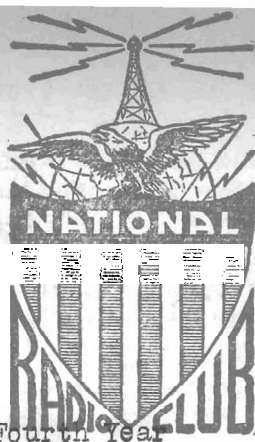

Box 757, WTOW Towson, Md. 1570 local daytime non-d., 1 kw. for special DX for NRC. Address, WTOW Inc., 26 West Pennsylvania Avenue. I quote, "Atmospheric conditions were not conducive to the best of reception. In fact earlier that morning we were treated to a display of the Aurora Borealis for almost a full hour. This is indeed a rarity in Maryland. I hope we will be able to again conduct another test in a few months with better operating conditions!" WTUC Union City, Tenn., 1580 local non-d. 250 watts daytime for f/cs. Address, WTUC, Owned by Union County Broadcasting Co., 227 South Second Street. WTUC is owned and operated by the County. I quote. "TUC officially signed on the air Saturday 9/22/56. All of our equipment is Gates, and our tower height is 100' due to interference to Princeton, Ky." DX continues below par at this time of the year. The two DX broadcasts scheduled on Monday 1/14 from WEST (600) Caribou, Me. and KAAA (1230) Kingman, Ariz. were not heard at this den. Later in the day I heard that Caribou had an early morning low of 39° below zero, so I couldn't blame WEST if they decided not to put on the DX. I did log the new WKBX (1330) Corinth, Miss. on that morning of 1/14 from 5-5:30 a.m. with its RS, and with a fair signal. On 1/15 the DX from WHRT (860) Hartselle, Ala. came in well with only slight interference from AN CMEL. But the DX from KLUV (1580) Haynesville, La. slated to DX on this date of 1/15 did not show, as the frequency was clear at this time. I was happy to hear Station WWXL (1580) Manchester, Ky. with its DX on 1/16 for a new logging. But on 1/17 when KLEC (1430) Jonesville, La. was due to DX Test for us they failed to show. On Sunday 1/20 I logged the RS s/on and programs of WHBG (1360) Harrisonburg, Va. topping AF KXOL from 7-7:30 a.m. The latest verifications the past week were letters from: KGEN WPCA KEED-dx KLTR KMIN CFRY KLEV-dx KUVB CKOT-dx and cards: WLBA KATR (on a KWBU QSL). Thus my total veries stands at 2,959.

I want to say WELCOME to those new members listed in the 1/19/57 DX NEWS and also wish them lots of luck in their future DXing and to remind them that if they take an active interest in the doings of the NRC and the DX hobby, they too will receive much help in their quests for new stations. Support the NRC by regularly reporting to the columns of the DX NEWS and you will be well repaid for your efforts. Now to my DX activities by dateline. 1/13 I overslept the needed WAOA-1480 NNRC DX but KEVE-1440 Minneapolis was heard on NNRC DX under WQOK for a new catch here. 1/14, as 600 was perfectly clear from 3:30 until after 4:00 I do not believe that WFST made it at that time for their scheduled DX. I know that WICC did a stand-by for them for WICC was back on the air at 4:40 and likely at 4:30. I did not expect to log KAAA-1230 on their DX and I most certainly did not. I shall be waiting for info on what happened to WFST. WSBS-860 Great Barrington, Mass. heard on RS 3:48 to 4:45 s/off, only S-2 but very clear; then WEVA, Emporia, Va. was heard at S-3 for another new one. 1/15- WHRT Hartselle, Ala. on NRC DX OK from 4:41-4:56 for the third catch on 860. KLUV-1580 must have "frozen up" as the frequency was clear here with the temperature at 12° below zero. 1/16- WWXL-E580 Manchester, Ky. heard the first 15 minutes but with a very poor signal. WLDS-1180 Jacksonville, Ill. heard on NNRC DX 4:15-4:33 but WHAM had carrier on, but OK for a fair report. 1/21- CJKL-560, Kirkland Lake, Ont. copied at s/off 12:05-12:15 over CFRA and WFIL for a new one here. WHIR-1230 logged on DX through tough. WNOR. WHEP-1310 not heard as WCAM always puts in a terrific signal here after 1 a.m. KAWL-1370 heard briefly for NNRC but not needed. Did not try for CFRC-1490 as not needed. The needed WNIA-1230 was logged fair under WNOR. WICC was silent at 4:45 but I don't know when they signed off. WMOO-1490 (badly needed) was not heard. Guess I'm too close to WTXL. WNNJ-1360 heard for NNRC but not needed. 1/22- WCHS-580 Charleston, W.Va. noted on s/on at 6:34. They may be off AN (I hope). Now for the DX "mail bag." 1/19, a QSL card was received from Paris in reply to my fourth request for a verie of my report to Lille 1376 kc/s., dated 1/8/54. The last letter dated 10/11/56 was sent direct to Paris and the reply confirms that report. Another BCB country for me, hi, signed by Dir. Gen., Combined Regional Services but not legible. 73.

Veries are WDOB WLEC WLBA WDDY CKNX WDDT WEND. I still have 29 new reports out. 1/15- 13° below, never even put cold headphones on. 1/16- Only 4° below today. Have my cap on, bathrobe and sweater, heavy lap robe over my knees, the headphones kept my ears warm. To you boys on the West Coast, who is English speaking announcer on 1380 after KHON signs off at 4:00 EST? Have heard this six or seven times lately. Unknown on 910 with WLCS with a tape recorded "Party Line" program and talked with ladies, at 3:15 to after 3:31 but bothered at times by WLCS. WWXL DX OK here for new one. 1/17- 6° below today; went to bed. 1/18- Warm today, 4° above zero, Used wife's eight tube Zenith to DX on; built-in antenna too. Too cold to go into room where big set is; gas is low again today. Even heard KSTN and Mexican heard on 1420. Both WEND and WDDT have had personnel changes since their DXes for the NRC. 1/19- Still zero weather and have a bad cold, so went to bed and no DX. 1/20- No DX, still nursing a bad cold, was in bed until nearly 5 p.m. Saturday - real "Life of Reilley" for me.

WSAT-1280 AN 4:00; WNCA-1570 s/ on 6. 1/22- KATR-1030, new calls for KWBU logged in the evening to 7:00 s/off and KPSO-1230 heard briefly s/off 7:05 for new call of old KBLP. Veries continue to come in good with some f/ups being sent out. I still have 28 reports out for December and 16 for November to send f/ups on. Received several delayed reception reports on KDAY's DX last November 25 from a DXer in Ohio and one in New Jersey. Also another from New Zealand in the Dunedin area. All have been answered and put into the mail. I believe that I have solved my "mystery" Colombian on 800 kc/s. to be "Radio Militar" as this station has been heard several times on a Saturday morning with no music of any kind and never a bit of advertising. At least at the times I've been hearing him. I wonder if anyone has ever heard and verified HJTA on 800 kc/s.? I find that he is listed in the WRH as a "Cultural" station. Received a verie from CKNX, Wingham, Ont. on their DX show and Mr. Reid said that a fellow DXer in Palm Springs (Raleigh Biss?) and I share the honors for the furthest reports on the DX program. Got a nice verie in from 4VA, 1080 kc/s., 1 kw. Port-au-Prince, Haiti, from a report of 12/31/56. Don Reynolds was responsible for this nice catch. Thanks, Don. Looks as if JONR, 1010 kc/s., Osaka and JOHD, 1370 kc/s., Kitami, are the best Japanese to catch at the moment. The higher powered ones aren't making it across the Pacific. I believe that an article on "How to Verify Latin-American Radio Stations" should be brought forth by someone who really has success with them so to show the way to some of us "novices." I don't believe that a LA form and an IRC is enough. How about Hank T. or Hank H. or perhaps Roger A.? Perhaps John Alexander may be able to help us out here on the Coast. The World Radio Handbook is about due here any day now. I mailed in my order last November. From the standpoint of reports I'd say that the DX NEWS is gaining in size over the same period last year. Perhaps it is a hold-over from wartime office work but I always type two carbon copies of reports to stations heard, and two carbons of my reports to DX NEWS. As my regular (?) correspondents know, I send one copy to whomever I happened to owe a letter the longest. In the case of Herb Campbell, it was well over a year I had owed him. But I added no note, explaining why he was receiving the carbon copy; maybe he thought he had received it by mistake. My purpose in sending these carbon copies is to get the news, if any, to my friends before they receive DX NEWS; and obviously it does get to them first, from me. Scheduled Special DX programs heard from Jan. 8 to 23 are these: 1/12; 800 KPDC, good. 1/13- KEVE 1440 possibly, through KPRO and WQOK; WKOA (1480) weak. 1/14- 1230 KAAA fair through KMUR marathon. Didn't try for others. Reported also to 1230 KMUR, 1440 WABR on RS, 5:03-5:08 1/14; 1150 WIOK RS at 5:14 to 5:17, and 990 WHOO RS from 5:24 to 5:34, all 1/14. February 2, 1957

We really have a nice lot of DX information this week, mostly all in the Americas, but some really good material, so let's get started.

NORTH AMERICA

CUBA--HS advises us that the all-nighter on 1420 is CMCG in Havana. Others have also advised the same, so I sent off a report with hopes. DR advises that he has been hearing CMBK (1150) Havana well after an apparent 0530 sign-on. Uses 250 watts. CMKS (900) Guantanamo has been logged on 1/1 at 0345 by CMS. CMS also is one of the first, if not the first, to report CMHI (940) a new station in Cienfuegos, "Radio Tiempo", heard at 0359 on 1/1. CMS also reports a prepared card verie after 5 years of trying from CMCX. Signed by Luis Munoz, Presidente. Freq. is 1060 Kcs. The NNRC reports CMCA (1150) Havana on 11/10 at 0130. Our records show CMCA on 730 Kcs. with CMLK or CMCC on 1150. What do you fellows hear on 1150?

HAITI--RSM reports 4VA (1325) often heard with excellent signals in the evening. Believes they are off Sundays. Announce in English, French, and Spanish, "You are listening to "Radio Haiti" in Port au Prince". (Don't you mean 4VW, Ray, 4VA is on 1080 Kcs., we feel-FV) Further on both stations. NNRC has also reported 4VW on 1325 Kcs. with slogan "Radio Haiti", this is apparently a new frequency and the correct one, although the NNRC also reported 1335 Kcs. DR reports 4VA (1080) "Radio Commerce" Port-au-Prince, heard often at 0600 sign-on in French. Verifies promptly. He reports signer as J. Hait. (We previously reported signer as Joyce Hart-FV) HS reports another one in 4VS (1385) with French program to 2200, weak on 1/16.

EL SALVADOR--YSS is in the news this week. RSM has logged him through PJALC via his loop from 1930-1939 on 1/16. DR notes slogan as "Radio Nacional-Alma Cuscatleca", heard S-9 Plus 1/14 from 2245-2303 sign-off. Slogan, call, and BCL and SW freqs announced clearly, then 2 anthem type songs with group singing. Then off at 2303. HS adds that he heard YSS announce a group of calls at 2000 which sounded like YSS, YSBS, YSO, YSAX, YSER Santa Ana, YSKL.

JAMAICA--ZQI (720) Cross Roads, is heard often in the evenings but signal is pretty spotty and haven't gotten a decent report as yet. (RSM)

COSTA RICA--TISA (830) logged at sign-on at 0525, announces as "La Voz del Tropico", San Jose. (HS)

FUERTO RICO--Thanks to all of you for information re WIVV (1370) Island of Vieques. LE and HS both got information which I confirmed by logging them myself on 1/28 from 0500-0530 with hymns and Bible readings. Program is in English and was in clear here until WKHC came on at 0530. HS says in clear at his place until at least 0540 on 1/13. LE notes that WDEF in Chattanooga also comes on at 5; so Sunday morning should be best time for WIVV. Owner is Calvary Baptist Mission of Puerto Rico. BS sends along the note that WABA (850) Aguadilla, is heard at sign-on at 0400 in English and Spanish. He had them on 12/31 with verie back 1/26 signed by the GM. Address is WABA, P. O. Box 188, Aguadilla. WKAG (580) "Radio El Mundo" sent a verie letter signed by Ofelia Landoss, secy. to Mr. Lamas. (DR)

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC--Unknown (1210) Ciudad Trujillo, logged on 12/31 at 0300. CMS reports this and also says it isn't listed on a new list he just received from the Dominican Republic. Not on ours either, Stan. The list does show two new ones, HEST (1360) La Vega, "La Voz Dominicana"; and HISA (1230) Barahona. (Stan, we reported HISA last fall when it came on the air-FV) Stan wonders (re 1210) if he misread the calls of "La Voz de Reeleccion".

NICARAGUA--NNRC reports reception of a "Radio Noticias" in Managua on 745 Kcs. on 12/5 at 2225.

February 2, 1957

GUATEMALA*-CMS reports a veric card in from TCTO. He says he logged them on 810 Kcs. and that is the frequency specified on the card. (That's where we have him listed-FV) JPA says he has identified the station on 1209 Kcs. as TGED, (1210) with SW call as TGEF. Heard fairly often here but seldom readable due to terrific hotrodyne with WCAU (1210).

MEXICO*-XERJ (1320) Mazatlan, verified promptly for Christmas AM program. Address is Apartado 60, Mazatlan. Signor is Rafael Elizaldo, Gerente. (DR) XEFD (590) Rio Bravo, Tams., returned prepared card with letter and coverage map. U. S. Address is P. O. Box 421, Weslaco, Texas. (DR) LK reports his first foreign verification of the season is from XEFD (630) Monterrey, N. L. HS reports logging XERCN (1110) at 2000 on 1/9. HS has also noted XEG (1050) off air at 0440 on 1/13. Finally from HS XMMU (580) Piedras Negras, Coah., best from 1840-1900 as he reduces his power at 1900. NNRC reports XEOX (1440) Ciudad Obregon, apparently a new frequency.

HONDURAS*-Via the NNRC we learn that Phil Finkle, Shortwave Ed. of URDXC is American representative of "Radio Monserrat", Station HROW in Tegucigalpa. The correct address is Apartado Postal 253, and HROW is now transmitting on 845 Kcs. with 800 watts, soon to be 2 Kw. Verification is by QSL card and reports are requested. The owner is Sr. Alfredo Leon Gomez.

SOUTH AMERICA

NETHERLANDS ANTILLES*-RSM says that PJA10 (655) "The Voice of Aruba" is a real powerhouse nightly. They announced in December that they were swapped with reports but would answer all reports addressed to P. O. Box 19 as soon as possible. Copied for report 2026-2113 on 1/19. HS logged them in English at 1920-2000 on 1/16 announcing as above. Time is ½ hour ahead of EST. HW noted that they were very good at 0530 sign-on, so your editor tried on 1/28 and logged them with good signal signing on in English, Dutch, and Spanish. They were in a terrific squeeze here though with both WRCA and WSM way over S-9 Plus on both sides. RSM also adds that PJA5 (1435) is heard often with good signal in evenings. He also heard PJC2 (864) very often in the evenings.

CHILE*-Friendly veric, via QSL card received from CB66 (660) for reception of 10/29 signed off at 0330. Although veric stated definitely (In English) that it was really our station you heard, I was still skeptical and therefore did not report it when received a month ago until Ted V. also logged this station and heard ID clearly on 1/21. Veric referred to "the end of our night transmission". Plan to increase power from present 1 Kw. to 50 Kw. about April. Anxious for reports then, so maybe can arrange something. (JPA)

PERU*-OAX4B (1200) "Radio Lima", logged on 1/16 from 0115-0200 with several IDs as "Radio Lima". Also heard several other days, apparently all-nighter, so there are 2 LA stations all-night on 1200, "Radio Lima", and "Radio Popular", HJCV in Bogota. Both have been logged here, HJCV on top until recently. PRE9 has never been heard here. (JPA)

VENEZUELA*-Veric card received from YVAH (700) Maracaibo. (CMS) YCMF (1120) heard nightly after sunset. (RSM) YVKE "Radio Cultura" (1101) copied 1916-1945 on 1/25. (RSM) YVQC (650) most powerful Venezuelan this season, carries baseball after 2000 most evenings. Copied for report 1957-2012 on 1/16. YVKC (790) noted at s/on 1/13 at 0531. Others unidentified on 700, 1345. One on 1345 announces as 1350 Kcs. (RSM) (700 is YVAH, Maracaibo; and there is none listed on 1350, although YVKU is listed on 1340 Kcs.-FV)

BRAZIL*-Latin heard 1740-1750 on 1000 Kcs., believed to be PRB9 "Radio Record". (RSM)

BRITISH GUIANA--Your editor climbed on the band-wagon after receiving glowing reports from RSM, RW, and CPA. On 1/28 "Radio Democrata" was logged at 0440 sign-on in English.
