TUNING FOREIGN DX STATIONS

By Norm Maguire

GENERAL

There is nothing quite as thrilling or satisfying to a BCB DXer than DXing for foreign stations. This search for foreign DX is considered by many as quality DXing as contrasted to quantity DXing of U.S. and Canadian stations. To receive foreign stations, a different set of techniques must be developed. Tips and techniques outlined below are offered as suggestions. Try them all, use those which suit your fancy and develop any additional techniques that you may come across in the pursuit of your hobby.

For foreign DX, a systematic approach is required. Very little "fishing" (random tuning) can be satisfactorily applied. The only use of "fishing" is to determine from what areas foreign DX may be arriving. Unfortunately, the barometric theory can not be applied to foreign DXing as current barometric readings can not be obtained from foreign countries.

Systematic approach requires certain fundamental steps which may be generalized as follows:

1. Determine the best times to DX for certain groups of stations (Usually grouped by continents.)
2. If daytime or evening DX is contemplated, know your powerful local and semi-local stations so these frequencies can be avoided.
3. For early morning DX, know the all-night stations and the clear or reasonably clear frequencies in your location.
4. Make a list of the most frequently reported stations and times of their reception for the continental area in which you are interested, noting frequencies. (This information can be obtained from International Digest and sometimes in Musings.)
5. For initial attempts at foreign DX, eliminate those stations that operate on or near crowded channels or near stations that tend to splatter.

The approach outlined above is adequate for beginners, but may be modified to suit your tastes as you become more proficient. Try this method first and you will find that you will soon hear some foreign stations. Be patient. Try first for the easier stations. The more difficult stations will come as you perfect the techniques.

Logging stations heard must be done carefully and accurately. Some minor detail may be all that is required to obtain a verification. Knowledge of the foreign language used is a definite asset, but is not required. Check your time (clock or watch) against a standard time station such as WWV or CHU (7335). Give your time to the nearest $\frac{1}{2}$ minute if possible. Be patient. It may take half an hour to log just five or ten minutes of program data. Fading is a greater problem with foreign DX than with domestic DX. Give time and details of sound effects. Japanese stations, for instance, will verify upon correct time loggings of sound effects. Describe them as best and as complete as you can. Note if one or more persons are talking, the pitch and speed of their voices, whether male or female. Describe the type of music, if selections are unfamiliar. Note the frequency of the station in your log.

There is some variance of opinion in the manner of reporting to foreign stations. If you can write fluently in the station's own language, this is best. However, if the language is unfamiliar to you, it is usually best to write in English. The station will generally find someone who can translate your letter. For Spanish speaking stations, better results will be obtained though use of a good Spanish Report Form. If possible, use the station's own time or GMT (Greenwich Mean Time) in reporting. Be accurate on the time-this can not be stressed too heavily.

A few words concerning postage for your reports and replies. Return postage should always be included with your report. Stamps, obtained from stamp dealers, may be used if sufficient postage is enclosed

for the reply. Otherwise, standard International Reply Coupons (IRC) obtained from your local post office, can be used. The IRCs are good for first-class postage from almost any country in the world. Air mail replies require varying numbers of IRCs and will not be included here. You may find the correct number of IRCs for an air mail reply in the Radio Amateur Call Book Magazine. If in doubt about the amount of postage to put on your report, check with your post office. In general, the following rates apply:

Tuning The Latin Americas

(Mexico, Central and South America)

In general, reception is best from these stations after dark in your local area. As a rule, these stations must be tuned at the same time that U. S. and Canadian stations are broadcasting their regular schedules. Most Latin American countries use the same frequencies as we do, which makes this DX more difficult. Some stations do operate on split-frequencies or vary from their assigned frequencies, as their frequency control requirements are not as strict as those of the FCC. In general, Latin American stations sign off between midnite and 0100 EST. There are few all-nighters among these stations. A list of the more frequently stations, by country, is given below.

MEXICO: The easiest group is the Mexicans. Many "border" stations that cater primarily to U.S. listeners and advertisers are exceptionally powerful and operate all-night. Most Mexican stations operate on CST. Sonora is on MST and stations in Baja California operate on PST. Try first for these stations:
