 This will acknowledge your letter of November 17 advising that you are observing an unidentified carrier on 1490 kcs. regularly on Monday mornings, 1 A.M. through 5 A.M. You are advised that this matter is being referred to one of our primary monitoring stations and if a "fix" can be obtained you will be so advised.
 There are no lists available from the Commission of coming Proof of Performance tests made by standard broadcast stations.

I usually DX for foreign stations but I'll share ry experience of 11/15. The Bureau of Standards gave the propagation report of U-5 so I thought there might be some LA DX. However East in clear channel stations were very strong so I tuned in KCBS-740 (100 miles south of here) and sat back to read. At 1:05 EST my wife asked who the station under KCBS might be. I said KTRH but she said it sounded like a Canadian and sure enough, they were playing "God Save the Queen." It looked like I just missed long sought CBYA. (Maybe CEL since this seems early for Alberta s/off). Then I decided that CX might favor the North so I tried for KFAR-660 in Fairbanks which I have never heard even when KFRB-300 is good. At tune in I caught KFAR mentioned, but then WPCA took over for 15 minutes and I decided to try switching antennas. The loop brought in two weak stations mixed so that I could copy neither. Then by accident (can't P. 6)

(Clarence Franzen, cont'd from P. 5) I discovered that with both antennas on I got one strong station while with the big one alone I got another strong one. The result was 20 minutes of 99% copy on KFAR using both antennas. By removing the loop I could get WRCA with nothing under it. The other way KFAR with nothing under. Report out. Also caught CHRD-250 that night. Otherwise I just received my best Oceania veries from WYTH 900 and my best Asian from JOFK-880. CX seem much better than last year so good DX, all.

Forty reports out for the month as of the 18th. DX in general has been very good in the Celestial City here, especially in the evenings. Here is a tip for you DXers to the North and East of Pekin. 

COSTA RICA*-TIQ (1175) "Radio La Casino", Puerto Limon, now states in a verie that they are using 1000 watts power. (NZ)

SOUTH AMERICA

BRAZIL*- "Radio Riomar", ZYB20 (1480) Ave. Epamondas, 55, Manaus, Amazonas, Brazil, is a new station reported. (NZ)

ASIA (FAR EAST)

INDONESIA*-This country is finally on the BCB with YDD (1111) "The Voice of Indonesia" at Djakarta. The outlet is for South East Asia in French directed to Laos, Cambodge, Vietnam, Thailand. (NZ)

SOUTH KOREA*-HLKX "Team Radio" (1150) 20 Kw., vs is Tom Watson, Jr., Correspondent HLKX, Team Radio, APO 971, San Francisco, Calif. (NZ) AFKN Pusan is finally definitely on 1250 Kcs., and should be removed from 1230 Kcs. on any lists you may have. (NZ)

GOA*-Commercial Service of Radio Goa has been heard to announce as operating on 880 Kcs. (NZ)

NIBI-NIBI*-More on this outlet reported by Deutsche Welle and questioned by just about everyone else. Dave Thomas of NNRC writes that there is such a station and that he will supply details through the NNRC later. He says tests were run on 10/12 and that he has a report to the station, but would prefer to await his reply before releasing any information. Thanks to Bob Duggan for trying to locate some information about this island to no avail.

NORTH VIET*NAM*-Station reported as operating on 250 meters (1200 Kcs.) with English news between 10 and 10:30 PM NZT. (NZ) The station with Communist propoganda on 1155 Kcs. seems definitely to be in Hanoi. Heard with English news at dictation speed. (NZ)

SOUTH VIET-NAM*- "Station Hue" is apparently the official name of the Saigon transmitters. Heard and verified on 1150 Kcs. and also heard on 1090, 838, and 1360 Kcs.

NORTH KOREA*-NZ reports that the frequency of 705 Kcs. reported for Pyongyang is apparently a mis-print of 785, and that the other known frequencies of Pyongyang are 820 and 1080 Kcs. Also heard on 620 Kcs. (NZ)
