PANAMA--*--ROU (1025) David, noted 2/12 from 2239 until s/off at 2334, often strong signal, but TV GRM. (GK)

VIRGIN ISLANDS--*--WLTV (1190) Columbus Bay, Christiansted, St. Croix, assigned 500 watts has been deleted. (FCC) Don't think it ever did come on the air.

SOUTH AMERICA

URUGUAY--*--CX28 (1090) Montevideo, is AN Monday AM's, has frequent ID as "Radio Imparcial", heard with full ID 0400 very clear. (GK) This is station believed to be LA with man and woman announcer ID as "Radio -----" in several spots between 0326 and 0350 2/8. Entirely different programming, all talk with poor modulation noted 0415-0430 same channel, doubt if this portion was CX28. (RHM)

NETHERLANDS ANTILLES--*--Verification for report of 1/13 in from FJC2 (895), prepared card signed illegibly and stamped "JULIANA ZENDER CURON CURACAO". Country #20. (RBS)

VENEZUELA--*--YVKS (750) Caracas, "Radio Caracas", seems to be the SS that s/on 0530. The SS on 770 at 0528 seemed to say "La Voz de Venezuela" and could be YVLP. The SS on 790 seemingly AN at 0340 2/8 seems to be a Venezuelan also, maybe YVKC. (GK)

EUROPE

MONACO--*--Trans-World-Radio, formerly "The Voice of Tangier" will start tests in May, 1960, over the new 100 Kw. transmitter from Monte Carlo. Regular and full schedule will be broadcast from 10/1. (DW)

PORTUGAL--*--Lisbon II (755) logged on 2/13 from 1815-1900 s/off. Strong at times. CSB-2 (1034) Lisbon, was coming in with strong signals on 2/13, 2030-2102 s/off. Featured pop music; man and woman announcers. Good volume for 25 Kw. Snowstorm tonight seemed to help reception. (BL)

FRANCE--*--I previously reported hearing Strasbourg (1277) use German between 0030 and 0100. On a second try, the language (Thru much GRM) sounds oriental which would check with WRH (Kabyle & Arabic)(BD)

EAST GERMANY--*--Veries are slow coming in this season, but I did get a very positive one back from Dresden (1043) in 3 weeks. (BD)

RHM*-UNID La announcing "Radio -----" on 840 0545-0555 2/11, slogan not similar to HJKC, YVMY, or any other listed in Weyrich log on 840. Closer to being like PRH9's slogan, but too late in morning for that. Sounds most like "Radio Verechi", very fast and rough to copy as hetrodyned.

UNID 2 letter call in English on 820 at 0530 on 2/7, Sunday before WBAP/WFAA s/on, similar to NHK call, but I know of no NHK station on 840; edfinitely not KBS, nor a number call. Very slow call, sounds like NHY, signal too poor to read otherwise, even as to language.

UNID station on 1370, 12/21, lovely waltz music, YL announcer at 0426 before WMOD's scheduled DX which wasn't on, not similar to WIVV programming, which I believe starts at 0430. Does anyone know of a NZ/Aussie area station here with YL announcer? Have heard only man on 2AP. (RHM)

GK*- "Radio Reloj" on 730 Kcs. heard 2/8 at 0341, after KFQD faded out, seems to be AN. (GK)

Apartado 3611, not 225 as shown in last Weyrich log. New country for me in series. (HSW)

HAITI--4VS (1385) Port-au-Prince, had evangelistic program on 2/18 2000-2130 fair to good signal strength. 4VW (1325) heard almost nightly, but no answers to my reports. Have others had any luck? (BD)

HONDURAS--Recent UNID SS slogan "Radio Ponaire" is HRZN on 887. Heard nightly until 0104 s/off. (MA) 715 Kcs. is probably HRTV heard 2300 with usually good sigs. (MA) HR?? (886) logged in spots from 2330 2/25 to 0100 2/26. I wonder if this is "Radio Pinaros" listed in WRH60 as MW freq. of SW HRZN (9610). No s/off heard, but no trace of signal after 0100. (RHM) (Apparently so, as per MA's report above-FV)

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC--HIF Puerto Plata (1162) verified by letter of 2/13, report of 11/11/59. This 7 days after I sent a 2nd report. Signer is same as CMS reported Antonio Badui-Hijo, Adm-Proprietarie. They show freq. as 1160, power 1000 watts. (BD)

MEXICO--XEQR (1030) "Radio Centro", Mexico City, logged 2/8 with fair signal 0400-0455 with WBZ silent. (Spanish report sent) (HSW)

PANAMA--Station on 1025 Kcs. ss at 2135 with Spanish music and singing, 2141 Spanish announcement (Lost signal), 2144 Man with announcement. (No signal again) 2148 More speaking, QTH?. 2158 Marches. 2200 Off. Is this Panama???? (MA)

CUBA--SS on 795 from 2200-2300 on 2/23 with slogan "Cadena Havana" and gongs. Mostly Spanish musicals S-9 at times. (MA)

I wrote him saying that I would, when space permitted in DX NEWS, to give you the contents of his letter, then leaving anything further on the subject up to him and the members themselves. The N R C will in no way participate, thus leaving you members and Marty free to take any action seen fit. Now the contents of his letter.

QUOTE I got to thinking the other day, about how much we need a non-commercial organization for the purpose of giving all clubs together, who participate in broadcast band DX, a single united spokesman - sort of a "lobbyist" you might say.

The "Popular Electronics" attempt at this was no doubt for the purpose of selling magazines, and was in my estimation, very ill advised and poorly run. I propose to set up an organization in which I will take full responsibility, and use my station, KCLV, as sort of official agency. The purpose would be to issue call letters, and actually license DX monitoring stations (not by law of course, but to give us some official standing) keep complete files on all DX monitors registered, and act as a spokesman in issuing various "propaganda" to radio stations, and in keeping the FCC, NAB, and other radio groups informed of what we do, and why. It is my belief that we need a central agency of this type, interested only in advancing the hobby, in order to improve our status as to DX verifications, of course all AM DXers would be welcome to the organization, regardless of club affiliation. The only rule would be, a member in good standing in their club. I would like to see how this idea goes in our own club first, so I will appreciate it if you would put out some info on my proposal through DX News to get the members reaction. The only cost to those desiring to register would be a 4¢ stamp, and I would do all the work, and issue certificates. I think a good name would be the "United Standard Band DXers of the World. Signed

At request of Office of Civil & Defense Mobilization, FCC announced Friday, Feb 26th that a nationwide 30 minute Conelrad drill will be held May 3rd. Participation is mandatory for all broadcasting stations licensed by FCC EXCEPT those in ALASKA-GUAM-HAWAII-VIRGIN ISLANDS-PUERTO RICO

Drill will be held from 1;00 to 1;30 P.M. Eastern Standart Time running simultaneously in other time zones (i.e. 10 A.M. P S Time) All AM stations not holding authorization for operation on Conelrad frequencies of 640 kcs and 1240 kcs as well as all FM and TV stations (unless specifically authorized to operate by FCC) MUST REMAIN SILENT during the 30 minute duration of drill.

Programming for Conelrad stations remaining on air will be provided over four national radio networks through civil defense. Suggested local programming will be furnished stations remaining on air prior to alert.

Will lads, again here is a chance for those of you who are able to do some daytime DXing, to try for some of those close to the border Canadian stations you need. Last year I tuned in at least 6 of them but being at work was not in a position to copy for a report.
