of the Canadians were not heard either. Last logging this week was on the evening of the 21st when I got a real surprise finding XERG-1090 really pushing through. Hi. WCKR 310 carrier and ET 4:45-5:05 on 11/16; WQAM-560 Proof of Performance test 11/18 1:00-2:53 a.m. That's the latest on the locals. On 11/19 I had high hopes of really cleaning up with all the DXes. However, no CJRL or sign of anything on 1230; no WAMW-1580, KHAM ET heard instead; right now at 3:20, no sign of CKSB-1250 so am logging KVCL-1270 on NNRC DX. KGHM logged 2:20-2:35 (1140); KHAM-1580 2:39-2:53 ET. Something on 600 kc/s. giving ID in code, I can't read code, but did recognize a "W"; this was 2:45-3; same thing on 590, no IDs, just TT. KULA-690 coming in at 3:00. At 3:25, still no sign of CKSB; am listening to WOWL-1240 f/c, must be regular third Monday, heard last month (3:15-3:30). KSL really booming in. No sign of CHSJ-1150 either; I guess I just live too darn far South! LA noted 3:30 on 1170? Have had loose antenna connections this evening; really thought they were bad when listening to 640 about 1:15; Conelrad instead, with varying volumes. WWL-870 carrier and tone 3:35. Something on 1150 now at 3:40, sounds like RS though. WQAM got some nice reports in last week. I ran the 1-6 a.m. shift Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday 11/12-14. WHY ARE WE CHEATING OURSELVES?

I read with great interest Stanbury's remarks on long wave reception in the October 6th issue of DX NEWS. I have long had an interest in long wave but have never had a decent receiver with which to tune that band. I have always felt (as so few DXers do) that long wave is a part of bcb and that the totals of both should be counted in all DXers bcb logs, SUPREMACY RATINGS and what have you. Why is this my belief? It's simple. We bcb DXers (at least almost all of us) do not support SW DXing in any form. Well, long wave is further removed from SW than bcb, so really, if we face it truthfully, its more legitimate than the standard US broadcast band. Another point in favor of long wave is the simple fact that whether we know it or not, LW is a part of the broadcast band in Europe, so why can't a bcb DXer in the USA count same? Sure are some nice stations to be had on that low band- Iceland and Turkey on 182 kcs. France on 164 with Moscow and BBC on 200 kc. not to mention many others. Why isn't it accepted by our club? There are two probable reasons. First, few of us have sets covering the low band and therefore know little about it. Second, most of our members are mainly domestic DXers and as a whole foreign stations on bcb or any other band hold little interest for them. Since the majority of us have this attitude we draw the line at 540 kc. since we have no commercial broadcasting stations below that point. Why are we cheating ourselves? There are many real DX catches to be had on the low bands, and I for one am going to take a crack at some of them. All DXers with low frequency sets on the East Coast have an excellent chance to hear some fine DX from TAs. The fellows in the Mid-west and West are not so fortunate, but there are radio beacons in the USA and foreign countries which could be heard that would make interesting catches and who knows when the next TA cycle comes our way maybe you just might snag a rare catch. So even though few of us have long wave receivers, I feel that our by-laws should accept all stations from 1 kc. to 1610 kc. Anyone interested in looking into LW DX can follow Stan's advice and buy the October issue of Popular Electronics entitled "The Comback Trail of Long-Wave DX." I just purchased a Navy RBL receiver manufactured by National and I'll keep you informed as to what can be heard on the low band. This set will also be used in conjunction with my HQ-129X which should give me added selectivity on bcb. Any other DXers in this club who tune the low bands aside from Alexander (who was active when on the East Coast) and Lippincott? Lets hear from you.
