Greetings, all, from a different resting place again. Have been out here about 1 1/2 months now. Consequently, haven't been doing much DXing. The little that has been done is concerned mostly with daytime semi-locals, which are a novelty to me. Even with this, veries are real slow in coming in - about 50% return. Among the unverified ones are WNTA-970 which is most annoying, and WHIL-1430 heard one evening when noisy WNJR was off. Recent catches are WEEZ-1590 way under WERA in the afternoon, WBAZ-1550 WJDY-1470 WNLK-1350 and on 4/23 (when I couldn't sleep) I heard WEER-1570 with ET from 12:15 to 12:30; WHOM-1480 (in EE for a change) with crystal test at 12:45, WFNL-1600 ET with mx until at least 2:00, WELE-1590 I think, with ET at 1:10, and WENZ-1450 with ET at 1:25. (Gee, Ernie, seems as if we're getting about the same stuff). Hey, do any of you WC-ers ever hear WQXR-1560, or for that matter, does anybody, anywhere, hear KGBT-1530? 73

First things first. WNJR-1430 used to overmodulate here making quite a nuisance of itself. They used to put very bad responses on 1410/1450 with lesser ones scattered around between 1370 to 1480. The response on 1450 was so bad that WCTC would only be heard with WNJR nulled out the most it was possible - and then difficulty was usually encountered. And WCTC's .5 mv/m contour (primary coverage) passes only a few miles to the S which means they (should) put in a good signal here (which they do). So this will give you an idea of the severity of that response. So, on SM 4/29 I turned on the set and found it worse than ever - bad responses on 1290 and 1470 (new ones) and the ones on 1410/1450 really bad. I couldn't even hear WCTC with WNJR nulled out the most possible! So I made a tape of this condition and sent it to WNJR along with a note that these responses have been getting worse and that this was the worst yet. So I got results. WNJR finally corrected it and are not overmodulating. I can even hear WCTC loud and (fairly) clear with the loop directed right towards WNJR's XR about two miles away. So, to Andy Rugg, why not drop CKGM a letter about your problem? Maybe their engineering staff doesn't know it exists. That 's one I've been after. 4/8- KOB-770 nice signal with test program between 4:00 and 4:30 am. 4/9- 2BL-740 again, but much better signal than the previous week. Logged in detail from 4:00 am until after 5:00 with clear ID, but KCBS came on at about 5:05 for a test, and that ended it. One on 750 sounded like an Aussie, maybe 4QS, but couldn't ID. Some ZeddsOs also heard. 4/12 and 4/13- Mostly IAs, but got detailed logs on "Radio El Sol" Lima, 895, both evenings, and sent report to signer and address reported by Hank Wilkinson. Congratulations and thanks to Pete Taylor for undertaking his most interesting survey. All DXers must appreciate the time and expense involved in writing to 200 stations. Perhaps out of it will come an improvement in the verie situation. I suspect, however that some stations will simply not verify no matter how good the report is. My own records show that I have gotten approximately the same percentage returns on report forms and personal letters, typed and handwritten reports, and reported periods ranging from ten minutes to several intervals in two or more days. Even PP cards do not seem to be the answer. After several f/ups I sent one to WGUY. It came back (after one month) with only initials, no signature or position indicated. It does have a Bangor postmark, but that's about it. I suggest as summer static reduces DX, DX NEWS be used for comments on methods of reporting and obtaining veries. I have several ideas which I will try if I have time. One technical note: ~~xxxxxxx~~ If anyone else has a RX using a 6F6 in the audio power stage, I suggest that he replace it with a 6K6GT. No circuit change required. This will reduce drain on the power supply, cut down on component-cooking heat, and probably reduce or eliminate any microphonic problems. 73. THE JUNE ISSUE WILL BE JUST THAT MUCH BETTER IF YOU SEND IN A MUSINGS REPORT FOR IT!

- 615 YNM Managua, Nicaragua, heard weakly several nights around 2215 only audible with BFO on and even then no copy. (AR) Verie signed by Tacho Sanchez, Dir. #9 for Nicaragua. Logged on 615, but verie says 620 Kcs. (HTT)
- 655 YSS San Salvador, El Salvador, often heard as weak het, but broke through consistently in late April around 2300. (AR)
- 670 2CO Albury, New South Wales, logged 4/12, 0459-0520, ABC gongs and time signal. (RHM)
- 723 .... Jeddah, Saudi Arabia, registered air mail verie received 1 year and two months after reporting during Ramadan. Two copies, one Arabic, one in English. Country #144. (HTT)
- 737 TFU Akureyri, Iceland, nice QSL verie with pony stamps. Also have TFE verified some years ago. (HTT)

- 925 HRVS Logged with S-9 signals on 4/23 and 4/24 between 2100 and 2200. ID as "Radio Catolica, La Voz de Suyapa, in the Republic of Honduras". Seems to sign off prior to 2230. (BD)
- 1020 TGUX Guatemala City, Guatemala, very strong 4/30 AN in English at 0143 advertising Super Shell gas and Hertz Rent-a-Car. At least as strong as XERF. (CM)
- 1035 AVROS What a surprise to receive a verie card from A.V.R.O.S., Paramaribo, Surinam, for a Sept. 23, 1960, report, only one year 7 months ago. Quite positive too, and signed by either L. or J. Hering. Second verie from Surinam. (BD)
- 1120 XETR Ciudad Valles, S. L. P., logged 4/13, 0701-0712, frequently giving call letters. (RHM)
- 1145 .... Haitian IDing as "Radio Caraibes", strong on 4/18 particularly between 2140 and 2215. No call letters heard. (BD)
- 1160 CMBN "La Voz del INRA" (Institute Nacional Reforma Agrario) C. M. Stanbury is correct, this call is positively CMBN, probably 25 Kw., most programs originate from CMBQ-1150, who has probably a power of about 250 watts now. (CAT)
