CKRB

On Monday morning, January 9th, Station CKRB, St. Georges de Beauce, Quebec, will present a special half-hour DX Program for the NRC from 4:00 to 4:30 EST. The program will be in French and English. Just recently CKRB moved from 1250 to 1460 kilocycles, and increased power from 5,000/1,000 to 10,000/5,000. Now with the 1460 spot clear on Monday mornings, here is the ideal time to hear a much-sought station. CKRB originally took the air on 7/20/53 on 1400 kilocycles with 250 watts. Then in September 1958 they moved to 1250, and just now in November 1960 to 1460. Mark this on your calendar as a M-U-S-T! All reports, with return postage, an IRC, or a U.S. 5¢ piece, should be sent Mr. Jacques Pepin.

The rest of my rquipment consists of a two speed dual track tape recorder, Q multiplier, duplicating machine, Spot Radio subscription (expired) plus various other\$ longs and publications. I have found the duplicator quite useful, as when I write out a report on one of my forms, I stick a stencil under it and cut the stencil, which can be used to run off a f/up in a fraction of the time it takes to write them out. Lazy, am I not? Well, to DX, if it can be called that, for it seems that better loggings were made during the summer, such as KICY-850. As a foreign member this report should have gone to the International DX Digest, but this will cover not international DX. The DX season should have been on for almost two months now, but because of the unusually warm weather (I believe) there has been no DX to hear for weeks. The season opened very promisingly in October during a week of cold weather. I even copied four NA stations among numerous DX signals one night. But right now it only rains instead of being cold and much of snow. The four stations above were CKXL, Calgary, Alta., 1140; CFRN, Edmonton, Alta. 1260; CKX, Brandon, Man. 1150; and KNOX, Grand Forks, N.D. 1310. The first two stations have already verified, CKXL mentioning that my report was their first from Europe. However CKX and KNOX have failed to reply although I sent them taped reports! I remember reading in this paper that Canadian stations always verify?? As to KNOX, this station got a report from another Swedish DXer, Chris Hederstrom only a month before mine. Chris' report and tape was played over their radio and TV several times and Chris got a tape back. But the second Swedish report did not fascinate them so much. Now I have sent f/ups to both these stations. Here in Sweden all BCB DXers (and others too) are awaiting the opening of "Radio North" a 20 kw. station to operate seaborne from a ship registered in Nicaragua anchored just outside Swedish territorial waters off Stockholm. They will broadcast NX, music and commercials "American style" 24 hours a day, in this way competing with the "monopoly" non-commercial and government-owned Swedish Broadcasting Corp. The Radio North establishment is said to be financed by two American millionaires, Clint Murchison Jr. and Robert F. Thompson, who are said to own both oil wells and radio stations. The name of the Chief of Production is Bok Reitzel, formerly at CBS and lately chief of "the most popular radio station in San Francisco." Maybe these names are known by DXers in the USA. Just anyhow, this is a strange business in this part of the world. Finally, could anyone send me a sample of a PP card? I have read that some of you have such cards printed up. They are not used by us here in Sweden. Also, how do these IRCs look and how do they work? Anyone sending me a card (PP or IRC) will of course get anything in return from me. Happy New Year and much DX in 1961!

The D layer is caused by the strong cosmic radiations from the Sun and disappears at night. The D layer also absorbs ECB waves, which is why little or no skip occurs during the day. No MW transmitter at the moment. (RP) "Radio Monte Carlo" heard on Saturday night at 0130 with western music, but announcements in Arabic.
