LONG-TIME FRIEND OF DXERS CALLED BY DEATH

CLINTON R. WHITE, 65, founder and owner of Station WCRW, Chicago, 1240 kc/s., died following a heart attack in that city on November 23, 1959. Mr. White, who operated WCRW since 1926, is an old-time friend of DXers ever since he built the station, known as "The Gold Coast Station." The last DX broadcast especially for the National Radio Club from WCRW was heard on February 5, 1951; having been arranged by a personal visit of three active Club members at the time; Eldon Addy, Leo Herz, and Len Kruse. Mr. White is credited with originating instantaneous recording process used in electrical transcriptions and other electronic developments.

I was able to plan my campaign and sure enough the verie arrived yesterday. I simply watched 830 kc/s. each evening that I could listen and after two weeks I found an evening when WCCO was pouring in with a powerful signal. Knowing then that CX were right I tuned 1050, turned my 6' dia. loop with its null toward dominant XED. Sure enough I ended up with three stations more or less average about equally. The hour is late, and in order to get this in the mail to Ray on time this week, we'll get right into the DX news.

NORTH AMERICA

MEXICO--*AEQY (1000) "Radio 111", s/off Monday AM at 0300 with fine signal. (DR) Mexican received about 730 Kcs. 11/28 at 0110 to 0120 when I lost it. It was all in Spanish, should have been AEA, but he kept saying Ickes Ah Koo. Mentioned Vera Cruz and Monterrey. (FW) (Frank AEX is now a relay of AEG, so you were really hearing an AEG program over AEX. The station you logged was AEA-FV) AENC (1540) was running quite late on 11/29 around 0150 to 0200 with a special crowning of the "Reina de la Ciudad de Celaya" event. Nice signal and apparently in the clear completely. (MER) Among numerous Mexicans heard Monday AM 11/23 were AEGR (1030), 0030-0100 and AEFR (1180) 0055-0100, both good signals. (BL)

EL SALVADOR--*YSEB (1075) nightly with the "La Voz de la Centro America" and then say E ESE E B. (DR)

PUERTO RICO--*AMIA (1070) s.on Monday AM at 0430. Announcer has broken English, about 34-5 here. (DR)

CUBA--*CMK, Havana, now on 1190 Kcs. Heard clearly 11/23 0045-0100. (BL)

BAHAMAS--*Received ZMA (1540) from 2001-2100 when KAEL knocked them out of the air. First I've had ZMS for a long time. (FW)

NICARAGUA--*YNLS (675) at its best very strong 2330-0030 on 11/27. (BL)

HONDURAS--*HRN now using 1005 Kcs.; heard there on 11/25, 2100-2300. The usual good signal, but haven't heard them since then. (BL)

HAITI--*Right now while I'm typing this, 4VM in Port-au-Prince, on 1325 kcs. is coming in nice and readable in French. Will stick with it till s/off. First noted at 2128 12/1. Still with it at 2203 and they are having Christmas carols at 2215, some even in English. High peak was S-7; (MER)

GUATEMALA--*SJ's unidentified on 1185 Kcs. is TGRL "Radio Landivar" (Pronounced Lan-dee-var) located in Quezaltenango, located about 60 miles west of Guatemala City. Noted here at 2300 on 12/1 with nice readable signal and audible almost nightly with a little splash from KLIF Dallas on 1190 kcs. TGED (1210) Guatemala City, comes through CMHK, Cruces, Las Villas, Cuba, almost nightly. Announces as "La Voz de la Capital". There are several more LAs on 1210 Kcs. too, but TGED holds forth most evenings here. (MER) TGJ (880) Nueva Fundo, heard 12/2 at 2030 way above WCBS. (DR)

BERMUDA--*ZBM-1 noted on 11/9 for the first time ever from this location. Strong enough at times to be readable and noted from 0345 to past 0400. (MER) WRM mainly from KRUZ and WINN on adjacent channels. (MER)

SOUTH AMERICA

NETHERLANDS ANTILLES--*PJA-5 (1435) fair to good on 11/27 and 11/28 1900-1930 using Spanish and Dutch. (BL)

ARGENTINA--*whatever this Argentinian station is, it's coming through on 1195 kcs. as have heard Argentina mentioned, and he seems to mention Buenos Aires quite often although may be a network station. suffers tremendous splash from WQAI 1200 Kcs. on evenings when LAs are coming in. (MER) (It is LR9-FV)

BRAZIL--*"Radio Globo" logged on 1180 Kcs. and audible most evenings. "Radio Mayrink" (1220) audible around 0000 GMT, logged 10/16 and 11/8. "Radio Tupi" (1230) audible all nights. (RP)

EUROPE

NETHERLANDS--*A new commercial station will shortly be on the air operating from a ship in the North Sea with a Dutch commercial service. No date or frequency yet, but on DCB close to Hilversum I or II if they can find a clear channel. (RP)

ANDORRA--andorra Radio (818) 100 Kw., according to latest schedule 0659-0900, 1200-1400, and 1730-2400. Times appear to be Central European Time, not GMT, as s/off at 2300 GMT as checked here. Plenty of BC QRM here. (RP)

OCEANIA

HAWAII--KFOA heard Monday when s/off off, fades in the background here nearly out. Readability almost perfect when fade in. (DR)

MISTERY

FW--Station on 810 or 820, mentioned Cali and Cuba around 9-10 PM Again Spanish which has me stumped. (HJED, Cali-810)

LR--550 Kcs. nightly. Does CMCY have a slogan similar to "Radio Progreda Ki Ya? 12/3 heard on 720 Kcs. SS over WGN using the slogan "Radio Tiempo de la Hora" or "Radio Viempo ve la hora". Who is this?

NER--Station noted on 11/30 on 1214 Kcs. with dinner-style music from 2230-2300. S.off comes at 2305 and I tried to track their national anthem which I believe is the Colombian "Himno Nacional". I tried to see if it might be HJEL in Cali, but a check of their SW outlet HJEF on 4765 doesn't indicate the same programming or s/off time, so it might be HJBE in Ocana, Colombia. Weak signal most nights with deep fades. Another unidentified at 1213 Kcs., giving previously mentioned UNID station QM at times, but much weaker. LA also on 1224 Kcs. but have not been able to sit with this one long enough for an ID. LA on 1207 Kcs. and suffering too much splash from WHBG and WXYZ to be readable. Noted at 2130 on 12/1. Another on 1312 Kcs. at 2120, but suffers from WRR, Dallas, on 1310 Kcs. Noted also on 12/1. Good to excellent strength on this one, but the splash prevents reading. (

HHR--Heard station on 1470 that had music in Spanish, then played a few bars of music before announced talked. He repeated "Beerseeccate" three times when he talked. After more than three years of compiling this section, it is the honest and frank opinion of the writer that there is indeed only lukewarm interest in this section. Of the thirty seven names listed above, only about ten keep their totals regularly up to date, while a dozen others furnish data about once a year. Eighteen of those listed have not changed their totals in over six months. A new DX season is now in full swing and is already two months old, but only ten of the above have reported within the past sixty days. It appears to me that the section, which could be of interest to many, is a page in the weekly bulletin once a month that probably could be eliminated, and used for more pertinent information. There are many active veteran DXers that have been listed in the past, but did not keep totals up to date, so had to be dropped. They should be listed, all of them, as veterans and newcomers alike, would enjoy, I should think, knowing how the active DXers are faring, and how they have done over the years. As spare time here is absolutely at a minimum, it does not seem worth the time and effort to provide a section that is apparently of so little interest to the majority of the membership. As I am planning to sail for England in April for a two months trip, I shall be forced to drop the section for two months, or earlier, if interest continues to wane. Alaska and Hawaii count as foreign. Canada does not for stateside DXers.
