SPECIAL N.R.C. DX FROM WTTM-1380 DECEMBER 7

This will be a combined DX and Test program from WTTM, who changed their test schedule this month to fit into this time when they can be heard better, with most all-night stations off the air. It is believed that only KGMS in Sacramento will be on 1380 at the time of this broadcast, plus KPOI out in Honolulu, so mostly everyone ought to be able to latch onto this station, not heard too frequently in DX circles. Popular music, frequent station identification, and perhaps bits of cycle tone will go into the make-up of this N.R.C. DX from Port Huron, so be sure to be tuned to 1380 kilocycles next Monday at 4 a.m., EST for this program, which promises to be a fine one, and one many of our members are certain to want to hear and log. NORTH AMERICA

COSTA RICA--Costa Rican on 1377 Kcs, which I assume is TIJR heard regularly. Slogan is "Radio P?????". There is another new one on 1035, but not Radio Senora as the location is not San Jose nor is this my previous mystery station on this frequency. (CMS)

CUBA--CMDS (1582) Holguin, logged 11/10 at 1930 with no sign of CMHZ which previously controlled this spot. (CMS)

SOUTH AMERICA

ARGENTINA--LR9 "Radio Antartida" (1195) Buenos Aires, received several evenings around 2000, a real good DX bet. (CMS)

SURINAM--Despite FBIS and NARC reports to the contrary, AVROS was on 1030 last spring and is on 1035 now. QSL card received and it starts out "A.V.R.O.S. confirms reception on 1030 Kcs." The only flaw in the card is that for the power, they have filled in one of their Short Wave frequencies, but in view of the opening statement, it really doesn't matter. Signer is Agnes J. Fredriks. Country #85. First program begins at 0435 but s/on is closer to 0430. (CMS)

VENEZUELA--"Radio Continente" in Caracas, is now operating on 1160 Kcs. Heard at 2300 on 11/4. (CMS)

EUROPE

ANDORRA--Andorradio has added a morning transmission from 0100-0300 on weekdays over 818 Kcs. (DW)

NORWAY--A new low-powered station is reported operated by the Academic Radio Club, Technical University, Trondheim, on 1484 Kcs., it operates weekdays from 1700-1730; Saturdays 1730-1800; and Sundays 1715-1745. Power is 400 watts. Address is The Academic Radio Club, Uke-senderen, Technical University (NTH), Trondheim, Norway. Also operates on 7210 and 9610 Short Wave. (DW)

ENGLAND--I missed this information earlier, and acting on the assumption that some of you did too, here is some information regarding current policy of the BBC re verification. The following is quoted from a letter sent by the BBC to Arthur Cushen of New Zealand: "It is quite true that the former BBC policy of not giving official confirmation of any reports on reception has been modified, and we now send out a card which grades the finding of the reporter. To give complete verification in the first group (a) we normally require to know the date and time of the transmission, frequency, brief programme details to identify the transmission, and some estimation of the quality of reception. The card which shows Big Ben against a background has the following information on the reverse side. Thank you for your request for verification and the appropriate finding is indicated thus:

(a) Your report was in accordance with our published schedules on.....

(b) You probably heard one of our transmissions, but the information you give does not entirely confirm this.

(c) This may have been a rebroadcast of our programme by another organization.

(d) Your reception does not seem to agree with any of our transmissions at the time you give."

All this is signed by the verie signer who is W. Axon, Senior Superintending Engineer, External Services, the BBC, London. (NZ via DXG) I'd like to know if anyone has received one of these cards yet, and if

you have, I'd like to see it. It will be returned promptly if you would send it to me. Would also like Roy Patrick to check on this for our members. (FW)

AFRICA

GABON-*-"Radio Libreville" has been testing over 1520 Kcs. but is not yet reported on regular schedule. (DW)

ASIA (NEAR EAST)

KUWAIT-*--The Kuwait Broadcasting Service is currently operating on 1130 and 1344 Kcs. in the medium wave bands. Power is assumed to be about 1 Kw. (DXG)

ASIA (FAR EAST)

JAPAN-*--The address for the Far East Network has been changed to APO 99, San Francisco, California. (DXG) A new station in Yokohama is to carry the IBRA programs in Japanese. This is apparently to be JORF on 1480 Kcs. (DXG)

SOUTH KOREA-*--HLKX, Incheon, is currently operating on 1065 Kcs. according to a recently received letter. (DXG)

This would be best on Monday morning when some of the graveyard all-nighters may be silent. This is country Number 7. If you have a special country you would like us to cover, let me know. Also let me know if this feature is of any service to you. If it doesn't help, there is little use in our continuing it. Try for LR9 on 1195 as noted above, for Argentine is not an easy country to get.
