DX has really slowed down here with not much listening of late. MM 3/19 again very noisy. Noted SS AN on 1460 in well at times and is a San Salvador station with several local commercials but who? I note YSJJ listed on 1450 so perhaps they have moved to 1460. Then added JOLF-1310 Tokyo between 4:29-4:50 with good signal at times with only a little QRM from WGH AN and up to S-7 at times but much fading. KWEW-1480 barely heard on r/c-TT 2:00-2:15 under AN WABB; one ID said all reports must be accompanied by SAS. Unn WPUP-1390 ending cw mx ET at 2:26 with Ray Allen, CE, at the mike. WXXX-1310, Hattiesburg, Miss. has applied to FCC for the following change: increase day power from 1 to 5 kw., move to 1290 kc/s., and go full time with 1 kw. at night. Question: Why was not the moving of KFMB from 540 to 760 not listed in the FCC changes in station data? I am not complaining, just asking a question. (Good question, Dave - either we didn't get it or we missed it -ed.) Is the station listed in the new call section of the 2/24/62 issue on 1360 Suluth, Minn. really 1390 Duluth, Minn. of the 1/27/62 issue? (Yes -ed.) A newspaper item in today's Kansas City Times said: "The FCC refused today to renew the license of radio station KRLA, Pasadena, Cal. The commission gave the station until 4/16/62 to wind up its affairs. The decision reversed a 4/21/61 recommendation of an FCC examiner that the station be grated a license renewal for one year instead of the usual three year period. The FCC decision resulted from an inquiry into whether, among other things, the station owners had made applications to the FCC in good faith, the station's program logs were changed to deceive the commission, and whether the station controlled by Jack Cooke, an alien, in violation of the communications act and the FCC rules. The station is operated by Eleven Ten Broadcasting Corporation on 1110 kc/s."

(Fine, Alan - as long as YOU cut the stencils -ed.) Ernie, is it permissible to plug articles in commercial magazines which have to do with BCB DX? (Yes -ed.) Veries? Yup and OK too, best are HCJB-700-dx and VP4RD-730 "Radio Trinidad". Radio Trinidad has very stylish new stationery and according to their letter the use of a horizontal antenna "T" type 180' high. However noted in going over this issue, one member suggests or asks about cutting stencils for stations easily heard in the Caribbean area - South America - Central America along with their Calls - Frequencies - Slogans etc. This log to be published only when we have a blank page. Sorry but if so many of you will re-call that last list of Latin American stations the NRC published turned out to be a big flop in every way. The Club charged .15¢ per copy and the number of members who purchased that log was so small that the Club actually lost money despite using paper that was already paid for. Thus the result was that the NRC would publish NO MORE LOGS of any kind.

Vane Jones and Whites publish logs along with the FBIS and the World Radio Handbook, all deal in at least Latin American countries while the FBIS and WRH cover the entire world outside the United States. Those desiring to purchase any one of them can find where to send for them along with the price.

It is fully realized that we DXers are very much in need of an up to date log, but the NRC is in no position to attempt to publish one and does not desire to go into competition with those who are already in the log publishing business. Then to drag out the publishing of any log makes it obsolete by the time it has been completely published. As it is, those publishing complete logs have to add a supplement when its put on the market in order to bring it as much up to date as possible. So it is suggested that any one having the time-definite data that helps make a log better, contact those already in the business and try and make their log better, and you might get paid for your information. So again the NRC will not publish any kind of a log either small or large.

While still space it must be remembered that when you have a change of address to immediately notify me at either P.O. (BD)(We'll argue, Ben, that this is NOT Seville, but San Sebastian-FV) EBU is correct, 638 is definitely San Sebastian, while Sevilla is on 647. I rcvd a verie from Seville (647) in December direct from the Director of the RNE-outlet in Sevilla. As for the "verie" received by BD from Madrid, this again proves that in Spain, network HQ often does not know details about local stations, so BD should count the verie as from San Sebastian. (LR)
- 645 HOS22 "Radio Mia", this ID positively heard 3/16 at 2300 s/off but on 12/21 the "Radio Rumbos" ID was positively heard. At that time mentioned FM which was not the case with Radio Mia, while the latter also IDs as "La Gran Cadena de Libertad." Any suggestions? (CMS)

- Who is the SS here at 2300 over WGN? (LDS)(Could be HJAN listed just above-FV)
- 740 CM-- Noted Cuban s/on here on 3/19 at 0525. Couldn't catch slogan, a network station, but don't know which one it is as two listed on 740. (FHN) / (LDS)
- 2BL Sydney, Australia, heard with poor signal 0400-0430 on 3/12
- 755 Timisoara I, Romania, verie card and letter received for February reception, #2 for Romania, this from Bucharest. (BD)
- 760 "Radio Peking", logged 3/17 0700-0800, IDs at 0730 and 0800 with pips and tone very strong on both hours. (RHM)
- 780 4YA Dunedin, New Zealand, heard 3/12 with good signal from 0335-0400. (LDS)
- 782 Hetrodyne at 2300 on 3/25, can't be CSB9, is it East Germany? (JE)

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- 782 CSB9 Portugal. Hetrodyne found on WBEM almost every evening here, undoubtedly CSB9. Occasionally in breaks through and is audible only to be drowned out by WABC's rock 'n' roll (JF)
- 800 IYZ Rotorua, New Zealand, heard 3/12 with fair signals 0400-0420, weaker than 4YA. (LDS)
- 818 Cairo V, Egypt, finally logged 3/1 at 2000 and after, on late for Ramadan. (CMS) / (RHM)
- 820 JOUC Hofu, Japan (I assume) very good 3/14 at 0600 with NHK ID. English speaker behind WFAA's TT, ID ruined when WFAA IDed. Who was it? At 0430 on 3/12. (LDS)
- 825 YVLT Los Teques, Venezuela, in with strong signals at 1930 on 3/21 on DX program. Announced as "Radio Miranda", never heard them give call once. (JF) Signals up to S-9 with log from 1930-2000 and the repeat from 2230-2300, heavy static on the late program. Report sent, hope they verify. (BD) Logged from 2245-2330 S-8/9 hampered by snow static. Sure happy to log this one thanks to Kermit Geary and the IDXD. (HSW)
- 881 BBC Tentatively logged on this frequency on 3/26. Slight het. on WCBS at s/off, after it went off the air, English speaking man with British accent giving talk, but WCBS almost immediately came back on with TT to drown him out. Time was 0115. (JF)
- 890 AFRTS Adak, Alaska, ID as "This is the Alaska Network" at 0500, 3/19 for a nice catch as about 2400 miles, or about 3/5 of the way to No. Japan. (RHM)
- HJCE Bogota, Colombia, report sent for reception of 3/19 from 0130-0200, as previous report was sent to HJCI rather than HJCE. Still comes in quite good on Mondays on their AN show with frequent IDs as "Canal de Color" and also as "La Voz de Bogota" on the hour. (FHN)
- 920 HJAF Cartagena, Colombia, sent air mail v/1 and pennant, round trip taking 12 days. Letter came from Circuito Radial ABC, specifying reception of Emisoras Fuentes. Signer was Carlota Mendoza M. Suggest sending reports for other stations on this net to Aptdo Aereo 91, Nal 31, Cartagena. (BD) Listed on letterhead of HJAN as member of "Cadena de estaciones el servicio de la costa atlantico de Colombia". 10 Kw. (JBR)
- 950 XEGM Tijuana, B. Cfa., s/off in English at 0100, s/on in Spanish at 0900. (LDS)
- 1000 HJAZ Monteria, Colombia, is also listed with net including HJAF (920) and HJAN (720). Power is 10 Kw. also and slogan is "Emisoras Sinu". (JBR)
- 1020 TGUX Guatemala City, listed as all-night signed off at 0236 $\frac{1}{2}$ morning of 3/26. (JBR)
- 1035 4VE Cap Haitien, Haiti, apparent s/off is 2303, noted often with strong signal. (JF)
- 1080 Who is AN SS on here Monday mornings? (JF)
- 1090 XERB Rosarito Beach, B. Cfa., s/off 3/19 at 0315, both in English and Spanish. (RHM)
- KHAI Honolulu, Hawaii, logged 3/19 for first time; very rough with QRM, but logged 0315-0430 with no s/off logged. (RHM)
- 1185 HRWW Verie from HRVW-HRWW with pennant signed by Irma Sikaffey, Adm., lists 1185 and says power increase likely for end of 62. WRUL affiliate. (DJ)
- 1196 VOA Munich, West Germany, noted their signal last 4 Monday mornings, fadeout about 0115 generally. (JF)

- 1200 PRB-6 Sao Paulo, Brazil, believed to be the station with a Japanese program on 3/19 0345-0355, signals from S-3/5. Same program heard back in July, but report never answered. (BD)
- 1205 RTF Bordeaux I, France, 3/26 first noted at 0030 or so, signal lasted till past 0200, quite good most of the time with French talks and music. (JF)
- 1210 Unknown LA signed on around 0400 on 3/19. A chime interval signal was heard for several minutes prior to this sign-on. Late, South American music. Did anyone else hear this one? Puzzled? (BD)
- 1214 BBC Outlet on this frequency noted between 0030-0100. Quite strong also at times, but very poor copy for report as almost all uninterrupted (quiet) instrumental music after a newscast at about 0030. (JF)
- 1225 HCBJ2 The LA on 1225 may be HCBJ2, Radio El Mundo, Guayaquil, Ecuador, listed on 1220 but heard on 1225 for at least $\frac{1}{2}$ year. Ecuadorean stations usually not heard in Sweden, but this is a big surprise as heard now and then. Good antenna at sea? Unfortunately, does not reply even to taped reports. (LR)
- 1235 ZBM-1 Hamilton, Bermuda, common in early evening. Verie back within 3 weeks for 1st report. (JF)
- 1250 HJAO Barranquilla, Colombia, another one listed with HJAN-HJAF 1000 watts, "Radio Vigia". (JBR)
- 1310 XEC Tijuana, B. Cfa., s/off 0400 daily. Except Monday. Qth is Calle Segunda 169, Apartado 23. Send English report, as they understand it very well. (LDS)
- JOLF Tokyo, Japan, logged on 3/19 from 0429-0458 with signal up to S-7 at times with only a little QRM from a Ner WGH and easy to get a good log. (FHN)
- 1340 HJAO Cartagena, Colombia, another listed in net with HJAN-HJAF. This one 1000 watts, "Radio Vigia". (JBR)
- 1358 TA in German, I think, although readability tough, logged with fair signals on 3/23 between 0045 and 0130 when signal faded completely. Bremen, West Germany, seems the most likely, since according to WRH, the Berlin DDR station operates only from 1030-1815. Other West Germans were also coming in well. (BD)(My sources agree-FV)
- 1380 XEKT Tecate, B. Cfa., nice long letter in English received for report of special AN show on 3/5 signed by E. H. Whitford who says he is a missionary who does English programs on XEKT. Also says they were running a special marathon to raise money for a Red Cross Ambulance for the town and that they were using 250 watts at the time although usually run only 150 watts at night. Address is Apto Postal No. 29 Tecate, B. Cfa., (FHN)
- 1395 Unid LA here may be HCVE4, "La Voz de Esmeraldas", Esmeraldas, Ecuador, who is the 2nd surprise here this winter with several loggings. Must also have a favorable location No reply so far after 2 months. (LR)
- 1420 XEXX Tijuana, B. Cfa., s/off 0400 except Monday at 0100. Sunday mornings they have bull-fights in English from about 2300 Sat. until 0300 Sunday. Their QTH is Apto Postal 469. They also understand English. Signer is Jean de la Torre, Rodriguez, Gerente General. (LDS)
- UnID SS logged here briefly atop at 0538 Sunday 3/18. Any ideas? (RHM)
- 1440 HOC Colon, Panama, logged on 3/17 from 0430-0500 with very good signals at times and a good catch if 250 watts as listed in WRH. No slogan caught but frequent mention of Panama and at one place gave frequencies they were operating on as

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- Colon (1440), Panama City (1500) and SW frequency in Panama City. (FHN)
- 1450 XECB San Luis Rio Colorado, Sonora, s/off 0200 daily, They use a Gates 250 watt XR and the slogan "La Voz del Desierto" Verie promptly signed by Francisco Marquez V., Gerente. I would suggest reporting in Spanish. (LDS)
- 1460 YS JL San Salvador, El Salvador, heard here AN on 3/19 with frequently ID and local commercials for San Salvador. YS JL is listed on 1450 and none on 1460 so wonder if this would be the one as they certainly can't be on both. (FHN)
- Unknown logged AN 3/19 with election returns seemed to be Colombian using EST and mentioned Bogota. Sounded like "Radio Alegria" Who knows? (SRM) (Looks like both of you had the same station, but you got different ideas as to who or where it was. -FV)
- 1470 XEAU Tijuana, B. Cfa., s/off 0300 daily except at 0200 Monday. Send reports to Chula Vista, California, not TIJUANA, use English. (LDS)
- 1475 4VGM Magloire Broadcasting Circuite, Port-au-Prince, verified by letter. Signer is Frank Magloire, Directeur-Proprietaire. Why is this station being reported on 1430? Is on 1475 now and probably has been for at least two years. (CMS)
- 1532 HJFC "La Voz de la Sabana" (Not Cabana), Bogota, is the Colombia here definitely. (LR)
- 1538 Finally received a verie card from "Radio Senegal" Dakar, confirming reception on 10/21/61. Certainly worth the wait. On the other side of the card is a very interesting description of Senegal. Country #56. (BD)
- 1550 XEBG Tijuana, B. Cfa., s/off at 0400 daily except at 0300 on Monday. (LDS)
- 1562 "Radio Veronica" at sea logged at 1900 on 3/4 and at 2130 on 3/13. Appears to be AN as frequently puts het on WQXR. (CMS)
- 1570 XERF Ciudad Acuna, Coahuila, back in full fury 3/16. What happened? (LDS) Noted more Spanish and less English since they have returned. (JF)
- Verie card back in 8 days from Hamburg, West Germany, confirming 3/13 reception of Flensburg. For those who don't have this one, the NDR QSL card is as near to the "Ideal" verie card as any I've seen. (I have two other NDR cards both on Oldenburg loggings.) (BD)
- 1577 Unknown here was good S-5 today up to about 0250, hope it is CSB6. WAKR was off with trouble, a SS here but a TT also here and no ID on either. (JBR) (3/26)
- 1578 CSB-5 Heard again on 3/22, quite easily with WEEZ temporarily off the air. On until at least 2030, when WEEZ returned. Some have reported this Portuguese station as being on 1575 Kes., but I found them darn close to 1578. (BD)
- 1590 XEHC Ensenada, B. Cfa., s/off 0200 daily, sister to XEC, slogan is "Radio Bahia". (LDS)
