Also logged was either WCHI or KCHR, both 13:50 on a f/c between 4:55 and 4:57, a tentative was sent to both. Up on 1/18 to try for the WIVI 1010 f/c but doggone that buzz was there, plus a hum which I usually hear only in the day time. Foday 1/19 there was finally a break in the buzz and I found that there were extraordinary CX for DX. Signals from the South and Southwest were wonderful logged XFACH 1110. Good DX to all and 73s. PS- Just looked through CM/of Trequencies list and note that XHAI is AN. I guess that that's it but I'm not logging it yet until I hear a definite ID.

He notes excellent The reception on several occasions with the following noted: Rennes (874); Miramar (782); Erussels (926) & Rengier (935); Toulouse (944); VOA (1195); Norden Osterloog (1295); Lille (1376); BBC (1457); Monte Carlo (1466); Nice (1554); A German

on (1586), and en unID on 1594. Monto Carlo, Tangier, and Miranar have been heard several times with fair to good signal strongth between 1800 and 1900 EST. The others plus Monte Carlo were AM loggings. He also notes a total of 44 solit frequency stations logged in Spanish. The best LA night so far was January 8th from 2035-2230, which was excellent. Carl has maybe a clue on the 1085 station signing-off with Star Spangled Banner reported by BD in 1/3 DXD. Twice in the past ten days he has heard WFT signing off on 1085 and 1135. This was not a spill-over, but separate and distinct carriers which could be peaked and nulled with the loop, AND WITH ENTROVENTIC SIGNALS ON 1090, 1100, 1120, and 1130. Also noted CRML putting a similar signal on 895, but not on 915 Kes, Carl says that he doesn't pretend to know what is doing it. He is just reporting what he hears.

The above information is greatly appreciated, and we do hope that many more of you will take the time to send a report to this DIGIST.

Space also has to be reserved at times so as to include the Freq Check lists-Construction Permit List-Conditions of the Frequencies list, Club Business to Members etc. So please cooperate.
