Hi fellows. Now that the school year is behind me, I am getting into some serious DX-ing. About all I had time for last season was trying to catch the DX Specials, and I didn't hear all of them I needed. Static has been at an all time low this year, so I have been able to make a few additions to the log. By date: 7/5- WISE-1310 ID Asheville, N.C. an SSS below WISH. WMIX-940 very briefly at 7:48 on SSS. Tape sent. They are 5,000 D in Mt. Vernon, Ill. 7/8- WBAC-1340 ID at 6:30 am, dandy signal for a 250 watter. No report, lots of mess on 1340 as usual. WEMB-1420 on an abrupt s/on at 6:58 am, no SSB or anything, mentioned call and frequency and went right into RS. Ver-ies are: v/1, WKGN-1340 and WENS-1460. V/c, WIRE-1430 WPFB-910 (really nice). A note to all, including "AN Situation List", WSAI is not AN seven days as listed in Condition of Frequencies. They are off Sunday AMS 2:00-5:00, per a visit to them. I got myself invited into the control room to watch the operations by one of the DJs and got promptly thrown out by a newsman. Hoo-hah! The DJ, Paul Purtan, is from Buffalo N.Y. and is very familiar with the NRC, how about that? Also visited WCKY who were very hospitable for a large outfit. Local WZIP-1050 are supposed to s/off at 8:00, but last night left their carrier on until after 10:30. I thought daytimers were supposed to wait until after 12:00 to test. I called the studio to inquire into this fiasco, but no answer. On 7/20 I am leaving for Northern Michigan on vacation and this year have the family's consent to stop at some radio stations. Will visit WCRM WCEN WSOO and others if I can get away with it. Above and two nickels will get you a dime! 73.

I have three major items of interest. 1. For the past several weeks I was able to gain access to a magnificent receiver - a Collins R-390, located in our base communications center. 2/ I just returned from a very wonderful week in Sweden, where I attended the 1962 DX Parliament. 3. I will probably be back in the States by 8/1, and look forward to being able to help with the final arrangements for the Indianapolis Convention. First, a brief resume of DX in NE France lately. 5/30- Noted good signal from AFN-1304 at 7:05 pm EST s/off. 2:00 a.m., NAs picking up. 3:30, WCKY noted. 3:46, it happened! A distinctive voice in the muddle on 1190 kc/s. Out of the noise came none other than WOWO - about 15 minutes of tape was taken, including a portion of the Indianapolis Time Trials! (ED. note: Fort Wayne is Don's home town.) 6/4- WCBS @ 8:05 pm (2:05 am, CET). WJAR-920 at 8:30 and WNJR at 9:55 (twilight outside) plus usual stuff, including Brazilians. Beside these very unusual (for late spring, anyway) catches. I have noted the following which seem to be common when NA is good: WMEX-1510 WEZE-1260 WTOP-1500 WQXR-1560 WKBW-1520 WPTR-1540 WBT-1110 CBN-640 CJON-930 CBI-1140 CBA-1070 WTIC-1080 WBZ-1030 WNEW-1130 and WHN-1050. Less frequently, WIAM-1470 WBAL-1090 WEGP-1390 WCAU-1210 and WNJR-1430 have shown up. There are nearly always Brazilians present, between the hours of 8-10 pm (2-4 am, CET) strong on 1180 1190 1220 1340 1280 1000 and weaker ones on many other frequencies. As for this side of the water, reception of many Italian, Spanish and German stations continues to be the rule in the evening hours. After the Spanish QRM clears the air at 7 pm (1:00 am here) the relatively few ANs have very good signals, such as Horby-1178 Prague-1295 and many DDR and Radio Moscow relays. At 9:05 pm (3:05) the s/off of AFRS-Azores-1500 can be heard. There are only a few consistent signals from North Africa, these being Algiers I-890 Algiers II-980 and Tunis-962. From the Near East, Jeddah-723 is the only consistent SSS DX. As I mentioned I attended the 1962 DX Parliament in Lund, Sweden. It was certainly a most enjoyable and wonderful experience. Also I spent several days in Stockholm as guest of Lars Ryden, a most amiable and accomplished host. It's State-side or Bust and I hope to see everybody in Indianapolis. Remember, the 7122d Tac Fighter Wing will be in Indiana in time for the grandest NRC Convention ever-will you?

AFN Frankfurt 872, Munich 548, Poland 1304 1367, Luxembourg 1439, Tirana 1088, Hungary 1250, Holland 1007, Romania 854, 908, 1151, Greece 1493, 1511, and 728, BBC Malta 1178. Now 81 countries logged and 61 verified. 73 All.

ROY PATRICK, 8 SIDNEY STREET, DEREY, ENGLAND--Here we are again. I'm afraid I haven't done a great deal of BCB listening for a while. It is a pity we are on BST which makes us an hour ahead of GMT and it is not good for DXing. Nice letter and tape from Larry Godwin of Amarillo, and I heard some of the convention on it. Been looking for Monte Carlo on 755 as reported by EBU, but no luck at 0700. Most of the US stations report have QSLd. I sent reports to WPTR and WMEX which sent very nice cards. WRUL wondered if anybody in the states has heard a European on medium wave, so I sent them a copy of DX NEWS. Quite a few listeners in Europe have told this station of the good reception of US stations on medium wave during the winter. Have been looking for the new commercial station which expects to start broadcasting from a ship near Southend on Sea. I think on 980 Kcs. I would like to thank all the DXers who send greetings to me on tape from the NRC convention and I have now added the tape to my library. WRUL on "Postmark New York" mentioned the NRC. Weather now nice and another tape from Larry Godwin arrived with greetings from members in that area. I plan to do another tape for the NRC convention this year. I hope to include some of the European stations, a trip around Europe which should be of interest to East Coast DXers and I hope to include a recorded message from Ken Brownless. When I have finished the tape I'm sending it to Larry. (If this seems disjointed, it is because it is a composite of about five letters and notes from Roy, condensed into one OVERSEAS ITEM-FV) Roy also sent some interesting information about the Pilkington Report concerning commercial and color TV in England.

Don Roller at the home of Lars Ryden--I am currently staying at the home of Lars Ryden a very very excellent host, indeed. I have been given a very extensive tour of "Sveriges Radio". I will attend the entire session of the "DX Parliament". I will have much material of interest to the foreign station DXers to present at the convention.

Lars Ryden adds a PS. Sorry not to have been able to send you DX items lately --you may expect to hear in the near future. This has been a nice visit with Don, a fine ambassador of the NRC.

BENGT A. ERICSON, Linnegatan 4, Skara, Sweden--Here is a pip from me again. The condx here have been poor, but now perking up again. I hope so and like so. The government owned Radio Sweden has been new organized and here is the new schedule. The National Program is broadcast from 2345 until 1605 on 593, 719, 773, 980, 1178, 1223, 1448, 1529, and 1562. The Swedish Melody Radio is broadcast from 2345-1215 on 1394, and 1594 Kcs. Then from 1605-2345 on 593, 773, 980, 1178, and 1223. Program 2 (Good music and talks) is broadcast between 1215 and 1730 on 1394 and 1594. A special program to Europe in German and English is transmitted via Hoerby 1178 between 1800-1900. The frequencies 593, 773, 980, 1178, and 1223 are on the air 24 hours a day. Only break is on Wednesday morning between 0300 and 0500. The Swedish speaking Radio Nord on international waters broadcasting on 602 Kcs. has ceased its transmissions according to a new Swedish law forbidding every commercial radio station transmitting programs to Sweden. Sponsoring companies will be punished. Pffft. It is horrible. All commercial programs in Sweden are forbidden. Radio Nord finished on June 30th, 1962 at 1800. Furthermore AFN Berlin on 935 Kcs. is a 24 hour a day station. Power is 10 Kw. Well, that is all from me just now. I hope that your convention will be fine. I am going to send a tape to your convention.

NEWS NOTES

ROY PATRICK

PORTUGAL--Voice of the West now BC at 2200 GMT in French, 2245 in English, 2330 in Spanish. Freqs. now used 755 and 1061 Kcs. Both outlets are audible here with a fairly good signal.

EAST GERMANY--Radio Berlin International has been reported BCing on 1115 Kcs. This is a move from 1356 Kcs. English programs for US forces in Berlin at 2230 according to announcement. Received here with quite a lot of QRM.

ENGLAND--The Automobile Association has asked for a MW frequency on which broadcasts can be made over a radius of 10 to 20 miles. This for on the spot local road and traffic information service to motorists

AT SEA--Radio Veronica (1562) now send a very nice QSL card. Power is listed as 2500 watts. They seem to come on the air around 1000 GMT. The new commercial station which should be on the air anyday now operating three miles from Southend on Sea. No sign of them yet, but according to one National newspaper, they have been reported testing on 980 Kcs.

HAITI--"Radio Lumiere", Box 71, Aux Cayes, is on the air from 0530-0900 and 1530-2215 weekdays, Sunday 0530-2215 in French and Creole. Uses 4VI, Aux Cayes (760) 1 Kw, and 4VIE Jeremie (1180) and in near future 4VUE (780) Port-au-Prince.

POLAND--The Polish Radio, Warsaw, broadcasts in English to the British Isles from 1430-1500 on 1205 Kcs.

SURINAM--The Home Service of the AVROS, Paramaribo, is aired from 0430-2330 over 1035 Kcs., 4 Kw. News in Dutch every hour on the hour.

TCHAD--"Radio Tchad" is now on the air weekdays 0000-0100, 0500-0900, and 1100-1600, Sunday 0000-1600. Uses 1538 Kcs. with 4 Kw. More power expected later.

A station named Pyrgos, Western Peloponnesus, operates with 500 watts on 1250 Kc. Saturday nights (2100-2200 with an English tourist program. Requests reports and promises QSL letter.
