As of 1/1/58, I have 662 veries from 36 countries; 557 from the U.S., 27 Canadians, and 78 from elsewhere. All states are verified (the last two were KGEM, Idaho 11/56 from Miami, and KRAM, Nevada in 2/57, from Miami) and all frequencies except 720 (never got around to WGN). Three provinces are missing (Newfoundland, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island), although CFBC was reported once. In 1957, 304 reports were sent out with 135 back (a lot of recent and foreign reports still out). In 1955 I had 54 for 89, and in 1956, 53 for 81, which is a poor 60%. PP cards have made the difference this year, with 30 sent out and only four of these not sending them back signed (WHIM KRAI KXXX KIMN). I guess being out here will help the old log considerably, although not too many veries yet from these Asiatic stations (or even FEN Okinawa, or KMTH or AFKN Korea). WGBS and KENI verified, saying my report was the furthest one received. From Japan, reception covered $\frac{3}{4}$ of the globe, with Tangier and WWL KIRF heard regularly. Reports are still out to 14 unverified countries, including Colombia (HJKC-840 really surprised me!). As for policies, I have about seven stations verified twice. U report them again when they change frequency, or when reception is unusual (like noon reception in Miami of WSM). I use the following publications: The Weyrich Log is great for domestic info; the NZDXL Pacific Log is great out here; and the WRH is good for foreign addresses and ID info. Several logs are kept: All verified stations are listed by frequency and state/country; the latter includes v/s. A running log of reports is kept, and the date of receipt is added as they come in. Carbon copies are made of each report. Veries are kept in a notebook. That is the Taylor System! Locally, KAIM-870 has quit ANing as of 1/1. Apparently, a new station has been licensed here, but haven't heard much about it. 73s.

The new reports sent out were to KRKO-1380, KPUG-1170, KSEM-1470, KXRX-1500, KRKD-1150, CFSL-1340, LLPL-1390, XEAK-690, KOJM-610, KPAX-1060, KGYW-1190, KMA-960, WKOM-1070, KNKS-620, and KAYT-970. Of these, I sent tapes to KRKO, Everett, Wash. and KAYT, Rupert, Idaho. Veries from KBVM Lancaster, Calif. KRKO Everett, Wash. and KPUG, Bellingham, Wash. are already in.
