Thanks to Francis Nittler's tip, I logged s/off of CKX, 1150, 11/30 at 2 a.m. I am sorry to say that KBYR, 1270, seems to be blocked in this part of the world by AN WXYZ. Verie - HJAO-1020, 25 days; new signer, Sergio Lombana, Director, and personal letter, not the form of last year. Loggings 11/29- WCBS atop 880 8:45, not TGJ, so wait till another time. Unneeded CJOB running 5 x 9 on 680, odd, since verie told me they run at night 2 1/2 kw. pointed due North. This at 8:53. XEW-900, and XEB-1220, taken for routine logs 11/29. Trying to ID IA on 770, probably XEHB, but KOB fades up just about ID time. Heard a rooster call there once. Mouth-watering session of second-hand DX at tape recorder 11/29, IDing a few for Godwin. JOBK-670, VOA-1180, OVX4X-895, YNDX 675, TIV-755, plus ones that he had IDed, as ZEM-1-1235 (beautiful signal). Watch out, Central League, for Godwin. I batted .333 on 12/1 DXes: Too much Latin on CKX-920; too much KTOP on 1490; too much KOIL 1290. Couldn't hear a whisper behind 'em, either. WHNY-1250 DKed with 5 kw. and fought with WETU Eting new 5 kw. rig. WHNY s/on half hour early. KPID-1450 good, weaving in and out with WJXN, and a good show for identifying. And the police and organ music kept track of the signal easily! HJAT-1080 logged between DXes at near 100%, and log taken on WSPA-950 after 5 a.m. s/on.
